STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE.

AN ACT amendatory of chapter eleventh of the revised statutes, relating to education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Every town shall raise and expend,
- 2 annually, for the support of schools therein, a sum of
- 3 money, exclusive of the income of any corporate
- 4 school fund, or of any grant from the revenue or funds
- 5 from the state, or of any voluntary donation, devise or
- 6 bequest, or of any forfeiture accruing to the use of
- 7 schools, not less than seventy-five cents for each
- 8 inhabitant, according to the census of the state, by
- 9 which representatives to the legislature were last ap-
- 10 portioned.

- SECT. 2. No town which neglects to raise the 2 amount of money required to be raised by section one 3 of this act shall, during the year in which such neglect 4 occurs, receive any part of the state school fund 5 required to be apportioned to the several towns by the 6 treasurer of state.
- SECT. 3. Each school agent shall return to the 2 superintending school committee, in the month of 3 April, annually, a certified list of the names and ages 4 of all persons in his district from four to twenty-one 5 years, as they existed on the first day of said month, 6 leaving out of said enumeration all persons coming 7 from other places to attend any college or academy, or 8 to labor in any factory or at any manufacturing or 9 other business.
- SECT. 4. If any school agent neglects to return the 2 scholars of his district, as provided in section three of 3 this act, the superintending school committee shall 4 immediately make such enumeration in such district, 5 and be paid a reasonable sum for the service, and the 6 sum thus paid shall be taken from the amount to be 7 apportioned to the district of such delinquent agent.
- Sect. 5. The superintending school committee shall 2 return to the assessors, on or before the fifteenth day 3 of May, annually, the number of scholars in each

- 4 school district, according to the enumeration provided
- 5 for in sections three and four of this act.
 - Sect. 6. Any school district maintaining graded
- 2 schools may raise, for the support of schools therein,
- 3 a sum of money not exceeding that which it receives
- 4 from the town in addition thereto.
 - Sect. 7. This act repeals all acts and parts of acts
- 2 inconsistent with it, and shall be in force when ap-
- 3 proved.
