### Reduction of Sinking Fund.

On December 31, 1886, the amount of securities and cash in the sinking fund was \$2,110,390.57, while on December 31, 1887, it was \$949,660.64, and, in explanation of this reduction, I would state that on February 26, 1887, in accordance with that portion of section 5, chapter 43, Public Laws, 1887, which reads "The Treasurer of State is hereby authorized and directed to cancel all State of Maine bonds now in the sinking fund, or such as may hereafter be purchased

for the State," I cancelled all the State of Maine securities in the sinking fund amounting to \$1,162,000.00 as shown on preceding pages leaving in the sinking fund \$948,390.57, invested in securities outside the State of Maine. During the year 1887, the sinking fund received for interest on this sum, \$39,750.00 of which amount I used \$38,479.93 in the purchase of \$36 000.00 State of Maine bonds, which were also cancelled and deducted from the bonded debt of the State. These figures show an unexpended balance on the interest received by the sinking fund during the year 1887 of \$1,270.07 which added to the amount left in the sinking fund February 26, 1887 (\$948,390.57) gives \$949,660.64, the present condition of said fund. In brief, while the amount with which to pay the bonded debt has decreased \$1,160,729 93, the bonded debt has been diminished \$1,198,000.00, showing a net reduction during the year of \$37,270.07. This amount may seem small when compared with the reduction in 1886, which was \$209,112.16. But the larger part of that reduction was made by paying from the State Treasury for bonds falling due in 1885 and 1886, \$59,000 00.

Amount appropriated by Legislature in 1885, \$80,479.95.

Interest on Maine bonds in sinking fund, \$66,600.00.

While in 1887, the law only allows the interest received by the sinking fund from bonds other than the State of Maine to be credited to it.

By this change in the law, the decrease in the bonded debt during the past year shows a falling off of \$171,842.09 as compared with 1886, but the change in the law also allowed a reduction of one mill on the dollar in the rate of taxation making a reduction of \$236,902.07 in the amount assessed the taxpayers of the State in 1887 as compared with the previous year.

### Relative to Payment of Bonded Debt.

In order to be preparing for the payment of the bonded debt which becomes due next year, and to relieve the taxpayers from paying interest on State of Maine bonds owned by the State and forming part of the sinking fund, the Legislature of 1887 passed an act entitled "An Act to renew a portion of the public debt and to limit the operation of the Sinking Fund," which reads as follows :

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. For the purpose of renewing and extending such portions of the bonded indebtedness of this state as mature and may be outstanding on the first day of October, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and for paying the temporary loan authorized by section two of this act, the treasurer of state is hereby authorized to issue new bonds in sums of not less than one hundred dollars each, with coupons attached for the payment of the interest at a rate not to exceed three per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and both principal and interest payable in Boston or at the treasury of Maine. The bonds so issued shall bear date the first day of October, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and be payable to the amount of fifty thousand dollars per annum for twelve years, beginning with the year eighteen hundred and ninety; seventy thousand dollars per annum for ten years, beginning with the year nineteen hundred and two; seventy-eight thousand dollars per annum for ten years, beginning with the year nineteen hundred and twelve, and ninety thousand dollars per annum for eight years, beginning with the year nineteen hundred and twenty-two. In case the balance due on the public debt in eighteen hundred and eighty-nine shall be less than two millions eight hundred thousand dollars, then the division of the yearly payments shall be made by the treasurer for the same period of time, and in the ratio that the foregoing apportionment bears to the true amount of the debt then to be renewed. Each bond so issued shall be signed by the treasurer, countersigned by the Governor and attested by the secretary of state, with the seal of the state, the coupons to be signed by the treasurer only, or the name of the treasurer may be engraved thereon. The treasurer, with the approval of the governor in writing, shall have the right to negotiate the sale of the bonds aforesaid, or may advertise for proposals for the same in such papers as he may deem expedient.

SECT. 2. In order to provide for the payment of that portion of the public debt maturing and remaining unpaid on the first day of June, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, the treasurer of state is hereby authorized to procure, on the faith of the state, a temporary loan or loans sufficient to accomplish that purpose, and he is hereby authorized in behalf the state, to give notes for the same payable within five months with interest, not exceeding four per cent per annum.

SECT. 3. The treasurer of state, with the approval of the governor in writing, is hereby authorized, at any time after the passage of this act, to issue and exchange any of the bonds authorized by section one of this act, for an equal amount of the bonds of the state now outstanding, on such terms as in his judgment, and in the opinion of the governor, shall be advantageous to the state. In case of exchange, the new bonds shall be dated at the time of the surrender of the old, but the interest shall not begin to accrue thereon until the first day of October eighteen hundred and eighty-nine.

SECT. 4. The treasurer of state, with the approval of the governor in writing, is hereby authorized to sell any portion or all of the bonds in the sinking fund exclusive of the state of Maine securities therein, and may apply the proceeds thereof to the purchase of such outstanding bonds of the state as may be obtained, but in both cases at prices, which, in his opinion, and in the judgment of the governor, shall be advantageous to the state.

To carry out the provisions of section 3 of this act, it became necessary to, at once, procure the bonds as described in section 1, and, with the advice and approval of the late Governor Bodwell, I gave the engraving of the same to the American Bank Note Company of New York which for many years had done similar work for the State. Although it was not considered probable that many of these new bonds could be exchanged for the old issue during 1887, I considered it wise to at once signify our readiness to exchange, and, therefore, on May 24, 1887, issued the following notice which was mailed to all known holders of large blocks of Maine bonds, and inserted in the leading daily papers of this State, New York and Boston.

By virtue of the provisions of the 43d chapter of the Public Laws of the State of Maine, approved February 26, 1887, "to renew a portion of the public debt," the undersigned, Treasurer of the State, will at any time after July 1st, 1887, receive proposals at his office in Augusta, from the holders of the State's Bonds maturing June 1, 1889, and October 1, 1889, for an exchange of the same for an equal amount of the new issue of bonds authorized by the act aforesaid, to be delivered at the time of exchange, but to bear interest from October 1, 1889.

The total amount of bonds offered in exchange is two million, eight hundred thousand dollars, payable as follows:

#### **Rate of Taxation.**

The rate of taxation for the years 1885 and 1886 was three and three-quarters mills on the dollar, while for 1887 and 1888 the rate is but two and three-quarters mills on the dollar, one mill of which is returned to the various towns in the State for the benefit of schools.

Notwithstanding this reduced rate of taxation,

# STATE OF MAINE.

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TREASURER'S OFFICE, }  
AUGUSTA, January 20, 1888. }

*To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council:*

The committee appointed by the Governor and Council under authority of section 71, chapter 2, Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer as embodied in his annual report for the year ending December 31, 1887, have carefully examined the books in the office of the State Treasurer, and found them correctly cast and properly vouched.

His statement and account of receipts and expenditures of the public money for said year, as stated in his report, we found to be correct.

The amount of cash on hand at the close of the year was \$312,288.03; of this sum \$305,431.34 was on deposit in sound and reliable banks within the State, and in the Suffolk National Bank, Boston, and \$6,856.69 in the safe in the office of the Treasurer. The State receives interest on its deposits in banks out of the State. The revenue from that source last year amounted to the sum of \$1,560.63.

The committee, in compliance with law, destroyed by burning, in the presence of the Treasurer, all coupons paid by the State Treasurer, on account of the public debt, during the year 1887, amounting to the sum \$145,512.00, as charged on his books, exclusive of \$95,040.00 interest paid on registered bonds, vouchers for which were on file in his office.



The committee also destroyed, in a like manner, all bonds and coupons thereto attached that were converted into registered bonds by the State Treasurer during the year, amounting to \$146,000.00, together with registered bonds received by him for re-issue, amounting to \$30,000.00.

The sinking fund account as represented on the State Treasurer's books January 1, 1887, amounted to \$2,110,-390.57. Chapter 43, sections 5 and 6, Laws of 1887, limits the operation of the sinking fund, and requires that all State of Maine bonds held therein, as an investment, shall be cancelled by the State Treasurer, and destroyed, in the presence of the committee appointed by the Governor and Council to examine the Treasurer's accounts for 1887. In compliance with section 5 of said act, all State of Maine bonds held as investment by the sinking fund, amounting to the sum of \$1,162,000.00 were destroyed by burning in the presence of the Committee; a record of the number and amount of each bond destroyed is filed in the Treasurer's office.

The Committee also destroyed in a like manner State of Maine bonds purchased during the year 1887, amounting to the sum of \$36,000.00; a record of the same and the number and amount of each bond is filed in the Treasurer's office.

The securities outside of the State, remaining in the sinking fund, amounting to the sum of \$949,660.64, were examined and found to agree with the Treasurer's statement of that fund.

The Committee find in the hands of the State Treasurer, trust funds deposited by the Union Mutual Life Insurance Company, as required by chapter 49, section 57, Revised Statutes, for the benefit of all policy holders in said Company, amounting to the sum of \$100,000.00, and the same is invested in United States and city of Portland registered bonds.

They also find in charge of the State Treasurer, trust funds held for the benefit of the "Agricultural College" amounting to the sum of \$118,300.00, invested in State of Maine bonds.

The following Associations, in conformity to law, have deposited with the State Treasurer, for the benefit of their

certificate holders, the sum of \$38,405.61, divided as follows, viz: Maine Benefit Association, \$26,967.21; Provident Aid Association, \$9,303.40; Maine Mutual Accident Association, \$2,000.00; Dirigo Mutual Accident Association, \$135.00. The securities of each, on deposit, were examined and found to agree, in character and amount, as shown by the State Treasurer in his report.

The present efficient Treasurer has, during the past three years, made several valuable changes in the books of his office, and in the mode of keeping the accounts of his department, which greatly assists the examining committee in their work.

All papers and vouchers pertaining to the business of the office were properly filed and numbered.

The Committee, in the discharge of their official work, acknowledge valuable aid from the State Treasurer, and from his competent clerks.
