# PUBLIC LAWS, 1905, CHAPTER 92.

AN ACT to provide for the better enforcement of the laws against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating Liquors.

Section 1. The governor is hereby authorized to appoint a commission consisting of three persons, one of whom shall be a lawyer, two members of said commission shall be from the dominant political party and one from the political party casting the next highest vote at the last state election.

Each member of said commission shall be paid a salary of fifteen hundred dollars per year and actual expenses.

The salary shall be payable in four quarterly payments on the first days of January, April, July and October.

Said commissioners shall be provided with an office at the state capitol, with suitable furniture, stationery and other necessary facilities for transacting the business of the commission, and may employ a clerk at the expense of the state.

Section 2. Said commissioners shall be known as enforcement commissioners and with the advice and under the direction of the governor shall have, and are hereby authorized to exercise in any part of the state, all the common laws and statutory powers of sheriffs in their respective counties in the enforcement of the law against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors.

Section 3. Said commission shall appoint such number of deputy enforcement commissioners as in its judgment may be necessary, who shall have the same powers as are given said commissioners under the preceding section. Such deputies shall be appointed in writing signed by a majority of said commissioners, which appointment shall be recorded in the office of said commission, and shall hold office during the pleasure of said commission. Upon being discharged they shall immediately surrender their certificate of appointment and all papers and other property relating to their office.

Section 4. Said commissioners and deputies shall be sworn and give bonds to the state for the faithful discharge of their duties, the commissioners in the sum of five thousand dollars and the deputies in the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars.

Any party injured by the official misdoing of any deputy, having first obtained judgment against him and failed to satisfy the execution issued thereon on demand, may, at his own expense, in the name of the commissioners, for the time being, institute suit upon such bond in the county in which the original judgment was obtained or in the county in which such deputy resides, for the purpose of collecting such judgment. The name

of the party for whose benefit the suit is brought shall be stated in the declaration and endorsed on the writ and such party shall alone be liable for costs unless the court for good cause shown shall require other endorsers.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the said deputy enforcement commissioners to exercise all the powers herein conferred when, where and as directed by said commission, and for their services, they shall be paid three dollars per day and the actual expenses occasioned by the performance of such duty, and shall, at such time as may be fixed by the commission, present their accounts for approval and after approval the governor and council shall draw their warrant against any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, in payment thereof.

Section 6. There shall be taxed for said commissioners and deputies in the bills of costs the same fees as sheriffs and witnesses have been heretofore entitled to receive, which shall be paid directly to the state treasury.

Section 7. The said commission, upon being satisfied that the local authorities fail to enforce the law against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors in any city or town of the state, shall, subject to the limitations of section two, instruct the deputy commissioners in the county, and may send one or more deputy commissioners from some other section of the state to enforce said law.

Section 8. The governor may, after notice to and an opportunity for the attorney for the state for any county to show cause why the same should not be done, create to continue during his pleasure, the office of special attorney for the state in such county and appoint an attorney to perform the duties thereof. Such appointee shall, under the direction of the governor, have and exercise the same powers now vested in the attorney for the state for such county in all prosecutions relating to the law against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors, and shall have full charge and control thereof; he shall receive such reasonable compensation for services rendered in vacation and term time as the justice presiding at each criminal term in the county shall fix, to be allowed in the bill of costs for that term and paid by the county.

Section 9. All fines collected by prosecutions undertaken by said commission or its deputies shall be divided equally between the state and the county in which the prosecution is had, except during the time when a special attorney is appointed to perform the duties of the attorney for the state for said county, in which event all fines collected on prosecutions instituted during such time by said commission or its deputies or by said special attorney, and half of all other fines in all cases in which such attorney shall take part, shall be paid to the state. Each clerk of the court shall within thirty days after the adjournment of each criminal term, certify to said commission a list of all fines collected in his county since his last return, which list shall show the origin of the case in which they were collected, and so far as exhibited by the papers or records, the connection of any of the special officials herein provided for, therewith. Said commission shall determine what moneys are due from any county to the state under the provisions hereof, and such sum shall be paid by the county treasurer to the treasurer of the state within thirty days after said commission shall notify the county commissioners of any county of its determination.

Section 10. Nothing in this act shall in any way relieve the sheriffs or the municipal officers of cities and towns, or except when such special attorney has been appointed, the attorney for the state for the county, of the duties devolving upon them for the enforcement of the law against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors, and all fines collected by prosecutions instituted by them, except those in which such special attorney shall take part, shall be paid entirely to the county wherein the conviction is secured.

Section II. Whenever, in the judgment of the governor, either of said commissioners is negligent in the performance of his duty, it shall be the duty of the governor, and he is hereby authorized to remove said commissioner from office.

Section 12. Whenever, in the judgment of the governor, the commission is no longer necessary, he is hereby authorized to remove from office all members of said commission, and the commission shall be thereby suspended, until such time as he deems its services are again required.

Section 13. This act shall take effect when approved.

## PUBLIC LAWS, 1909, CHAPTER 255.

AN ACT to amend Section five and repeal Section nine of Chapter ninety-two of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred five, providing for the better enforcement of the laws against the manufacture and sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section five of chapter ninety-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred five is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the following words, "The state auditor on or before the fifteenth day of each month shall notify the county commissioners of each county where the powers aforesaid are executed, of the sum paid by the state treasurer during the preceding calendar month for the services and expenses of said deputies in such county, and such sum shall be paid by the county treasurer of said county to the treasurer of state within thirty days after such notice is mailed. In case of failure to make such payment within said thirty days an action of debt may be maintained against said county in the name of the treasurer of state, for the benefit of the state, to recover said sum, or the amount payable as aforesaid may be deducted by the treasurer of state from any sums due from the state to such county,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 5. It shall be the duty of the said deputy enforcement commissioners to exercise all the powers nerein conferred when, where and as directed by said commission, and for their services they shall be paid three dollars per day and the actual expenses occasioned by the performance of such duty, and shall, at such time as may be fixed by the commission, present their accounts for approval and after approval the governor and council shall draw their warrant against any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, in payment thereof. The state auditor on or before the fifteenth day of each month shall notify the county commissioners of each county where the powers aforesaid are executed, of the sum paid by the state treasurer during the preceding calendar month for the services and expenses of said deputies in such county, and such sum shall be paid by the county treasurer of said county to the treasurer of state within thirty days after such notice is mailed. In case of failure to make such payment within thirty days an action of debt may be maintained against said county in the name of the treasurer of state, for the benefit of the state to recover said sum, or the amount payable as aforesaid may be deducted by the treasurer of state from any sum due from the state to such county."

Section 2. Section nine of chapter ninety-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred five is hereby repealed.

# REPORT.

#### To His Excellency the Governor:

The Enforcement Commissioners respectfully submit to your Excellency the following report of the work of their department since the period covered by their former report of December 31, 1908.

The details of the work are fully shown by the tabulations which we submit as a part of the report. You have been fully informed of the general conditions which have existed from time to time, and the Commission has appreciated your counsel and direction at our frequent conferences and through our correspondence.

The scope of the work of the Commission is limited and defined by the statute under which it exists, and the interpretation of the law adopted by the Commission and set forth in its first report in 1906 have been followed. Section 7 of the statute provides:

"The said commissioners, upon being satisfied that the local authorities fail to enforce the law against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors in any city or town of the state, shall, subject to the limitations of section two, instruct the deputy commissioners in the county, and may send one or more deputy commissioners from some other section of the state to enforce said law."

In discussing the meaning of this section the Commission in that report used the following words:

"The Commission concluded that by the use of the word 'satisfied,' one of no trivial significance, and by the obvious spirit, scope and purpose of the law, the legislature intended that the powers given by the act to the Commission should not be invoked until it had by reasonable, impartial and fair investigation and consideration satisfied itself that the local authorities were not diligently and faithfully seeking to apprehend offenders and to institute proceedings, and that, until the Com-

mission was so satisfied, it had no authority to undertake to enforce the law in such locality. On this point there was obvious misunderstanding, many apparently thinking that the deputies, whether the Commission was acting in the county or not, could be used to search any suspected place and could act as detectives for any occasion. We believe this misunderstanding was due to the provisions of the act being misunderstood, and in this connection we wish to state that by actual inquiry we found very few who had even read the act or examined its provisions although they were discussing it freely. And we furthermore determined that even if in any locality there were persistent and continued violations of the prohibitory law, nevertheless if the 'local authorities' were in our opinion doing all that we could do if there and accomplishing all that we could accomplish, we were not 'satisfied' of a failure to enforce within the meaning of the act and had no authority to intervene."

Our general law, as stated in the Revised Statutes, Chapter 29, sections 61 and 69, places the duty of enforcement primarily upon the mayor and aldermen, selectmen, assessors and constables in every city, town and plantation, and upon sheriffs and their deputies and county attorneys, all of whom are charged with the duty, each to the limit of the powers of their respective offices, of seeing that complaints are made and prosecutions instituted for all violations of the liquor law. This duty is enjoined particularly with reference to this law. We have endeavored in all cases, before exercising the powers conferred upon us in any county, not only to make certain of failure by the local officers, but to bring about action on their part if possible, and have constantly referred complaints received by us to the local officers before sending our deputies to work in any locality.

We have tried to get in touch with the people likely to be interested in enforcement in all parts of the state. Our position may be understood from the following circular letter, copies of which were sent to individuals in every town.

"Dear Sir:

We believe that the work of the Enforcement Commission may be made much more effective if we can receive information

and suggestion as to conditions in the different counties of the State.

Believing that you may be interested, we take the liberty to ask you to write us as to the general conditions of enforcement in your vicinity, and as to any particular violators of the law whom you may have in mind or of whom you hear complaints. We would be glad also to receive any suggestions which may occur to you looking to better enforcement, now or in the future.

Anything which you may write will, if you desire, be treated as entirely confidential.

We would esteem it a favor if you would suggest the names of any persons who would be interested in this direction, and who would perhaps be glad to take up this same subject with us.

Thanking you in advance for any assistance which you may be able to render us, we are,

Later, the letter of which the following is a copy was sent to many individuals:

"Dear Sir:

We would be obliged if you would write us as to present conditions of enforcement in your vicinity. If they are not satisfactory, have they been called to the attention of the local or county officials?

Would you and perhaps others who are interested in enforcement be willing to assist the Commission to the extent of getting together and taking steps to call the attention of the officials to the situation and request them to act, and in case of neglect on their part to do so, then to take up the matter with us?

We believe the law contemplates local enforcement where it can be secured, and intervention on the part of the Commission when officers will not do their duty. If it should be understood that the temperance men in the different parts of the State would demand enforcement, and follow up their demand by appeal to us, we believe that in many cases the demand would be heeded. Your communications will be treated as confidential unless you direct otherwise.

In 1909, at the beginning of the year, we withdraw our deputies from counties where new officials had been elected, in order that they might have opportunity to enforce if they saw fit.

April 13, 1909, the terms of the Commissioners then in office expired, and April 26th appointments were made by your Excellency of Henry W. Oakes of Auburn, George M. Phoenix of Alfred and Andrew P. Havey of West Sullivan, who organized with Mr. Oakes as chairman, Mr. Phoenix as secretary, and Mr. Havey as treasurer.

New appointments of deputies were made, very largely from the former force, whose faithfulness and experience recommended them to the commissioners, all the appointments not being made at once, but deputies being added from time to time as occasion required. A list of deputies who have been in service at any time during the period covered by this report is given elsewhere. These officers, often-times in the face of bitter attack and popular opposition, always against such obstacles as the liquor-sellers and their friends could interpose, have worked with courage, intelligence and zeal in the performance of their difficult duties. They have been constantly called upon at all hours of the day and night, often required to be continually away from their homes, and we have found them prompt and ready to respond to our requirements.

Work has been continuous in Androscoggin and Penobscot counties for most of the time, and in other counties occasionally during the period of our report.

In Androscoggin, with five deputy sheriffs designated and regularly paid a per diem for enforcing the liquor law, the work has nevertheless fallen almost entirely upon our deputies.

In Penobscot in the early part of 1909 practically no attempt was made to enforce the law, and after communication with the local officials, on the eighth day of May our deputies resumed work in various parts of the county, including the city of Bangor, where conditions were very bad. They have continued in the county ever since. On the 18th of November, 1909, they were withdrawn from the city of Bangor upon the assurance of the mayor and chief of police that the municipal authorities would enforce the law. Conditions, however, were not satisfactory, and grew steadily worse until March, 1910, when we decided to set the deputies at work again and made preparations to do so. Before they resumed work, however, a new administration took charge, and not only were the strongest assurances made, but immediate, practical, and, we think, efficient enforcement ensued, which continued until the fall of this year. Since that time, while enforcement has not been kept up to the extent to be desired, the local officials have made a considerable number of raids and have claimed to be enforcing as well as possible.

In Cumberland County, as in Penobscot County, new officials took office Ian. 1, 1000, pledged to enforcement, previous to that time most of the enforcement in the city of Portland having been by the municipal authorities. For a considerable time the law seemed to be well enforced. Later conditions became unsatisfactory, and the Commission for a considerable time engaged in correspondence and interviews with the county officials to bring about local enforcement. At length things were in such a condition that we decided it was necessary to act, and on the 23rd of March, 1910, our officers were set at work in the county, making successful raids and finding conditions actually existing which justified beyond question our decision. The officers continued at work until the 12th day of June, when they were withdrawn after a conference with the sheriff and county attorney and prominent citizens interested in enforcement in Portland, and upon assurance that full enforcement would be given by the county officials. At that time, in connection with our work, one of our deputies had been engaged for some time in secret work obtaining evidence against the liquor-sellers in Portland. When we withdrew the regular working force we informed the county attorney of the presence of this deputy, and by his desire he continued, reporting regularly in writing to the county attorney as to his daily work, and placing his information at the disposal of the county attorney to be used as he thought proper in the prosecution of the various offenders. The presence of this officer was not then known to the other deputies. After the removal of our working force conditions changed and continually grew worse, until we decided it was necessary to resume

regular work, and on the 29th day of August the force of deputies was sent back, and has continued in Portland and Cumberland County ever since. The secret deputy continued to work until shortly before the session of the grand jury in September, and his evidence was placed in the hands of the county attorney and at his disposal. The deputy, Mr. Weyand, was before the grand jury, but practically no prosecutions in the Superior Court resulted from his work. Accordingly, considering that these cases should receive attention, we caused complaints to be made before the municipal court, and a very large number of liquorsellers were brought in and convicted, most of them for the offenses of single sale and nuisance. Practically all of these cases which were in the jurisdiction of the lower court have been appealed, and with the bound over nuisance cases will be before the Superior Court at its next term for disposal. These cases have been efficiently handled in the municipal court, largely by the assistant county attorney, Mr. Bodge.

In this connection we mention an attack made upon Mr. Doughty, one of our deputies, while making a raid on the 22nd day of November, 1010. He entered the place alone in the evening, finding a considerable amount of liquors, the person in charge making his escape at the time. While Mr. Doughty was in the place attending to the liquors the lights were turned out, the wire being cut, and a mob broke into the room. Mr. Doughty forced his way into the yard where there was light from the street lights, and was there assaulted, struck over the head with a club, and was for some time fighting for his life. He probably would have been pounded to death but for the arrival of captain of police Small, who came to his assistance, and succeeded in dispersing the crowd. This attracted much attention and aroused much public indignation, a reward being offered by citizens for evidence which would lead to the conviction of the assailants. Fortunately Mr. Doughty was not permanently injured, and soon afterwards resumed his work.

Work has been done, as will appear by the tabulated statements, to some extent by our deputies in Aroostook, Franklin, Knox, Piscataquis, Sagadahoc, Washington and York counties.

In Franklin County in the first part of 1909 there was failure to enforce in the village of Chisholms, which practically forms a part of Livermore Falls, where our deputies were at work.

After a conference with the county attorney, sheriff and county commissioners, an adequate force was provided by the county officials and since then satisfactory work has been done, so that we have not been called upon.

In Knox and Sagadahoc, as a result of conferences with the county officials, they undertook to enforce the law, and while the results have not been in all respects as complete as desired, we have not undertaken enforcement since in Sagadahoc County, and only for a short time in Knox.

In Aroostook and Piscataquis counties officers have been sent in upon particular complaints, but have not been kept in the counties.

In Washington County we have sent in officers several times, but except in one or two instances in Calais, and quite generally in Eastport, conditions have been reported to us as quite satisfactory. In Eastport there has been more or less constant sale of liquor. We have sent deputies there a number of times for investigation, and to make raids. While officers are stationed in the place the dealers plan to stop business and ship away their stocks, as they can easily do by water. There is much difficulty in landing deputies, as suspicious characters are reported along the transportation lines, and whenever an alarm is given liquor business stops. Notwithstanding this, successful raids have been made by our deputies.

Conditions in York County have been generally good. The small amount of work which has been done there has been in the way of investigation, complaints having been received with respect to some localities during the fall of 1910.

Owing to the size of the state and the great extent of its border, the question of enforcement presents some unusual difficulties, which are well illustrated by the instance of Aroostook County, where liquor is easily brought in across the border, and handled from pockets. Remote places in the lumbering and sporting regions are difficult to handle by sending deputies from outside, and to station deputies permanently at such places would involve very large expense. Many such places are only to be dealt with by use of secret officers. Such officers it has been very difficult for the Commission to provide, owing to the fact that we have no authority to offer compensation except to duly appointed deputies, and to the further fact that consider-

able effort is made by the liquor-sellers, whenever a deputy is appointed, to locate and identify him. To make his work effective it is necessary ordinarily for him to appear in court, so that he soon becomes recognized, and afterwards can be used for secret work only to a limited extent. Some valuable work in this direction, however, has been done by some of our officers, especially by Mr. Weyand.

We apprehend that some popular misunderstanding of the scope of the statute constituting this Commission exists. The commissioners and the deputies have only the powers of sheriffs, and this extends only to enforcing the law with respect to the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors. They can only bring the cases to the courts. From that point, except as they appear as witnesses, their power and, of course, their responsibility ceases. When cases reach the higher courts they are directly under the control of the county attorney. If the county attorneys fail to follow up the prosecutions, the cases amount to very little. An examination of the details in our tabulations show a great number of cases continued without prosecution, or nol prossed, or placed on the so-called special docket after a judgment of conviction. We believe that examination of these details will satisfy any person that in

the counties where the work has been done by our deputies, if the cases had been followed through properly with the purpose of making them effective to enforce the law and to punish liquor-sellers sufficiently so that they would find it advisable to cease violations of the law, there was plenty of material furnished to accomplish this end. One feature well illustrates the situation. When an appealed liquor case is called in the upper court and the defendant does not respond, he is defaulted, and on default the sentence of the lower court is affirmed. This constitutes a conviction, and in regular course a mittimus is issued, which is a warrant from the court to arrest the defendant in execution of his sentence. Bearing in mind that enforcement officers work in any county only because the local officers fail to perform their duty, and that our deputies would naturally be the officers selected to make the arrests, nevertheless when a mittimus is issued upon cases brought by the enforcement officers it has been almost the invariable practice of county attorneys, who have the discretion in this matter, to place the mittimus in the hands of the sheriff or his deputies, instead of in the hands of the enforcement deputies who have prosecuted the cases. The result of this has been constantly the extraordinary spectacle of a court in session ready to enforce the sentence, the mittimus in the hands of the officer requiring him to apprehend the criminal, and the criminal walking unmolested about the streets within practically easy reach of the officer and continuing without arrest not only until after the adjournment of court, but in many cases without being arrested at any time. Of course the result of all these things is a confidence that liquor may be sold, if not with impunity, at least with a certainty that no more damage will be done to the offender than is absolutely unavoidable, and there is the further result that the liquor-seller is guite ready to take chances of being caught again and again, with the expectation that after the enforcement deputies have got through with him he will be taken care of at a later stage in the proceedings.

Since July 3, 1909, at which date the amendment became a law by which the State is to be reimbursed for the amounts paid the deputies for their services and expenses by the counties in which their duties are performed, the counties have been notified by the State Auditor, of the following amounts so payable. These include in most cases the bills for services of the deputies to Oct. 15, 1910, and expenses to Sept. 31, 1910, inclusive, these being the bills paid in November, notifications of which were sent by the State Auditor under date of Dec. 14, 1910.
