IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
SIXTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and sixty-four of the public laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, entitled an act requiring the secretary of state to furnish the clerks of courts in the several counties a list of all persons commissioned and qualified as justices of the peace and quorum, trial justices, and notaries public.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section one of chapter two hundred and sixty-four of  
2 the public laws of the year one thousand eight hundred  
3 and sixty-four is hereby amended, by inserting after  
4 the word "counties" in the second line, the words  
5 "and to the clerks of the United States courts in this

6 state," so that the first sentence of said section as  
7 amended will read as follows :

8 SECT. 1. The secretary of state shall, on or before  
9 the first day of June next, forward to the clerks of  
10 courts in the several counties and to the clerks of the  
11 United States courts in this state, a list of all justices  
12 of the peace, justices of the peace and quorum, trial  
13 justices and notaries public in this state, whose com-  
14 missions shall then be in force, and the evidence of  
15 whose qualifications has been filed in his office.
