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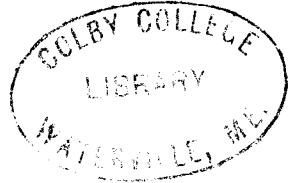

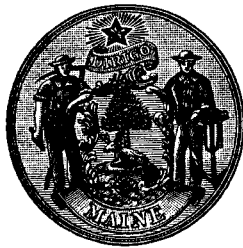

To the Legislature of Maine:

GENTLEMEN:—In accordance with a provision of the Constitution of the State, I have the honor to transmit herewith a detailed account of the receipts and expenditures of the State Government for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1908, together with a brief abstract of other matters of public interest pertaining to the Department.

BONDED DEBT.

The total bonded indebtedness on January 1, 1908 was \$713,000.00.

As provided by law \$70,000.00 would have matured during the year 1908, but under the provisions of Chapter 6, Private and Special Laws of 1903, \$55,000.00 of the outstanding bonds were redeemed prior to maturity, leaving only \$15,000.00 to be paid during the year 1908, and thus making the total bonded indebtedness on Jan. 1, 1909, \$698,000.00.

TAXES.

All taxes assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1907, have been paid in full.

During the past ten years the following balances have been in the treasury at the close of the year :

SCHOOL AND MILL FUND.

Under the present law this fund is derived from a tax of one and one-half mills on the total valuation of the State, six per cent. interest on the permanent school fund, and one-half the amount received by the State from the Tax on Savings Banks and Trust and Banking companies.

The following table shows the number of scholars and the amount distributed to the several cities, towns and plantations for the past ten years, together with the total amount of State Tax assessed.

UNIVERSITY OF MAINE OR AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE FUND.

From the sale of land scrip apportioned to the State of Maine by the United States Government entitled "An Act donating Public Lands to the several States and Territories which may provide Colleges for the benefit of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts," approved July 2, 1862, there was issued to said college an unnegotiable bond in the sum of \$118,300.00, which should constitute a perpetual fund, upon which interest at rate of five per cent. should be paid semi-annually.

No portion of said fund, nor the interest thereon, shall be applied, directly or indirectly, under any pretence whatever, to the purchase, erection, preservation, or repair of any building or buildings.

Also as provided by Chapter 105 of the Resolves of 1887 the Treasurer of State was authorized and directed to receive from

the Maine State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts (now University of Maine), in trust, the sum of \$100,000.00 bequeathed to said college by Abner Coburn.

An unnegotiable bond for this amount was issued bearing interest at rate of four per cent and payable semi-annually, said bond maturing in 1917.

MAINE INSANE HOSPITAL.

The sum of \$50,000.00 was bequeathed to above Hospital by Abner Coburn in 1887, and under Chapter 70 of the Resolves of 1887, the Treasurer of State issued an unnegotiable bond for this amount bearing interest at rate of four per cent. and payable semi-annually, bond maturing in 1917. See Gilman and Williams legacies.

PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND.

The money received from the Land Agent, derived from the sales of land appropriated for the support of schools, constitutes the "Permanent School Fund," and a sum equal to six per cent. of the amount of such fund is annually appropriated to the support of common schools and distributed among the several cities, towns and plantations according to the number of children therein between the ages of five and twenty-one.

On the first day of January 1909, the fund amounted to \$445,-711.79.

LANDS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC USES.

This fund is received from the Land Agent, being the amount collected by him on account of sales of timber and grass on reserved lots in unincorporated townships, and paid into this Department from time to time as provided by Chapter 7, Section 15 of the Revised Statutes.

When any township or tract is organized as a plantation, the interest on the fund belonging to said plantation is paid annually from the Treasury, upon authority from the Governor and Council, to be applied for the support of schools according to the number of scholars in each school.

When any such township is incorporated as a town, said fund belonging to it is to be paid over by the Treasurer of State to the Treasurer of the trustees of the ministerial and school funds therein, to be added to the funds of the corporation, and held and managed as other school funds of that town are required to be held and managed.

This fund now amounts to \$309,262.98.

PENOBSCOT INDIAN FUND.

The amount to the credit of this fund is \$73,828.48. \$50,000.00 of said sum was received from sale of four townships of land purchased by the State of said tribe in 1833, to which have since been added receipts from leases of the shores of several islands in Penobscot River now occupied by the tribe.

PASSAMAQUODDY INDIAN FUND.

This fund is derived from proceeds of sales by the Land Agent of timber and grass on Indian Township since 1853, and now amounts to, \$33,140.72.

FOXCROFT ACADEMY FUND.

As provided by Chapter 277, Resolves of 1868, there is held in trust for the use and benefit of said Academy the sum of \$1,000.00, upon which interest at rate of six per cent. is payable annually to the trustees.

HEBRON ACADEMY.

Under Chapter 278, Resolves of 1868, the sum of \$1,000.00 was appropriated to be held in trust by the Treasurer of State for the use and benefit of said Academy.

Interest at rate of six per cent. is payable annually to the trustees of said Academy, providing it has been open for instruction under the direction of said trustees, for at least two terms of ten weeks each in the year preceding any claim made under the resolve:

And provided further, that if the trustees of said Academy shall fail to maintain instruction therein for the period of two consecutive years, the grant herein made shall become forfeited.

HOULTON ACADEMY.

This fund of \$2,000.00 is held in trust for the use and benefit of said Academy from funds arising from the sale of timber and lumber, the Legislature appropriating same for educational purposes.

Under this Resolve, Chapter 370 of the Laws of 1864, interest at rate of six per cent. is payable annually to the trustees.

SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2, MADISON.

This fund of \$1,000.00 is derived from a bond of the State of Maine, which by Resolve of March 25, 1863, the Treasurer of State was directed to receive from Mahlan D. Spaulding, of Boston, the coupons thereon to be paid to the legal agent of the District as they became due, and at maturity of said bond five per cent. of the amount to be paid annually for all time to come.

WILLIAMS LEGACY.

This legacy and bequest from Joseph H. Williams to the State, amounting to \$1,000.00, for the benefit of the Maine Insane Hospital, was accepted by the Legislature under Chapter 220, Resolves of 1897, and a sum of money, not less than forty dollars, must be appropriated from time to time by the Legislature, and paid annually to the trustees of said Hospital.

GILMAN LEGACY.

This fund of \$1,000.00 was bequeathed to the State by Helen A. Gilman, to be held in trust for the promotion of the pleasure and comfort of the patients in the Maine Insane Hospital at Augusta, upon the condition that a sum not less than fifty dollars a year should be appropriated by the Legislature to be expended annually.

This amount, together with the condition as set forth in said will was accepted by the Legislature under Chapter 131, Resolves of 1905, interest at rate of five per cent. being payable to the Trustees of said Institution.

SANFORD LEGACY.

The sum of \$1,300.00 was paid into the State Treasury in 1854, under the will of Isaac Sanford; \$700.00 being bequeathed to State Reform School (now the State School for Boys), and \$600.00 for the benefit of the indigent blind, and deaf and dumb, all of said beneficiaries to be natives of the State.

As provided by Chapter 197 of the Public Laws of 1856, a sum of money equal to six per cent. of the amount bequeathed to the State Reform School was appropriated annually for the support of the library, said sum to be paid in the month of February.

No part of the legacy of \$600.00 for the deaf, dumb and blind has been applied for. Under the will this amount is to be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council for the benefit and use of such above persons as may apply for aid to be educated and improved in institutions established for that object; the principle to be kept on interest, as much, and as far as may be.

MADAWASKA TERRITORY SCHOOL FUND.

As provided by Chapter 100 of the Private and Special Laws of 1861, there is held in trust the sum of \$5,000.00 for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Madawaska Territory, as their share of the surplus revenue distributed to the inhabitants of the State in 1837, said sum to constitute a permanent fund, on which six per cent. shall be paid annually for the support of schools in said Territory.
