REPORT.

LAND OFFICE, December 1, 1864.

To the Governor and Council of Maine :

I herewith submit the Annual Report of the operations of this department, which, with the annexed schedules, exhibits the operations of the Land Office for the present year.

Influences affecting other sections of our country have not escaped that part of the State where the operations of this department have to be applied ; and the current events of the times have wrought many changes in the social condition and rendered uncertain the tenure by which the hardy pioneer has clung to his new home, hence it is not my privilege to report that degree of progress which has marked the course of our new settlements in other years.

Yet, notwithstanding the many untoward circumstances which hindered an extensive emigration, the diminution has not been so marked as might be supposed, as is evinced by the number of new contracts entered, and conveyances made after settling duties had been completed.

There have been conveyed of the public lands for cash and cash securities, twenty-one thousand three hundred fifteen (21,315) acres ; under resolves of the Legislature, thirty-seven thousand seven hundred three (37,703) acres ; of the lands opened for settlement upon surrender of the contracts made for the performance of settling duties, nine thousand three hundred fifty-five (9,355) acres ; contracted by land certificates, fifteen thousand nine hundred twenty-three (15,923) acres.

For a detailed description of the several tracts and lots conveyed and contracted, reference is made to schedules marked A, B, C, D.

In pursuance of the provisions of the "Act in relation to the sale of timber on the public lands," permits have been granted for cutting timber and other lumber upon the following townships, viz : W. C. Hammond, G, R. 1 ; Coffin & Hawes, N. E. quarter 10, R. 4 ; J. C. Madigan, C, R. 2 ; William Fitzgerald, 9, R. 4, and N. W. and S. E. quarters 8, R. 4 ; John S. Jenness, W. half 7, R. 15 ; George Seely, 17, R. 9 ; Dole & Giddings, 8, R. 15. Other applications have been made, and additional permits may be called for.

At the last session of the Legislature donations from the public lands were made as follows, viz : Bates College, two townships ; Maine Wesleyan Seminary and Female College, and Westbrook Seminary, the "timber and lumber" for the term of ten years upon one half township to each ; and for educational purposes, the "timber and lumber" growing upon one township for the term of ten years.

In accordance with the provision of the several resolves and further instruction from the Governor and Council, there have been selected and advertised, for the benefit of Bates College, townships numbered 8 and 10, Range 17, W. E. L. S., excepting from the last named township "a tract of land three miles square from the south-east quarter," leaving, however, more than a full size township from the sales of which and the other township named, it is expected the sum of twenty thousand dollars may be realized for the college and an additional sum for the common school fund.

The "timber and lumber" growing upon the north-west and south-east quarters of township numbered 8, Range 4, W. E. L. S., have been advertised to be sold for the term of ten years for the benefit of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary and Female College ; the east half of township numbered 9, Range 3, W. E. L. S., has been designated for the Westbrook Seminary, and the residue of Township 9, Range 4, W. E. L. S., for educational purposes.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in the act entitled "An act for the establishment of normal schools," approved March 25, 1863, and the further report of Council, made August 15, 1864, I have advertised to be sold all the right, title and interest which the State has, being one undivided half owned in common with proprietors, in townships numbered 16, Range 11, and 16, Range 12, W. E. L. S.

Under resolves of the last Legislature, appropriations were made for repairing roads and bridges as follows, viz :

For carrying out the purposes contemplated by the resolves, I have made contracts during the season and expended sums as seemed to be required, under the supervision of Josiah Gellerson, Thomas Burton, Ziba Haley, John Sawtelle, William M. Lord, Alvin Haynes, M. L. Durgin, A. J. Chadwick, R. B. Campbell, William D. Bither, and Charles D. Bryant, as follows :

Four hundred eighty-two dollars eighty-seven cents had been worked upon the road in the south half of Township No. 2, Range 3, by R. B. Campbell, and one thousand dollars expended by Josiah Gellerson in building the bridge at Mattawamkeag Forks under resolves of previous years, under instructions from my predecessors, but whose accounts had not been audited—the sums charged respectively to E. Woodbury, R. B. Campbell, Josiah Gellerson, covering in all \$1,482.87, have been retired from the books in this office.

The expenditures have been made with scrupulous regard to the intention of the Legislature, yet it will be observed that while the aggregate amount expended falls short of the sums appropriated, a brief explanation seems to be required for diverting to other purposes any sums of money which have been authorized for specific uses.

It was found upon examination of the road leading through Indian Township, that a large quantity of debris had collected, and bushes grown to good size outside of the traveled part and within the original width of the road. Mr. John Sawtelle was employed to clear off the bushes and other obstructions. The better condition of the road under the supervision of Mr. Haley, with the improvements referred to, will be fully realized when future repairs shall be called for.

A section of the Military Road beginning at the easterly end of Molunkus Bridge, continuing a distance of twenty-three rods, was found upon examination to have an average depression of two feet eight inches below the water level of the annual spring freshets, and the frequent interruption to the stages conveying the daily mails to and from Houlton, heavily loaded teams and light carriages, during the rainy season required repairs to be made, to prevent the annual recurrence of difficulties suggested, at that point. The work has been thoroughly done by Mr. Thos. Burton, agreeably with his contract, and the sum stipulated has been paid in full; yet the sum required for the work so far exceeded his estimates, that all compensation for personal services has been lost to him; and I would suggest that some provision be made to reimburse him for the amount of loss sustained.

I employed Hon. Parker P. Burleigh as surveyor, with Messrs. John M. Wilson, A. P. Files and Thomas W. Porter, to go upon Township No. 18, Range 3, W. E. L. S., for the purpose of mak-

ing such an examination, survey and allotment as would accomplish the objects contemplated in "Resolve authorizing the Land Agent to examine into the situation of the land occupied by settlers in Township 18, Range 3." The work is incomplete, yet so nearly done as to furnish sufficient data to determine an equitable exchange with the proprietors for their moiety of land in the township.

The sum of \$15,505.30 has been paid into the State Treasury, and the schedules annexed will exhibit the objects to which all sums have been applied during the year.

In common with other sections of the State, Aroostook County has contributed liberally of her material in men to fill her quotas in answer to calls for the national armies. And while no murmurings have been heard in the performance of this patriotic duty, yet there is a limit, beyond which the material interests of that section may suffer depletion, and cause some reaction against the wise and beneficent policy which has been pursued by the State.

It will be borne in mind that for a series of years the legislation of the State has been characterized with singular liberality in stimulating a large emigration towards our northern border, and the statistics of the county demonstrate the fact that the response has been commensurate to the generous proffers made, yet if labor shall continue to be withdrawn, the duty of exercising its wisdom may yet be devolved upon the Legislature to save to the State the advantages growing out of measures previously adopted.

The importance of keeping the lines of communication open to the St. John River through the settlements located upon the eastern and western sections of the first five ranges of townships in the county of Aroostook, cannot be overestimated. Proprietors and the State own alternately the townships upon parts of both routes, and in so far as they should the proprietors have not declined to unite with the State for the purpose of keeping the roads in good repair where the public travel requires it to be done.

Some portions of the timber lands lying within the easterly ranges were visited by fire during the summer of the present year, but I have not learned that the public land belonging to the State suffered material damage. But the inhabitants residing in the town of Washburn and upon Township B, Range 1, called "Alva," have suffered great losses. Mills, dwellings, barns, crops and fences have been swept away.

At the moment of most imminent peril, when the angry and red-dened element was darting his forked tongue through the timber forest, when all human agencies were becoming impotent, a merciful Providence interposed; the gentle rains descended; silently and quickly the danger passed, bringing gladness to many hearts and relief from impending destruction.

My immediate predecessor in this office, the Hon. Hiram Chapman, who had received an unanimous réélection for a second term, was, after a brief illness, removed from his earthly labors on the morning of the 15th of March last, and in passing it is sufficient only to add that in his rule of action in life was exemplified a fidelity and faithfulness in the discharge of official duties, worthy of emulation by others assuming similar trusts.
