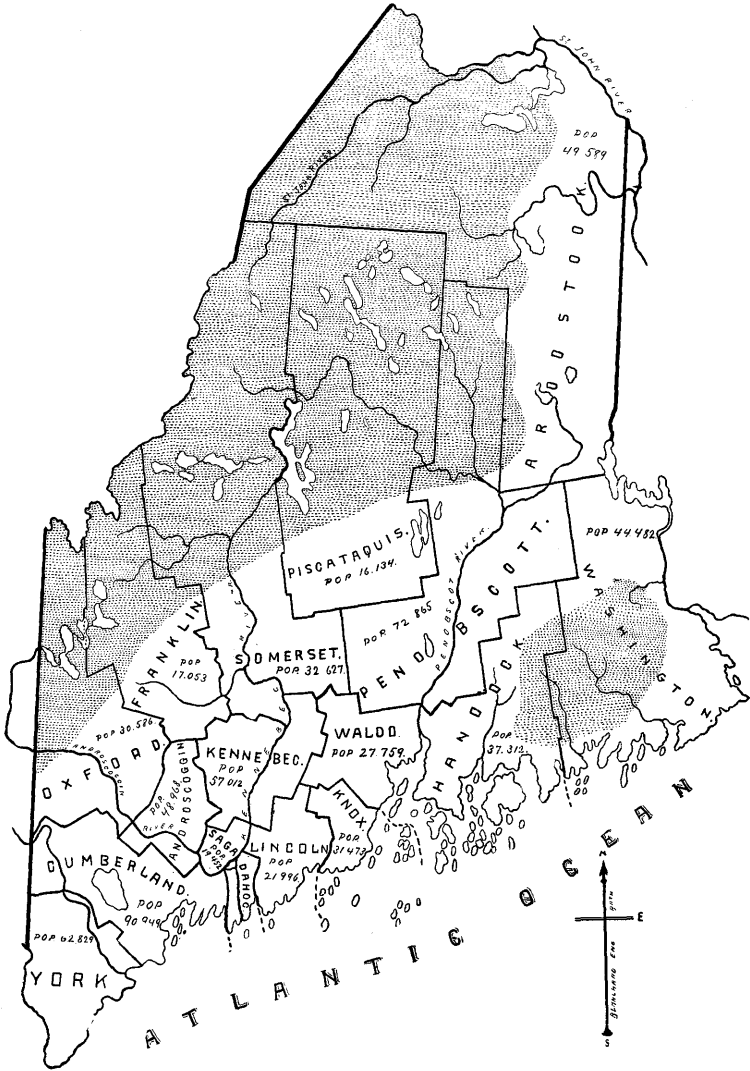

## REGISTRATION REPORT, 1895.

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This, the fourth report of the Department of Vital Statistics, gives the results of the registration of the births, marriages, divorces, and deaths in Maine during the year 1895. Many of the figures herein presented are very satisfactory when compared with those of the three preceding years, and with those exhibited by the reports of our other states in which a trustworthy system exists for the registration of vital statistics. In our first registration year, 1892, an exceptionally high death-rate was due to the epidemic prevalence of influenza. Since then the total number of deaths in the State and the death-rate have steadily diminished. In 1892, the number of deaths was 12,147; in 1893, 11,134; in 1894, 11,012, and in 1895, 10,464. The death-rate for the four years has been, respectively, 18.37, 16.84, 16.66 and 15.83. There were, therefore, in 1895, 548 fewer deaths than in 1894, 670 fewer than in 1893, and 1,683 fewer than in 1892. It is to be hoped that the death-rate of 1895 indicates more nearly than that of any preceding year the normal death-rate of the State, or the mean death-rate in the absence of unusual epidemic influences.

The number of births registered in 1895 is larger than that in any previous year,—it was larger than that of the preceding year by 822, while the birth-rate was 22.33 as compared with 21.09 in 1894. In the three years 1892-94, the greatest variation in any one year from the average number for those three years was only 111. The considerable increase in the number of births is undoubtedly due in some measure to the greater care on the part of town clerks to make their records as complete as possible.

The marriage-rate of the State has varied but little in the four years 1892-95. It has been, respectively, 8.56, 8.76, 8.46, and 8.67.

The number of divorces decreed in 1895 was 681, which, in proportion to the number of marriages solemnized during the same year, is larger than in any of the other New England States.

**Population.**—The population of the State of Maine in 1890 was, as given by the eleventh census, 661,086. In 1880, the population of the State was 648,936. There was, therefore, a gain of 12,150 in the decade between the last two census enumerations. The following table exhibits the population of the several counties in 1880 and in 1890, and the gain or loss in each :

**Density of Population.**—Table No. 2 shows the comparative density of the population in the several New England States at the last two census enumerations. The extremes of density were in Maine and Rhode Island, there being in 1890, 22.1 persons per square mile in Maine, and 318.4 per square mile in Rhode Island.

Total area 66,465 miles, of which 4,460 or 6.7 per cent is water.

In our own State, as is shown in the map which accompanies this report, a large part of some of the counties is unsettled and covered with forest. This timbered region is represented by the shaded portion of the map. It results, therefore, that the degree of density differs quite widely in the different counties. The following is a tabular statement of the comparative density of the population in the several counties :

**Birth, Marriage, and Death Rates.**—In this report the birth-rates, marriage-rates, and death-rates from all causes, are stated as so many among each 1,000 of the population as shown by the census of 1890.

Death-rates from individual causes, or from groups of diseases are expressed as per 10,000.

**Relation of Births to Deaths.**—As the total number of births registered in Maine in the year 1895 was 14,762 and the number of deaths was 10,464, the natural increase of births over deaths was 4,298.

The following table shows the number of births and deaths in each county, and the preponderance of births over deaths. In none of the preceding registration years has the number of births been greater than the number of deaths in every county in the State.

## NOTES ON BIRTHS.

In the year 1895, 15,430 births were registered in the State, including still-births (14,028 in 1892, 14,604 in 1893, and 14,607 in 1894).

The number of living children born was 14,762, and the number of still-births was 668.

Of the whole number of living children of which the sex was certified, 7,602 were males and 7,144 were females. In 16 births, the sex was not stated. For each 100 girls born there were 106.4 boys (106.7 in 1892, 107.4 in 1893, and 104.7 in 1894).

**Birth-Rate.**—The birth-rate of living children for the State was 22.23 for each 1,000 of population, using the figures as given in the census returns for 1890 as the basis of calculation.

Table No. 13 shows the number of births in each city with the birth-rate of each. The average birth-rate in the cities per 1,000 of population was 23.94 as compared with 21.65, the birth-rate of the rest of the State.

The birth-rate of the different counties varied widely. It was the highest in Aroostook, 39.56, and the lowest in Waldo, 14.84. In four counties, Aroostook, Androscoggin, Cumberland, and York, the birth-rate was above that of the whole State. The birth-rate in each county is shown in Tables No. 4 and No. 8.

For the purpose of comparison it may be stated that in 1895 the birth-rate in New Hampshire was 21.08; in Vermont, 21.18; in Massachusetts, 27.02; in Rhode Island, 25.68; and in Connecticut, 24.41.

**Parentage.**—Of the total births in the State, 63.05 per cent. were of native parents; 20.17 per cent. were of foreign parentage; 15.32 per cent. were of parents, one of whom was foreign; while of 1.46 per cent. the nationality was not stated.

Lincoln county, as in each of the previous years, had the largest percentage of native-born parents, to wit, 92.82 per cent. Waldo followed with 91.02 per cent. of native parentage, and only 0.97 per cent. in which both parents were foreign-born.

In Hancock county, in 87.47 per cent. of the births, the parents were native-born.

In Franklin, the percentage was 81.22, and in Oxford, 81.47.

Low percentages of native-born parents were shown in Androscoggin county, where, in 38.10 per cent. of the births, the parents were native-born, and 47.43 per cent. were foreign-born; and in York county with 53.05 per cent., and in Aroostook with 51.44 per cent. of the parents native-born.

The percentages of parentage, whether American-born or foreign-born, may be found for the other counties in Table No. 14.

Comparing the percentage of the births in our twenty cities with that of the rest of the State, we find that, in the cities, 41.69 per cent. of the births were of American parentage, while in the rural

parts of the State, the percentage of American-born children was 73.01.

The largest percentage of foreign-born parents was in Biddeford, 68.05, and in Lewiston, 66.93 per cent.

The lowest percentage of foreign-born parents was again in Belfast where no birth was reported in which both parents were foreign, while in Ellsworth only 1.59 per cent., and in Rockland 8.51 per cent. of the births had both parents foreign-born. For further comparisons see Table No. 15.

Comparing the statistics of the other New England States with our 63.05 per cent. of American-born parents, we find that in 1895, in Vermont 78.93 per cent. of the births were of American-born parents; in Massachusetts, 32.45 per cent.; in Rhode Island, 33.31 per cent.; and in Connecticut, 41.4 per cent.

**Seasons and Births.**—The largest number of births in any one month in 1895 was 1,329 in March; the smallest was 1,115 in November; the largest quarterly total was 3,835 in the third quarter; the smallest, 3,497 in the last quarter.

The following is a tabular statement of the number of births in each quarter of each of the four years 1892-95:

The three consecutive months in which the largest number of births occurred were March, April, and May, 3,924.

**Twin Births.**—In 1895, 165 twin births occurred; in 61 instances the twins were both boys; in 49, both girls; in 54, a boy and a girl. In 95 cases the parentage was American; in 48, foreign; and in 20 instances the parentage was mixed. Of the 330 children, 290 were born alive, and 40 were still-born.

Triplets in Portland and Jonesboro. Other facts may be learned by consulting Tables No. 16 and No. 17.

**Still-Births.**—Of the 668 still-born children, 374 were males, and 272 females. In 22 the sex was not stated. With the exception of 10 still-births, as to which the nativity of the mother was not stated, 472 were of American mothers, and 186 were of foreign mothers.

The largest number of still-births, 110, occurred in Cumberland county; while the minimum number, 14, was reported in Franklin county.

The largest number of still-births, 71, was returned in March; the smallest number was 46 in June and November. See Tables No. 18 and No. 19 for other details.

## NOTES ON MARRIAGES.

The number of marriages registered in the State during the year 1895 was 5,729 (5,726 in 1892, 5,795 in 1893, and 5,594 in 1894). We have, therefore, for the year 1895, a marriage-rate of 17.34 (persons married) to every 1,000 of population, or at the rate of 8.67 marriages per 1,000 persons.

**Marriage-Rates.**—The marriage-rate was higher in Aroostook county than elsewhere in the State, as in the preceding year, it being for that county 21.90 per 1,000. The lowest marriage-rate, that of 11.42 per 1,000, was in Sagadahoc county. See Table No. 4.

Comparing the marriage-rate of Maine, 17.34 per 1,000, with that of the other New England States, we find that for the same year, 1895, it was in New Hampshire 20.52; in Vermont, 16.51; Massachusetts, 18.48; Rhode Island, 18.2; and Connecticut, 16.2.

**Nativity.**—Of the 5,505 records of marriage in which there is a statement of birthplace, in 74 per cent. the groom and bride were both American; in 11 per cent. both were of foreign birth; in 7 per cent. the groom was American and the bride of foreign birth; while in 8 per cent. a foreign groom and American bride were united.

**Seasons.**—The largest number of marriages, 632, was solemnized in October, while the smallest number in any one month, 307, occurred in March. See Table No. 22.

**Ages of the Married.**—The largest number, both of grooms and brides, was between 20 and 25 years of age. While still under 15 years of age, 20 brides were married; in the age-period 15-20 years, there were 204 grooms and 1,632 brides; in the period 20-25 years, 2,052 men and 2,096 women were married; from 25-30, 1,586 men and 933 women; from 30-35, 709 men and 383 women; from 35-40, 414 men and 254 women; from 40-45, 230 men and

141 women; from 45-50, 179 men and 107 women; from 50-55, 113 men and 59 women; from 55-60, 95 men and 33 women; from 60-70, 101 men and 53 women; from 70-80, 38 men and 8 women; over 80, 4 men. See Table No. 24.

In 4,912 marriages the groom was older than the bride; while in 817, the bride was the elder; 952 widowers and 625 widows were remarried; 186 men and 199 women were remarried after having been divorced from a former marriage.

Table No. 25 exhibits the fact that 4,582 men and 4,895 women were married the first time; that 1,018 men and 767 women were married the second time; that 110 men and 51 women were united in a third marriage; while 8 men and 4 women contracted marriage a fourth time. In one marriage in which the bride was 41, it was her fifth marriage.

The oldest groom was 84 years of age, and the oldest bride was 76; in 11 marriages the bride was only 14 years old.

### NOTES ON DIVORCES.

Six hundred and eighty-one divorces were decreed in the year 1895 (552 in 1892, 627 in 1893, and 674 in 1894). In 1895 there was decreed in Maine one divorce for every 8.4 marriages solemnized within the same year; in New Hampshire, one to every 9.8; in Vermont, one to 9.7; in Massachusetts, one to 24.2; in Rhode Island, one to 9.4; in Connecticut, one to 15.8. The divorce-rate is, therefore, greater in Maine than in any other New England State, and much greater than in some of them.

Some of the causes for which divorces were granted are: Adultery, 103, or 15.1 per cent. of the whole number; extreme cruelty, 11, or 1.6 per cent.; desertion, 207, or 30.4 per cent.; intoxication, 62, or 9.1 per cent.; cruel and abusive treatment, 145, or 21.3 per cent.; failure to support, 36, or 5.2 per cent. The other divorces were granted for multiple or associated causes.

The wife was the libellant in 480 divorces, and the husband in 201.

In the divorces granted for adultery, the husband was the libellant 61 times, and the wife 42 times.

On account of extreme cruelty, the wife was the libellant in all of the 11 cases.

For desertion, the husband was the libellant 95 times, and the wife in 112.

For intoxication, the husband was the libellant in 3 cases, and the wife in 59.

For cruel and abusive treatment, the husband was the libellant in 33 instances, and the wife in 112.

For failure to support, the wife was the libellant in the 36 divorces decreed for that cause.

Two divorces were granted before the married life had lasted 6 months; 9, before 1 year; 213, after from 1 to 5 years marriage; 161, after 5 to 10 years; 195, after 10 to 20 years; 68, after 20 to 30 years; and 27, after more than 30 years of married life. Tables No. 26 and 27 may be consulted for more detailed statements.

## NOTES ON DEATH AND THE CAUSES OF DEATH.

**Death-Rates.**—The number of deaths registered in the year 1895 was 10,464 (12,147 in 1892, 11,134 in 1893, and 11,012 in 1894). The number of deaths for this registration year was, therefore, 548 less than that for the year 1894, 670 less than for 1893, and 1,683 less than for 1892. The death-rate for the State for the year 1895 was 15.83 for every 1,000 of population as returned by the census of 1890 (18.37 in 1892, 16.84 in 1893, and 16.66 in 1894). Based on the estimated population of 1895, the death-rate would be slightly lower, 15.67.

By referring to Table No. 4, it will be seen that the death-rate of Piscataquis county was lower than that of any other county, being only 13.14, while the counties Cumberland, Kennebec, Knox, and York show death-rates of 17.91, 17.79, 16.73, and 16.70, respectively.

The death-rate in the cities was 18.36 (20.46 in 1892, 19.89 in 1893, and 19.65 in 1894) as compared with that of the rest of the State with the cities omitted, which death-rate was 14.77 (17.46 in 1892, 15.54 in 1893, and 15.39 in 1894).

**Death-Rates Compared.**—For the year 1895, the death-rate of Maine was 15.83; of New Hampshire, 17.71; of Vermont, 16.51; of Massachusetts, 19.01; of Rhode Island, 19.06; and of Connecticut, 17.8.

**Season and Mortality.**—The largest number of deaths occurred in March, 1,053. In 1894 the largest number was in January, 1,266. The smallest number of deaths in any one month was 715 in June. In the preceding year the smallest number was 761 in November. During the spring months 2,750 deaths occurred; during the summer, 2,456; during the autumn, 2,668; in the winter, 2,585.

Table No. 29 exhibits the total number of deaths which occurred in each month of the four years for which a report has now been made. In 1892 the highest mortality occurred in January; in 1893, in August; in 1894, in January; in 1895, in March. The smallest number of deaths in all four years has been in November. The number of deaths for 1895 in each month by counties is shown in Tables No. 4 and No. 33.

**Sex and Mortality.**—Of the 10,464 decedents, 5,226 were males and 5,228 were females. The sex of 10 was unstated.

Among children dying before they were 5 years old, 1,322 were males and 1,015 were females; there were 307 more deaths among boys under 5 years of age than among girls within the same age-period. On the contrary, at the age-periods from 10 to 50 years there was a preponderance of deaths among females, while there were more deaths among males at the ages from 50 to 80. At the age of 100 years and over, four persons died, two men and two women. See Table No. 33.

**Age and Mortality.**—The following shows the number of deaths which occurred within each age-period, and the relation which the percentage in each period bears to the whole number of deaths:

**The Causes of Death.**—Of the 11,302 deaths, including still-births and premature births, the cause of 10,755 was certified, leaving 547 of which the cause of death was unspecified or so ill-defined as to preclude satisfactory classification.

The following table shows the mortality from ten prominent causes in the four years 1892-95. In 1895, as well as in the two preceding years, diseases of the brain have headed the list, while in each of the four years the next most prominent cause of mortality in the State has been consumption. In 1892, on account of the existing epidemic of influenza, pneumonia was raised to the first place in the list of the causes of death.

By referring to Table No. 30 it will be noticed that the causes of death are arranged under eight "Classes," and that the causes of death in some of the classes are distributed into several "Groups." The following notes on some of the classes and groups of diseases and individual causes of death will be arranged in accordance with the classification shown in this Table 30, and the classification of the causes of death to be found in the latter part of this report.

**Zymotic Diseases.**—The lists of the zymotic diseases usually include small-pox, measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, whooping cough, diphtheria and croup, and the diarrheal diseases. The following table shows the number of deaths that resulted from each of these causes in 1895 in each of the New England States, the total deaths from these causes, and the zymotic death-rates per

10,000 of living population. It will be noted that the zymotic death-rate of Vermont was lower than that for any other of these states, and that the highest rate in 1895 for these diseases was in Massachusetts.

**Infectious Diseases.**—Disregarding influenza, the number of deaths caused by this group of diseases was 684 in 1892, 678 in 1893, 536 in 1894, and 575 in 1895. In 1895 there were, therefore, 39 more deaths from these causes than in the preceding year. By consulting the table which follows it will be seen that the number of deaths from measles, scarlet fever, cerebro-spinal meningitis, and typhoid fever was smaller than in any previous registration year, that from whooping cough the mortality was much greater,

and that the combined mortality from diphtheria and croup was larger than for the two preceding years, but smaller than in the year 1892.

**Small-Pox.**—No death has resulted from this cause in any of the four years covered by the Vital Statistics reports, 1892-95.

**Measles.**—This disease caused the death of 8 persons of whom 4 were males and 4 were females.

Ages: Under 1, 2; 1-5, 5; over 60, 1.

**Scarlet Fever**—The total mortality from this disease was 25 (36 in 1892, 80 in 1893, and 29 in 1894),—13 males and 12 females. The largest number of deaths occurred at the age-period 5-10. The largest monthly number of deaths from this cause was 8 in December. There were 3 deaths in the first quarter, 3 in the second, 7 in the third, and 12 in the last three months of the year. Knox, Penobscot, and York counties each had 4 deaths from scarlet fever; Aroostook and Washington had three each. In six counties no death occurred from scarlet fever. Of the 25 deaths

from this cause, 8 were in the cities. The following is an exhibit of the scarlet fever deaths arranged by counties, months, and age-periods for the three years 1893-95 :

The scarlatinal death-rate per 10,000 for the State was 0.38; for the cities, 0.40. In the same year it was, in New Hampshire, 1.48; in Vermont, 2.04; in Massachusetts, 1.93; in Rhode Island, 2.90; and in Connecticut, 0.79.

**Influenza.**—During the year for which this report is made, 152 deaths were attributed to influenza. By months the percentage distribution of deaths from this cause was as follows: January, 7.2; February, 11.9; March, 28.3; April, 21.7; May, 13.8; June, 2.0; July, 2.6; August, 1.3; September, 5.3; October, 2.6; November, 2.0; December, 1.3. The following shows the age incidence of deaths reported as having occurred from influenza.

**Whooping Cough.**—The number of deaths from whooping cough was 82 (54 in 1892, 51 in 1893, and 20 in 1894),—of which 37 were males and 45 were females. The number of deaths in the cities was 31. Fifty-seven of the 82 deaths from this cause were among infants under 1 year of age.

The death-rate in the State from whooping cough was 1.24 per 10,000; that of the cities, 0.66; of Vermont, 0.97; of Massachusetts, 1.07; of Rhode Island, 1.17; of Connecticut, 1.56.

**Diphtheria.**—There were, for the year 1895, 135 deaths from diphtheria (106 in 1892, 69 in 1893, and 77 in 1894). Of the decedents, 58 were males and 77 were females.

Ages: Under 1, 7; 1-5, 44; 5-10, 45; 10-20, 32; 20-30, 4; 30-40, 1; 40-50, 1; 50-60, 1.

Of the 135 deaths, 57 were in the cities, and 78 in other places. The diphtheria death-rate for the State was 2.04, and for the cities, 2.91.

**Croup.**—The number of deaths referable to this cause was 62 (106 in 1892, 83 in 1893, and 62 in 1894). Of the 62 decedents, 29 were males and 33 females. All were less than 10 years of age.

Ages: Under 1, 20; 1-5, 34; 5-10, 8.

The death-rate for croup was, for the State, 0.94; for the cities, 1.02.

It is now conceded that the two diseases, croup and diphtheria, are etiologically one and the same. The combined death-rate for the two diseases is, for Maine 2.98 per 10,000 of living population; of our cities, 3.93; and in the same year, for New Hampshire, 3.25; Vermont, 2.44; Massachusetts, 7.16; Rhode Island, 9.61; Connecticut, 4.75.

**Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis.**—The number of decedents was 29 (38 in 1892, 30 in 1893, and 34 in 1894), 15 males and 14 females. Eight of these deaths were in the cities. Deaths from this cause occurred in every month; distributed by quarters, they were 8, 8, 6, 7. The death-rate from this disease was 0.44.

**Tetanus.**—This disease was the cause of 10 deaths (7 in 1892, 10 in 1893, and 6 in 1894). The decedents were, males 9, and females 1. All these deaths occurred in the months from May to December,—May, 1; June, 2; August, 1; September, 3; October, 2; December, 1. No county had more than one case.

Ages: Under 1, 1; 5-10, 1; 10-20, 4; 20-30, 1; 50-60, 3.

**Typhoid Fever.**—Including 10 deaths from “gastric fever,” 9 “bilious fever,” 1 “fever,” and 1 from “slow fever,” there were 206 deaths from typhoid fever. Of these, 91 were of males and 115 of females. As indicative to the loss which the State incurs from typhoid fever, it is well to bear in mind that the age distribution of the decedents shows that the deaths from this disease are principally among those active and productive age-periods when human life is of the most value,—73 per cent. died between 10 and 50 years of age.

Ages: Under 1, 2; 1-5, 14; 5-10, 11; 10-20, 43; 20-30, 63; 30-40, 29; 40-50, 15; 50-60, 10; 60-70, 9; 70-80, 7; over 80, 1; not stated, 2.

The largest number of deaths, 35, occurred in September, and the smallest number, 8, in June. By quarters, 44 were in the first quarter, 31 in the second, 58 in the third, and 72 in the last quarter of the year, and 1 not stated.

The typhoid death-rate of 4.44 in the cities is considerably greater than that in the villages and rural towns, which is 2.56. The rate for the State is 3.12. The typhoid death-rate for the same year was, in New Hampshire, 3.76; Vermont, 2.65; Massachusetts, 2.71; Rhode Island, 3.25; Connecticut, 3.17.

**Malarial Diseases.**—Ten deaths were returned as from malarial diseases. The diagnosis in 6 of these was “malarial poisoning;” in 2, “malarial fever;” in 1, “chronic malaria;” and in 1, “the result of fever and ague.” The age of 1 of the decedents was between 30 and 40; 3, between 50 and 60; 3, between 60 and 70; 2, between 70 and 80; and 1, 82. With the exception of one, the decedents were all men. It is stated that 6 of them contracted the disease in the army; that 1, the woman, received the disease in the South; in 1, it is said that it was contracted outside of the State; in 2, “chronic malaria and dropsy caused by malarial poisoning.” There is no statement as to whether the infection was received within or without the State.

In the other New England States, in the same year, the number of deaths attributed to this cause was, in Vermont, 4; Massachusetts, 67; Connecticut, 116; and New Hampshire and Rhode Island, none.

**Tuberculosis.**—Tuberculosis, a communicable and, therefore, a preventable disease, destroys more lives than any other malady. In 1895, it was the cause of 1,397 deaths (1,513 in 1892, 1,446 in 1893, and 1,449 in 1894). The death-rate per 10,000 from this cause was 21.13. The death-rate from tuberculosis in the same year was 19.49 in New Hampshire; 17.48 in Vermont; 29.36 in Massachusetts; 22.48 in Rhode Island; and 20.94 in Connecticut.

Cerebral Tuberculosis (Tubercular Meningitis).—The number of deaths was 82; 36 were of males and 46 of females. The number in the cities was 35. The death-rate for the State was 1.24; for the cities, 1.79.

Ages: Under 1, 23; 1-5, 26; 5-10, 9; 10-20, 11; 20-30, 3; 30-40, 5; 40-50, 2; 50-60, 1; 60-70, 2.

Pulmonary Tuberculosis (Consumption).—From this cause 1,195 deaths were registered in 1895 (1,352 in 1892, 1,299 in 1893, and 1,262 in 1894). There were, therefore, in 1895, 157 fewer deaths than in 1892; 104 fewer than in 1893; and 67 fewer than in 1894.

Ages: Under 1, 15; 1-5, 16; 5-10, 9; 10-20, 158; 20-30, 351; 30-40, 240; 40-50, 117; 50-60, 102; 60-70, 103; 70-80, 66; 80-90, 16; over 90, 1; not stated, 1.

It is thus shown in this report, as it was in the three preceding reports, that the smallest number of deaths occurred at the age-period 5 to 10 years, and that, of the decedents whose ages were given, 81 per cent. died at those ages when their deaths entailed the greatest loss to the State.

As to the sex, 523 of the decedents, or 43.8 per cent., were males; and 672, or 56.2 per cent., were females.

The State's death-rate from consumption was 18.08 in each 10,000 of population; that of the cities, 21.08. Outside of our State, in the same year, the death-rate from consumption was, for Vermont, 15.07; Massachusetts, 21.94; Rhode Island, 22.48; Connecticut, 16.63.

**Tuberculosis Mesenteric.**—There were 31 deaths from this cause, 12 males and 19 females.

Ages: Under 1, 3; 10-20, 3; 20-40, 13; 40-60, 9; over 60, 3.

**Tuberculosis, Other Forms.**—Of these deaths, 89 in all, the cause assigned was, in 66, tuberculosis, general tuberculosis, or acute tuberculosis; in 12, scrofula; in 1, disease of bone; in 5, psoas abscess; in 2, miliary tuberculosis; in 2, tubercular adenitis; and in 1, tuberculosis of kidney.

**Diarrheal Diseases.**—The total number of deaths caused by the diseases under this group was 635 (662 in 1892, 642 in 1893, and 602 in 1894). The death-rate for this group of diseases was 9.60 per 10,000. That of New Hampshire, for the same year, was 13.12; Vermont, 8.15; Massachusetts, 12.60; Rhode Island, 16.11; and Connecticut, 15.33.

**Infantile Diarrhea.**—This, as synonymous with cholera infantum or including it, was the cause of 523 deaths (546 in 1892, 507 in 1893, and 468 in 1894). A reference to the following table will show the number of deaths which occurred in each month, as well as the number in each county, and the county death-rates for this cause. There were in the first quarter of the year but 13 deaths from this cause; in the second quarter, 29; in the third quarter, 392; and in the fourth quarter, 89. The largest number of deaths occurred in August, 162.

Of the children dying from this cause, 55 per cent. were less than 6 months old, and another 33 per cent. were less than 1 year of age, making 88 per cent. of deaths within the first year of age.

Ages: Under 6 months, 287; 6-12 months, 172; 1-2 years, 64.

In the classification of deaths from diarrheal diseases, only the deaths among children 2 years old, or younger, are included under "infantile diarrhea." The deaths from diarrheal diseases, other than those under this cause, were cholera morbus, 25; dysentery, 45; and diarrhea, 42.

Of the 523 deaths from infantile diarrhea, 272 were returned from the cities. This represents an urban death-rate from this cause of 13.78 (15.20 in 1892, 14.33 in 1893, and 13.27 in 1894), which is strongly in contrast with 5.44, the rate for the villages and rural districts (5.33 in 1892, 4.95 in 1893, and 4.47 in 1894).

The death-rate for the State from this affection was 7.91. For the same year it was, in New Hampshire, 10.92; in Vermont, 5.51; in Massachusetts, 9.50; for Rhode Island, 13.00; for Connecticut, 10.89.

**Dietetic Diseases.**—Thirty-five deaths were returned under this class of causes; 16 of malnutrition of infants; 3 of rickets; and 16 of alcoholism. The special death-rate from alcoholism was 0.24. For the same year it was 0.02 in Vermont; 0.71 in Massachusetts; 0.62 in Rhode Island; and 0.66 in Connecticut.

**Constitutional Diseases.**—With tuberculosis transferred to the class of zymotic diseases, there were 666 deaths from constitutional diseases, or a death-rate of 10.07 per 10,000 for the State.

**Rheumatism.**—The returns give 56 deaths from this cause (68 in 1892, 46 in 1893, and 66 in 1894),—24 males and 32 females. Eighteen of these deaths were in the cities. The special death-rate for this disease was, therefore, 0.85, while that in the cities was slightly higher, 0.91. For the same year it was, in Vermont, 0.90; Massachusetts, 0.97; Rhode Island, 0.96; Connecticut, 1.11. The following shows the deaths from this cause arranged by counties, months, and age-groups :

**Cancer.**—From cancer in its various forms and locations there were 480 deaths (404 in 1892, 433 in 1893, and 474 in 1894). Of the decedents, 173 were males and 307 females. The cancer death-rate for the State was, therefore, 7.26. In the same year the death-rate was, in Vermont, 5.93; in Massachusetts, 7.00; in Rhode Island, 6.10; in Connecticut, 5.77.

Distributed as to its more frequent locations, there died of cancer of the stomach 137; of the breast, 62; liver, 42; uterus, 74; abdominal and intestinal, 34; throat, 11; rectum, 11; lip, 6; neck, 3; face, 16; tongue, 4; mouth, 3; jaw, 5; thigh, 2; nose, 3; various, 19; parts unspecified, 48.

**Diabetes.**—The deaths from this cause numbered 77 (55 in 1892, 65 in 1893, and 71 in 1894). The special death-rate from diabetes was, therefore, 1.16 in 1895. Forty-one of the decedents were males and 36 were females.

Ages: 1-5, 3; 5-10, 3; 10-20, 8; 20-30, 7; 30-40, 9; 40-50, 7; 50-60, 5; 60-70, 19; 70-80, 15; over 80, 1.

**Old Age.**—There were registered 579 deaths as due to old age, 238 men and 341 women. Of these decedents, 101 were between 70 and 80 years of age; 352 were from 80 to 90; 119 were from 90 to 100; while 3 were over 100 years old; and the age of 4 was unknown.

From Table No. 33, however, it will be seen that the whole number of persons who died at the ages between 70 and 100 years

or more was 2,897 (3,801 in 1892, 3,147 in 1893, and 3,242) in 1894), or one death in every three and one-half was of a person who was between 70 and 100 years of age or older. Assuming that all these 2,897 died of old age, the death-rate from old age would be 43.82 among every 10,000 living at all ages.

Comparing with other states, we find that, in the same year, the death-rate of old persons (70 years of age and over) was, in Vermont, 51.47; Massachusetts, 34.09; Rhode Island, 31.26; and Connecticut, 37.49.

**Centenarians.**—Among the persons whose decease occurred in 1895, four had reached or exceeded the age of 100 years. Two of these persons were women and two were men. Their names, together with a few facts relating to the life history of each, are as follows :

September 28, Jane Neely died at Portland at the age of 102 years. She was born in Ireland. Her father was Cornelius Kerwin. The maiden name of her mother was Ellen Armstrong.

March 30, Jonathan S. Ellis died in Farmington at the age of 101 years, 7 months, and 20 days. He was born in Nova Scotia.

February 16, Samuel Higgins died in Gorham at the age of 100 years, 9 months, and 5 days. He was born in Gorham. The birthplace of his father and mother was Cape Cod, Massachusetts.

January 24, Rachel Rice died in Waterford at the age of 100 years, 8 months, and 17 days. Waterford was her birthplace.

**Diseases of the Nervous System.**—The number of deaths registered under the causes included in this group was 1,535 (1,459 in 1892, 1,451 in 1893, and 1,543 in 1894), or 23.97 to every 10,000 of population.

In the same year the death-rate from this group of causes was, in Vermont, 38.45; Massachusetts, 24.64; Rhode Island, 20.56; Connecticut, 24.15.

**Inflammation of the Brain or Membranes.**—The number of deaths was 261 (236 in 1892, 263 in 1893, and 286 in 1894),—125 males and 136 females. Of these, 114 were in the cities. The death-rate from the several diseases grouped under this head was 3.95.

Ages: Under 1, 104; 1-5, 61; 5-10, 18; 10-20 13; 20-40, 23; 40-60, 20; over 60, 22.

**Apoplexy.**—From this cause 488 deaths occurred (488 in 1892, 422 in 1893, and 408 in 1894),—267 males and 221 females. Of these, 154 were in the cities. The State's death-rate from apoplexy was, therefore, 7.38; that of the cities, 7.86; that of New Hampshire in the same year, 8.53; Vermont, 4.57; Massachusetts, 7.25; Connecticut, 8.44.

The largest number, 49, occurred in February; the most fatal of the four seasons was the winter, and this is true of the years 1892 and 1893.

In 1894, the greatest mortality from this cause occurred in the spring.

Conversely, the smallest number of deaths, 33, was in April; the smallest number in any one season was 119 in the autumn months. Over 77 per cent. of the deaths were of persons 60 years of age and upward.

**Softening of the Brain.**—From cerebral softening there were 77 deaths,—those of 36 males and 41 females.

Ages: 20-30, 1; 30-40, 6; 40-50, 6; 50-60, 3; 60-70, 13; 70-80, 35; over 80, 13.

**Paralysis.**—Of the 261 deaths from “paralysis,” 106 persons were males and 155 were females.

Ages: Under 1, 3; 1-5, 2; 5-10, 4; 10-20, 1; 20-40, 9; 40-50, 13; 50-60, 21; 60-70, 39; 70-80, 103; over 80, 65; not stated, 1.

**Hemiplegia.**—From this form of paralysis there were 12 deaths reported, eight men and four women.

Ages: 30-40, 1; 50-60, 2; 60-70, 1; 70-80, 6; over 90, 2.

**Epilepsy.**—Twenty-six males and 8 females died of epilepsy, 34 in all.

Ages: under 1, 4; 1-5, 2; 5-10, 2; 20-40, 10; 40-60, 6; over 60, 8; not stated, 2.

**Diseases of the Heart.**—From diseases of the heart, including those from endocarditis, valvular disease of the heart, hypertrophy and dilatation, pericarditis, angina pectoris, and unspecified, there were 948 deaths (816 in 1892, 875 in 1893, and 940 in 1894). The following exhibits the age and sex distribution of each form of disease for the year 1895 :

As may be noted, Knox county had the highest death-rate from diseases of the heart, and Aroostook the lowest. The rate for the State was 14.34; that of New Hampshire for the same year was

18.3; Vermont, 18.54; Massachusetts, 15.07; Rhode Island, 13.90; Connecticut, 12.44.

**Diseases of the Respiratory System.**—Without the inclusion of tuberculosis, 1,165 persons died from the various respiratory diseases, as tabulated on page 101 (1,796 in 1892, 1,407 in 1893, and 1,312 in 1894). From these diseases there were, therefore, 631 fewer deaths than in 1892, 246 fewer than in 1893, and 147 fewer than in 1894. Although 1892, our first registration year, was noted as an influenza year, the falling off in the mortality from the diseases of the respiratory system is very encouraging. Including the deaths from pulmonary tuberculosis, as well as from pneumonia, bronchitis, and the other respiratory diseases, in 1895 the number of deaths was 788 smaller than in 1892, 346 smaller than in 1893, and 214 smaller than in 1894.

The death-rate from the respiratory diseases (excluding pulmonary tuberculosis) in 1895, was 17.62 in each 10,000 of population, as compared with 19.85 in 1894, 21.28 in 1893, and 27.16 in 1892. For the New England States the death-rate from this group of diseases was: Maine, 17.62; New Hampshire, 21.94; Vermont, 17.36; Massachusetts, 27.25; Rhode Island, 26.97; Connecticut, 25.27.

**Pneumonia.**—The number of deaths registered under this cause was 812 (1,431 in 1892, 1,143 in 1893, and 1,023 in 1894), of which 427 were males and 385 were females. The death-rate from this disease was, therefore, 12.28 per 10,000 (21.56 in 1892, 17.27 in 1893, and 15.47 in 1894). As 282 of the deaths occurred in the cities, the urban death-rate was 14.39. For the same year the pneumonia death-rate was, in New Hampshire, 16.97; Vermont, 14.47; Massachusetts, 18.61; Rhode Island, 17.81; Connecticut, 15.78.

**Bronchitis.**—From this cause, including both acute and chronic bronchitis, 225 deaths were registered (287 in 1892, 197 in 1893, and 209 in 1894). Among these decedents, 109 were males and 116 females. Of these 225 deaths, 101 were in the cities. The largest number of deaths in any one month was 43 in March. The smallest number of deaths occurred in August. The largest number of deaths in three consecutive months was 90 in January, February, and March; the smallest number in any three consecutive months was 37 in August, September, and October. The number of deaths by quarters was 90, 55, 38, and 42.

The bronchitis death-rate of the State was 3.40; of the cities, 5-15. For the same year the bronchitis death-rate was, in New Hampshire, 4.97; Vermont, 1.65; Massachusetts, 6.24; Rhode Island, 7.12; Connecticut, 6.60.

The following shows the age distribution of the decedents from this disease; it will be noticed that there was a great fatality at either extreme of life:

**Pleurisy.**—Nineteen deaths were charged to this disease (18 in 1892, 19 in 1893, and 15 in 1894),—8 males and 11 females.

Ages: 1-5, 1; 10-20, 4; 20-30, 2; 30-40, 3; 40-50, 2; 50-60, 1; 60-70, 2; 70-80, 2; 80-90, 2.

**Diseases of the Digestive System.**—The combined mortality from this group of diseases was 693 (659 in 1892, 653 in 1893, and 685 in 1894), or a death-rate of 10.48. The distribution of these under their several causes will be found on page 101.

**Peritonitis.**—There were 125 deaths from this cause (129 in 1892, 151 in 1893, and 137 in 1894),—47 males and 78 females. Forty-six of them were in the cities. The following shows the county, month, and age distribution of the deaths from this cause:

**Appendicitis.**—Of the deaths classified under this cause, 36 in number, 33 were returned as due to “appendicitis,” and 3 to “perityphlitis.” Twenty-four of the decedents were males. The number of deaths in each month was January, 4; February, 1; March, 5; April, 2; May, 1; June, 1; July, 7; August, 3; October, 4; November, 2; December, 6.

Ages: 5-10, 4; 10-20, 5; 20-30, 9; 30-40, 5; 40-50, 5; 50-60, 5; over 70, 3.

**Cirrhosis of the Liver.**—Thirty-three deaths were ascribed to cirrhosis of the liver—those of 20 men and 13 women. Of these 33 deaths, 13 were in the cities, and 20 in the rural parts of the

State. The death-rate of the State from this one cause was 0.50 per 10,000 (0.19 in 1892, 0.18 in 1893, and 0.29 in 1894); that of Connecticut, for the same year, was 0.87. The data for comparison with other places are wanting.

**Diseases of the Urinary System.**—There were 475 deaths referred to the diseases under this group, equivalent to a death-rate of 7.18.

**Nephritis.**—Acute and chronic, caused the death of 90 persons, 55 males and 35 females. The death-rate from nephritis was, therefore, 1.36.

**Bright's Disease.**—This was the cause of 234 deaths (204 in 1892, 217 in 1893, and 219 in 1894),—126 males and 108 females. Of these deaths, 60 were in the cities.

**Childbirth.**—Under the group of accidents and diseases of reproduction, 36 deaths were registered, not including puerperal fever (69 in 1892, 59 in 1893, and 41 in 1894). This is equivalent to a special death-rate of 0.54.

**Accidents.**—From accidents of various kinds, 341 persons met their death (376 in 1892, 330 in 1893, and 286 in 1894). Of

deaths from falls, there were 28; 8 were from a carriage; 1, falling down stairs; 1, falling out of bed; and 1 each from a load of hay, from a ladder, from a ship's mast, roof of court-house; while 14 were unspecified.

Fractures caused 45 deaths,—fracture of skull, 14; of spine, 1; of hip, 10; of thigh, 14; of vertebral column, 3; arm, 1; face, 1; not stated, 1.

Eighteen deaths were from gun or pistol shot; one death was from a cut.

From railway injuries there were 27 deaths.

From burns and scalds, 31 deaths occurred. Three deaths from falling into boiling water; 2 from kerosene lamp explosion; 1 from upsetting lighted oil stove; 1 from lighting a fire with naphtha; 1 fell into a fire; the rest, unspecified.

From poisoning 10 deaths occurred, of which opium was the cause of 4; lead poison, 1; iodine, 1; arsenic, 1; carbolic acid, 1; tobacco, 1; sewer air, 1.

By drowning, 81 lives were lost.

The returns indicate that 3 deaths occurred from machinery accidents. One person was lost at sea.

The death-rate from accidents in this State was 5.16; in Vermont, 6.62; in Massachusetts and Rhode Island, 7.62; in Connecticut, 7.30.

**Homicide.**—Under this group 6 deaths were registered. This is equivalent to a death-rate of 0.10. For homicide, the rate for Massachusetts was 2.91; Rhode Island, 0.15; Connecticut, 0.10. The total number of homicides in New England was 94 (29 in 1893, and 54 in 1894).

**Suicide.**—Within the year, 66 persons took their own lives (59 in 1892, the same number in 1893, and 39 in 1894),—51 males and 15 females. Of the males, the occupation of 19 was farmer; of 6, laborer; 3, millman; 2, railroad hand; 2, truckman; 2, carpenter; 2, grocer; 1, judge of probate; 1, shoemaker; 1, lumberman; 1, blacksmith; 1, surveyor of lumber, 1; student; 1, prison convict; 1, retired soldier; 1, sailor; and in 6, the occupation was not stated.

Of the females, the occupation of 4 was returned as housewife, and 4 as housekeeper; 3, housework; 1, seamstress; 1 dress-maker; 1, mill operative; and 1, pedler.

As to the means employed, 15 committed suicide by hanging ; 15, by shooting ; 7, by drowning ; 10, by cuts ; 10, with poison ; and in 9, the method is not stated.

The youngest suicide was a boy of 14 years, and 10 months ; the oldest, a man of 80 years. The largest number of suicides in any one month was 10 in September. There were 9 in October, and 8 in December. By quarters, the suicides were 11, 20, 15, and 20. The largest number in any one county was 10 in York ; the highest death-rate from suicide was in Knox county. The rate for the State per 10,000 of population was 1.00 ; that of Vermont, in the same year, was 1.02 ; Massachusetts, 1.12 ; Rhode Island, 0.81 ; Connecticut, 1.31.

The death-rate from suicide in some European countries was as follows for the years 1887-91 : Ireland, 0.24 ; Italy, 0.52 ; Scotland, 0.56 ; The Netherlands, 0.58 ; England, 0.80 ; Sweden, 1.19 ; Belgium, 1.22 ; Prussia, 1.97 ; France, 2.18 ; German Empire, 2.46.

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
