TREASURER'S OFFICE,

AUGUSTA, January 1, 1906.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to lay before you, as required by law, a detailed statement of the transactions of this department during the past fiscal year, and an account of the condition of the State Treasury at the close of business on the 31st day of December, 1905.

BONDED DEBT.

On the first day of January, 1905, the total bonded indebtedness of the State was \$1,403,000, and by the refunding act of 1889, \$70,000 would mature in 1905, but \$60,000 of this issue having been purchased in 1904 under chapter 6, Private and Special Laws 1903, only \$10,000 was left to mature in 1905, which was redeemed October 1st. In addition to this amount, the State purchased \$13,000 unmatured bonds, making \$23,000 canceled in 1905, leaving a bonded debt of \$1,380,000 outstanding on the first day of January, 1906.

TOWN TAXES.

All taxes assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1904, have been paid in full.

To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council of the State of Maine:

Your committee appointed under provisions of section 77, chapter 2, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer for the year ending December 31, 1905, would respectfully report that we have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in the printed report of the Treasurer. A correct voucher is on file for each disbursement.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year 1905, was \$245,139.91. The receipts from various sources for the year 1905, were \$2,608,608.07, making a total of \$2,853,747.98. The expenditures for the year were \$2,423,502.02, leaving a balance in the treasury on December 31, 1905, of \$430,245.96. The last item is verified by the statements of the cashiers of the several banks in which money is deposited, and a certificate of the Secretary of State to the amount of cash in the office of the Treasurer January 1, 1906, before the commencement of business on that day.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1, 1906, was \$1,380,000. Of this indebtedness \$1,111,000 bears 3% interest; \$150,000 bear 4%; \$118,300 bears 5%, and bonds to the amount of \$700, due October 1, 1889, have never been presented for payment. No temporary loan exists. There has been paid during the past year \$23,000 of the bonded indebtedness as follows: Registered bond numbered 591, for \$3,000 of the reissue loan of June 1864, and registered bond numbered 451, for \$10,000, and registered bond numbered 486, for \$10,000, of

the reissue loan of October, 1869. Ten thousand dollars of this amount matured during the year 1905, and thirteen thousand dollars was purchased under the authority of chapter 6, of the Private and Special Laws of 1903.

Your committee, January 29, 1906, in the presence of Hon. Oramandal Smith, State Treasurer, destroyed by burning, as required by law, the above mentioned bonds, also destroyed by burning the following registered bonds of the reissue loan of June, 1864, for which new registered bonds have been issued. No. 207, \$35,000; No. 208, \$35,000; No. 209, \$35,000; No. 419, \$5,000.

A certificate showing the number and amount of each bond destroyed is on file in the office of the State Treasurer.

All trust deposits have been examined and verified, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's report.

We find the books and accounts neatly and systematically kept.

The committee desire to express to the Treasurer and his efficient clerks its thanks for their courtesy and assistance during the examination.
