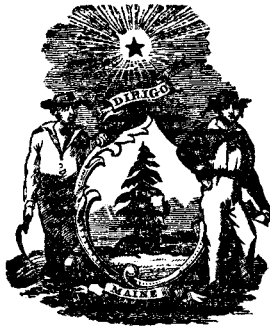

AUGUSTA, January 1, 1905.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to lay before you, as required by law, a detailed statement of the transactions of this department during the past fiscal year, and an account of the condition of the State Treasury at the close of business on the 31st day of December, 1904.

BONDED DEBT.

On the first day of January, 1901, the total bonded indebtedness of the State was \$2,103,000. By the provisions of the refunding act of 1889, \$50,000 of this amount matured and was paid in 1901, and \$70,000 in each of the succeeding years 1902, 1903 and 1904. By an act of the legislature of 1903, the Treasurer of State was authorized, with the advice and consent of the Governor and Council, to purchase unmatured bonds of the State. Under this authority, \$440,000 of such bonds were purchased and canceled in 1904, making the total reduction of the State debt since 1901, \$700,000, leaving the bonded debt outstanding on the first day of January 1905, \$1,403,000.

TOWN TAXES.

All taxes assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1903, have been paid in full.

To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council of the State of Maine:

Your committee appointed under the provisions of section 77, chapter 2, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer for the year ending December 31, 1904, respectfully report that it met at the Treasurer's office on the 10th day of January, 1905, and has been in session every secular day since that date.

We have examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in the printed report of the Treasurer. A voucher is on file for each disbursement. The books, records and accounts of the department are well and systematically kept.

The amount of cash in the treasury January 1, 1904, was \$637,678.38. The receipts from all sources for the year A. D. 1904 were \$2,308,015.37, making a total of \$2,945,693.75. The expenditures for the year were \$2,700,553.84, leaving a balance of cash in the treasury, December 31, 1904, of \$245,139.91. The last item is verified by the statements of the cashiers of the several banks in which money is deposited, and a certificate of the secretary of State to the amount of cash in the office of the Treasurer January 1, 1905, before the commencement of business on that day.

The committee in the presence of Hon. Oramandal Smith, State Treasurer, destroyed by burning, as required by law, the following registered bonds of the State:

Seventy thousand dollars of this amount matured during the year 1904, and four hundred forty thousand dollars were purchased under the authority of chapter 6, of the Private and Special Laws of 1903. Also destroyed by burning the following bonds for which new bonds have been issued: No. 549, \$50,000; No. 531, \$10,000; No. 532, \$15,000.

A certificate showing the number and amount of each bond destroyed is on file in the treasury.

All trust deposits, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's report, have been examined and verified by the committee.

The committee desire to express to the Treasurer and his efficient clerks its thanks for courtesies extended during the examination.
