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# REPORT.

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*To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council:*

In compliance with the statute requiring the State Assessors "to make a report annually of their proceedings, and to include therein a tabular statement of all statistics derived from returns of local assessors, with schedules of all corporations on which State taxes were assessed during the year," we submit the following report, it being the twelfth annual report, including the sixth biennial State valuation as made by this board, acting as a board of equalization, and which will be the basis for State and county taxes for the years 1903 and 1904.

The past two years have been of such vast and universal prosperity to the State of Maine as never before known. This is clearly shown by the increase in the population and in the present State valuation as compared with former years.

The increase in number of polls being 4,991, denotes an increase in population of over 20,000.

The total valuation of the State for the year 1902 is, \$352,228,897

The total valuation of the State for the year 1900

This increase is made up as follows, viz.:

In compliance with an order passed by the last legislature requiring this board to carefully investigate the value of the wild lands in this State with a view of bringing the State valuation of the same to a just and full value, we have devoted a large portion of the present year to that work, and as a result of our labors the

value of wild lands, including public lots, has been increased to the extent of \$6,649,021, viz.

Beside this amount of increase, the wild lands have been reduced in Penobscot county by organization of the town of Millinocket \$500,000, and in Aroostook county by Sheridan plantation, now Ashland, \$56,807.

This class of property has advanced in value rapidly during the past two or three years and we believe these lands are to-day worth the valuation we have placed upon them. By comparing the returns of valuations as made by assessors of cities and towns for the years 1900 and 1902, it will be seen that nearly every item or class of property shows an increase.

The returns of local assessors for the present year show an increase in the value of real estate for the two years of \$11,974,568, of personal estate \$1,910,567, a total of \$13,885,135. The returns of real estate no doubt show approximately the actual increase in value, but the returns of personal estate do not. We are not in Maine exempt from the general condition prevailing in nearly every State, which is the apparent inability of assessors to reach all forms of property.

The value of live stock for the two years shows an increase of \$737,863, money at interest \$1,678,438, stock in trade \$637,697, trust companies stock \$66,598, shipping \$114,878, logs and lumber \$364,871, wood and bark \$70,456, musical instruments \$194,021, carriages \$4,026, furniture \$143,040, real estate of railroads \$222,815, of street railroads \$61,600, property exempted from taxation a decrease of \$137,481.

Bank stock shows a decrease of \$472,774, corporation stocks not classified, a decrease of \$82,475. Great credit is due the assessors of cities and towns for the able and efficient aid and work they have given us in the past, and especially is this the case during the last two years.

Their returns for the present year show an aggregate valuation of more than \$5,000,000 nearer the State valuation than before and thus bringing their returns to within less than 5½ per cent of the State valuation—whereas a few years ago it was over 13

per cent below. Aroostook county shows the largest increase in property of any county in the State, viz., \$2,527,758, and its increase in live stock is also the largest being \$234,591 as per assessors returns.

In accordance with order passed by the last legislature we have made a thorough canvass of the State and have secured information and description of 670 bridges of over 50 feet in length, cost, construction, age, etc. A full and complete report of all information we have obtained on this subject will in due season be rendered by this board to the next session of the legislature.

We append herewith all statistics received the present year from the cities, towns and plantations of the State. Also schedules of all corporations on which State taxes were assessed, embracing railroad companies, telephone, telegraph and express companies, savings banks, trust companies and general corporations.

We desire again to express our grateful appreciation of the valuable aid rendered us by State, county and municipal officers.

## TAX SYSTEMS OF OTHER STATES.

This board has been able to give some attention to the act of the legislature of 1901, directing the State Assessors to "investigate and inquire into the system and method of taxation of other states."

After the completion of wild land hearings the present year, a member of the board was delegated to visit as many states as practicable. Fourteen states were visited and we submit a brief outline of the several tax systems as the result of his investigation.

### WISCONSIN.

The state of Wisconsin has a somewhat complex system of taxation. It includes the general ad valorem taxation of property; a system of license fees imposed upon railroads and certain quasi public corporations; and a system of ad valorem taxation imposed by the state taxing board on certain other quasi public corporations. Assessors are required to value land and buildings or improvements separately. All property to be assessed at full value. All tangible personal property as far as practicable to be valued upon actual view, owners of intangible personal estate are required to make sworn lists of same; assessors neglecting to comply with this provision subject to severe penalty. Exemption includes "property of counties and municipalities." The property of railroads, street railroads, express, telegraph and telephone companies is exempt from local assessment, being taxed directly by the state. Property of agricultural societies is exempt. Owners of vessels employed in foreign trade may by the payment, annually, of three cents per ton of net registered tonnage secure exemption from further taxation.

Shares in state or national banks are taxable in the town where the bank is located. Under a peculiar construction of the Wisconsin statutes no deduction is permitted from the value of shares on account of any real estate taxed to the bank. On the other hand by a decision of the supreme court of Wisconsin, shares of banks are properly considered by the owner as debts due or to become due from which he is entitled to deduct any debts he may owe, in listing his property for taxation. Railroads are taxed as follows: On roads earning less than \$2,000 per mile \$5 per

mile and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent on all earnings above \$1,500 per mile. Roads earning between \$2,000 and \$2,500 per mile 3 per cent of gross earnings; between \$2,500 and \$3,000 per mile,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent, and on all roads earning \$3,000 and over per mile the rate is 4 per cent. The Wisconsin law does not provide a rule to ascertain the pro-rata part of interstate earnings and the amount is obtained from statements or returns from the railroad corporations. All railroad taxes for state purposes. Street railroads taxed locally at the rate of 4 per cent on gross earnings where such earnings are equal to \$500,000 per annum, where the receipts are less than this amount the rate is 2 per cent, 9 per cent of such taxes for the state, 3 per cent for county and 88 per cent for city or town where road is located. Telegraph companies are taxed for first wire and poles \$1.00 per mile, second wire 50 cents, third wire 25 cents and for each additional wire 20 cents per mile all for state purposes.

Telephone companies where the gross earnings exceed \$100,000 per annum are taxed 3 per cent on same, on other companies the rate is  $2\frac{1}{4}$  per cent all for state purposes. Fire insurance companies are taxed 2 per cent on business done in the state. In addition the real estate is taxable locally and in cities and villages are liable to additional taxes to maintain fire departments. Life insurance companies organized in the state taxed 3 per cent on gross income from business in the state. Foreign insurance companies and those of other states required to pay a license. There are other minor corporations taxed on a basis somewhat similar. Express, sleeping car, freight line and equipment companies are taxed by a special ad valorem method. Briefly stated, the property including franchises is valued by the state board and taxed at the average rate of property taxation in the state. All for state purposes.

An inheritance tax law was enacted in 1899 applying to estates above \$10,000 but has recently been declared unconstitutional. The court held, that the taxation of estates above that amount and exemption below that amount, created special privileges. A poll tax of \$1.50 is required for highways from male inhabitants between twenty-one and fifty years of age. The average rate of property taxation for all purposes is approximately  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. State tax rate 1.57 mills. One mill of state tax with the interest on the permanent school fund and penal fines are apportioned to

cities and towns for schools on basis of school population. Cities and towns required to raise an equal amount.

A state tax commission was created in 1899, consisting of one commissioner and two assistant commissioners, both political parties represented in membership. They are appointed by the governor, term of office ten years. They are not permitted to hold any other office of profit; engage in any business, or serve on political committees. The salary of the commissioner is \$5,000 and the assistant commissioners each \$4,000 per annum.

Wisconsin has large areas of wild or unimproved land but no unincorporated townships like those in Maine. All such wild land is incorporated and included in the limits of some town. As the territory becomes settled new towns are made by subdivisions of territory. The same condition prevails in Minnesota and Michigan.

#### MINNESOTA.

The system of taxation in Minnesota is in a somewhat confused and unsatisfactory condition, not so much from imperfect laws as from uneven and lax application. The legislature in 1901 authorized the appointment of a special commission to prepare a new tax code for the state. The commissioners were appointed in April, 1901, and with commendable diligence completed their labors and made their report January 10, 1902. The report was accompanied by a comprehensive tax code which after long consideration and discussion by the legislature failed of adoption.

Property of all kinds is valued for assessment on a very low basis. The chairman of the State Board of Equalization is authority for the statement that the average valuation of property on the assessment rolls in this state is not more than one-third of a fair and reasonable value. By a provision of the Minnesota tax laws an exemption of \$100 is allowed of the personal estate of each owner. This exemption as shown on an abstract of the tax rolls of the whole state amounts to a total of \$23,000,000. And this is not all. Personal estate is given to the assessors and listed to several members of a family with the result that the \$100 exemption allowed to each one there is little left upon which to assess a tax.

State and national banks assessed on 50 per cent of par value of stock and surplus. Savings banks not taxed by the state, real

estate of banks taxed locally; deposits taxable to the holder but in fact not generally taxed. The average rate of property taxation for all purposes is 2.71 cents on the dollar. State tax rate for 1901 2.83 mills. One mill of state tax apportioned to cities and towns on basis of average attendance in the public schools. Each school district required to raise not less than 1 mill nor more than 9 mills on the valuation of the property in district for support of schools. No poll tax required in this state. Exemptions from taxation include: Water supply works when owned by a city or town, property of agricultural societies used for exhibition purposes. Property of railroads is exempt from local taxation.

Each town has one assessor chosen by the people. Each county has a board of review of local assessments. The State Board of Equalization consists of the governor, attorney general, state auditor and one member from each of the eighteen judicial districts in the state. Railroads are taxed by the state for the first three years after construction one per cent of gross earnings. For the next seven years two per cent and after that three per cent. Changes in the law for railroad taxation must be submitted to the people and a majority of all votes cast necessary for adoption. An amendment to the law making a uniform rate of four per cent was voted on by the people in November, 1902, but failed of adoption.

Street railroad property is valued by State Board of Equalization and the valuation apportioned to towns where the road is located and taxed locally at municipal rates same as other property.

Property of telegraph companies valued by the state board and assessed by the state at the average rate of taxation in the state.

Telephone companies taxed three per cent on gross earnings. Pullman cars taxed three per cent on gross earnings in the state. No provision for pro rata part of interstate earnings and like the Maine statute of 1901 produces but little revenue.

Express companies are taxed six per cent of gross earnings less amount paid railroads, insurance companies taxed two per cent on gross premiums. Retaliatory provisions same as in most states.

A collateral inheritance law was enacted in 1897 another in 1899 and a third in 1901, all have been declared unconstitutional by the state courts.

## IOWA.

The general assembly of Iowa enacted a code of revenue laws in 1897 which with minor amendments by subsequent legislatures constitutes the tax laws of the state. Assessors are required as far as practicable to visit every owner of taxable property and in his presence make up a list of property on which he is liable to taxation. Owners of property who refuse to assist in making up the list or to make oath to the same guilty on conviction of misdemeanor. The assessors are required to deliver to each person assessed a duplicate of his list as made up. If not satisfied with his assessment the owner may appear before the town board of review which has power to raise or lower any item in the list and there is no appeal from its decision regarding individual assessments. The several assessment rolls of each city and town in each county are transmitted to a board of county supervisors or commissioners which makes an equalization of the property in the several assessment districts.

The county auditor transmits the county equalization to the State Board of Equalization consisting of the governor, secretary of state, treasurer and auditor. This board has authority to revise the work of the county board but generally the work of the county supervisors is approved. By an unexplained provision of the Iowa laws, all property must be listed and valued at its actual value as nearly as can be determined and one-fourth of this value is adopted as the basis of assessment. A poll tax of 50 cents for county purposes and \$2.50 for highways is assessed in this state. Exemptions include the property of a county or municipality if used exclusively for public purposes; sheep and swine under six months of age; all other animals under one year old. Honorably discharged soldiers and sailors or the widows of such are entitled to an exemption not to exceed \$800. This exemption does not however apply where the property owned has an actual value of \$5,000.

Land not exceeding ten acres including all buildings, machinery and personal property employed in manufacture of beet sugar is exempt from taxation. The average rate of property taxation for all purposes was approximately  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent in 1901. The state tax rate was for 1901, 4 mills. No portion of this apportioned for schools. Cities and towns must maintain their



own public schools. Shares in state or national banks are assessed to the owners in the town where the bank is located; deduction is made in value of shares on account of real estate assessed to the bank. No banks, state or savings, taxed directly by the state. By a provision of what is known as the "Tax Ferret Law" the county supervisors are authorized to employ persons to assist assessors in the discovery of property not assessed. By this method of inquisitorial work the amount of intangible personal estate has been largely increased. Persons so employed receive 15 per cent of taxes collected from new property so discovered by them.

All the property of railroad corporations employed in the operation of their business is valued by the State Board of Equalization and the valuation apportioned to the cities and towns where the line is located on the basis of mileage and is taxed locally at municipal rates. Street railroads, when entirely within the limits of any town, assessed locally by the town assessors. Inter-urban roads valued by state board and valuation apportioned to the several towns where line is located. Property of express, telegraph and telephone companies employed in their business valued by state board and valuation apportioned on basis of mileage to towns where line extends.

Shares in loan and building associations taxed locally to the owners. Shares of insurance companies organized in the state are taxable to the owner. In addition companies pay to state one per cent on premiums less amount paid for losses or endowments. Non-resident companies doing business in the state are required to pay  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent on gross premiums received in the state.

The collateral inheritance law of Iowa provides for a tax of 5 per cent on all sums above \$1,000 passing to collateral heirs. County attorneys report to the state treasurer estates liable to this tax in their respective counties and receive as compensation 5 per cent of amount collected.

Iowa is a great state and has a good system of taxation; practically all taxes are apportioned on an ad valorem basis. If this state would abandon the one-fourth of full valuation as a basis of assessment the average tax rate would be surprisingly low. This state is one of the great agricultural states of the union. The valuation of live stock for 1901 is given as \$167,461,261, nearly twelve times that of Maine.

The state auditor of Iowa is a veritable "*Pooh Bah*" being ex officio, insurance commissioner, state bank examiner, loan and building examiner, and commissioner of revenue.

#### ILLINOIS.

Assessors are required to furnish blanks to every property owner for listing personal property. Owners of personal estate liable to taxation are required to make a list in detail and make oath to same. In case of refusal or neglect the assessor must list and value the same according to his best information and add fifty per cent to value so obtained. Every person owning or using a franchise granted by the state must list and value the same as personal estate. Notwithstanding the drastic provisions of the Illinois listing laws much personal property escapes taxation, and the county boards of review, and the State Board of Equalization in the exercise of their duties, are compelled to add to the original figures of the local assessors. The law provides that all property must be listed at full cash value, such as could be obtained at a fair voluntary sale. Of the full valuation thus obtained one-fifth is adopted as the assessed valuation. The result is an appalling tax rate. The average total rate of property taxation in the state in 1901 was \$43.80 on each \$1,000 valuation.

The state tax rate for 1901 was five mills. One and two-tenths mills apportioned for schools, 3 8-10 mills for general state expenses. Bank stock is taxed in town where the bank is located. No deduction from value of shares on account of real estate owned and taxed to the bank. State Board of Equalization has so ruled. A case is pending in the Illinois supreme court involving this question. The courts of Illinois have ruled in case of certain corporations "that the property taxed to the corporations, and shares taxed to owners, are distinct properties for purposes of taxation. The State Board of Equalization consists of one member from each congressional district and the state auditor who is chairman of the board. By an act of the legislature of 1899 cities and villages are authorized to impose a tax of one per cent upon all property within corporate limits for a period not exceeding thirty years, the proceeds to be used solely for the purchase or construction of water works.

The main line of railroads is valued by the State Board of Equalization and the valuation apportioned on basis of mileage and taxed locally, value of buildings and second track apportioned to town where located. Rolling stock and all other property including the franchise apportioned on mileage basis to each city or town. All these items of property assessed at municipal rates. Under its charter the tangible property of the Illinois Central Railroad is exempt from taxation, but by a special statute this railroad company pays to the state seven per cent of its gross earnings. The tangible property of street railways is taxed locally same as other property. Valuation of stock and franchise above value of tangible property assessed in town where general offices are located. Express companies, if Illinois corporations, taxed same as street railways. If non-resident companies only tangible property taxed. Telegraph and telephone companies taxed same as express companies. Insurance companies, if resident corporations, stock valued by state board and taxed on this valuation at municipal rates where general offices are located. If non-resident companies, tangible property assessed where located and in addition two per cent on gross premiums.

No savings bank proper in this state but state banks have a savings department same as trust companies in Maine. No state taxation, deposits taxable to the owner. Private banks assessed at municipal rates where located on net assets. Illinois statutes provide for an inheritance tax law, on estates passing to direct heirs, of one per cent on all above \$20,000. To more distant relatives two per cent on all amounts above \$2,000 to each heir. In other cases three per cent on all estates less than \$10,000. From \$10,000 to \$20,000 four per cent, \$20,000 to \$50,000 five per cent and on all estates above \$50,000 six per cent. Estates of less than \$500 not liable to any tax, devises to any charitable or educational institution exempt from taxation.

It will be observed that in practically all forms of taxation the ad valorem basis is adopted. The revenue laws of this state are brief and concise.

If the full value of property, instead of one-fifth of full value should be adopted as the basis of taxation few states would show so low a tax rate. This state is growing rapidly in population and wealth.

## INDIANA.

In this state each town chooses one assessor for a term of four years ; not eligible for re-election during the following four years. In large towns deputies are appointed to assist in taking inventory. Assessors are required to give bond in the sum of \$3,000 for faithful discharge of duties. By their oath of office they are required to assess all property in their jurisdiction, at what in their judgment it would bring at a fair voluntary sale. The assessor or his deputy is required to call upon each person in his assessment district, who owns taxable property, for a list of all real and personal property. All franchises granted to persons or corporations to be listed and assessed as personal estate. All property must be valued by the assessor as far as practicable upon actual view. In case of refusal or neglect of owner to return list assessor required to make list on best information obtainable and add fifty per cent to it. Any owner of property or any other person required to give evidence refusing to answer proper questions is upon conviction liable to fine or imprisonment. Poll tax of 50 cents for state, 50 cents for schools and additional amount for municipal purposes authorized by law. Among exemptions from taxation are "property of counties or municipalities" and "the property of agricultural societies." There is also an exemption of mortgage indebtedness of \$700 provided the property is valued at twice that amount. This exemption in the whole state amounts to approximately \$30,000,000.

All local assessment rolls are submitted to the county board of review consisting of county assessor, treasurer and auditor. This board has authority to equalize all assessment rolls in their respective counties. Appeals may be made from valuations made by local assessors to the county board, and from equalization made by the county board on any class of property, to the State Board of Equalization, or board of tax commissioners. This board consists of the governor, state auditor, secretary of state and two members appointed by the governor, one from each political party. In this state the governor is elected for a term of four years, and is not eligible for re-election. Indiana has no living ex-governor. There is no state that more fully exemplifies the principle of minority representation. All commissions having custody of public institutions are evenly divided

in membership as possible from both of the two great political parties. The custom is universally commended. The average rate of property taxation in the state for all purposes was in 1901 \$17.00 per thousand dollars valuation. The state tax rate is approximately three mills on the dollar, 11-10 mills apportioned for schools, the remainder for the state expenses. Towns are required to maintain schools six months in the year. The minimum salary of teachers is fixed by law.

It is doubtful if any state has better or more comprehensive corporation laws than Indiana. Railroad corporations are required to make returns in detail to the state auditor. The valuation of main line and rolling stock is fixed by state tax commissioners and apportioned to cities and towns through which the line extends on the basis of mileage. Depots, all buildings, machinery and second track valued and apportioned to cities and towns where property is situated. All the valuations thus apportioned become the basis for local taxation at municipal rates. By a statute of 1901 street railroads are subject to the same provisions. Stock of express, telegraph and telephone companies valued by the state board, and valuation apportioned to cities and towns where the lines extend on basis of mileage and taxed at local rates. Shares in loan and building associations taxable to the owner where he resides. Savings banks taxed upon real estate only; deposits taxable to the owner. Insurance companies pay state tax of three per cent on net receipts. There is no inheritance tax law in this state. It will be observed that practically all taxes in this state are apportioned on an *ad valorem* basis.

#### MICHIGAN.

The constitution of Michigan provides that all assessments shall be at cash value. The statutes of the state provide that all property not expressly exempted by law shall be taxed. The assessing officers must demand from each person who they believe has personal property liable to assessment a complete list of such property. Persons wilfully refusing or neglecting to make out true and correct sworn statements or refusing to answer proper inquiries regarding their property, deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable on conviction by fine or imprisonment. After the assessment is taken it is reviewed by a local

board consisting of the assessor and two members chosen by the people. Among exemptions we note: Real estate owned by a county or municipality and used for public purposes. Property of an agricultural society used for fairs. All property of G. A. R. Posts and other veterans associations and Women's Relief Corps. This state like many others has suffered from undervaluation. A thrifty and prosperous state, increasing rapidly in wealth. Yet in the decade from 1888 to 1898, the assessment rolls showed practically no increase. In fact outside of the city of Detroit there was a loss of \$8,000,000 in valuation in the ten years. Vigorous measures were demanded. In 1899 the legislature passed an act creating a board of state tax commissioners and by subsequent legislation made it ex-officio a board of state assessors, with almost absolute power over the assessment of property throughout the state. After the assessment rolls are made up and confirmed by local boards of review the state board has authority to examine them and upon evidence raise or reduce the valuation of any parcel of property and the taxes must be assessed locally on the values thus fixed. The result of the work of the state board has been that the assessment rolls of the whole state show an increase of \$425,000,000 since the board was established. The state board employs competent men to assist in making investigations regarding valuations of every class of property. Perhaps its most important work has been the valuation of property of railroads and other public service corporations. These corporations heretofore have paid taxes to the state based on earnings, but under the present laws the taxes are to be assessed on the valuation as fixed by the state board at the average rate of property taxation in the state. In the appraisal of railroad property the board employed Prof. Cooley, professor of mechanical engineering in the University of Michigan, with a large number of experts to aid them in ascertaining the cost of reproducing the property and estimating its present value. For the purpose of estimating the intangible or franchise value the board employed Prof. H. C. Adams, professor of political economy in the University of Michigan and statistician of the United States Interstate Commerce Commission. The report of Prof. Adams is an interesting document. Briefly stated, he lays down the rule that "in the long run the true cash value of such property

must be the capitalization of an assured income." His estimate of the intangible value was reached by taking the average earnings for ten years, setting aside from this amount five per cent on the appraisal of the tangible property, and capitalizing the balance on a basis of seven per cent. In the appraisal of other public service corporate property experts were employed to assist the board. All taxes from these sources becomes part of the primary school fund. The average rate of property taxation in the state in 1899 was \$21.165 on each per thousand dollars valuations, and largely through the work of the state tax commissioners the average rate was reduced to \$15.47 in 1900. The members of this board, five in number, are appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate for a term of six years, annual salary \$2,500, with ample provision for clerical assistance and expenses.

The state tax commissioners procure from the registers of deeds in the several counties a record of every mortgage recorded, giving name and residence of mortgagor and mortgagee, with date and amount secured. These reports are made monthly and oftener if required. The state board transmits lists to the assessors of the tax districts where the mortgagees reside where they are assessed, owners having right to deduct any debts they may owe. Such a provision for securing uniformity of assessment surely is not unreasonable so long as the law makes debts due or credits, taxable property. Prior to the work of the state board the amount of mortgage credits taxed in the state was about \$6,000,000. In 1901 the amount assessed was approximately \$55,000,000. Bank stock is assessed to owners in town where bank is located except that owned in same county, which is taxable to owners in the town where they reside. Insurance companies taxed on net assets less assessed valuation of real estate, at municipal rates. Michigan has an inheritance tax law of five per cent above \$500, on property passing to collateral heirs. In the case of direct heirs the exemption is \$5,000 and the rate one per cent. The assessment of poll taxes is optional and they are not generally assessed. The present rate of state taxes on property is one and eight-tenth mills.

Michigan has without doubt one of the most effective tax systems in the country. The wide scope of authority given the

state tax commission, with the active co-operation of local assessors has produced a genuine reform and by the marked reduction of the tax rate has brought relief to all who were paying taxes on all the property they possessed. The tax dodgers are being lined up and made to contribute. The undervalued mining and other corporate properties must henceforth bear their share of public expenses and be taxed on an ad valorem basis same as other property. There is much in the Michigan tax system which other states may properly adopt.

#### MASSACHUSETTS.

The laws of the commonwealth require a poll tax to be assessed on all male inhabitants above the age of twenty years, the only state of which we have knowledge that requires a poll tax of minors. A former statute provided that females of the same age who requested it might be assessed for a poll tax, but by an act of 1901 this provision is omitted. All property liable to taxation unless expressly exempted by law. Assessors are required to assess all property at its fair cash value. Property owners are notified to bring in sworn lists, and there are severe penalties for evasion of taxation. Exemptions include the property of incorporated Grand Army Posts or veteran associations to the amount of \$20,000, while so used. There is exemption of \$500, of property of widow or unmarried woman above the age of twenty-one years; of all persons above the age of seventy-five years, or for any minor whose father is deceased, provided the value of the whole property of such person does not exceed \$1,000. The property of disabled soldiers and sailors or of their wives or widows is exempt to the amount of \$2,000, provided their whole estate does not exceed \$5,000. Bunker Hill monument is specifically exempt. Vessels engaged in foreign trade are exempt provided owners make return of net income of such which is taxable. An important feature of the Massachusetts law is the treatment of mortgaged property. The design of the statute is to secure one tax only on the real estate whether mortgaged or not. But the law applies only to mortgages on taxable real estate. Hence mortgages on real estate exempt by law or on property beyond the state are taxable as personal property or debts due. On taxable real estate



encumbered with a mortgage, either the mortgagor or mortgagee may on request be assessed for separate interest as real estate. The practical result is, however, that property in most cases is assessed to the mortgagor and he pays the tax. A beneficial result of the law has been a reduction in the rates of interest demanded on such loans.

The rate of taxation in this state for local expenses is limited by law,  $10\frac{1}{2}$  mils on the dollar in Boston and 12 mills for the rest of the state.

Massachusetts has unique corporation tax laws. No other state has adopted the precise method of taxing the corporations whose privileges depend on its laws.

The main outline of this plan of taxation is as follows. The real estate and machinery of all corporations situated in the state are assessed by the local assessors and taxes paid to the city or town. The remainder of the value of the property, including the franchise, as indicated by the market value of the outstanding shares above the assessed value of property assessed locally, is taxed by the commonwealth at the approximate average rate of property taxation in the State. This rate in 1901 was \$16.10 per \$1,000 valuation. Street railroads in addition are required to pay tax on gross earnings, the rate from one to three per cent based on average receipts per mile. The greater portion of such taxes received by the state is distributed to cities and towns where shares are owned. Banks are taxed by a method similar in its main features, but with some difference in detail, on account of the need of conforming to the provisions of the federal law regarding national banks. Savings banks are taxed one-half of one per cent on average deposits, less value of real estate mortgage loans and some other minor deductions. Safe deposit, loan and trust companies are taxed on their capital stock under the general corporation law, and are also subject to a separate tax on deposits and trust funds. Insurance companies are taxed on value of shares under general corporation tax law. There are other taxes assessed on certain insurance companies, with retaliatory provisions which may apply to companies of other states. The inheritance law of Massachusetts applies only to collateral heirs on property above \$500, at the rate of five per cent. Property passing to direct heirs, to educational, charitable, and religious institutions, or to a municipality for public use exempt from this tax.

## NEW HAMPSHIRE.

Assessors are required to assess property at its full and true value in money. Polls assessed. This state has perhaps the most rigid provisions for listing of any state. Wilful refusal or neglect to return sworn lists subjects any owner of taxable property to dooming of four times value of property as ascertained by the assessors. It is not strange that such a severe remedy is not generally applied.

Towns are authorized by vote to exempt manufacturing property not exceeding ten years, and all materials used in construction of vessels. They may exempt from taxation all money borrowed from residents by the municipality. There are other liberal exemptions provided, viz: horses and cattle under eighteen months old; sheep and swine under one year. Vessels engaged in foreign trade ten months during the year exempt. The net income, however, of such vessels is taxable.

The average rate of property taxation was in 1901 \$16.90 per \$1,000. State tax rate, two mills on the dollar. The State Board of Equalization consists of four members appointed by the supreme court; equalization made once in four years.

Railroads required to pay a tax upon the actual value of the road, rolling stock and equipments as fixed by the State Board of Equalization at the average rate of property taxation in the state. These taxes are paid to the state, one-fourth of same apportioned to towns through which the line extends, and of the remaining three-fourths, to each town such proportion as the number of shares owned in such town bears to the whole number of shares; the balance of the three-fourths represented by non-resident stock retained by the state.

Telegraph and telephone companies are taxed by the state by the same method as railroads. All taxes retained by the state. National bank stock taxed same as in Maine. Savings banks are required to pay taxes to the state at the rate of three-fourths of one per cent on their interest-bearing deposits; deducting value of real estate and New Hampshire mortgages not yielding over five per cent interest and every guaranty savings bank, trust company, loan and trust company, and loan and banking company divided into shares subject to the same provisions and in addition a tax of one per cent on special deposits and whole capital stock.

Fire insurance companies taxed by the state at rate of one per cent on paid up capital stock.

## VERMONT.

This state has had for more than twenty years a listing law requiring owners of property to make a detailed description of all taxable property and make oath to same. In case of refusal or wilful neglect to return list, the assessor must make up list from best information and double the amount. The law is generally satisfactory. Poll tax of \$2.00 required. All property required to be valued at its just and true value in money. Assessors required to make new valuation of real estate every four years. All deposits in savings banks in excess of \$1,500 liable to municipal taxation. Treasurers of savings banks required to make returns of such amounts to town assessors with name of owners. Towns are authorized to exempt by vote for a period not exceeding ten years, manufacturing property, quarries and mines. Real estate of railroads exempt for eight years after construction.

The average rate of taxation in the state is \$16.00 per \$1,000 valuation. Real estate pays 65 per cent, personal estate 25 per cent and polls 10 per cent of all taxes assessed. Vermont has a state tax commissioner who has charge of corporation taxation, but the state has no method of equalization. Hon. J. E. Cushman, the present tax commissioner, in a recent report to the legislature has recommended the establishment of a board of state assessors similar to that in Maine. The tax commissioner appraises the property of railroads, including the franchise, and a tax of seven-tenths of one per cent is assessed. Railroad companies, however, may in lieu of such taxes pay 2½ per cent of gross earnings, and with few exceptions they pay on this basis. Telephone companies are taxed three per cent on gross earnings from business done in the state. Telegraph companies are taxed for first wire and poles 60 cents per mile and 40 cents per mile for each additional wire. They have the option of paying in lieu of these taxes three per cent on gross earnings in the state. Sleeping cars taxed five per cent on gross earnings in the state. Express companies taxed four per cent on business done in the state.

Steamboat, car and transportation companies taxed seven-tenths of one per cent on appraisal or option of paying two per cent on gross earnings. Insurance companies taxed two per cent on gross premiums. Life companies of Vermont pay in addition one per cent on surplus above necessary reserve. Savings banks are taxed seven-tenths of one per cent on deposits, surplus and undivided profits, deducting from same United States bonds not exceeding ten per cent of assets, real estate and all deposits in excess of \$1,500 which are taxed locally.

Trust companies doing a savings business, subject to same provisions except that real estate is not deducted. All Vermont corporations and all others doing business in the state having capital or deposit of \$50,000 are required to pay a license of \$10 and for each \$50,000 or part thereof additional \$5, no tax however to exceed \$50.

#### NEW YORK.

The most notable tax legislation in recent years, was that enacted by the legislature of the state of New York, in 1899. This act, chap. 712, Public Laws of 1899, enlarged the definition of real estate for purposes of taxation so as to include with the value of tangible property all franchises. We quote from the law: "A franchise, right, authority or permission specified in this division shall for the purposes of taxation be known as a *special franchise*." A special franchise shall be deemed to include the value of the tangible property of a person, copartnership, association or corporation, situated in, upon, under or above any street, highway, public place or public waters in connection with the special franchise. The tangible property so included shall be taxed as a part of the special franchise. No property of a municipal corporation shall be subject to a special franchise tax." This act became effective October 1, 1899. Under the provisions of this act all persons and corporations subject to taxation on a special franchise are required to make a detailed report on blanks furnished to the state tax commissioners, who determine the value of the special franchise, after full opportunity for hearing for parties interested. The several valuations are certified to the cities and towns where property is located and becomes the basis of local taxation. The total valuation of the real estate of the whole state for the following

year 1900 shows an increase of \$281,432,712 over that of 1899. Of this increase \$170,140,857 was secured by including special franchise values as fixed by the state tax commissioners. This somewhat radical but admittedly just legislation aroused strong opposition from parties interested. Much litigation followed and many cases yet remain unsettled. Forty-seven cases were tried and argued before Hon. Robert Earl, ex-chief judge of the court of appeals, who was appointed by the court to act as referee.

The contention was made and argued on the following lines:

First: That the act of 1899 violated the home rule provision of the state constitution of New York. Second: That it was in conflict with the provisions of the federal constitution, forbidding the states to pass any "law impairing the obligation of contracts." Third: That the execution of the statute was impracticable. The contention was stated as follows:

"A special franchise has no ascertainable value beyond the value of the tangible property in connection with it. The right to use the streets cannot be valued. Its value cannot be separated from the value of other property and rights. Hence the act which requires a state board to value each special franchise requires an impossibility and cannot be executed." Upon these forty-seven cases the referee has recently made an elaborate report sustaining the law on every point.

The tax laws of New York do not require owners of property to furnish lists to the assessors for taxation. The assessors of each tax district are required annually to ascertain by "diligent inquiry" all the property and the names of all persons taxable therein. The proportion of personal estate to real is surprisingly low. In the report of the state tax commissioners for 1901 they say:

"The disproportion between the assessment of realty and personalty has advanced from  $7\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 to  $8\frac{1}{2}$  to 1. Retention upon their rolls by local assessors of personal assessments is annually becoming a task more and more difficult of achievement. Neglect or laxity of local assessors is not to be inferred as accounting to a large extent for this condition. Non-residence; deduction for alleged indebtedness; share-holdings in properties supposedly assessed at distant 'home offices'; savings bank sanctuary, and legally exempt securities, are the main avenues through which fugitive personalty takes flight."

The law of this state provides that the assessment rolls shall contain the full value of all taxable property. Notwithstanding this reasonable provision, the State Board of Equalization in 1901 estimated the average local valuation of the whole state to be approximately 70 per cent of full value. Among exemptions in New York we note: "Property of a municipal corporation situate within its limits held for a public use." "The real property of an agricultural society permanently used by it for exhibition grounds." "All vessels registered at any port in the state and owned by an American citizen or by a New York corporation engaged in foreign trade." Stock of banks is valued by adding the amount of capital stock, surplus and undivided profits and dividing the result by the number of shares. Owners of stock are entitled to no reduction in valuation for any reason whatsoever. The special rate of taxation is one per cent on this valuation which is in lieu of all other taxation on the capital stock. Banks are required to collect the taxes and pay the same to the county treasurer and the county supervisors apportion the taxes to the several tax districts where the stock is owned. Real estate of banks taxed locally same as other real estate. Savings banks are taxed by the state one per cent on amount of surplus and undivided earnings. New York has an elaborate system of franchise taxation. Space forbids a description in detail. An organization tax on all corporations organized in the state, a license tax on foreign corporations doing business in the state, an annual franchise tax on corporations, an additional franchise tax on transportation and transmission corporations; on water works, gas, electric, steam heating, lighting and power companies, insurance companies, trust companies and foreign bankers, all for state purposes. The rates are low, but the stupendous extent of corporate investments in this state yields a large revenue. New York has a transfer or inheritance tax law; the rate is five per cent to collateral heirs above the value of \$500. Exception is made in favor of property descending to direct heirs where the tax applies only to personal property above the value of \$10,000, at the rate of one per cent. Property descending to any religious corporation exempt from the provisions of the law. Personal property other than money or securities, passing to charitable, educational, library, patriotic, cemetery or historical purposes, exempt from this tax.

The average rate of property taxation in the state was approximately  $2\frac{1}{4}$  per cent in 1901. The state tax rate for 1902, 13-100 of one mill on a dollar.

## PENNSYLVANIA.

This state has had no revision of its general statutes since 1874 and no compilation of its tax laws is obtainable, so we are unable to give full description of the system of property taxation, which is somewhat unlike that of any other state.

The constitution of Pennsylvania does not in explicit terms require uniformity of taxation, but does contain the provision that "all taxes shall be uniform upon the same class of subjects."

In cities of the first class, which include Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Allegheny City and Scranton, real estate is divided into three classes for purposes of assessment, with three rates of taxation; city property being assessed at full rate, suburban property at two-thirds of full rate and farming property at one-half of full rate.

In cities of the second class, the classification varies somewhat from that in the largest cities, but here there are three rates of taxation.

It is urged, and with good reasoning, that there is a broad principle of equity observed in these discriminating rates of taxation, the classification corresponding very nearly with the direct benefits received from municipal expenditures.

Cities of the third class and towns are permitted to levy taxes on real estate and on some classes of personal property, but the maximum rate of taxation is fixed by law. But little personal estate is assessed for municipal expenses, but a more general system of personal property taxation is applied by counties, a portion of the revenue thus received being paid into the state treasury for state expenses. No direct state tax is levied on cities and towns. In no state in the Union are manufacturing industries so lightly burdened with taxation as in Pennsylvania. The state has an elaborate system of corporation assessment. The state constitution provides that "the power to tax corporations and corporate property shall not be surrendered or suspended by any contract or grant to which the state is a party." Corporations have been divided and subdivided into classes for

purposes of taxation. Corporations having capital stock are taxed annually one-half of one per cent on the value of the capital stock.

This provision applies to domestic and foreign corporations doing business in the state. Banks, savings institutions and foreign insurance companies are excepted from its provisions and are taxed by another method. Manufacturing companies except those manufacturing spirits or malt liquors are exempt from state taxation. Corporations organized for the purpose of distilling liquor and selling same at wholesale are taxed one per cent on value of capital stock. Foreign insurance companies are required to pay to the state two per cent of all premiums received from business in the state. Banks and savings institutions having capital stock are required to pay four mills on the dollar of the value of the capital stock. They are also required to collect an equal amount from the shareholders in addition. They can, however, on payment of one per cent of the par value of the capital stock secure exemption from other taxation except on real estate. Transportation and transmission companies such as railroads, pipe line companies, steamboat and canal companies, street railways, telegraph, telephone, palace, sleeping car and express companies are required to pay in addition to the tax on capital stock, a tax of eight mills on gross receipts from business done in the state.

A tax of three mills on the dollar is imposed on all public loans, except United States and state loans, held by residents of the state. A similar tax of four mills on loans by corporations. Treasurers of counties, cities and towns, and treasurers of corporations are required to retain amount of tax out of interest payments and pay to the state. All such securities are thus exempt from county or local assessment. It will be observed that the state does not look to the owner of such securities for payment of the tax. It levies the tax upon the borrower instead of the lender. The several treasurers thus become assessors for the state. Savings institutions without capital stock are required to pay to the state three per cent on net income. They are also liable to local taxation on property. This provision applies to brokers, private bankers and some other corporations. There is much in the Pennsylvania tax system that should interest all students of taxation.



## NEW JERSEY.

This state has two permanent tax commissions. A state board of taxation of four members, not more than two from one political party. This board has power to review and correct all local assessments by raising or lowering the valuation of any parcel of property, to secure uniform and true valuation. The board may by rule direct local assessors to value land and buildings separately.

There is also a state board of assessors which has charge of the assessment of railroads and all corporations taxed directly by the state.

Statutes provide for assessment of poll tax of \$1.00, but in cities none are levied except to owners of property. No list of property required of owners. Assessors required to assess all property at full value. The proportion of real to personal estate assessed is approximately  $5\frac{1}{2}$  to 1.

This state is most liberal in its exemption of property from taxation. Assessors are required to list and value such property, and make return of same to the state board of taxation. Exempted property increases every year. In 1901 it amounted to over \$100,000,000. Bonds and securities of the state, of counties and municipalities, exempt from taxation. Property of counties and municipalities exempt wherever situated. Property of honorably discharged soldiers and sailors or their widows exempt to the amount of \$500. No state tax levied on cities and towns. The average rate of property taxation for county and municipal purposes is \$18.00 per \$1,000 valuation.

All property of railroads and canals including franchises valued by the state assessors and taxed one-half of one per cent for state purposes, and an additional tax of one per cent on all real property situate outside of the main stem, or right of way. This tax of one per cent is distributed by the state to the tax districts where property is located.

Under the municipal franchise act of 1900, street railways, telegraph, telephone, water, gas, electric lighting and all other corporations using or occupying public streets, highways or public places, are taxed locally on real estate, and in addition an excise tax by the state of two per cent on gross receipts. Taxes thus collected are distributed to municipalities where the prop-

erty is located. Express companies taxed locally on all tangible property and in addition must pay to the state two per cent on all business done in the state.

Savings banks are taxable locally for the full amount of their property and assets, without any deduction for debts and liabilities, same as other property. A statute enacted in 1888 providing for a tax of one-half of one per cent on amount of deposits, was held by the New Jersey courts to be unconstitutional. Trust companies are taxable for full amount of capital stock in the town where bank is located, real estate assessed being deducted from value of capital stock. New Jersey has a general franchise tax law applying to all corporations that do not pay a franchise under some other law. The rate is one mill on the dollar on par value of stock issued up to \$3,000,000 and one-half mill on amounts between three and five million, and for every million or part thereof above five millions \$50. Collateral inheritance tax rate, five per cent on all estates above \$500. Property passing to direct heirs and to charitable, religious and educational institutions exempt.

#### CONNECTICUT.

Sworn lists required from all owners of property. In case of refusal or neglect to return lists, assessors must make up lists from best information and add ten per cent to same. Poll tax of \$1.00 is assessed on males from 21 to 70 years of age. Assessors are required to list and value at fair market value, not at forced sale value. Exemptions include: The property of counties and municipalities; disabled soldiers and sailors entitled to exemption on property to amount of \$3,000, and all other honorably discharged soldiers and sailors and their wives or widows exempt to the amount of \$1,000. Sailing vessels and all vessels engaged in foreign trade exempt. The net income of such vessels is, however, liable to taxation. There are other minor exemptions of personal property. No state tax has been levied on cities and towns since 1889. The state receives sufficient revenue from other sources. The state tax commissioner is appointed by the governor; salary, \$3,000, and liberal amount for expenses. His duties require that he visit towns and cities, inquire into manner of assessments, to see that all taxes are equitably assessed.

Banks, trust companies, insurance, investment and bridge companies are required to make returns to the state tax commissioner and are taxed one per cent on value of capital stock, deducting all taxes paid locally on real estate. Taxes thus received by the state are apportioned to towns where shares are owned, the proportion represented by non-resident stock paid to towns where property is located.

Railroads and street railroads are taxed by the state one per cent on the value of capital stock, and one per cent on value of bonds, not exceeding par value, deducting all taxes paid locally on real estate. Express companies are taxed at five per cent on business done in the state. Telegraph companies are taxed 25 cents on each mile of wire owned or used. Telephone companies pay a tax of 70 cents on each transmitter and in addition 25 cents on each mile of wire owned or controlled. Real estate of telegraph and telephone companies taxed locally. Savings banks are taxed one-fourth of one per cent on deposits less deduction from deposits of each bank of \$50,000, and all bonds and stock not taxable to the holder. Such banks also deduct from their state taxes all taxes paid locally on real estate. Succession or inheritance taxes apply to property passing to direct heirs; rate, one-half of one per cent. To collateral heirs or strangers the rate is three per cent. Estates to the amount of \$10,000 and all gifts made to institutions for free exhibition and public benefit exempt from tax. Any person sending to the state treasurer any bond, note or other chose in action or description of such, may, by payment to the state annually of a tax at rate of four mills on the dollar secure exemption from local taxation on such property. The rate is low, but the state derives much more revenue than was derived formerly from local taxation of such intangible property.

#### RHODE ISLAND.

The statutes of this state require that all property liable to taxation shall be assessed at its full and fair cash value. Poll tax of \$1.00 assessed. Personal property taxable to the owner in the town where he has had his actual place of abode the greater part of the time during the twelve months prior to April 1. No person liable to taxation on personal property except on the surplus above actual debts. The provisions for

listing practically the same as in Maine. No penalty for failure to bring in lists except forfeiture of right to apply for abatement. Towns may by vote exempt manufacturing property from taxation not exceeding ten years. Vessels engaged in foreign commerce exempt from taxation, provided owners make statement to assessors of net income received, on which they are taxed at rate of one per cent.

Railroad property taxable same as other property. No state tax upon railroads except to pay salary and expenses of the railroad commissioner. Theoretically the shares of railroads and other corporations are taxable to the owners for the excess of value above the value of tangible property assessed, but in fact are not generally taxed. Equalization of cities and towns made by the general assembly. State tax rate, 1.8 mills. No town permitted to levy tax of over one and one-half per cent except to pay debts, for the sinking fund, or for extraordinary repairs for damage caused by the elements.

Street railroads are taxed by the State one per cent of gross earnings and in addition a sum equal to all dividends above eight per cent. Street railroads are subject to local regulation, and are required to pay to cities and towns a percentage of earnings; in the city of Providence the street railway company pays five per cent of gross earnings. Savings banks are taxed by the state four mills on the dollar on deposits and surplus. Savings department of trust companies subject to same provisions. Insurance companies taxed two per cent on gross premiums. Telegraph, telephone and express companies taxed locally on real estate, and by the state two per cent on gross earnings. A special commission in 1892 reported a new tax code much like that of Massachusetts, but the general assembly refused to adopt it.

## CONCLUSION.

In the foregoing brief description we have given of the several systems of taxation, many interesting facts are necessarily omitted. The trend of tax legislation in the several states is an interesting study. No public question is so prominently before the legislatures of our country. It invades and has its influence in every department of governmental management. In the earlier days of our republic, but little revenue was required for the simple wants of state and municipal governments, and taxes were levied on specific objects, real estate bearing the chief burden. Since 1850, however, owing to the rapid concentration of population in cities, the great creation of wealth in these centres, the constant formation and evolution of new forms of industry, the growth of railroads and other public service corporations, have made necessary a modification of tax systems in order to reach new and less tangible forms of wealth.

Again, the great burden of expenditures put upon the states by the Civil War, the erection and maintenance of substantial public buildings, the establishment of great public institutions essential to the public welfare, the constantly increasing demands for municipal expenses, have taxed the wisdom and ingenuity of legislatures to provide ways and means to furnish sufficient revenue. There is a strong popular demand in all the states for the taxation of franchises of corporations. There is a noticeable tendency to change the basis of assessment from gross receipts to an ad valorem basis, but the great difficulty of ascertaining the value of the property and franchise causes the simpler mode of taxing gross receipts to be more generally adopted. In the Southern states the tendency is to levy taxes on licenses, privileges and incomes. While many states incline to inquisitorial methods to ascertain the nature and value of property, such methods certainly are not growing in favor. There is in fact in the Eastern states a considerable sentiment in favor of relieving personal property from direct taxation, and the substitution of franchise taxes, excise taxes and inheritance taxes, all of which ultimately involve the taxation of personal property.

But the evolution and modification of tax systems has of necessity been slow. The conservatism of legislatures is opposed to radical changes in existing laws. Nor has the work of special tax commissions generally produced tangible results.

A special tax commission was appointed in this State in 1889, in Rhode Island in 1891, in Massachusetts in 1896, in Minnesota and New Jersey in 1901. Each commission after a careful investigation of the whole question, reported a comprehensive measure for the assessment and collection of taxes, and in each case the proposed act failed of adoption by the legislature. But the agitation and effort to reform and improve existing methods of taxation show no signs of abatement. The strife with the imperfections of human nature still goes on, seeking to obtain through new enactments just and equal taxation, a result which under any system of taxation can only be approximately attained. Within the narrow scope of authority given to this board under the laws, while we have favored all reasonable modifications of our own tax laws, we have not attempted to discredit or destroy a system of taxation which has stood the test of years, and which the State has not entirely outgrown. But rather have we labored to obtain a strict compliance with the letter and spirit of the law as it exists. Our main endeavor has been to secure through the official acts of the boards of assessors of the several municipalities a uniform basis of valuation, and through their best efforts, as far as practicable, a complete list of all taxable property in each municipality. And we feel warranted in saying that our efforts have been to some degree successful. We feel justified in the belief that taxes in this State are apportioned on a more just and even basis than was the case in former years, and that the tax system of Maine compares favorably with those of other states.
