The Governor and Commander-in-Chief, Augusta, Maine:

SIR: In accordance with section seventeen, The Military Law, I have the honor to submit the report of this office for the year ending December 31, 1914.

EQUIPMENT.

During the past year the troops have been supplied with practically a new equipment. Olive drab overcoats have been issued to the Second Infantry replacing the old blue overcoats which have been obsolete for a number of years. The new automatic pistol, caliber .45, has also been issued to officers and men of both the Second Infantry and the Coast Artillery Corps. Four army wagons with harness have been added to the field equipment of the Second Infantry, making a total of twenty-two wagons, the number required by regulations for field service. A large amount of clothing and tentage has been drawn from the government, which will insure a full equipment for the troops should they be called into the United States service.

ARMORIES.

Extensive repairs have been made on the State armory at Portland. The federal government has installed a new dummy armament of the latest design in this armory, which will enable the organization of Coast Artillery Corps to receive the same training in the armory that they would receive at the forts and I believe with this advantage they will increase their present

high state of efficiency. A large amount of the work of installing this equipment has been done by the members of the Maine Coast Artillery Corps and to them belongs the distinction of having men qualified to perform this work. It is a source of satisfaction to all that, in event of the Maine Coast Artillery Corps being called into actual service, they would be in a position to perform every part of the work required of them. The work of equipping the armory has been under the direction of Captain Henry W. Hobbs, Artillery Engineer, C. A. C. Great praise is due Captain Hobbs for the able manner in which he has performed his duties. There has been no improvement in the armories of the other companies since my last report. The 6th Company at Sanford should be provided with better quarters at once. The 10th Company at Brunswick is located in the town hall, the company having the use of the hall only one night each week; the property is stored in the balcony but no lockers are provided and the large amount of military property in the hands of this organization is practically without protection. The conditions at this armory are very unsatisfactory. The town officers have several times, when the matter has been called to their attention, agreed to provide better quarters but up to the present time nothing has been done. The armory rental for the town of Brunswick for the year 1914 has been withheld by the Armory Commission and will not be paid until a suitable armory is provided. Unless conditions are improved at once it is feared that the federal government will withdraw all aid for the support of the 10th Company. This matter has now been placed in the hands of the Attorney General for action under section ninety-five, The Military Law.

INSTRUCTION.

Correspondence schools have been conducted as in former years for the Coast Artillery Corps and Infantry by the Inspector-Instructors on duty in the State and for the Medical Department by Major James R. Church, M. C., U. S. A. In the Second Infantry, of the forty-seven officers on the roster twenty-seven completed each paper with a mark of satisfactory, nine completed a majority of the work, nine completed less than a majority of the work and two failed to turn in a

single paper. In the Coast Artillery Corps, in addition to the work of the correspondence school examinations were held in May and November under the provisions of General Orders No. 166, War Department, series 1911. The following officers and enlisted men have been given certificates of proficiency by the Chief of Coast Artillery, U. S. A., in the courses listed below:

CAMPS OF INSTRUCTION.

The Coast Artillery Corps participated in joint defense exercises at Fort Williams, Maine, July 16-24, inclusive. The instruction was under the direction of Captain Henry M. Merriam, C. A. C., U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor. In his report Captain Merriam states that during target practice no assistance was necessary from regular officers or men. I believe that the camp this year was the most successful ever held by the Coast Artillery Corps of this state.

The annual tour of duty for the Second Infantry was held at the state camp ground, Augusta, August 3-12, inclusive, in conjunction with Company B, 5th United States Infantry, and was called the Camp of Instruction for Company B, 5th United States Infantry. The joint camp of regular and National Guard troops was so held in order that the federal appropriation for encampments and maneuvers would be available for the camp held in Maine. The camp was under command of

Colonel Charles G. Morton, 5th United States Infantry. Captain Thomas A. Roberts, 2nd United States Cavalry, acted as camp adjutant, and Major Weston P. Chamberlain, Medical Corps, U. S. A., was Inspector-Instructor of the militia sanitary troops and camp surgeon. First Lieutenants Charles A. Hunt, Gordon R. Catts and Edwin Butcher, United States Infantry, and Second Lieutenant Thompson Lawrence, 5th United States Infantry, were detailed as instructors. One Inspector-Instructor was assigned to each battalion and Lieutenant Butcher being the regular Inspector-Instructor assigned to this state was given general charge of the instruction.

The program as prescribed was carried out with few exceptions and provided for the most needed instruction for the regiment. The march of the entire regiment with its transportation into the field, the camp in the field and the return march were of especial value in keeping the troops instructed in marching and in making and breaking camp, and I believe that this should always be a part of the program of instruction. The troops camped on the farm of Mr. Horace Sturgis, near Riverside, and their conduct was excellent. Not the slightest damage was reported and the proprietor expressed his appreciation of the conduct of the troops while on his land and extended to them an invitation to camp there again.

Another valuable feature of the program was the instruction given each company in field firing at surprise targets. This year's work showed vast improvement in fire control and discipline and proved conclusively the value of last year's instruction. The officers and men are intensely interested in this work and it should be given a place in every camp of instruction.

Company B, 5th United States Infantry, was camped with the Second Infantry and its officers and men were on very friendly terms with the officers and men of the National Guard. An exhibition drill by the company was greatly appreciated and furnished an opportunity for all to see the possibilities of constant instruction. The company commander, Captain Joseph K. Partello, gave a demonstration of the new infantry pack and equipment.

One unit of a United States field bakery, with a personnel of one sergeant and three men, supplied the entire command daily with fresh bread of excellent quality.

The camp police and the police of latrines for the first few days did not satisfy the camp surgeon, who was very critical of even minor details, but conditions in this respect improved until the surgeon expressed himself as perfectly satisfied. The utter failure of the use of one incinerator by two companies shows the wisdom of having one incinerator for each company, in which case the company commander can be held strictly accountable for its condition at all times.

Each afternoon was devoted to recreation and athletic sports. This added much to the enjoyment and content of the men and furnished the necessary relaxation from drills, etc.

A regimental post exchange was conducted by First Lieutenant Thomas M. J. Enright, Battalion Adjutant, and all peddlers were excluded from camp. In this way the men were supplied at reasonable prices with tobacco and sundries that go to make a soldier's life more pleasant. The balance of the proceeds, after paying expenses and supplying prizes for athletic events, was credited to the regimental fund.

Great improvement was shown by the troops during the ten days' encampment but there is always room for a better observance of military courtesy, especially by enlisted men.

The use this year of two instead of four horses for the field transportation made it impossible to have the wagon train in camp promptly. Experience has proven that where only two horses are used many delays occur, especially on grades and the rate of march of the wagon train is not fast enough to keep up with the troops.

As a whole the camp was very satisfactory and the improvement in all branches of training was most gratifying.

Great praise is due Lieutenant Edwin Butcher, U. S. A., for the able manner in which he has conducted the instruction in this as well as previous camps. The state is to lose the services of Lieutenant Butcher during the coming year and this loss will be greatly felt by the National Guard of Maine. During the three years that he has been on duty with the troops of this state he has won the esteem of both officers and men for his excellent instruction and untiring efforts for their comfort and welfare and I wish at this time to express to him my sincere appreciation of the many courtesies shown me during the past year.

The Ship's Company Naval Reserve performed its annual tour of duty on board the battleship Rhode Island during the period July 25-August 8, inclusive. The commanding officer of the ship commends the officers and men of the Reserve for the excellent manner in which they performed their duties. During the past year the number of officers in the Naval Reserve has been increased from seven to ten and the number of enlisted men from one hundred and seven to one hundred and seventy-three. The Reserve is now in excellent condition and credit is due Commander Dyer for bringing his command up to its present high state of efficiency.

OFFICERS' CAMPS OF INSTRUCTION.

A camp of instruction for all officers of Infantry, except chaplains, and all officers of the Medical Corps and officers of the Staff departments who had pursued the prescribed course of instruction during the winter, was held at Augusta, June 9-13, inclusive. There were present forty-three Infantry officers and eight Medical officers. The instruction of the Infantry officers was under the direction of Lieutenant Edwin Butcher, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor, assisted by Lieutenant Ralph R. Glass, U. S. A., Military Instructor at the University of Maine. The instruction of the Medical officers was in charge of Major James Robb Church, Medical Corps, U. S. A. In addition to the officers attending this school, there were several students from the University of Maine and I recommend that a number of students be permitted to attend these camps of instruction each year.

A camp of instruction for the officers of the Coast Artillery Corps, who qualified in the Basic, Range and Communication and Battery Commanders' courses prescribed in General Orders No. 166, War Department, 1911, was held at Fort Williams, November 1-8, inclusive. The officers attending were:

CHANGES IN THE MILITARY LAW.

It will be necessary at the next session of the Legislature to amend Section thirty-six, The Military Law, changing the rank of officers in the several staff departments to conform with the requirements of the War Department, under Circular No. 8, Division of Militia Affairs, 1913. The following changes in rank will be necessary: The inspector general from colonel to major; the chief commissary transferred to the quartermaster corps with rank of major; the judge advocate and chief of ordnance from lieutenant colonel to major. In accordance with the provisions of Circular No. 8, the above changes in organization become effective January 1, 1914, but owing to the fact that only biennial sessions of the Legislature are held in this state the Secretary of War, upon request, granted an extension of time until the Legislature had its opportunity to act, as indicated by the following communication from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs:

"Office Chief Staff, Div. Mil. Affrs., Oct. 21, 1913—To The Adjt. Gen. Maine:

"1. Returned, with the information that the Secretary of War will extend the time specified in Circular No. 8, Division of Militia Affairs, current series, in so far as it applies to the officers serving in the staff departments of your State, until the legislature has had an opportunity to make the rank of officers of such corps or staff departments conform to the requirements of the federal law.

"2. Where there is an evident intent on the part of the authorities to comply with these requirements (and it is under-

stood that every effort will be made in this case to induce the legislature to make suitable provision) it is the desire of the War Department to extend to them every possible facility.

"It must, however, be remembered that should the legislature fail to make provision for the officers in question, the War Department will be unable, after a suitable time has been allowed for action, to recognize such officers for federal purposes.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

The camps of instruction for Infantry and Medical officers should be continued with the addition if possible of a camp of instruction for non-commissioned officers of Infantry each year.

As far as possible arrangements should be made to enable the several companies of the Coast Artillery Corps outside of Portland to receive the benefit of the new dummy armament and equipment that has been installed in the Portland armory.

THE FOLLOWING CHANGES IN THE MILITARY LAW ARE RECOMMENDED:

That Section 8 be amended so that the aides on the staff of the Commander-in-Chief shall be detailed from the commissioned officers of the active militia.

That Section 36 be amended to conform to the requirements of Circular No. 8, Division of Militia Affairs, 1913, by creating new staff departments and changing the rank of officers.

That whenever it appears in The Military Law the words "Naval Reserve" be changed to "Naval Militia," in order to conform to the regulations of the Navy Department.

That the legislature be asked to continue the appropriation made in 1913 for the purpose of securing the names and records of the officers and men who served in the United States Navy during the Civil War.

In addition to the articles listed there is on hand a miscellaneous supply of furniture and hospital stores purchased from time to time for use of the Medical Department, but not of standard pattern. There is also on hand one ambulance of obsolete pattern, complete with harness and appendages.

REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL.

I herewith present my annual report for the year 1914. As has been the case in prior annual reports this report will be more or less general inasmuch as special reports have been forwarded from time to time as the various organizations have been inspected.

ARMORIES.

There has been but little change in the condition of the armories throughout the State since my last report. During the year a change of quarters has been provided the 7th Company, C. A. C. This change effected a great improvement in the accommodations for this organization giving a larger drill space, more room for the care of clothing and equipment, better offices, and more adequate heating and lighting facilities. These improvements are largely due to the enterprise of company organizations which assumed a large portion of the expense in connection therewith.

Extensive alterations and improvements in the armory of the 12th Company, C. A. C., Westbrook, make it the best armory in the State. The company occupies two entire floors of the building in which it is located, one being used for a drill hall and gallery range and the other for company rooms, offi-

cers quarters, property and locker rooms, meeting hall, toilets and baths. Telephone service is in every room and the quarters as a whole are model ones.

Artillery equipment is now being installed in the Portland armory, but as yet the installation is incomplete.

The need of suitable armories in the State has long since become an old story. Municipalities either cannot or will not afford means to relieve this embarrassing condition, and the only relief seems to be in the suggestion heretofore made by me, that of a state owned and controlled system of armories.

CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT.

The equipment of the militia improves from year to year. During the year the new pattern overcoat has been issued to the Infantry. Some method by which shoes for field service might be issued to the members of the militia without expense to them, to be used by them solely for military purposes and forming a part of the equipment, is suggested as one very necessary step towards the completion of the equipment. All organizations are now supplied with the O. D. blankets.

There appears to be some improvement in the care of clothing and equipment in the armories, but when on duty, the average enlisted man shows a disposition to neglect his clothing. At inspections the larger part of the service clothing appeared badly grease stained and otherwise dirty. This is particularly noticeable in the Infantry where practice marches are taken as a part of the camp program and individual cooking required as a part of the instructions. The appearance of the service clothing is further marred by the custom of carrying in the pockets of the clothing oil for use in the care of the rifle.

The dress clothing is in fair condition although the dress coats are beginning to show the effects of wear at the right shoulders due to the chafing in carrying the rifle.

CARE OF THE RIFLE.

Attention to the care of the rifle is more marked. With few exceptions they are to be found in good condition. This condition is due alone to the vigilance of company commanders and efficient quartermaster sergeants. Excelling all other

organizations in this respect is Capt. Charles H. Norton's Company F, Second Regiment, whose rifles appear in perfect condition. Others worthy of special mention are 6th Company, C. A. C., Sanford, Company D, Second Infantry, Norway, and the Third Division, Naval Reserve, Rockland.

The Eleventh Company, Coast Artillery Corps, having fallen below the required standard of efficiency was disbanded by General Orders No. 10, A. G. O., June 26, 1914.

CAMP OF INSTRUCTION IN RIFLE PRACTICE.

The annual Camp of Instruction in Rifle Practice was held at the State Rifle Range in Auburn, September 21-25, under the provisions of Special Orders No. 96, A. G. O., c. s.

Colonel James L. Moriarty, Inspector General, was detailed to command the camp.

1st Lieut. James W. Hanson, 2nd Inf., Ordnance Officer.

Officials and Range Officers reported to the Camp Commander Monday, September 21st.

Camp was made on the same land as last year, the work being done by civilian employees organized into a provisional company under command of Captain William C. Bryant, C. A. C. The work of making the camp was completed Monday. The camp guard for the entire tour was furnished by a detail from the Fourth Company, C. A. C.

Tyro Teams arrived in camp Monday afternoon and evening and were assigned to quarters by the Camp Adjutant. Cots,

mattresses and pillows were supplied each competitor upon arrival by the Camp Quartermaster.

The company tyro team match started at 7.30 A. M., Tuesday, and was completed in the afternoon of the same day.

The Company Teams arrived Tuesday, the match for these teams being scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday. This match was completed Thursday noon.

The Artillery-Infantry Match was shot Friday and completed at noon.

Ranges for individual matches were open during the entire tour when not in use for team matches.

Cease firing sounded at 2.30 P. M., Friday, when all matches were declared closed.

Prizes were awarded the successful competitors and camp was broken late in the day.

Perfect weather conditions prevailed during the entire tour which greatly aided in the success of the camp.

The system of messing was the same as in previous camps,—a general mess under the supervision of the Chief Commissary. This did not prove as satisfactory as heretofore due to the fact that the cooks were not accustomed to work in camps of this kind.

The Medical Officer reported daily on the sanitary condition of the camp. Reference to these reports show the sanitary conditions to have been good. The discipline throughout the camp was good. The appointment of an experienced coach to accompany each company tyro team is recommended. Details of the various matches may be had by referring to the report of Capt. Frank E. Drake, Second Infantry, Statistical Officer.

NAVAL MILITIA.

The enlisted strength of the Ship's Company, Naval Reserve, has been increased to fifty-three men to a division with an additional officer to each division. The various divisions are now recruited to the required strength. The Third Division was unfortunate in the attendance at the annual inspection. This lack of attendance was accounted for in the occupations followed by many of the men preventing their attendance. The First and Second Divisions appeared at inspection with almost perfect attendance. These organizations display a most com-

mendable spirit resulting in enthusiastic and efficient work, a splendid personnel, largely resulting from the untiring efforts of Lieutenant Commander Reuben K. Dyer.

CAMP OF INSTRUCTION FOR COAST ARTILLERY CORPS.

As heretofore the only opportunity for observation of the work of this branch in actual service work was gained in connection with the Governor's visit to camp. This visit occurred on a day in which only the routine camp life was being followed, a change in the program being necessitated by the efficiency of the Corps in accomplishing their program earlier than anticipated. The tour of inspection disclosed a marked improvement in attendance, efficiency and strength in this branch of the service, resulting in most flattering results at the annual tour of duty.

ANNUAL TOUR OF DUTY, SECOND INFANTRY.

The annual tour of duty of the Second Infantry was held at Augusta, August third to twelfth. This being the year for joint maneuvers with the Regular Army, Colonel Charles G. Morton, 6th U. S. Infantry, with Company B of that regiment were ordered for duty at this camp. Colonel Morton commanded the camp. Three U. S. Army officers were detailed for duty with the regiment as instructors and were assigned, one to each battalion.

The program of instruction for this tour was arranged by Lieut. Edwin Butcher, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor of the Second Infantry and approved by Col. Morton.

This program was similar to that followed last year consisting of company drills, close and extended order, and battalion drills in the forenoon, fire problems, battalion parade and guard mount in the afternoon. In the fire problems and parades the battalions alternated. In addition to this instruction in camp the regiment participated in a practice march and field problems leaving camp Thursday morning. A problem in advance guard was taken up en route and successfully worked out. The regiment arrived at the Sturgis farm at about noon where camp was made.

Friday forenoon was devoted to instruction in digging model kitchen pits, sinks and fires and construction of hasty intrenchments. This work was very well done and a great improvement over that of last year. At eleven o'clock the regiment left camp and halted on the road at noon for instruction in individual cooking, each man cooking his own meal. This was exceptionally well done. March was then resumed and the problem of attack and defense taken up. This was performed by the various companies under command of the First Sergeants, the Company officers acting as observers. Cultivated fields interfered somewhat in the execution of this problem but on the whole the results were satisfactory. This completed the work for the day.

The regiment broke camp early Saturday morning returning to camp at Augusta. The results of this field work were highly satisfactory. This was due largely to the shortened length of the march from that heretofore taken and the experience gained in the work of last year. On account of the shortened march there was but little complaint of sore feet, the men suffered little from fatigue, and consequently entered into the various problems with fine spirit and enthusiasm.

Regimental inspection was held Tuesday, August eleventh, and was made by the Inspector-Instructor. The results of the inspection disclosed the equipment in good shape. Owing to continued foggy weather the rifles were in somewhat rusty condition and not in the usual good condition as at prior inspections. With very few exceptions the army shoe was worn. The haversacks carried by Companies D and K in addition to being old and obsolete were in poor condition. The knives and forks of Company I appeared old and rusty. The policing of the camp was well done. The incinerators were not up to the standard and as a result did not give proper satisfaction. A shortage in the issue of wood further interfered with the proper working of the incinerators. The best of discipline was maintained throughout the tour and received the highest commendation from Colonel Morton. The detraining and entraining was done according to schedule. The cars were found to be clean and well supplied with good water.

GENERAL REMARKS.

Continued improvement has been disclosed at inspections in the care of books, papers and records. Attention to orders heretofore issued as to the handling of company funds has been followed almost without exception. The percentage of attendance at inspections has compared favorably with past years. However, a lack of recruited strength was apparent in many of the organizations of the Second Infantry. One reason given for this was the fact that instead of the usual out-of-the State maneuvers which were due this year, the tour was conducted at the State camp-grounds. The opportunity of mingling with the troops of other states has always acted as an inducement to recruiting and this opportunity being lacking this year seriously hampered commanding officers along this particular line. A falling off in efficiency and general strength was altogether too apparent at inspections, but these conditions seemed to have been overcome when the various organizations appeared at camp for the annual tour of duty.

The State is to be complimented on the personnel which composes its militia. The work now demanded of the officer and enlisted man exacts the best type.

In order for the commissioned officer to retain his office, it is necessary that he be not only physically qualified, but that he also possess sufficient mental qualifications to enable him to reach and maintain a higher standard than has obtained in earlier years. Especially is this true of the officers holding com-

missions in the Coast Artillery Corps. Of them is required the necessity of passing examinations prepared by the War Department. These examinations are based upon a course of studies prescribed for the officers. Failure to attend to the study of the courses laid out necessarily means failure at examinations followed as a matter of course by the elimination of the delinquent officer from the service. With the advanced standard for officers comes also a corresponding higher standard for enlisted men. Intelligence in the enlisted man is as necessary as physical strength. With these two qualifications being striven for and being gained, it might well be said that the condition of the militia is satisfactory.

In compliance with Special Orders No. 86, A. G. O., dated July 30, 1914, I attended the joint maneuvers of the Second Infantry and Company B of the Fifth United States Infantry at Augusta, Maine, in August, 1914.

The subsistence stores were handled entirely by the Regular Army quartermaster, and the only advantage I gained from the tour was the experience of watching the quartermaster in his work. The same was true of officers in the Second Infantry assigned to the subsistence department, as all of the work was performed by the quartermaster and enlisted men of the Regular Army. I believe this was a mistake inasmuch as these tours are held for educational purposes and unless the National Guardsmen are allowed to do the work, they profit very little. Stores should have been issued to the Second Infantry as a unit and thereafter handled by Second Infantry officers and enlisted men.

I also acted as mess officer for general headquarters, accounts for which were rendered and paid through the Adjutant General's office.

I attended the State Small Arms Competition at Auburn, Maine, Sept. 21-25, 1914, under Special Orders No. 96, A. G. O., dated August 28, 1914, as subsistence officer. All accounts for expenses for subsistence for this tour were rendered through and paid for by the Adjutant General.

The following is submitted as my annual report for the year ending December 31, 1914.

PERSONNEL.

No changes have occurred in the personnel of the Medical Corps during the past year.

EQUIPMENT.

Clothing and equipment for two detachments of the Hospital Corps is on hand and in excellent condition.

We have two complete regimental infirmaries, one at Norway (C. A. C.), the other at the store house in Augusta; this latter belongs to the 2nd Infantry. Both are so arranged that they can be shipped for any part of the State in an hour's time, in case of emergency.

INSTRUCTION.

Under direction of the Adjutant General I continued the Correspondence School for Medical Officers commenced last year. I divided the questions into two sections, the first section thoroughly covered the Examination of the Recruit and all Medical

Reserve Corps officers were urged to take up the course and nearly all did so, and in some notable cases they also answered the questions given in the second section which was devoted to the mobile units of the Medical Department in the field. The officers of the Medical Corps were required to answer both sections. Later in the course the second section contained problems in paper work.

The instruction of the Hospital Corps at the annual encampment of the 2nd Infantry, as given by Clymer B. Long, First-Class Sergeant, H. C., U. S. A., from Fort Williams, was extremely valuable in every respect and I can not too strongly urge that if possible his services be secured as instructor for both detachments during the coming summer.

ASSOCIATION MEETINGS.

On August 29th I recommended that Majors Kendall and Towne of the Medical Corps be detailed to represent the State at the annual meeting of the Association of Military Surgeons of the United States, to be held at Cincinnati, September 28-October 2. They report a very interesting and instructive meeting.

TYPHOID PROPHYLACTIC.

About 80 per cent of the officers and 15 per cent of the men comprising our two regiments have received the typhoid prophylactic up to the present time. Effort will be made to continue the work as rapidly as possible.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

No. 1. That questions on sanitation and care of troops be included in the papers of all officers being examined for promotion.

2. That the services of a sergeant of the hospital corps, U. S. A., be secured for the instruction of the members of the hospital corps attached to the 2nd Infantry and Coast Artillery Corps of this State, during the encampments of these regiments the coming summer.

No. 3. That certain changes and improvements be made at the State grounds before the next annual encampment as indicated in my report under date of August 15, 1914, on the Camp of Instruction for the 2nd Infantry, August 3-12, 1914

This decided falling off in the Naval Militia standing is due, I believe, to lack of range facilities for all the Portland organizations, though with this handicap, the Coast Artillery Corps did better this year than last. The loss of a possible 20% of its figure of merit in the Second Regiment Infantry is due to the failure of the commanding officers in Companies A and H to make returns, in spite of repeated requests from this office,

and at least two reports to you of the failure. This fact added 102 to the divisor in making the regimental figure of merit with no qualifications to offset it.

PISTOL PRACTICE.

This year is the first year for practice with the Colt Automatic .45, and the practice was conducted under the regulations with the regular army dismounted course. Thirty men qualified, more than half of them as experts; of the thirty nineteen are officers; the pistol practice was on the whole, considering that the automatic is a new weapon to most of us and the course

entirely new, satisfactory, but more men, especially more officers should qualify.

1. *In the Coast Artillery Corps.*

I have received returns of Small Arms Firing from all the organizations in the Coast Artillery Corps. I regret to inform you that no organization has complied with that condition of the deed of gift which reads; "No unit can be considered as a prize winner which has not shot the minimum number of men allowed to the unit * * * ", in this case 66 men. Therefore there is no winner in the Coast Artillery Corps.

2. *In the Second Regiment Infantry.*

I have had returns from all organizations except Cos. A, E, H, I, and L. Of those received no organization has shot 61 men, the number required by the deed of gift. Therefore there is no winner, though Company B has shot 60 of the 71 borne on the rolls during the season.

3. *In the Naval Militia.*

All the divisions have made returns, but no division has shot the required number of men. As is the case with the land forces, no division of the Ship's Company is entitled to one of the trophies.

While it may not be entirely proper, I desire to mention in this connection that for the season of 1915 the conditions have been materially changed and I hope the two trophies presented to this State may be awarded to two organizations in the State.

I enclose herewith a copy of the report to the War Department and the same report separately of the firing in the Ship's Company Naval Militia.

NAVAL RESERVE OF THE STATE OF MAINE

Subject: Report of National Naval Militia Association of the United States at Washington, D. C., March 16, 1914.

1. In accordance with instructions from the Adjutant General's Office dated March 5, 1914, the Commanding Officer of the Maine Naval Militia proceeded to Washington for the meeting of the Naval Militia Association.

2. The meeting was called to order at 10.30, March 16th in the New Willard Hotel. All states with a few exceptions were represented; the Naval Militia Office by Commander F. B. Bassett, Jr., U. S. N.

3. The Naval Bill H-R8667 recently passed by Congress and which is now a law was taken up by sections and discussed at length by the delegates in conjunction with Commander Bassett.

4. Section 2 relative to size of a Naval Militia unit was generally conceded to be 55 or 56 men and three officers, Lieutenant, Lieutenant J. G., and Ensign; not more than 80 maximum and not less than 41 minimum. 56 men and three officers is in conformity with the U. S. N. regulations and was recommended.

5. It was generally thought that the term "Maine Naval Militia" or whatever state it was in which the militia was located was the best name for all organizations and the United States desires that they shall be so called.

6. Section 16-17, that an inspector-instructor from the Navy be detailed to each organization on request from the Governor of a state and that a standard regulation for organization, discipline, training, armament and equipment be adopted by the Naval Militia; that the officers have three years in which to qualify for their position by progressive examinations.

7. It was the opinion of the Naval Militia Office that the Commanding Officers have to devote too much time to paper work which should be left to men of less ability and that they did not have time enough to train and plan for drilling their men.

8. They are of the opinion that more attention should be given to Ship Routine and to Ship and Gun Drills and less to Landing Force. The whole meeting was instructive to Commanding Officers and a great deal of information was gathered by myself relating to Naval Militia work.

Subject: Report of Annual Cruise, Maine Naval Militia.

I herewith submit the following report of the annual cruise of the Ship's Company Naval Reserve of the State of Maine.

1. In accordance with Special Orders No. 83, issued from The Adjutant General's Office July 16, 1914, ten officers and one-hundred and forty-five men reported on board the U. S. S. Rhode Island at 4.00 o'clock P. M., Saturday, July 25th, 1914.

On board ship was one Battalion of Connecticut, one Battalion of Rhode Island, and one Division of Missouri Naval Militia.

The entire Ship's Company on board the U. S. S. Rhode Island consisted of about twelve hundred men, including the regulars. Quarters were rather cramped for so many officers and men, but sleeping accommodations and messing arrangements were admirably handled by the Ship's officers.

2. The ship left Portland Sunday, July 26th, bound for Halifax, where we arrived on Monday afternoon and left for Newport, R. I., on Thursday, July 30th. During the stay in Halifax shore liberty was given officers and men and the visit to a foreign port was greatly enjoyed by them. I think shore liberty in some town or city away from the men's home port is one incentive that gets them to sea.

After landing the Rhode Island Militia in Newport, the ship sailed Monday morning, Aug. 3rd, for Gardiner's Bay for target practice by the Maine, Connecticut, and Missouri Naval Militia. Each State handled both the ship and guns for their own practice.

On Aug. 6th we landed the Connecticut and Missouri Militia at New Haven, Conn., and Aug. 7th, proceeded to Portland, arriving about 5 o'clock P. M., on Saturday, Aug. 8th, a cruise of fifteen days.

3. We had fine weather, one gale of wind, plenty of fog, and the rest fair weather. During the heavy weather coming from Nova Scotia to Cape Cod, our own, as well as the other Naval Militia, were suffering more or less from that annoying but not fatal sickness which attacks nearly all landsmen on their first trip on rough water.

4. Instruction to the officers in Navigation and Gunnery was the best we have ever had and the ship's officers were very courteous and painstaking toward us.

The men had a lot of instruction in handling the guns and a great deal of experience in boat work, beside regular drills on ship, as "General Quarters", "Abandon Ship", "Collision and Fire Drills."

Our officers and men compared very favorably with the other State Militia in bearing, discipline, gunnery and seamanship. Our gunnery was weak this year by reason of poor spotting and also trouble with the deflection gear on two guns.

Our boat drills were excellent both with sail and oars.

Officers and men took to their work with earnestness and zeal.

5. The plans formulated on the U. S. S. Alabama in 1913 were followed by the U. S. S. Rhode Island and I, from my own experience in battleships, think this was the very best training possible for the Naval Militia, and the tour of duty for fifteen days was vastly more beneficial than eight days as heretofore. The only criticism that I should make was the large number of officers and men on one ship, which gave the men hardly time enough to practice gunnery, which is the fighting end of the ship, for without good gunners the ship is not much good.

To my mind, however, this cruise of 1914 was by far the best the Maine Naval Militia has ever had and I only wish that we could repeat it in 1915. I consider that a battleship is by far the best place to train the Naval Militia, and I especially recommend that the period be at least fourteen days.

3. Corps and Regimental commanders will direct members of the field, staff, non-commissioned staff and enlisted men not attached to companies or detachments to report in person at the most convenient point. Officers of any arm of the service resident in or nearby a city or town at which an organization of any other arm of the service is stationed may be ordered to report at the inspection of such organization. In such cases the Corps or Regimental Commander will send copy of his instructions to both the inspecting officer and commanding officer of the organization concerned. Corps and Regimental Commanders are authorized to issue necessary orders attaching officers or enlisted men temporarily absent from their home station to any other organization for muster.

4. Blank forms will be supplied from this office through Corps and Regimental headquarters to all commanding officers. All officers concerned are directed to study carefully the entire form and be prepared to give full, prompt and accurate information on all points covered.

5. Uniform for inspection is prescribed as follows: Enlisted men will wear the service coat, breeches, leggins, russet shoes, campaign hat and hat cord with cartridge belt, bayonet and scabbard. Commissioned officers will wear service uniform with campaign hat, hat cord, leggins and side arms. Overcoats, blankets, ponchos, shelter-halves, olive drab shirts, canteens, haversacks, mess kits, intrenching tools and other articles of personal uniform and equipment will be inspected with the property. The inspection of property will be made during daylight and will include all property in the possession of organizations which are articles of dress uniform, and of field and camp equipment, and which are necessary for armory instructional purposes. Particular attention will be given by the inspecting officers to the condition of small arms, and to the adequacy of cleaning facilities and material. During the inspection of property the responsible or other commissioned officer should be present with a sufficient detail of men to handle the same. In order to expedite the work, the property should be previously assorted and neatly arranged for inspection, all unserviceable property being separated from the serviceable. No exception having been made to Officers' equipment and U. S. Manuals in this year's instructions from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs, this property must be shown to the inspecting officer.

In connection with this inspection, attention is especially directed to the following instructions to inspecting officers from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs: "Verbal statements of organization commanders will not be accepted as evidence of compliance with Section 18 of the Militia Law; only properly kept and authorized records presented to the inspecting officer will be considered. If there are no records or

if the information cannot be obtained from such records as are kept, a proper notation ('No record,' or 'Record incomplete'), will be made by the inspecting officer. In no case will the figures be estimated or approximated.

"With a view of determining, as far as practicable, the efficiency in indoor instruction of organizations inspected, the War Department desires that organizations be formally inspected and given such exercises in drill and other forms of indoor instruction as inspecting officers consider necessary."

As this inspection is made to determine whether the Organized Militia of this State is uniformed, armed and equipped for field service, commanding officers will make certain that they have on hand IN THE ARMORY READY FOR INSPECTION the necessary field service uniforms, arms and equipment for the established minimum enlisted strength which is fifty-eight (58) for a company of infantry and sixty-three (63) for a company of coast artillery. All non-commissioned staff officers and enlisted men not attached to companies or detachments must present for inspection all articles of field service uniform, arms and equipment for which they are responsible.

6. When the reports of the inspecting officers show that the arrangement of property for inspection has been generally satisfactory, company commanders or other officers detailed to represent them at the inspection of property and company quartermaster sergeants will be allowed pay at State rate for one day. Claims for same should be promptly submitted on Form 33 but no payment will be made to any commanding officer or quartermaster sergeant if the report of the inspecting officer shows that he has failed to follow with reasonable care the instructions given in preparation of property for inspection.

In accordance with section 19, The Military Law, the Inspector General will proceed forthwith to make the annual inspection for 1914 of the several organizations of the active Militia, giving not less than ten days' notice to the commanding officer of each organization of the date fixed for the inspection of his command, which notice shall be promptly acknowledged to the Inspector General direct.

UNIFORM.

All organizations will parade for inspection in dress uniform. Enlisted men will not wear the breast cord.

MILITARY PROPERTY.

All military property must be in the armory on the day of the inspection. All uniform lockers will be systematically and uniformly arranged and will contain only the military property issued. All other military property will be conveniently arranged for this inspection.

All unserviceable property will be separated from the serviceable. Rifles will be thoroughly inspected and all found in an unsatisfactory condition will be reported by number.

BOOKS AND RECORDS.

A careful inspection of all books, papers, order files and company records will be made and their condition reported. Specific reports will be made upon the condition of the following books and records:

Retained copy of last property return, file of descriptive and assignment cards, correspondence book, document file, order file, retained copies of monthly return (form 47) beginning January, 1913, roll book, company record book, target record book and treasurer's book.

The following instructions for the preparation of books and records will be observed:

Property returns will be kept up to date by entering all invoices and transfers of property since "last return."

Descriptive cards for every enlisted man will be filed so that file of descriptive and assignment cards will be complete.

Briefs of all official correspondence since last State inspection to be entered in the correspondence book.

Document file to contain a copy of all official documents numbered to correspond with correspondence book.

General order file series of 1913 complete, series of 1914 complete to date.

Roll Book to contain the record of attendance at each drill or other meeting for instruction.

Company record book to contain a record of each business meeting of the company and company orders.

Target record book to contain a complete record of target practice for the season of 1913.

Company treasurer's book to be balanced to date of inspection and audited by the Company Council as provided in G. O. No. 5, A. G. O. series of 1912; bank deposit book showing the amount to the credit of the company with vouchers for all expenditures, to be presented.

HOURS OF INSPECTION.

Armories, books and records will be inspected during the day of the date set for the inspection of each command. Companies will be formed for inspection promptly at 8 o'clock P. M., unless otherwise directed by the Inspector General. Attention is invited to Paragraphs 98, 745 and 748, Infantry Drill Regulations, 1911, relative to inspection.

Commanding officers will see that all property, quarters, books and records are ready for inspection on the afternoon of the date set for inspection and will assist in the inspection and verification of military property.

Companies will be inspected as to their efficiency in drill in school of the squad, close and extended order and such company movements as the size of the drill hall will permit; and the efficiency of officers and non-commissioned officers as instructors.

EXECUTIVE CHAMBER.

AUGUSTA, February 24, 1914.

It becomes my painful duty to announce to the people of Maine the death of former Governor Joshua L. Chamberlain at his home in Portland, Maine, on this day. Funeral services will be held at Portland, on Friday, February 27, 1914, at 10.00 A. M.

Governor Chamberlain was born in Brewer, September 8, 1828, the son of Joshua and Sarah Dupee (Brastow) Chamberlain. He received his early education in the public schools of Brewer and later in Major Whiting's military academy at Ellsworth where he prepared for West Point. He entered Bowdoin College, however, in 1848 and graduated in 1852 with highest honors. He entered the Union Army in 1862, being commissioned lieutenant colonel of the 20th Maine Infantry. This regiment was assigned to Butterfield's famous Light Brigade, Morell's Division, Porter's 5th Corps, Army of the Potomac, and immediately entered upon the severe experiences of the Maryland Campaign. Re-joining the main army in Virginia early in November of that year, the history of his service from that time on is a part of that of the Army of the Potomac. He was promoted colonel May 20, 1863, awarded a Congressional medal of honor for daring heroism and great tenacity in holding his position on Little Round Top, and carrying the advanced position on Great Round Top, at the battle of Gettysburg, July 2, 1863. He was also recommended by all his superiors for promotion to the rank of brigadier general. This promotion was not made but Colonel

Chamberlain was immediately placed in command of his brigade and from that time forth he held a command above his lineal rank. June 18, 1864, for meritorious and efficient service on the field of battle and especially for gallant conduct in leading his brigade against the enemy at Petersburg, in which he was dangerously wounded, General Grant promoted Colonel Chamberlain on the field to the rank of brigadier general, the only instance in the history of our army. General Chamberlain made a record in all the arduous and trying campaigns through which he passed honorable to himself and to the State. During his period of service he commanded troops in twenty-four battles, reconnaissances and skirmishes without number and in advance and rear guards in contact with the enemy upwards of a dozen times. With his own command alone he fought several independent engagements, every one successful, capturing in battle 2700 prisoners and 8 battle flags, no portion of which can be claimed by any other command. He was six times wounded in action, three times narrowly escaping with his life.

On returning to Maine at the close of the war he resumed his professorship at Bowdoin College but in 1867, in recognition of his distinguished service and ability he was elected Governor of the State and was re-elected the three following years. After his retirement from the office of Governor in 1871 he was elected president of Bowdoin College and served in that capacity for twelve years. He resigned in 1883. In 1876 he was commissioned major general of the State militia and was in command at the capitol during the political troubles in January, 1880. In 1878 he was appointed commissioner to the Universal Exposition at Paris, France, for which service he received a medal of honor from the French Government. In 1900 he was appointed by President McKinley surveyor of the port of Portland, which position he has since filled.

As a mark of respect to his memory, the National flag will be displayed at half-staff on all public buildings, including armories of the active militia, until sunset on day of the funeral.

GIVEN at the Executive Chamber at Augusta, this twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and thirty-eighth.

1. The season for small arms practice for 1914 will begin on Patriot's Day, April 19, 1914, and end on October 31, 1914.

2. The course will be the "Courses for the Organized Militia" Part V, Small Arms Firing Manual, 1913, as modified in G. O. No. 6, A. G. O., State of Maine, series 1913, EXCEPT:

3. Rifle Experts of record for 1913 will be carried on the returns as Experts for 1914, without shooting the course. Sharpshooters and Marksmen of record for 1913 will not be required to shoot the Instruction Practice course but if Sharpshooters fail to qualify at least as Marksmen or Marksmen fail to requalify in the three trials allowed, they must shoot the Instruction Practice to entitle them to be carried as first or second class men.

4. On receipt of this order, each company and division commander will appoint by company order one member of his command as "Company Instructor of Small Arms Practice." The order making this ap-

pointment will be forwarded through usual channels and one copy will be mailed direct to the Chief Ordnance Officer, Brunswick. After the appointment has been made, the Instructor of Small Arms Practice may correspond direct with the Chief Ordnance Officer on all matters concerning Small Arms Practice. This does not prohibit or preclude company commanders from appointing themselves to these positions.

5. After a company instructor of small arms practice has been appointed, a range keeper will be appointed by the Chief Ordnance Officer, after consultation with company commanders. Announcement of range keepers and the rates and details of payment will be made at the School for Officers of the Coast Artillery Corps and Second Regiment Infantry, and will be communicated to commanders of divisions of the Ship's Company Naval Reserve.

6. New target record sheets are being prepared which will simplify the keeping of records of Small Arms Practice and the rendering of returns. The manila score cards used in 1913 will be issued hereafter with perforations for ease in filing and will be kept accessible for reference. If commanding officers have score cards on hand they should improvise perforations in them till they are used. The keeping of the file of score cards, the target record book and the rendering of required returns should be assigned to the company instructor of small arms practice appointed under paragraph 4 of this order.

7. The pistol course published in G. O. No. 6, A. G. O., State of Maine, series 1913, will be followed with the service pistol, cal. .45. Until the pistol is issued to the troops, officers will not be allowed to qualify.

8. Company commanders should remember that both Instruction and Record Practice must be shot for the Du Pont trophies. Under the deed of gift, for the details of which see G. O. No. 6, A. G. O., State of Maine, series 1912, no hold-over qualifications are allowed.

I. ENLISTMENTS PRIOR TO ENCAMPMENT. In order to be eligible to receive federal pay at an encampment of the National Guard an enlisted man must have had not less than 60 days' service in the Organized Militia (of this or any other state or territory or the District of Columbia), including at least fourteen periods of practical progressive military instruction of at least one and one-half hours each, or an equivalent service in the Regular Army, Navy or Marine Corps, or one academic year's service at a school where military instruction is given. (Cir. No. 2, D. M. A., 1913.) In accordance with the foregoing no man not eligible to federal pay under conditions set forth above will be permitted to attend any encampment of the National Guard in July or August, 1914, without permission from this office. All requests for permission to take to camp men ineligible to federal pay will be made through channels and will set forth in detail the reason for asking such permission.

II. COAST DEFENCE EXERCISES. The following organizations of the National Guard are designated to take part in Joint Coast Defence Exercises at Fort Williams in the Artillery District of Portland, July 16th-25th, inclusive, 1914:

Headquarters, band and twelve companies, Coast Artillery Corps, with attached post-noncommissioned staff officers.

Officers of the Medical Corps and Hospital Corps Detachment assigned to Coast Artillery Corps.

The Commanding Officer, Coast Artillery Corps, will issue necessary orders to carry this into effect.

III. SHOES FOR FIELD SERVICE. For the purpose of supplying enlisted men of the National Guard of this State with serviceable shoes for the summer field service, commanding officers are authorized to contract with responsible parties to supply such shoes, but contracts will not be made for other than the "Herman," "Bass" or "Foss-Packard" shoe without special authority from this office. Commanding officers will deal direct with the manufacturer or his agent and not

through this office. The basis of payment will be as follows: \$1.00 per pair will be paid by the State to the contracting manufacturer or his agent direct. The commanding officer will transmit the balance to the contracting shoe manufacturer or his agent upon receipt of State pay for field service, deducting the amount due from the pay of each enlisted man supplied with shoes under this arrangement. Commanding officers will notify this office of the number of shoes supplied under this order for the enlisted men of their commands but the allowance of \$1.00 per pair to be made by the State will not exceed the number of men actually present for duty for the tour of field service. The entire cost of any shoes in addition thereto must be met from company or other funds. Shoes purchased under this arrangement will become the individual property of the enlisted men at the conclusion of the summer encampment.

IV. MEMORIAL DAY. In accordance with paragraph 444 of the Regulations for the United States Army, on all armories and stations of the National Guard the national flag will be displayed at half-staff from sunrise till mid-day on Memorial Day. At noon the flag will be hoisted to the top of the staff and will remain there till sunset. Organizations of the Naval Reserve will render the honors prescribed by the Regulations for the Government of the Navy of the United States. To assist in the observance of the day by veteran organizations, commanding officers of the National Guard and Naval Reserve will place their commands at the disposal of local representatives of the Grand Army of the Republic on Saturday, May 30, 1914.

2. Corps and Regimental Commanders will direct members of the field, staff, non-commissioned staff and enlisted men not attached to companies or detachments to report in person at the most convenient point. Officers of any arm of the service resident in or nearby a city or town at which an organization of any other arm of the service is stationed may be ordered to report at the inspection of such organization. In such cases the Corps or Regimental Commander will send copy of his instructions to both inspecting officer and the commanding officer of the organization concerned. Corps and Regimental Commanders are authorized to issue necessary orders attaching officers or enlisted men temporarily absent from their home stations to any other organization for muster.

3. Uniform for inspection is prescribed as follows. Enlisted men will wear the service coat, breeches, leggins, russet shoes, campaign hat and hat cord with cartridge belt, bayonet and scabbard. Commissioned officers will wear service uniform with campaign hat, hat cord, leggins and side arms. Dress uniforms, overcoats, blankets, ponchos, shelter-halves, olive drab shirts, canteens, haversacks, mess kits, intrenching tools and other articles of personal uniform and equipment will be inspected with the property. The inspection of property will be made during daylight and will include all uniforms, arms and equipment available for field service or of use in connection therewith or preparatory thereto and which is of the pattern and quality issued to the Regular Army whether the property belongs to the United States or not. During the inspection of property the responsible or other commissioned officer should be present with a sufficient detail of men to handle the same. In order to expedite the work, the property should be previously assorted, and neatly arranged for inspection, all unserviceable property being separated from the serviceable. In connection with this property inspection, attention is especially directed to the following instructions to inspecting officers from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs: "No property not actually inspected will be included in the inspection reports. Commissioned officers having articles of government property in their possession must present the same for inspection. Memorandum receipts will not be considered." Inspecting officers are under special instructions to give particular attention to the day inspection of rifles and pistols and to the amount of cleaning material on hand.

As this inspection is made to determine whether the Organized Militia of this State is uniformed, armed and equipped for field service commanding officers will make certain that they have on hand IN THE ARMORY READY FOR INSPECTION the necessary field service uniforms, arms and equipment for the established enlisted minimum strength which is sixty-five (65) for a company of infantry and sixty-five (65) for a company of Coast Artillery. All non-commissioned staff officers and enlisted men not attached to companies or detachments must present for inspection all articles of field service uniforms, arms and equipment for which they are responsible.

4. When the reports of the inspecting officers show that the arrangement of property for inspection has been generally satisfactory, company commanders or other officers detailed to represent them at the inspection of property and company quartermaster sergeants will be allowed pay at State rates for one day. Claims for same should be promptly submitted on Form 33 but no payment will be made to any commanding officer or quartermaster sergeant if the report of the inspecting officer shows that he has failed to follow with reasonable care the instructions given in preparation of property for inspection.
