The public debt of the State of Maine on the first day of January 1873, was \$7,187,900, and has been reduced during the year by the payment of \$49,000 of the debt falling due March 1, 1873, (a bond for \$1,000 is now due and uncalled for) and by a charge of \$500 to the sinking fund of 1868, by order of the governor and council under authority granted them by resolve of February 6, 1867, said amount being for bond No. 453 for \$300, and bonds No. 713 and 714 for \$100 each of the loan of October 1, 1869, burnt at the fire in Boston, November 9, 1872—leaving the amount of the public debt January 1, 1874, \$7,138,400, and deducting the sinking funds (\$1,255,746) held for the payment of the same, the debt will be represented by the sum of \$5,882,654. A tabular statement of the public debt is herewith annexed.

During the year 1873, coupon bonds to the amount of \$343,000 have been received and cancelled, and a like amount of registered bonds issued therefor—and registered bonds to the amount of \$77,000 have been assigned and surrendered by the holders, and a like amount re-issued to other parties.

On the first day of January 1874, the public debt of this State will be in the form of \$1,904,000 registered and \$5,234,400 coupon bonds—aggregating \$7,138,400.

That portion of the public debt that became due in 1873, amounting to the sum of \$50,000 was paid at maturity, with the exception of \$1,000 uncalled for. All of the debt paid in 1873, was for a portion of the debt created in 1840 and renewed in 1856.

The sum of \$50,000 of the debt of this State will fall due March 1, 1874, and will be met from the current funds of the treasury.

On the 8th day of January 1873, the committee appointed for settlement of the accounts of the State Treasurer for 1872, after examining and finding them correct, and making record thereof in the treasurer's office, destroyed by burning all the bonds and coupons redeemed during the year 1872, amounting to the sum of \$432,998.00, viz :

In bonds..... \$46,000 00
 And in coupons..... 348,698 00

being the whole amount of interest paid in 1872, exclusive of \$38,300 paid on registered bonds; and the same committee on the 16th day of January, after examining and finding them correct, destroyed by burning all the bonds and coupons thereto attached, that had been converted into registered bonds during the year preceding, amounting to \$354,000, together with registered bonds received by the treasurer for re-issue to other parties amounting to \$38,000—and due record was made thereof.

The school fund for the year 1873, arising from the interest on the permanent school fund (\$19,156.37) and the semi-annual tax on savings banks due November 2, 1872, (\$62,432.69) and May 3, 1873, (\$68,863.13) amounting to the sum of \$150,452.19, was apportioned as required by law to the several cities, towns and plantations in this State, as designated in the following schedule. There is also included in the same schedule the apportionment of the school mill fund for January 1, 1874, accruing from taxation, as provided in an act approved February 27, 1872, amounting to the sum of \$224,157.32.

If there are no extraordinary appropriations made by the legislature the Treasurer would recommend a reduction of the State tax of 1874 to four and one half mills on the dollar of the State valuation. It was five mills on the dollar for 1873.
