TREASURER'S OFFICE,

AUGUSTA, January 1, 1903.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to lay before you, as required by law, a detailed statement of the transactions of this department during the past fiscal year, and an account of the condition of the State Treasury at the close of business on the 31st day of December, 1902.

TEMPORARY LOANS.

On January 1, 1902, the temporary indebtedness of the State for loans negotiated during the year 1901, was \$250,000, the Belfast Savings Bank holding two of the State's notes of \$100,000 each, and the Rumford Falls Trust Company, one note for \$50,000. This latter note and one of those held by the Belfast Savings Bank, were paid from the current receipts of the office, but in order to meet the other when due, it was found necessary to procure another loan of \$100,000, which was obtained from the Belfast Savings Bank on five months' time at the rate of $3\frac{1}{4}$ per cent per annum, and when this latter note matured, the State had sufficient funds on hand to take up the same, thus extinguishing the entire temporary loan outstanding. The bonded debt maturing during the year 1902, amounting to \$70,000, has also been paid from the current receipts of the office.

TAXES.

All taxes assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1901, have been paid in full with the single exception of the town of Dayton.

To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council of the State of Maine:

We, the undersigned, committee appointed under the provision of section 71, chapter 2, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of State, for the year ending December 31, A. D. 1902, have attended to that duty and beg leave to report: That we have carefully examined said accounts, and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in the printed report of the Treasurer.

We found on file a correct voucher for each item of disbursement.

We have also examined the certificates of deposits in the various banks, and find that the amount of cash on hand at the close of the year is correctly stated in said report.

Your committee, in the presence of Honorable Oramandal Smith, State Treasurer, destroyed by burning, as required by law, the following registered bonds, which matured during the year 1902, viz: No. 456, for \$50,000; No. 426, for \$20,000. Also the following bonds, for which new bonds of like amounts have been issued: No. 427, for \$20,000; No. 428, for \$10,000; No. 510, for \$2,000; No. 511, for \$3,000; No. 539, for \$10,000; No. 540, for \$3,000; No. 541, for \$3,000; No. 542, for \$3,000; No. 543, for \$1,000; No. 211, for \$50,000; No. 212, for \$50,000; No. 538, for \$10,000; No. 550, for \$50,000; No. 554, \$10,000; No. 555, for \$10,000; No. 557, for \$10,000; No. 558, for \$10,000; No. 562, for \$10,000; No. 563, for \$5,000; No. 564, for \$5,000; No. 552, for \$2,000; No. 556, for \$10,000.

We have also destroyed in like manner, four State of Maine notes, aggregating \$350,000, which notes represented the temporary loan outstanding January 1, 1902, and which matured during the year.

A certificate of our doings in this behalf is on file in the office of the State Treasurer.

Your committee desires to express to the Treasurer and his efficient clerks its appreciation of favors extended during the work of the committee.
