

RULES.

Ι.

At the time appointed for the meeting of the board, it shall be the duty of the members to be in their places.

2.

When the board shall have been called to order by the governor, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the secretary of state.

3.

The following standing committees shall be appointed, viz: On warrants; on accounts; on taxation and expenditures; on election returns; on state beneficiaries and pensions; on state prison and pardons; on reform school; on insane hospital; on public lands and buildings; on public instruction; on military affairs; on Indian affairs; on library; on pay roll.

4.

All committees shall be appointed by the governor, and shall consist of three members, unless otherwise ordered.

5.

In case the governor shall be absent at or during the meeting of the board, members shall be called to order by the senior councilor present, who shall act as chairman.

The seats at the council table shall be numbered commencing at the left of the governor's chair, and each councilor shall have and occupy the seat, which in number corresponds to the number of the district which such councilor represents.

6.

In debate upon any question, or in the presentation of any business, the members shall address the governor, standing in their places.

7.

A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

8.

All communications to the two branches of the legislature shall be transmitted by the secretary of state.

9.

The general business of the council may be prepared by the secretary of state, and placed by him in the hands of appropriate committees without formal action of the board. Every member who shall present a petition shall place his name thereon, and a brief statement of its contents.

10.

The yeas and nays shall be called upon the nomination of all officers of important grade. Upon the nomination of state officers, the call shall proceed alphabetically; upon district nominations, with the councilor representing said district and then alphabetically. Yeas and nays shall be called upon any question before the council by request of two members.

II,

The nomination of all officers of important grade shall have consideration in executive session and the council may go into executive session for deliberation at any time. No person other than the secretary of state or his deputy, shall be admitted to the council chamber during executive session, except by vote of the council. The messenger will be in attendance in the ante-chamber to secure the enforcement of this rule.

RULES. 7

12.

All debates or remarks in executive session are understood to be strictly confidential.

13.

When a motion has been made and carried, a motion to reconsider shall only be in order within the seven succeeding days; if seven days shall not intervene before adjournment, then within the first three days after the next meeting of the council.

14.

No member shall absent himself without leave; nor shall leave be asked or granted unless a quorum be still left at the board; and no member absenting himself without leave shall be entitled to pay for the time of his absence.

15.

No member shall act as counsel for any party before a committee of the legislature.

16.

No rule shall be dispensed with, except by the consent of a majority of all the members.

17.

No entry on the appropriation book shall be made, except by, or under the direction of the committee on accounts.

18.

No claim, demand or account rendered against the State shall be made the subject of a council order or report for payment by the chairman of any committee of the council, unless such claim, demand or account is fully itemized as to dates, amounts and subject matter thereof.

COUNCILOR DISTRICTS.

The following arrangement for Councilor Districts, for the ten years ending 1902, was adopted in convention of the members of the two branches of the Legislature of 1891-2.

The county of Cumberland, to constitute the second district.
The counties of Androscoggin, Somerset and Franklin, to constitute the third district.

The counties of Kennebec, Lincoln and Sagadahoc, to constitute the fourth district.

The counties of Hancock, Knox and Waldo, to constitute the fifth district.

The counties of Penobscot and Piscataquis, to constitute the sixth district.

The counties of Aroostook and Washington, to constitute the seventh district.

1 Term 2 3 years. 3 P.L., 4 Chap. 295, 5 1889. THE FACULTY. The faculty consists of the President of the University, Abram W. Harris, Sc. D., LL. D., 24 professors, and 30 other instructors, lecturers, and investigators, making in all 54 persons.

THE UNDERGRADUATE COURSES OF STUDY, leading to degrees are: the Classical, Latin Scientific, General Scientific; the Agricultural, Chemical, Preparatory Medical, Pharmacy (4 years); the Civil, Mechanical, Electrical Engineering.

SHORT COURSES are provided in Agriculture (one year or longer) and in Pharmacy (2 years).

THE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS are: For the Classical Course, English, Latin, Greek, either French or German, Roman and Greek history, plane geometry, and algebra.

For the Latin Scientific Course, the same as for the Classical Course, with the omission of Greek and Greek history.

For the Scientific Course, English, one year's study of a foreign language, either ancient or modern, English, Roman or general history, plane geometry, algebra and two sciences.

For the Agricultural, Chemical, Preparatory Medical and Pharmacy Courses, the same as for the Scientific Course with the omission of history.

For the Engineering Courses, the same as for the Scientific Course with the omission of history, and the addition of solid geometry.

For the Short Course in Pharmacy, English, geography, arithmetic, English grammar, United States history, and algebra through simple equations to the first degree.

The requirements for admission to the Short Course in Agriculture and to special courses are determined after a consideration of each case on its merit.

CERTIFICATES of fitness are accepted, in place of entrance examinations, from graduates of preparatory schools whose courses of study have received the approval of the faculty of the University.

THE EQUIPMENT of the University includes 20 buildings and laboratories for Physics, Biology, Bacteriology, Mineralogy, Photography, Agricultural Chemistry, Instruction in Chemistry, Investigation in Chemistry, Horticulture, Civil Engineering and Electrical Engineering; the Conservatories; the Forcing House, the Dairy; the Farm; the Drawing Rooms; the Shops used for Wood-working, Iron-working, and Filing; the Foundry; the Museum; the Observatory; the Herbarium; the Library.

THE TUITION fee is \$30 a year. The annual expense need not exceed \$230. Scholarships in the form of loans are provided for deserving students, who need aid. Rooms in the dormitories are free.

THE SCHOOL OF LAW, located at Bangor, maintains a three years' course of study leading to the degree of LL. B. Members of the bar, graduates of colleges or approved high schools are admitted without examinations. Others must pass an examination satisfactory to the faculty of the school. The tuition fee is \$60 a year. There are no other charges except the diploma fee of \$10. The Dean of the school is George E. Gardner, M. A., Bangor, Maine.

THE AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION is a department of the University, maintained by the United States government, for the prosecution of investigations in the art of agriculture and the sciences related to it. The State has charged the station with the fertilizer, seed and feed controls and the inspection of dairy apparatus. The director is Chas. D. Woods, B. S., Orono.

PUBLICATIONS. The University publishes an annual report, bulletins, and circulars, and an annual catalogue with full information in regard to the work of the University. The Experiment Station publishes an annual report and bulletins. All publications are sent free on application to the President.

MISCELLANEOUS. Women are admitted to all the courses of the University. Military drill is required of men students. The University is non-sectarian.

The year of the University begins on the third Thursday in September, and ends on the second Wednesday in June. The year is divided into two terms of equal length except for the School of Law, for which it is divided into three terms.

The Maine Industrial School for Girls, as a State institution, was established by an act of the legislature, approved by the governor March 17, 1899. The board of trustees were appointed by the governor May 23, 1899; and assembled for their first meeting and organization on June 3, 1899.

The Maine Industrial School for Girls is not a house of correction, but is designed as a refuge for girls between the ages of six and sixteen years, who, by force of circumstances or associations, are in manifest danger of becoming outcasts of society. It is not a place of punishment, to which its inmates are sent as criminals by criminal process—but a home for the friendless, neglected and vagrant children of the State, where, under the genial influences of kind treatment and physical and moral training, they may be won back to ways of virtue and respectability, and fitted for positions of honorable self-support and lives of usefulness.

RENDITIONS OF FUGITIVES FROM JUSTICE.

RULES OF PRACTICE.

The application for the requisition must be made by the district or prosecuting attorney for the county or district in which the offense was committed, and mus be in duplicate original papers of certified copies thereof.

The following must appear by the certificate of the district or prosecuting attorney.

- (a) The full name of the person for whom extradition is asked, together with the name of the agent proposed, to be properly spelled, in Roman capital letters, for example: JOHN DOE.
- (b) That in his opinion the ends of public justice require that the alleged criminal be brought to this State for trial at the public expense.
- (c) That he believes he has sufficient evidence to secure the conviction of the fugitive.
- (d) That the person named as agent is a proper person, and that he has no private interest in the arrest of the fugitive.
- (e) If there has been any former application for a requisition for the same person growing out of the same transaction, it must be so stated, with an explanation of the reasons for a second request, together with the date of such application, as near as may be.
- (f) If the fugitive is known to be under either civil or criminal arrest in the State or Territory to which he is alleged to have fled, the fact of such arrest and the nature of the proceedings on which it is based must be stated.
- (g) That the application is not made for the purpose of enforcing the collection of a debt, or for any private purpose

whatever, and that if the requisition applied for be granted, the criminal proceedings shall not be used for any of said objects.

- (h) The nature of the crime charged, with a reference, when practicable, to the particular statute defining and punishing the same.
- (i) If the offence charged is not of recent occurrence, a satisfactory reason must be given for the delay in making the application.
- I. In all cases of fraud, false pretences, embezzlement, or forgery when made a crime by the common law, or any penal code or statute, the affidavit of the principal complaining witness or informant that the application is made in good faith, for the sole purpose of punishing the accused, and that he does not desire or expect to use the prosecution for the purpose of collecting a debt, or for any private purpose, and will not directly or indirectly use the same for any of said purposes, shall be required, or a sufficient reason be given for the absence of such affidavit
- 2. Proof by affidavit of facts and circumstances satisfying the Executive that the alleged criminal has fled from the justice of the State, and is in the State on whose Executive the demand is requested to be made, must be given. The fact that the alleged criminal was in the State where the alleged crime was committed at the time of the commission thereof, and is found in the State upon which the requisition was made, shall be sufficient evidence, in the absence of other proof, that he is a fugitive from justice.
- 3. If an indictment has been found, certified copies, in duplicate, must accompany the application.
- 4. If an indictment has not been found by a grand jury the facts and circumstances showing the commission of the crime charged, and that the accused perpetrated the same, must be shown by affidavits taken before a magistrate (a notary public is not a magistrate within the meaning of the statutes), and that a warrant has been issued and duplicate certified copies of the same, together with the returns thereto, if any, must be furnished upon an application.
- 5. The official character of the officer taking the affidavit or depositions and of the officer who issued the warrant must be duly certified.

- 6. Upon the renewal of an application, for example: On the ground that the fugitive has fled to another state not having been found in the State on which the first was granted, new or certified copies or papers in conformity with the above rules must be furnished.
- 7. In the case of any person who has been convicted of any 'crime, and escapes after conviction, or while serving his sentence, the application may be made by the jailor, sheriff, or other officer having him in custody, and shall be accompanied by certified copies of the indictment or information, record of conviction, and sentence, upon which the person is held, with the affidavit of such person having him in custody, showing such escape, with the circumstances attending the same.
- 8. No requisition will be made for the extradition of any fugitive except in compliance with these rules.

PARDONS.

A petition for pardon should be addressed to the Governor and Council. The Secretary of State will issue a notice fixing the time for the hearing by the Governor and Council, and forward the same to the petitioners, in order that they may have the same published two weeks, at their own expense, in some newspaper published in the county where the convict was tried. The petitioners must also give written notice to the County Attorney for the county where the case was tried, stating the pendency of the petition and the time fixed for the hearing; and at the hearing must furnish the Governor and Council with a certified copy of the indictment and record of conviction.
