*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled:—*

In accordance with the provisions of Section 7 of Chapter 147 of the Public Laws of 1907, the State Auditor begs to submit herewith a full and accurate statement of the financial condition of the State and of the financial transactions thereof for the two years ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1912.

Full tabulations hereinafter show the bonded debt and other liabilities as well as assets as they existed on January 1, 1911-January 1, 1912 and December 31, 1912.

It will be noted that the cash on hand of \$457,128.65 and the amount due on State taxes of \$1,598,870.70, making aggregate assets of \$2,055,999.35 is sufficient to pay all outstanding payable liabilities in full.

It will also be noted that the unexpended balance of 1912 appropriations are treated as a liability and are considerably more than sufficient to cover all the outstanding claims against them.

An impression prevails to some extent that one year's assessment is available—and only available to pay the following year's current expenses.

This is manifestly an error.

The assessment of any year is an income for the year in which it is assessed. Such portion as is uncollected at end of the year is an asset, and only so much of it is available to pay current expenses of the following year as represents a surplus.

It is obvious that if outstanding bills due and payable on December 31st of any year, equal the assets, to pay the bills would absorb the assets; and, if any portion of the assets, cash or uncollected tax were used to pay accruing bills of the following year, an equal amount of bills due on December 31st would remain outstanding.

As a matter of fact and practice, the uncollected tax is offset and absorbed by the common school fund and other credits due the towns that owe the tax.

An adjustment between the towns and the State settle both.

I would respectfully recommend that legislation be enacted to the end, that the expenses of all the State departments and institutions be paid direct from the State treasury, to those to whom it is due.

By mutual agreement between the State Auditor, heads of departments, institutions and their trustees in the last two years, six more are having their expenses paid direct from the treasury, which were formerly paid in lump sums to the several departments and institutions and then paid out by them.

Nearly all are now established on this plan, having their expenses paid direct from the treasury after vouchers are audited and approved and warrant drawn for same.

The principal exceptions being the Maine Insane Hospital and the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital. These have rendered

statements the first of each month, showing amount of cash on hand, bills receivable and payable, thus enabling the Auditor to determine the necessary amount monthly required by these institutions to pay their preceding month's bills. The vouchers actually paid however were not received by the Auditor until several months later, and is unsatisfactory.

I would also respectfully recommend that a law be enacted to prohibit any head of a department or a state institution, who draws an annual salary for his services from the State, from drawing any additional salary or per diem, to be paid by the State, when serving on any board or commission for the State; thus avoiding payment by the State of a double salary for one man's services.

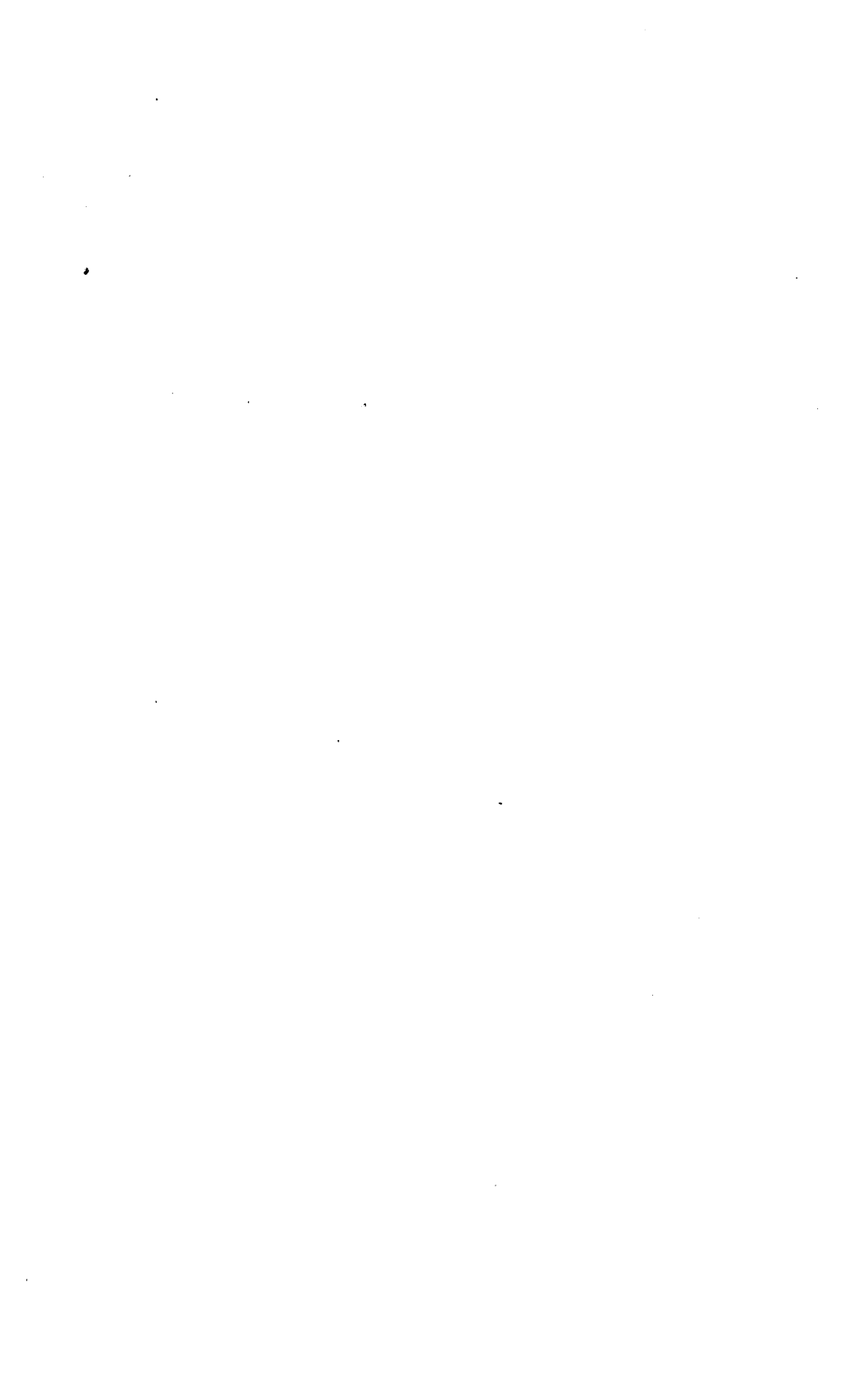
