STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes, relating to auctions and auctioneers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The aldermen of any city, and the 2 selectmen of any town, may license any person or 3 persons to be auctioneers for one year in such city or 4 town, and may exempt them from any liability to 5 deduct two and one half per cent. from the gross 6 amount of the sales for the use of the city or town 7 where the sale is made, when the goods sold by such 8 auctioneers belong to, or are sold for, the benefit of 9 parties residing out of the state.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent 2 with this act are hereby repealed.
