Maine's standard is such that we are enabled to reciprocate with thirty-three states.

We have investigated such complaints as have been brought to our notice and have succeeded in bringing the parties within the intent of the law without prosecutions. There are however a few within our jurisdiction who still persist in defying the Statute and they will be brought into court at an early date.

We would respectfully call your attention to one part of the Pure Food and Drug Law. In doing this we do not intend to criticize or reflect in any way upon the integrity of the present Director, but we do feel that the section which allows one man to make decisions and when made become laws, should be changed. While we do not claim that the present Director has or ever will abuse this privilege, we feel it is too much power to be given one person. We have the opportunity of resorting to the Referendum upon any and all acts of the Legislature, before they become laws, but a decision made by the Director of the Maine Experiment Station becomes a law without the Governor's signature.

We would suggest that the law be amended in such a way as to have a commission, representing the different business interests of this State, pass upon them before they are allowed to become effective.
