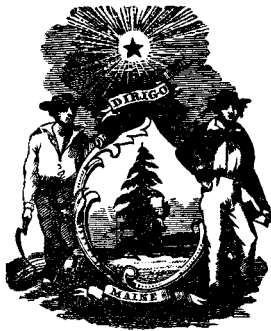

*To the Honorable Governor and Council:*

GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to lay before you, as required by law, a detailed statement of the transactions of this department during the past fiscal year, and an account of the condition of the State Treasury at the close of business on the 31st day of December, 1903.

**TRUST DEPOSITS.**

**GRANITE STATE PROVIDENT ASSOCIATION.**

The Granite State Provident Association of Manchester, N. H., which had a deposit in this office under chapter 79, Public Laws 1891, went into the hands of a receiver on May 1, 1896, Hon. Henry B. Cleaves being appointed receiver in Maine and authorized by the supreme judicial court to receive said deposit. In accordance with this order of the court, securities of the par value of \$37,198.05 were delivered to the Receiver September 23, 1898, and certificate for eleven shares of stock of the Cochecho National Bank of Dover, N. H., was surrendered to the Receiver October 4, 1901, leaving in this office on January 1, 1903, as shown by my last report, the following securities and cash:

## MAINE CASUALTY INSURANCE COMPANY.

The Maine Casualty Insurance Company went into the hands of a Receiver on August 4, 1903, Charles A. Strout of Portland being appointed Receiver and authorized by the supreme judicial court to receive the amount of the reserve mortuary fund on deposit in this office under chapter 237, Public Laws 1889, which fund on January 1, 1903, as shown by my report of that date, amounted to.....

*To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council of Maine:*

The undersigned, your committee appointed under the provision of section 71, chapter 2, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of State, for the year ending December 31, A. D. 1903, met at the Treasurer's office on the 12th day of January, A. D. 1904, and have been in session every secular day until this date.

We would respectfully report that we have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the accounts as stated in the printed report of the Treasurer. A correct voucher is on file for each disbursement. All books, records and accounts of the department are neatly and systematically kept.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year 1903 was \$438,892.68. The receipts from various sources for the year 1903 were \$2,550,343.93, making a total of \$2,989,236.61. The expenditures for the year were \$2,351,558.23, leaving a balance of cash on hand at the close of the fiscal year, ending December 31, 1903, of \$637,678.38. The last item is verified by statements of the cashiers of the several banks in which money is deposited and a certificate of the Secretary of State to the amount of cash in the office of the Treasurer January 1, 1904, before the commencement of business on that day. Against this balance of \$637,678.38 should be charged outstanding warrants to the amount of \$226,865.12, an unusually large amount, so that the actual balance is \$410,813.26, as compared with an actual balance of \$397,640.93, at the close of the last fiscal year.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1, 1904, was \$1,913,000, a reduction of \$70,000 during the fiscal year. Of this indebtedness, \$1,644,000 bears 3%; \$150,000 bears 4%; \$118,300 bears 5%, and bonds to the amount of \$700, bearing 6%, due October 1, 1889, have never been presented for payment. No temporary loan exists.

Your committee, in the presence of Honorable Oramandal Smith, State Treasurer, destroyed by burning, as required by law, the following registered bonds, which matured during the year 1903:

No. 404, for \$50,000; No. 406, for \$20,000; also the following bonds, for which new bonds of like amount have been issued:

No. 384, \$1,000; No. 566, \$5,000; No. 567, \$50,000; No. 568, \$10,000; No. 569, \$3,000; No. 570, \$10,000; No. 571, \$3,000; No. 572, \$3,000; No. 573, \$3,000.

Our certificate, showing the number and amount of each bond destroyed, is on file in the office of the State Treasurer. All trust deposits, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's report, have been examined and verified by the committee.

Your committee desires to express to the State Treasurer and his efficient clerks, Messrs. Caldwell, Emery, Wiswell and Miss Clancy, its appreciation of courtesies extended during the examination.
