STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE.

AN ACT to simplify indictments in capital cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. In any indictment for murder or man-
- 2 slaughter, it shall not be necessary to set forth the
- 3 manner in which or the means by which the death of
- 4 the deceased was caused, but it shall be sufficient in
- 5 every indictment for murder to charge that the defend-
- 6 ant did feloniously, wilfully, and of his malice afore-
- 7 thought, kill and murder the deceased; and it shall
- 8 be sufficient in every indictment for manslaughter to
- 9 charge that the defendant did feloniously kill and slay 10 the deceased.
- Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
