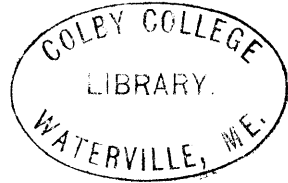

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to lay before you, as required by law, a detailed statement of the transactions of this department during the past fiscal year, and an account of the condition of the State Treasury at the close of business on the 31st day of December, 1901.

TEMPORARY LOANS.

The temporary loans outstanding on January 1, 1901, amounted to the sum of \$350,000, as shown in detail by the following table taken from my predecessor's report of that date:

It will be seen from this table that all the loans matured during the year 1901, but as the receipts of the treasury after paying ordinary expenses, were insufficient to meet the entire amount at maturity, it became necessary to negotiate new loans, and the amounts to meet the notes falling due February 12, 1901, and March 2, 1901, were obtained of the Belfast Savings Bank on one year's time at 3%. One half the amount falling due on July 23, 1901, was paid from the current receipts of the office and money to meet the remaining \$50,000 was obtained from the Rumford Falls Trust Company on one year's time at $3\frac{1}{4}\%$.

The note of \$50,000 falling due October 19, 1901, I was able to pay at maturity from the cash on hand.

A reduction of \$100,000 has therefore been made in the temporary obligations of the State during the past year, the amount now outstanding being \$250,000, placed as follows :

It will also be seen that by authority of chapter 137, resolves of 1901, \$36,000 was paid in redemption of outstanding pledges in favor of the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital.

TRUST DEPOSITS.

Among the securities deposited in this office by the Granite State Provident Association for the benefit and protection of its certificate holders, was a certificate for eleven shares of stock of the Cochecho National Bank of Dover, N. H., which appears in the assets of the company in this office on January 1, 1900, at \$1,100, as shown by the State Treasurer's report of that date. This bank went into the hands of a receiver, and during the year

1900, two dividends, aggregating 30%, were paid to stockholders, and on January 1, 1901, the State Treasurer's report of that date shows this certificate of stock as representing \$770, the \$330 received in dividends, appearing in the cash credit.

Last year a final dividend of 5.6% was declared by the receiver, amounting on the above mentioned certificates, to \$61.60, on payment of which, the certificate of stock was surrendered and the sum of \$708.40 charged as loss to the fund on deposit in this office.

TAXES.

All taxes assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1900, have been paid in full with the single exception of the town of West Bath.

STATE HOUSE,

To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council of the State of Maine:

We, the undersigned, your committee appointed under the provision of section 71, chapter 2, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of State, for the year ending December 31, A. D. 1901, met at the Treasurer's office on the 13th day of January, A. D. 1902, and have been in session every secular day until this date. We would respectfully report that we have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in the printed report of the Treasurer.

A correct voucher is on file for each disbursement. All books, records and accounts of the department are neatly and systematically kept.

The tax imposed by the legislature of 1901, on franchises of corporations, has greatly added to the duties of your committee, and somewhat more time than usual has necessarily been required in the work of examination.

The amount of cash on hand at commencement of the fiscal year 1901, was \$198,879.01. The receipts from various sources for the year 1901, were \$2,392,022.86, making a total of \$2,590,901.87. The expenditures for the year were \$2,293,064.70, leaving a balance of cash on hand, at the close of the fiscal year, ending December 31, 1901, of \$297,837.17. The last item is verified by the statements of the cashiers of the several banks in which money is deposited, and a certificate of the Secretary of State to the amount of cash in the office of the Treasurer January 1, 1902, before the commencement of business on that day.

The bonded indebtedness of the State, January 1, 1902, was \$2,053,000, a reduction of \$50,000 during the fiscal year. Of this indebtedness, \$1,784,000 bears 3% interest; \$150,000 bears 4%; \$118,300 bears 5%, and bonds to the amount of \$700, due Octo-

ber 1, 1889, have never been presented for payment. A temporary loan is outstanding, of \$250,000, as against \$350,000 January 1st of last year. Of the temporary loan outstanding, \$200,000 bears 3% interest and \$50,000 bears 3¼%.

Your committee, in the presence of the Honorable Oramandal Smith, State Treasurer, destroyed by burning, as required by law, the following registered bonds, which matured during the year 1901: No. 385, for \$30,000; No. 479, for \$5,000; No. 480, for \$10,000; No. 503, for \$2,000; No. 505, for \$3,000; a total of \$50,000. Also the following bonds, for which new bonds of like amount have been issued: No. 457, \$50,000; No. 514, \$10,000. We have also destroyed in like manner, four State of Maine notes, aggregating \$350,000, said notes representing the temporary loan outstanding January 1, 1901, which matured during the year. New notes, to the amount of \$250,000 have been issued during the year.

Our certificate, showing the number and amount of each bond and note destroyed, is on file in the office of the State Treasurer.

All trust deposits, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's report, have been examined and verified by the committee.

Your committee desires to express to the State Treasurer and his efficient clerks, Charles B. Caldwell, Daniel W. Emery and Melvin W. Wiswell, its appreciation of courtesies extended during the examination.
