STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter forty-four of the revised statutes relative to hawkers and pedlers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The second section of the forty-fourth chapter of the 2 revised statutes is hereby amended so as to read as 3 follows, viz. :

4 SECT. 2. The county commissioners in their counties
5 may license, for the purposes aforesaid, any person ap-
6 plying who proves to their satisfaction that he sustains
7 a good moral character ; has been five years a citizen
8 of the United States, and the year next preceding his
9 application, a resident of this state ; and such licenses

10 shall expire in one year from their date ; shall not be
11 transferred or assigned without the consent of the
12 board granting the same, and shall not be valid in any
13 other county than that in which it was granted ;
14 and the applicants shall pay therefor to the county for
15 which each license is granted, if they are to travel on
16 foot or in any boat or water craft, ten dollars ; with a
17 carriage drawn by one animal, fifteen dollars ; and
18 drawn by two animals, twenty dollars ; and shall pre-
19 sent to the commissioners with their application, a cer-
20 tificate of good moral character from the municipal
21 officers of the town where they reside, which shall be
22 attached to their license.
