*To His Excellency, Hon. Llewellyn Powers, Governor, and the  
Honorable Executive Council:*

GENTLEMEN: I herewith present my annual report, as required by the statutes of the State, giving in detail an account of the receipts and expenditures and the financial transactions of this department for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1900.

**BONDED DEBT.**

On the first day of January, 1895, the bonded indebtedness of the State was \$2,403,000.00, and at the present time it is \$2,103,000.00, which shows a reduction of \$300,000.00 in the past six years. During that period, the sum of \$430,140.00 has been paid in interest on this debt, making the aggregate sum of \$730,140.00 paid as interest and toward the liquidation of the bonded indebtedness of the State during my administration of the affairs of this department. The remainder of the debt matures as follows:

\$50,000.00 in the year 1901.

\$70,000.00 annually, 1902 to 1911, both inclusive.

\$78,000.00 annually, 1912 to 1921, both inclusive.

\$38,000.00 annually, 1922 to 1929, both inclusive.

## TEMPORARY LOANS.

January 1, 1900, a temporary loan of \$200,000.00, and a temporary war loan of \$150,000.00, as shown by my report for year 1899, were outstanding. Of the former loan, \$100,000.00 fell due March 2, 1900, and the balance, \$100,000.00 falls due the present year. Of the war loan, \$100,000.00 became due January 23, 1900, and the balance, \$50,000.00 falls due October 19, 1901. The loans falling due the past year were paid at maturity, but the receipts of the treasury not being sufficient to meet them and the current expenses of the State, further temporary loans to the amount of \$200,000.00 were negotiated, \$100,000.00 of which was procured January 23, 1900, and \$100,000.00 March 2, 1900, and the funds were used to meet the payment of said loans falling due on those dates. Therefore, the temporary loans now outstanding are as follows:

## REVENUE AND TAXATION.

The aggregate receipts of this department during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1900, were \$2,014,007.88, which amount increased by \$199,522.16 cash in the treasury on the first day of January, 1900, shows the available cash for the past year to have been \$2,213,530.04, and the amount of disbursements for all purposes was \$2,014,651.03, leaving a cash balance on hand at the close of the year of \$198,879.01, which amount is \$643.15 less than the cash balance on hand at the close of the year 1899.

The actual net disbursements for the years 1899 and 1900 were \$3,748,036.58, and the receipts, \$3,592,191.86, which shows

that the expenditures exceeded the receipts in the past two years by \$155,844.72.

The rate of taxation for the years 1899 and 1900 was two and three-fourths mills on the dollar, yielding a total revenue from this source for the two years of \$1,815,901.96.

All taxes assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1899 have been paid in full.

For your information, I present herewith a table showing the amount of receipts and expenditures of this department and the amount one has exceeded the other for each year since 1894 to the present time, as follows:

The temporary loans are not considered in the above figures; the actual receipts and expenditures only are represented. It will readily be seen, by the above table, that the expenditures for each year, in the past six years, with a single exception, exceeded the receipts; and for the six years, the total expenditures have exceeded the receipts by \$609,316.84. In calling attention to the condition of the financial affairs of the State in 1898, I said in my report for that year: "The condition of the treasury plainly indicates that if the appropriations for the next two years shall equal in amount the appropriations made for the past two years, it will be necessary for the legislature in order to save the State treasurer from embarrassment in the management of the financial affairs of the State, to provide additional revenue from other sources, or to increase the rate of taxation." This statement is

applicable to the financial situation of the State at the present time. If the current expenses of the State are to be met and the outstanding loans liquidated, the legislature must provide additional revenue from some source.

#### TRUST DEPOSITS.

The Maine Benefit Life Association of Auburn, Maine, passed into the hands of receivers on April 21, 1900, the decree of the court appointing Hon. Fremont E. Timberlake of Phillips and Hon. Seth M. Carter of Auburn as receivers, and authorizing them to receive the funds on deposit in this office for the benefit and protection of the policy holders.

Under this order, I delivered to said receivers on June 5, 1900, the following described coupon bonds:

Coupons maturing May 1st and June 1st, amounting to \$700.00, and interest due June 1st on State of Maine registered bond, amounting to \$45.00, were also turned over to said receivers on same date.

STATE HOUSE,

*To His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council of  
the State of Maine:*

The committee appointed under the authority of section 71, chapter 2 of the Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer for the year ending December 31, 1900, would respectfully report that they have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in his report.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year January 1, 1900, was \$199,522.16.

The receipts from various sources for the year 1900 were \$2,014,007.88 making a total of \$2,213,530.04.

The expenditures for the year have been \$2,014,651.03, leaving a balance in treasury on December 31, 1900, of \$198,879.01.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1, 1900, was \$2,153,000 as follows: \$1,884,000 bearing 3 per cent interest, \$150,000 bearing 4 per cent interest, \$118,300 bearing 5 per cent interest, and \$700 due October 1, 1889, not presented for payment.

Of the above bonded indebtedness, \$50,000 has been paid during the year 1900, leaving the amount of the same at the beginning of the fiscal year 1901, \$2,103,000.

The State has a temporary loan outstanding of \$200,000 and an additional temporary loan for war purposes of \$150,000, total \$350,000, which is same in amount as January 1, 1900.

The committee in the presence of the State Treasurer, Hon. F. M. Simpson, destroyed by burning, one note of \$100,000 which

matured January 23, 1900, and was issued for war purposes, also two notes for \$50,000 each, that matured March 2, 1900, together with registered bonds No. 454 for \$33,000, No. 455 for \$17,000, which matured during the year 1900, and registered bonds to the amount of \$180,000, received during year 1900, for which new registered bonds were issued.

All trust deposits, a list of which appears in the treasurer's report, have been verified by the committee.

By constitutional limitation, Hon. F. M. Simpson retires from the office of State Treasurer. His record for the past six years has been that of a most faithful and valuable officer.

The committee express their thanks to the treasurer and efficient clerks for valuable assistance rendered.
