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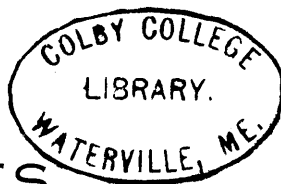

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled:—*

In accordance with the provisions of Section 7 of Chapter 147 of the Public Laws of 1907, the Auditor herewith submits to the Legislature a full and accurate statement of the financial condition of the State and of the financial transactions thereof for the two years ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1914.

Full tabulations as given show the bonded debt and other liabilities as well as resources as they existed January 1, 1913, January 1, 1914 and December 31, 1914.

In addition, the cash in the treasury of general funds has increased from \$457,128.65 on hand January 1, 1913 to \$728,353.23 on hand January 1, 1915, a gain of \$271,224.58 for the two years.

This has been done notwithstanding the fact that the tax rate was reduced one half mill for the two years, and the appropriations increased over \$1,500,000.00, principally for public improvements for schools, highways, agriculture, etc., for the same period.

All bills presented have been paid or money reserved for payment and there will practically be no deficiency for the years 1913 and 1914. The cash in treasury and taxes due will pay all liabilities of the State except trust funds, and leave a balance in favor of the State of \$336,842.19.

There has been no temporary loan during the two years.

Under Chapter 217 of the Public Laws of 1913 all bills of State Institutions including the State Prison are now paid direct from the State Treasury after being audited. This change of auditing and paying of the State accounts together with the great additional run of bills from the State Highway Department paid weekly, has increased the work in the State Auditor's office over fifty per cent, all of which has been done without extra help. This has been made possible by the efficient clerks in the State Auditor's office, every one of whom is an expert in his or her line, all working faithfully together as a unit.

The Auditor has impressed upon the heads of all departments and state institutions to render bills promptly and take all discounts. This system has resulted in a large saving to the State, from a small amount in some departments, to about \$1,000.00 for the Augusta State Hospital during the past year. During the last year by an act of the Legislature the funds known as the "Lands Reserved for Public Uses" has been adjusted and the report will be presented to the Legislature for their consideration and approval early in the session.

The interest derived from trust funds of institutions should be made carrying accounts in favor of those institutions, as the donors intended, and should not be allowed to lapse at the end of the year.

I would recommend that an act be passed whereby the interest on the funds due the plantations for Lands Reserved for Public Uses shall be paid in January of each year without waiting for a call from the several assessors who sometimes neglect to make the application. This can best be done through the State Superintendent of Public Schools Department sending the names of all plantations with amount due to the State Auditor's office early in January of each year, so that the same can be put into the first warrant paid in January of each year.

The receipts of the Boards of Dental Examiners, Bar Examiners, Embalming Examiners, Optometry, Commissioners of Pharmacy, Medical and Veterinary Boards, should be made carrying accounts.

I would recommend that an inventory of all state property be taken and account of same be kept in the State Auditor's office.

During the past two years the accounts of all state institutions have been examined and in this connection I would recommend that all persons handling state money of any amount should be bonded. I would call attention to the fact that the clerks in the office of Secretary of State, handling the receipts from automobile accounts, which amounted to over \$192,000.00 during the year 1914, are not bonded.

The Legislature of 1913 having by law adjusted the Penobscot Indian Trust Funds, and the conditions of the Lands Reserved for Public Uses Fund reported, I would recommend that the same may be done regarding the Permanent School Fund.
