*To the Legislature of Maine:*

GENTLEMEN:—The Constitution of the State provides that the Treasurer of State shall publish a regular statement and account of the receipts and expenditures of all public money at the commencement of the session of the legislature,—(Article 5, Part Four, Sec. 4.)

In accordance with such constitutional provision I have the honor to submit to your Honorable Body this regular statement, and some other tabulated information touching the transactions of the treasury department, trusting that such tabulations may prove helpful in your deliberations.

**BONDED DEBT.**

On the first day of January, 1906, the total bonded indebtedness of the State was \$1,380,000.00, and by the refunding act of 1889, \$70,000.00 would mature in 1906, but, \$50,000.00 of this issue having been purchased in 1904, under the provisions of chapter 6, Private and Special Laws of 1903, only \$20,000.00 was left to mature in 1906, which was redeemed October first. In addition to this amount the State purchased \$267,000.00



unmatured bonds, making \$287,000.00 cancelled in 1906, and leaving a bonded debt of \$1,093,000.00 outstanding on the first day of January, 1907.

In publishing this my last official report, I submit the following brief review of the progress of the State, during the six years now ending, in the liquidation of its indebtedness.

On January 1, 1901, the bonded debt of the State was \$2,103,000.00. There was also a temporary debt of \$386,000.00, making the total indebtedness of the State on January 1, 1901, \$2,489,000.00. During 1901 and 1902 the temporary debt of \$386,000.00 was extinguished, and no temporary loan now exists. The payments upon the bonded debt for each of the six years last past have been as follows: For 1901, \$50,000; 1902, \$70,000; 1903, \$70,000; 1904, \$510,000; 1905, \$23,000; 1906, \$287,000, making a total reduction of the State debt of \$1,396,000.00, and leaving the bonded debt outstanding January 1, 1907, \$1,093,000.00.

The annual interest account has been reduced from \$78,827.50 in 1900 to \$36,635.00 for 1907.

The rate of taxation upon the property of the State was reduced by the legislature of 1905 from  $2\frac{3}{4}$  mills to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  mills on a dollar.

All taxes against cities, towns and organized plantations for 1905 have been paid in full, with the single exception of that of the town of Mattamiscontis.

NOTE—I am pleased to state that negotiations instituted in December last, for the purchase of \$370,000 State of Maine 3% bonds owned and held by the Greenwich Savings Bank of New York, suddenly interrupted by the death of the president of that institution, have now been concluded, and the bonds are in possession of the State, thus reducing the bonded debt of the State within the two years last past \$680,000 and making the total reduction of the debt within the six years past \$1,766,000, leaving the total outstanding debt of the State now only \$723,000, and reducing the interest account from \$78,827.50 in 1900 to \$25,535 for 1907.

## STATE OF MAINE.

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STATE HOUSE,

*To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council of Maine:*

Your committee appointed under provisions of Section 77, Chapter 2, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer for the year ending December 31st, 1906, would respectfully report that we have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in the printed report of the Treasurer. A correct voucher is on file for each disbursement.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year 1906 was \$430,245.96. The receipts from various sources for the year 1906 were \$2,683,760.66, making a total of \$3,114,006.62. The expenditures for the year were \$2,516,035.60, leaving a balance in the treasury on December 31st, 1906, of \$597,971.02. The last item is verified by the statements of the officers of the several banks and trust companies in which money is deposited, and a certificate of the Secretary of State to the amount of cash in the office of the Treasurer January 1st, 1907, before the commencement of business on that day.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1st, 1907, was \$1,093,000. Of this indebtedness \$824,000 bears interest at 3%; \$150,000 at 4%; \$118,300 at 5%, and bonds to the amount of \$700, due October 1st, 1889, have never been presented for payment. No temporary loan exists.

There has been paid during the past year \$287,000 of the bonded debt, as follows: Of the loan of June, 1864, registered bonds No. 213, for \$10,000; No. 362, for \$10,000; No. 363, for \$10,000; No. 365 for \$50,000; No. 366 for \$15,000; No.

367 for \$15,000; No. 368 for \$50,000; No. 592 for \$35,000; No. 593 for \$35,000; No. 594 for \$35,000, and of the loan of October, 1869, registered bonds No. 487 for \$20,000; No. 508 for \$1,000, and No. 509 for \$1,000. Twenty thousand dollars of this amount matured during the year 1906, and two hundred sixty-seven thousand dollars was purchased under authority of Chapter 6 of the Private and Special Laws of 1903. Your committee, January 30th, 1907, in presence of Hon. Oramandal Smith, State Treasurer, destroyed by burning, as required by law, the above mentioned bonds. A certificate showing the number and amount of each bond destroyed is on file in the office of the State Treasurer.

All trust deposits have been examined and verified, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's report.

While your committee find the books neatly and accurately kept, at the same time, in view of the fact that there has been practically no change in the system of bookkeeping in this department for the last twenty years, your committee would suggest that in the absence of a law providing for a State Auditor the new State Treasurer and his efficient clerks examine into and determine what changes, if any, in the present system of bookkeeping would be of value to the department.

In closing this report, your committee desires to thank the retiring Treasurer, as well as all the clerical force in his office, for the prompt and valuable assistance rendered in the prosecution of its work.
