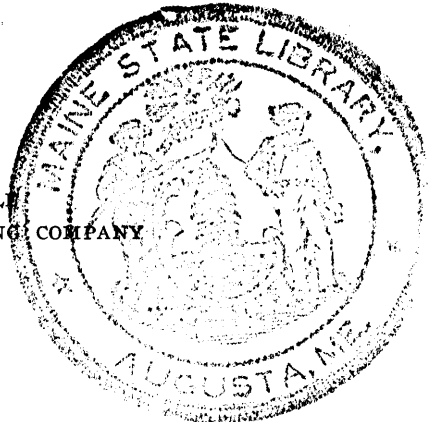
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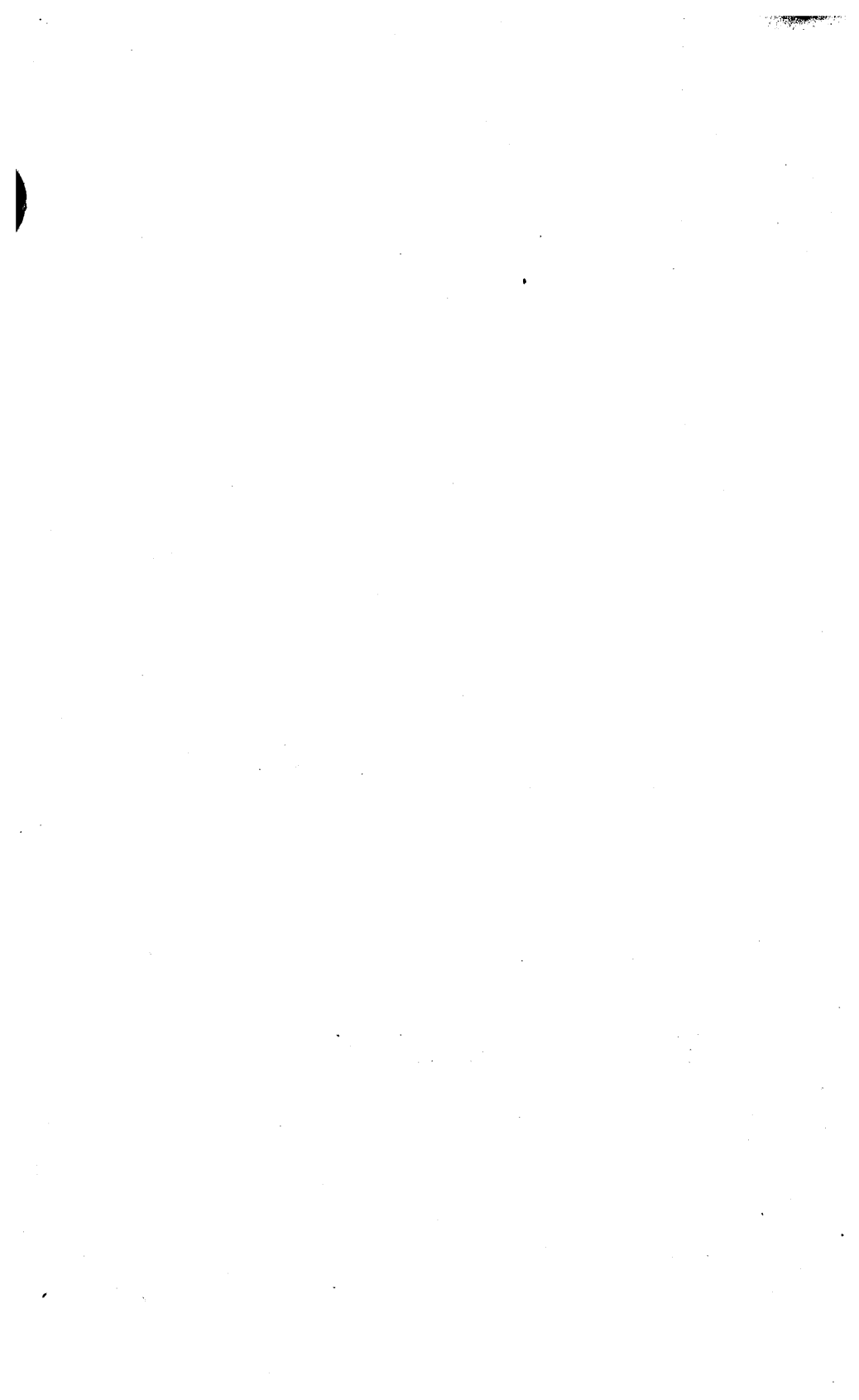

AUGUSTA, December 31, 1913.

The Governor and Commander-in-Chief, Augusta, Maine:

SIR:—In accordance with the provisions of The Military Law, I have the honor to submit the report of this office for the year ending December 31, 1913.

In submitting this report it should be prefaced with the statement that I was appointed to office November 1st, 1913, succeeding that most efficient officer, General Elliott C. Dill, who resigned and was placed on the retired list November 1st, 1913, having served as Adjutant General from May 1, 1909. Great praise is due General Dill for the able manner in which he conducted the military affairs of the State and in bringing the National Guard of Maine to its present high standard of efficiency.

GOVERNMENT PROPERTY.

Maine is one of the few states having a clean balance sheet with the federal government in the matter of government property. The National Guard of Maine is as well equipped as the guard of any state in the country. All property is in good condition and of the latest issue, except the old style blue overcoat, which will be replaced with the new olive drab coat during the coming year.

ARMORIES.

The armory question is one of the serious problems confronting the National Guard of Maine today. While there has been some improvement in armories during the past year, there are still a great many companies that should be provided with better quarters. In December, 1913, the city of Portland voted to donate the armory building in that city to the State, the transfer

being made December 8. Extensive repairs have been made and the building is now in excellent condition. Within the next few months the federal government will install a new dummy armament in this armory at a cost of about \$60,000. The Seventh Company, Coast Artillery Corps, at Biddeford, have moved into new quarters which are a great improvement over the old armory. The Twelfth Company, at Westbrook, have secured new quarters and now have the best armory of any company in the State. In the Second Infantry, Company E, of Skowhegan, and Company K, of Farmington, have moved into new armories and now have fine quarters. Companies C, of Livermore Falls, and I, of Eastport, have made extensive repairs on their armories. The companies at Sanford and Brunswick should be provided with better quarters at once. A new armory commission was appointed in November and a meeting will be called as soon as possible when the matter of providing better armories will be taken up.

INSTRUCTION.

Theoretical instruction for officers of the Medical Corps, Coast Artillery Corps and Infantry has been carried on through correspondence schools as in former years. The school for medical officers was conducted by Lt. Col. Bial F. Bradbury, Chief Surgeon, for artillery officers by Captain Henry M. Merriam, Coast Artillery Corps, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor, and for infantry officers by 1st Lieut. Edwin Butcher, Infantry, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor.

Under the provisions of General Orders No. 166, War Department, December 13, 1911, the following officers and enlisted men of the Coast Artillery Corps of this State have successfully passed the required examinations and received certificates of proficiency from the Chief of Coast Artillery, U. S. A., in the courses listed below.

CAMP OF INSTRUCTION.

A camp of instruction for all officers of Infantry except chaplains and all officers of the Medical Corps and officers of the Staff Departments, who had pursued the prescribed course of instruction during the winter, was held at Augusta, Maine,

June 10-14, inclusive. There were present: infantry officers, 37; medical officers, 8. The instruction of the infantry officers was under the charge of 1st Lt. Edwin Butcher, Infantry, U. S. A., the Inspector-Instructor. The instruction of medical officers was in charge of Lt. Col. Bial F. Bradbury, Medical Corps, N. G. S. M. The program of instruction was varied and comprehensive and kept the officers employed from six A. M. until six P. M., with conferences in the evening.

A camp of instruction for the officers of the Coast Artillery Corps, was held at Fort Williams, June 15-19, inclusive, under the direction of Captain Henry M. Merriam, Coast Artillery Corps, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor.

ENCAMPMENTS.

The annual encampment for the Second Infantry and attached medical personnel, was held at the State campground, Augusta, August 4-13, inclusive.

This year a change was made in the usual program of instruction. The regiment with its own transportation complete, with three days' rations and campaign allowance of baggage, took the field. A march of thirteen miles was made the first day and the regiment went into camp near Vassalboro. The second day was spent in camp and the third day the regiment returned to its permanent camp at Augusta. In spite of its length the conduct of the march was excellent. During the march problems in advance and rear guard and the attack and defense of the convoy were held. During the day spent in camp the troops were instructed in entrenching, digging of latrines and incinerators. In the forenoon a problem in attack and defense was held. The regiment profiting by its experience in the Connecticut maneuvers made and broke camp in a very efficient and satisfactory manner.

Another change in the program was the introduction this year of a fire problem by companies, in which the troops used ball ammunition and fired upon surprise targets. The officers and men took keen interest in this feature of the camp work and a percentage worked out by taking the amount of ammunition fired, hits made, and number of figures struck, gave a good idea of the relative efficiency of the various companies. The camp

this year was one of the most satisfactory yet held for the Second Infantry. The reports of the Commanding Officer of the Second Infantry, Chief Commissary and Chief Surgeon give detailed accounts of this tour of duty.

The encampment of the Coast Artillery Corps was held at Fort Williams, July 17-26, inclusive, and the entire Corps was camped together for the first time. This resulted in a uniformity of instruction for the entire Corps, which I believe has done a great deal to increase the efficiency of these troops. The work of the Coast Artillery Corps of Maine during this tour of duty has been highly commended by the War Department.

The Ship's Company Naval Reserve performed its annual cruise on the battleship Alabama during the period August 11-17. The report of Lieut. Com'd'r Reuben K. Dyer furnishes a detailed statement of this tour of duty.

In conclusion I would call your attention to the reports of the different departments published elsewhere in this report. As my term of office has been for a period of two months only, I will not attempt at this time to make any recommendations. Another report from this office is due before the next meeting of the legislature and I will defer any recommendations until that time.

I herewith submit my annual report.

As in the case of earlier annual reports this will be more or less general, due to the fact that detailed reports on the various organizations have been furnished your office from time to time according as these organizations have been inspected.

ARMORIES.

In previous reports I went into detail in regard to needed improvements in the various armories throughout the State. The tour of inspection revealed some much needed improvements in some of the armories. New quarters have been furnished Company B of Rumford. These are located in a rather small hall on the second floor of a building on the main street, and appear to be clean, well heated and well lighted. Although these quarters are a great improvement over those heretofore occupied by this organization, yet the lack of sufficient space for drill purposes and for the proper care of clothing and equipment is a serious drawback.

During the year much needed repairs were made on the building owned and occupied by Company I of Eastport. A new hard wood floor has been laid in the main room used for a

drill hall. A smaller room on the same floor has been converted into a locker room used for the storage of clothing and equipment. An attic room has been finished off and is now used as an amusement room. The building has been painted throughout the interior, and the quarters are now a vast improvement over former conditions.

I had occasion in my last report to criticise the quarters of Company K of Farmington as being entirely inadequate for the purposes of the company. This criticism no longer applies. Since my inspection the company has been provided with new quarters in a building formerly used as a skating rink. It appears to be an excellent proposition for an armory. There is abundant room for officers' quarters and for the proper care of company property. The building also furnishes generous space for drilling purposes—something lacking in nearly every armory in the State.

The Portland armory is now under the care of the State.

The City of Lewiston now holds a lease for a term of five years of the quarters used by the 8th and 9th Companies, C. A. C. Since the execution of the lease much needed repairing has been done. New floors have been laid and much needed painting has been done. The city has also generously met the expense for the installation of a plotting room and telephone booths.

A system of State owned armories seems to be the only solution of the great bugbear that now afflicts the militia. Municipalities do not seem to be inclined to realize the importance of a well trained, well disciplined militia. At least this would seem to be indicated in the quarters which they are compelled to furnish the various organizations in their midst. So long as these conditions obtain; so long as the cramped, in attractive quarters are dignified with the name of "armory," just so long will the endeavors of the company officers to build up and hold a representative organization continue to be a struggle.

CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT.

Inspections have disclosed a continued improvement in the care of clothing and equipment. This condition attests the conscientious and careful work of commanding officers of organizations, many of whom are embarrassed in endeavoring to per-

form their duty along these lines by the painfully inadequate facilities given them with which to work.

The excellent system used in the care of clothing and equipment in the armories has been very favorably commented upon by federal inspecting officers who have volunteered the information that the clothing and equipment of other organizations in other states with vastly superior facilities do not disclose the same care and attention as that of our own.

Care of the rifle is a subject that has been preached for many years. It is a part of the curriculum of the soldier. It has been put into actual practice, and we now have the rifles of the militia in better condition than ever before. Of course there may be here and there an exception to the general good condition of rifles, but these exceptions are so rare as to cause surprise.

SPECIAL INSPECTIONS.

A tour of inspection usually discloses unsatisfactory conditions here and there. The inspections of this year were no exception to the rule, although the conditions spoken of were not nearly so prevalent as heretofore. Unsatisfactory property conditions and lack of keeping company records properly were the causes for the ordering of a special inspection of Company H, Second Infantry. Special inspections were also ordered in the cases of the 8th Company, C. A. C., and the 11th Company, C. A. C.,—the first because of the unsatisfactory condition of the military property and the questionable personnel of the company, and the latter because of the enlisted strength having fallen far below that required as well as the small attendance at the regular inspection. More or less improvement was noted in each case.

CASUALTIES.

Company E, Second Infantry, having fallen below a suitable standard of efficiency at the time of inspection was disbanded by G. O. No. 10, A. G. O., May 7, 1913. A new company has been recruited since the disbandment which has been mustered in and assigned to the Second Infantry as Company E.

CAMP OF INSTRUCTION IN RIFLE PRACTICE.

A camp of instruction for rifle practice was held at the State Rifle Range in Auburn, September 22-25, under the provisions of S. O. 98, A. G. O., c. s.

Colonel James L. Moriarty, Inspector General, was detailed to command the camp. The following officers were detailed for duty as officials:

Lieut. Col. John J. Dooley, Ord. Dept., Chief Range Officer,

Lieut. Col. Blaine Owen, Sub. Dept., Commissary,

Maj. Gilbert M. Elliott, Ord. Dept., Statistical Officer and Adjutant,

Maj. William C. Goodwin, Ret., Quartermaster,

1st Lieut. Delbert M. Stewart, Med. Corps, Medical Officer.

It was deemed advisable to lease a tract of land adjoining the range for a camp site, thus allowing the entire range to be used for firing. The idea proved to have been an excellent one.

Camp was made under the most unfavorable weather conditions, the work being done by civilian employees under the supervision of Capt. Ara Cushman, Jr., C. A. C. Range officers and company tyro teams reported in camp Monday afternoon and evening. Rain interfered with the second day's program although the program for the day was eventually completed. The company team matches, Artillery-Infantry matches, and the individual matches were all completed according to schedule. After the completion of the firing on the last day of camp, prizes were awarded to the successful competitors and the camp was broken late in the day.

The discipline throughout the camp was good. The sanitation was properly observed. A gratifying feature of this camp was the substantial increase in the number of competitors as compared with prior camps. The various matches were entered into with keen competition and the results obtained bespeak a healthy prospect for this important feature of militia work.

The details of the various matches can be had by reference to the report of the Statistical Officer, Major Elliott of the Ordnance Department, herewith appended.

NAVAL MILITIA.

The First and Second Divisions of the Naval Reserve are in better condition than at any time in its history. The Third Division of the Naval Reserve, never a healthy or enthusiastic organization, has shown some improvement during the past year. There remains, however, abundant room for improvement along the lines of enthusiasm and interest such as will manifest increased attendance at drills and a higher standard of efficiency.

CAMP OF INSTRUCTION FOR THE COAST ARTILLERY CORPS.

The Inspector General was not assigned for duty with the Coast Artillery Corps during their annual tour of duty. Opportunity for observations was restricted to the ceremony of Parade and Escort of Color, which occurred Sunday, and also to a further observation the following day while accompanying the Governor on his official visit to the camp. The companies had complete charge of the guns and their working. This was the first time that this control was given. The ensuing results were eminently satisfactory, the work proving far superior to that of prior years. The entire program was under the supervision of the regular Inspector-Instructor.

ANNUAL TOUR OF DUTY, SECOND INFANTRY.

All the companies of the Second Regiment of Infantry, with the exception of Company E, reported for duty at the camp at Augusta, August 4th. Owing to the recent organization of Company E, orders to report August 9th, were issued. An inspection of the cars used in transporting the troops disclosed the same clean and orderly and also supplied with drinking water. After detraining the troops immediately marched to the camp grounds, where each company pitched its own tents in a heavy rain. This work was effected with dispatch. The program of instruction for this tour was excellently arranged and well carried out. The instruction for Tuesday and Wednesday mornings consisted of company and battalion drills in close order and company drills in extended order. The work was divided into three periods of forty-five minutes each with a like interval between each instruction. The entire program was under the supervision of Lieutenant Butcher, Inspector-Instructor.

tor, aided by one Sergeant-Instructor assigned to each battalion

The afternoon instruction consisted of a fire problem for one battalion followed by battalion parade and guard mount. Guard mount was done by companies. In the fire problems and the battalion parades, the battalions alternated.

Thursday a practice march was participated in by the entire regiment. The regiment departed from camp with full field train for a three days' tour. This was the first time in this State that a regiment of Infantry undertook a tour of this sort with full field equipment. The results on the whole were excellent. Advance guard problems were taken up en route and worked out to the satisfaction of the Instructor. Camp was established late in the afternoon after a thirteen mile march from the camp at Augusta to the Perley Farm in Vassalboro. Friday of this tour was devoted to instruction in digging model kitchen pits, sinks and the building of kitchen fires. Instruction was also given in the making of hasty entrenchments, also individual cooking. This line of instruction was of the greatest value to the regiment and was well performed. The afternoon's program consisted of an attack and defense problem which was of great interest. Outposts were established Friday night and Saturday morning camp was struck and at six o'clock the regiment prepared to march to Augusta. On the return march, the problem for solution was the attack and defense of convoy and rear guard. This did not seem to work out satisfactorily. On account of the length of the march the men were tired, lacked enthusiasm, and many suffered from sore feet. If similar tours are to be had in the future, it is suggested that the length of the march be not more than six miles. Men from the shops, offices and stores are in no condition to undertake such a fatiguing march as that undergone at this encampment, and only such results as actually happened can be expected if attempted. Camp was made in good order about noon Saturday. Sunday was devoted to regimental parade and guard mount only. The program for Monday and Tuesday was the same as for the same days the week before. Monday afternoon was devoted to athletics and regimental parade. The entire regiment was inspected Tuesday by the Inspector-Instructor. The inspection showed the regiment to be in a good condition, well equipped, and the equipment in good condition. During the

afternoon, the second battalion completed its fire problem. The exercises for the day were completed by parade by the first and second battalions. Wednesday was devoted to the breaking of camp and the returning of the various companies to their home stations according to schedule. As before suggested, Company E of Skowhegan did not report with the other companies, it being deemed advisable owing to its recent formation to have them report at a later day. The company was not in condition for field work. A Sergeant-Instructor was detailed with this company and during five days' tour made excellent progress.

Owing to the excellently arranged program, with its division of work, this encampment proved of more interest than usual. It is doubtful if more valuable work has been accomplished in any previous camp. The discipline of the troops was excellent as a whole. No complaints against the conduct of the troops were lodged, and only the most favorable comments were heard as to the conduct of the regiment while on the practice marches. The drilling of the regiment was very good, that of the first day in camp excelling that of any other first day. Special mention should be made of the excellence of the work of Company A in close order drill and that of Company I in extended order.

The policing of the camp was generally good although capable of improvement in some of the company kitchens and streets. Guard mount, with the exception of that of two companies, was not well executed. Doubtless, this was due to the lack of instruction in this ceremony for the past few years. The regiment is rated by the national government as one of the best equipped in the country.

GENERAL REMARKS.

Steady improvement in the care of books, papers and records has been disclosed at the inspections. Attempts at uniformity in the system of keeping records are bearing good results, and with here and there an exception, the results are very satisfactory.

More or less stress has been laid upon the appearance of organizations at inspections in past reports. The criticisms seem to be productive of good. A very marked improvement

has resulted. There is still room for many of the organizations to improve upon their attendance at inspections. Full attendances are to be desired. It is absolutely impossible to determine the efficiency of an organization where the attendance is lacking. Experience has shown that many of the company commanders make special efforts to gather their full strength, while others are not, or at least seem not to be, fired with much enthusiasm along those lines. It has been the experience of the Inspector General to receive the greatest courtesy from the different company commanders. These courtesies have tended to make his work of inspection much easier by having the various company properties so arranged as to take the least time in their examination. Their time has been freely given and this without recompense of any kind.

The personnel of the officers in the Coast Artillery branch of the service includes a larger percentage of qualified officers than any other like organization in the country. The War Department has prescribed the courses of study for these officers. Examinations upon these courses are held semi-annually. Faithful application to study produces good examinations. Hence the excellent rating of the Coast Artillery officers.

Complimentary notices have appeared from time to time in the reports from this office regarding the condition of the militia. These notices have been honestly made and have been founded upon thorough observation. Perfection in military organizations is to be hoped for; to demand it would be unreasonable. Suffice it to say that with the system under which the militia is now working, the results are about all that can be desired. The different branches will compare favorably with like branches in other states. A marked improvement is shown in the standard of the officers and men; valuable work is being seriously accomplished; interest and enthusiasm are markedly present.

Tables of attendance at inspections for this and the past year are herewith appended for the purposes of comparison.

REPORT OF THE CHIEF COMMISSARY.

NATIONAL GUARD OF THE STATE OF MAINE.

Subject: Annual report.

The following report of this office for the year 1913 is submitted, in accordance with Section 22, The Military Law of the State of Maine.

Under S. O. No. 79, A. G. O., July 9, 1913, proposals for bids for commissary supplies were issued in accordance with Section 27 of The Military Law, for the encampment of the Second Infantry at Augusta, August 4-13, 1913. The contracts this year were the best that have been secured during my eleven years' service and in spite of the constantly advancing price of food stuffs the cost of the ration this year was very slightly in excess of that of 1911.

Under S. O. No. 99, A. G. O., August 18, 1913, I was detailed as commissary officer at the State Small Arms Competitions at Auburn in September.

Under orders from the Governor and Council I acted as subsistence officer on the occasion of the Maine Veterans visiting Gettysburg at the 50th anniversary of the battle.

I most respectfully urge that The Military Law be changed at the next session of the Legislature in such manner that organi-

zations on duty at the State encampments be allowed cash savings from the commissary.

I would also recommend that the commanding officer at the State encampments request the officers assigned to companies to mess from the kitchens of their respective organizations. Too much importance cannot be made of the necessity of company officers maintaining a most intimate knowledge of the messing of their enlisted men. Under the present custom all the officers enjoy excellent messes and of course this is good from a social standpoint. It has come to my notice many times however, that a majority of the company officers do not know what the conduct of their kitchen is, how well or poorly the menu is prepared nor how economical or wasteful their cooks may be. This Department intends that the men shall be as well fed as they are at home and for that reason the quality of subsistence stores issued is always of the very best to be purchased, the quantity issued is according to regular army standards and that it is more than enough is attested by the fact that fifty percent of the organizations make savings. Should the officers mess as suggested, I have no doubt the men would be better satisfied and I believe that all the organizations would take away savings. The most expensive messes this year were the worst and this is always so. Where the subsistence officers found waste and extravagance they found also dirt and men dissatisfied with their food.

I wish to compliment the officers and also the enlisted men who served in this Department during the past year for their excellent work and loyal interest.

The following is submitted as my annual report as Chief Surgeon for the year ending December 31, 1913:

PERSONNEL.

During the past year the following changes have occurred in the personnel of the officers of the Medical Department.

MEDICAL CORPS.

Captain John G. Towne promoted to Major, January 3rd.

First Lieutenant Harry R. Farris promoted to Captain, July 14th.

First Lieutenant Edson E. Goodrich promoted to Captain, July 24th.

Henry E. Marston, M. D., commissioned First Lieutenant, February 15th.

MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS.

George A. Coombs, M. D., commissioned First Lieutenant, June 5th.

E. Motley Fuller, M. D., commissioned First Lieutenant, August 22nd.

Michael J. O'Connor, M. D., commissioned First Lieutenant, August 29th.

First Lieutenant George Shorkley resigned July 28th.

First Lieutenant Thomas N. Drake resigned August 20th.

EQUIPMENT.

The members of the hospital corps are fully equipped for field service. We have two complete regimental infirmaries, one at Augusta (2nd Inf.) and one at Norway (C. A. C.) Both are so arranged that they can be shipped immediately in case of need. We also have on hand extra supplies to expand the infirmaries into regimental hospitals if required.

INSTRUCTION.

Under direction of the Adjutant General, I conducted a Correspondence School for Medical Officers during the months of January, February, March and April. The course covered: Organization and Duties of Medical Officers, Sanitation in Camp and in the Field, Paper Work, Mobilization, and the Medical Officer in active service—on the march and in combat—a five days' Field School was held at Augusta in June for Medical Officers, in connection with the 2nd Regiment Officers' School. A review of the work done in the correspondence school was taken up and a number of problems in connection with the Infantry Officers made a very interesting and instructive session.

GETTYSBURG ANNIVERSARY.

In accordance with instructions from the Governor to make necessary arrangements for medical attendance in connection with the movement of Civil War veterans from this State to Gettysburg, Pa., and return, on occasion of the Fiftieth Anniversary Exercises of the Battle of Gettysburg, July 1-4, 1913, I arranged with Major Clarence F. Kendall and First Lieutenants Harry R. Farris and Delbert M. Stewart of the Medical Corps and one sergeant and seven men of the Hospital Corps to accompany me on the veterans' special train, leaving Port-

land, June 28th, and returning July 5th. All necessary supplies for the sick or injured were provided. Through the trip officers and men made every effort to serve our State's honored guests and make their journey comfortable and pleasant.

ENCAMPMENT OF THE 2ND INFANTRY, AUGUSTA, AUGUST 6-10.

To my mind the greatest practical good attained from this encampment was the camp at the Perley farm under field conditions. I have but two suggestions to make: one, that the water supply be more fully protected by guards on the stream above the point selected for drinking purposes; the other, that the company sinks be constructed promptly. This is an important matter and should receive the attention of the company officers immediately on arrival in camp. Many of the men suffered from sore and blistered feet. The shoes were of approved pattern but in nearly every case I found that they were not properly fitted, or had been worn but a day or two before camp. I believe this condition is entirely unnecessary and as each company commander has been furnished with Major Munson's excellent work, "The Soldier's Foot and the Military Shoe," that he should be held responsible.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION OF MILITARY SURGEONS.

During September 16-19, I attended the Annual Meeting of the Association of Military Surgeons at Denver, Col. The meeting was well attended and the sessions very interesting and instructive. The City of Denver and the local physicians showed us every courtesy, and the Adjutant General of Colorado and his officers arranged to make our stay a most enjoyable one.

TYPHOID PROPHYLAXIS.

An earnest effort has been made by the medical officers to encourage protection from typhoid fever by the use of Typhoid Prophylactic. All officers and men of the Medical Department, nearly one-half of the officers of the 2nd Infantry and Coast Artillery Corps and about 100 men have already taken the

treatment, and I have reason to believe that a good proportion of the Guard will be protected before the close of the coming year.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

1. That a sergeant of the Hospital Corps, U. S. A., be detailed with the Hospital Corps of the 2nd Infantry and Coast Artillery Corps during their annual encampment as an instructor, special attention being given to paper work and customs of the service.
2. That questions on sanitation and care of troops be included in the examination papers of all officers up for promotion.
3. That prior to the annual encampments a lecture be given each company of the 2nd Infantry and Coast Artillery Corps by a Medical officer assigned to that regiment, the lecture to embrace the essentials of sanitation, personal hygiene, first aid and the proper fitting of shoes and care of the feet.
4. That no member of the Guard be ordered from the State on military duty who has not received the Typhoid Prophylactic, or has had the typhoid fever.

The Portland organizations still have no home range, but the City of Portland made an appropriation which provided railroad and street car-fare to the Auburn range for the troops stationed in Portland including the Naval Reserve. Tenage was shipped to the range, and the squads under suitable supervision went into camp there for their rifle practice. Bath also has no range, but the City of Bath made a similar though smaller appropriation to send the members of the 4th Company, C. A. C. to Brunswick. These arrangements were successful, and I recommend the same plans for next year if the appropriation can be obtained.

REVOLVER PRACTICE.

Not much work has been done with the revolver; not nearly enough qualifications have been made to account for the expen-

diture of ammunition. I hope with the issue of the pistol, next year will show a great improvement.

STATE RIFLE TEAM.

The tryout for a State of Maine rifle team to represent the National Guard in the National Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio, was held on the State Range in Auburn, June 25th and 26th. The communication from the Camp Commander which follows gives the work of the tryout and its result.

This will inform you that in accordance with Special Orders No. 72, June 20, 1913, your office, I assumed command at the range in Auburn, Tuesday, June 24th and the officials and a number of competitors reported in camp.

Firing commenced at 8.00 A. M., June 25th, and continued till 5.30 P. M., with an hour for intermission for dinner. On the 26th firing began at 7.30 A. M. Camp was broken during the afternoon.

Owing to pressure of business in some cases, and the lack of 75% duty in others, only twenty-one (21) competitors reported for trying out. These were given four strings of 600 yards slow fire, two strings of 1000 yards slow fire, three strings of surprise fire at 200 yards and three skirmish runs.

SPECIAL REPORTS.

ENCAMPMENT, SECOND INFANTRY, AUGUSTA, MAINE
AUGUST 4-13, 1913.

NATIONAL GUARD, STATE OF MAINE

HEADQUARTERS SECOND INFANTRY,

HOULTON, December 20, 1913.

I herewith submit the following report of the duty performed by the Second Maine Infantry, August 4-13, 1913, as per Par. IV, G. O. No. 9, c. s. General Orders both A. G. O. and Regimental, also program as carried out are herewith attached. Attention is also drawn to the Diary of Operations, attached, for details of the encampment.

2. Troops reported during a heavy rain, but were soon under canvas. I consider the camp occupied this year one of the best laid out in the history of the State. Tentage was ample and in fine condition.

3. The work of the troops was of the best order. Officers and men were interested and enthusiastic. It was clearly proven, though, that the men soon grew tired of close order work. In my opinion they get all the close order drill needed in their home armories and should only have enough of it in camp to enable the battalion commanders to shake their battalions together. Close order is only a means to an end and that end is the extended order or battle tactics. A captain that can hold his men together in the excitement of the advance to an attack is far superior to the one that can put on a pretty close order drill. The oft repeated cry of our old militia days, that close order makes for discipline is simply rot. You might just as well say that the proper training for a locomotive engineer would be that of running a stationery engine.

4. The guard duty was very poorly performed. The sergeant from the regular U. S. Coast Artillery detailed to look after this duty evidently knew very little of what is required or had very little interest in imparting his knowledge.

5. The march to and from the Perley Farm in Vassalboro and the camp there was one of the best things for the Guard that has ever taken place in this State. The regiment showed splendid discipline and its behavior was such that the people in the vicinity of the encampment were loud in their praises. Capt. Perley on whose land we camped, deserves great credit and due consideration from the authorities for his many courtesies and for any land damages that may have occurred.

6. The regiment stood the march very well with exception of the band, a part of which were unable to make the whole distance on foot.

I would limit enlistments in regimental bands to young vigorous men or would do away entirely with the band, hiring one every year when the regiment goes into camp at Augusta.

7. All duties while we were in camp at the Perley Farm were well performed. "A sham battle" was fought on the day of the visit of the Commander-in-Chief and his party and was fairly well done. I most thoroughly disapprove of spectacles of this kind even for the edification of spectators or others as they put false ideas into the heads of the men and serve no good purpose that I can see.

8. I would recommend that in future when horses are hired for transportation service within the State that the contractor be required to furnish the grain ration. The team horses in this State are all accustomed to a larger grain ration than the regulations allow, and under the present system of issue there will always be trouble with the civilian teamsters especially if they own their own teams. It was clearly proven this year that field wagons should never have less than four horses each.

9. Lieut. Butcher, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor, again demonstrated his ability as a teacher of things military. The sergeants from the regular army, with the exception above noted, were of great assistance especially Sergeant Wilson.

10. The train service on the going trip was fair but on the return trip poor. It seems that the Maine Central R. R. think any old cars are good enough for troops. The special train that left Augusta, August 13th, for Bangor was made up of old cars that had been worn out in the service and in fact were dangerous to ride in. In the future, contracts with all railroads should stipulate the kind, number and condition of cars, should plainly state just what is required as to water, etc. A copy of this contract should be in the hands of each train quartermaster.

11. Athletic day, August 11th, inaugurated during the year of 1911, again proved a great success. Under the excellent management of Lieut. D. I. Gould all events were run off without a hitch. I would recommend its continuance.

12. Attention is called to reports herewith attached and especially to the many excellent recommendations contained therein.

ADJUTANT'S DIARY OF OPERATIONS,

ENCAMPMENT, SECOND INFANTRY, AT AUGUSTA, Aug. 4-13, 1913.

Monday, Aug. 4. The several companies, with the exception of the new Company E, arrived at different times and were immediately marched to the campground where tents were drawn and pitched and rations issued for three days. Some of the companies from the Eastern part of the State did not arrive until late. Interior guard was established at 4.30 P. M. by Company A.

Tuesday, Aug. 5: From 7.30 A. M. to 8.15 A. M., company close order drill and battalion close order drill from 9.00 A. M. to 9.45 A. M.

From 10.30 A. M. to 11.15 A. M., company drill in extended order.

At 1.30 P. M., the First Battalion had fire problem at the range.

At 4.30 P. M., battalion parade by the Second Battalion, followed by guard mount, Company L.

Wednesday, Aug. 6: Forenoon; same as preceding day.

At 1.30 P. M., fire problem by the Third Battalion at the range.

Four-thirty P. M., battalion parade by First Battalion, followed by guard mount, Company L.

Thursday, Aug. 7: This was the day for the practice march and at an early hour in the morning wagons were packed with the campaign allowance of tentage, baggage and three days' rations. The regiment was assembled as follows: Band, First Battalion, Second Battalion, Third Battalion, Hospital Detachment and Field Train, and marched to Seward's Mills via Western Avenue, Grove, Water, Bridge and Bangor Streets, leaving campground at 9.00 A. M. A short halt was made on Bangor Street, where an advance guard problem was taken up by the First Battalion. At Seven-Mile Brook, the regiment was halted for lunch, and arrived at the campground on Perley Farm, near Seward's Mills, at 3.00 P. M. The march was about twelve miles and the regiment arrived in good condition, with the exception of the Band, which seemed to be unable to make the march. Camp was made at once and interior guard established by Company C. The regiment was accompanied by The Adjutant General, Inspector General, Chief Commissary and Chief Surgeon.

Friday, Aug. 8: From 7.30 A. M. to 9.00 A. M., instruction was given in digging model kitchen pits, sinks and kitchen fire, by Lieutenant Butcher.

Governor Haines, with a party of friends, arrived about 10.00 A. M. and was taken to the field, where the regiment was being instructed in digging hasty entrenchments. These were finished at 11.00 A. M., and at noon the men cooked their own dinners.

The afternoon was taken up with a spectacular sham battle for the benefit of the guests.

At 4.30 P. M., interior guard was mounted by Company F and the Second Battalion went on outpost duty.

Saturday, Aug. 9: At an early hour camp was broken, wagons packed and the command ready to march at 7.00 A. M. The Band was sent in

by electric cars. A problem of attack and defense of convoy was taken up by the Third Battalion.

On arrival at Augusta the Band rejoined the regiment and the march was continued to the campground, arriving at 11.00 A. M.

Company E., the newly organized company, reported for duty.

At 4.30 P. M., battalion parade by the Third Battalion, followed by guard mount, Company M.

Sunday, Aug. 10: A talk was given by the surgeons on first-aid, with demonstration of use of first-aid packets. This was not very well attended by the officers.

Regimental parade at 4.00 P. M., followed by guard mount, Company H.

Monday, Aug. 11: The forenoon was devoted to company and battalion close order drill, followed by drill in extended order.

The afternoon was taken up with athletics.

At 4.30 P. M., regimental parade, followed by guard mount, Company D.

Tuesday, Aug. 12: From 7.30 A. M. to 8.15 A. M., company close order drill.

From 9.00 A. M. to 9.45 A. M., battalion close order drill.

At 10.15 A. M., the regiment was formed for inspection by Lieutenant Butcher.

At 1.30 P. M., fire problem by Second Battalion at the range.

At 4.30 P. M., parade by First and Third Battalions, followed by guard mount, Company G.

Wednesday, Aug. 13: The regiment broke camp and the several organizations returned to their home stations after the most successful camp the regiment ever had.

Notes: Typhoid vaccine was injected by the surgeons to all officers who cared to take it and most of them took advantage of the same.

Camp was very healthy with very few cases of sickness.

Credit for the success of this camp is largely due to the hard work of the Inspector-Instructor, Lieut. Edwin Butcher, U. S. A.

1. In accordance with Special Orders No. 70, issued from the Adjutant General's Office, June 16, 1913, 6 officers and 88 men of the Ship's Company and 4 mess attendants reported aboard the U. S. S. Alabama at 3.30 P. M., Monday, August 11th, for the annual tour of duty.

2. The Rhode Island Naval Militia was already aboard and with the arrival of the Maine organization, the Ship's Company was made up as follows:

3. The plan of instruction adopted by the Captain of the Alabama was based upon the practical supposition that war had been declared and that the battleship, previously in reserve with a small regular crew, was placed into active commission with a full complement and prepared for battle, manned and officered by a consolidated unit composed of regulars and the two militia organizations. In carrying out this plan, the Ship's Company was so organized that, with the exception of the Commanding Officer, the entire administration of the ship for all drills and emergencies, fell upon the reserve officers.

4. The Alabama left Portland at 8.00 P. M., August 11th, and proceeded to Gardiner's Bay, Long Island, N. Y., arriving at 7.00 A. M., Wednesday the 13th. Upon our arrival in Gardiner's Bay, repair parties immediately set out targets and range buoys in preparation for record service practice with the ship's 3-inch rapid-fire battery. In accordance with a program followed previously by naval militia organizations, both Maine and Rhode Island were to fire five strings of seven shots each for record, without preliminary sighting shots. The first of these five strings was to be fired by a commissioned officer as the first gun-pointer. The ship was to proceed across the base of the range at a speed of 10 knots

per hour, the target being at various ranges exceeding one mile. The firing was done under the regular battle fire-control system, the spotting, range and azimuth finding being computed by observers in the top of the fore-mast, and corrected figures telephoned to the guns every few seconds. Sight setters at the guns kept the guns adjusted accurately as per telephoned instructions, and gun-pointers, through the telescopic sights, maintained the difficult "pointing" necessary to overcome rolling and other movements of the ship. To produce effective shooting, therefore, under these conditions, required quick and accurate action simultaneously on the part of the fire control party, the sight-setters and the gun-pointers.

At 10.50 A. M. the ship came onto the range at standard speed, Maine and Rhode Island shooting alternately. The following records were then completed:

The report of the Chief Umpire, P. L. Holland, U. S. N., credited Maine with a figure of merit of 74.3% hits, Rhode Island with 34.3% hits. Maine's record was declared to exceed by more than 20 points, the highest record (Maryland) made by all other naval militia organizations having completed their record gun practice on the Alabama. Especial credit for excellent results was due the spotter and the first gun pointers.

5. On August 12th, both reserve organizations were stationed and thoroughly instructed for Fire, Collision and Abandon ship emergencies.

On the night of the 13th, the Ship's Company was thoroughly drilled in Torpedo Defense and exercises held to practice the same.

On August 14th regular battery drills were held in addition to special drills for Fire and Rescue and Gun-Cotton Parties.

On the morning of the 14th, pulling contests were held between Maine and Rhode Island organizations in whaleboats and cutters. The race for each type of boat was over a course of about one mile. Rhode

Island won both contests by very narrow margins, the distance between the two cutters at the finish being less than three feet.

6. At 1.00 P. M. on the 14th, the Alabama got under way from Gardiner's Bay for Bradford coaling station. In passing Newport the Alabama fell in with the U. S. Atlantic Fleet U. S. S. Wyoming, flagship. Permission was granted to proceed to Bradford where anchor was dropped at 4.55 P. M. No drills were held in the evening on account of the early hour scheduled for coaling ship the following day.

7. At 5.00 A. M. on the 15th all hands began coaling ship from lighters alongside, Maine on the port side with 448 tons and Rhode Island on the starboard side with 316 tons. Maine, with 12 men less on the lighters, took aboard an average of 6 tons more per hour than Rhode Island. With all coal aboard by 1.30 P. M., "field day" was held, during which every part of the ship is thoroughly scrubbed and cleaned. As a reward of merit a swimming party was granted the men during the afternoon.

8. At 12.25 P. M., August 16th, the Alabama dropped down to Newport where all hands were granted shore liberty from 1.30 P. M. until midnight.

9. At 7.00 A. M., August 17th, the Rhode Island reserves disembarked and at 7.30 the Alabama weighed anchor and proceeded to Portland in somewhat foggy weather. Arriving off Cape Elizabeth about 6.00 A. M., the 18th, the Alabama proceeded cautiously through a heavy fog until Cape Elizabeth light-vessel was picked up at 7.20. Anchor was dropped in Portland harbor at 8.55 and the Reserve disembarked at once.

10. The cruise on the U. S. S. Alabama was the most beneficial and instructive to the Maine Naval Militia of any in which they have taken part.

The idea of the cruise was that the nation was at war with some foreign country and that the Naval Militia were called on to fill up the crew of the reserve ships. It was surprising to see how quickly the Naval Militia lost their identity and amalgamated with the regular crew. I believe that a tour of duty on a battleship is the best possible training which a Naval Militia man can receive, but I think that the time should be at least two weeks instead of eight days. The officers and men just get familiar with the ship and their duties when the time is up. If, however, they had six more days, those six days would serve to fix firmly in their minds the training received, so that on the tour of duty the following year, they could assume their work with a superior knowledge than they now possess at the beginning of cruises.

I would recommend that the plan of organization, routine and orders compiled and arranged by Lieutenant (J. G.) C. C. Gill, U. S. N., and approved by Commander C. F. Preston, Commanding U. S. S. Alabama be followed each year with perhaps some slight modifications which may be deemed better by actual practice.

I desire to give Commander Preston and his officers of the Alabama great credit for this plan, and for their patience, courtesy and good

will towards the Naval Militia. Also, I desire to urge the Navy Department again to carry out this plan on our next tour of duty.

I am pleased to report that the comments of Commander Preston on the personnel of this organization were entirely favorable and most highly complimentary.

REPORT OF LIEUT. COMMANDER REUBEN K. DYER ON
CRUISE TO MEDITERRANEAN SEA.

NAVAL RESERVE OF THE STATE OF MAINE
HEADQUARTERS SHIP'S COMPANY
PORTLAND, January 1, 1914.

1. In pursuance of orders from the Navy Department I reported on October 23rd on board the U. S. S. Wyoming and was assigned to duty on U. S. S. Ohio. I was given the duty of assistant to the Executive Officer and to the Navigator.

2. There were in the fleet bound to the Mediterranean nine battleships, three colliers, one supply ship and one hospital ship.

3. We left Hampton Roads 1.30 P. M., October 25th, and arrived in Marseilles, France, 9.00 A. M., November 8th. We had fine weather on the voyage over, with the exception of a few days off the Azores.

4. Three times a day while on the trip over I worked from observation the position of the ship, and my calculations as a rule were identical or nearly so with those of the Navigator of the U S S. Ohio and also of the Navigator of the fleet. While I do not pretend to be an expert navigator, I feel competent to find my way most anywhere and to act as pilot or navigator along the coast of New England and Long Island Sound. I have had considerable experience both with small and large vessels.

5. My work with the Executive Officer was in line with my position as executive officer of the U. S. S. Alabama last summer and I derived a great deal of benefit from ship drills of all kinds, and of the general routine of a battleship both at sea and at anchor. This experience has fixed them more firmly in my mind than they would have been from annual cruises for the next ten years.

6. On November 30th, I was transferred to the U. S. S. Vermont as the Ohio was ordered to Mexican waters. We sailed from Marseilles December 1st, 6.00 A. M., and I was assigned to duty with the Ordnance Officer. I obtained a great deal of experience relative to this part of a fighting ship and also in the routine of ship duty.

7. December 11th, while 1200 miles from Norfolk, we broke the starboard shaft, putting the starboard engine out of commission. We were left by the fleet in convoy of the U. S. S. Delaware and Collier Orion. December 15th at 6.00 A. M. we broke the thrust bearing of the port engine and we wallowed in a heavy sea until 10.30 A. M. when

the Delaware started to tow us. After one of the greatest feats of towing one battleship by another we arrived at Cape Henry December 19th and at the Norfolk Navy Yard December 20th.

8. It was an experience of seamanship on this voyage back which very few regular naval officers get during a lifetime, and which would hardly happen to a naval militia officer. There is no doubt in my mind but that this trip to Europe was the most beneficial experience which a naval militia officer could have. I found the officers of both ships willing and ready to instruct us in anything which we showed an aptitude to learn. If any officer went to Europe and back on this voyage and derived no benefit, it must have been the fault of himself.

9. I would respectfully request that the Navy Department extend to the Naval Militia an invitation to participate in future cruises.

II. In accordance with Paragraph 2, S. O. No. 295, H. E. D., Governors Island, New York City, December 21, 1912, the inspections

ordered in Paragraph I will be made by the following officers of the regular service:

III. Corps and Regimental Commanders will direct members of the field, staff, non-commissioned staff and enlisted men not attached to companies or detachments to report in person at the most convenient point. Officers of any arm of the service resident in or nearby a city or town at which an organization of any other arm of the service is stationed may be ordered to report at the inspection of such organization. In such cases the Corps or Regimental Commander will send copy of his instructions to both inspecting officer and the commanding officer of the organization concerned. Corps and Regimental Commanders are authorized to issue necessary orders attaching officers or enlisted men temporarily absent from their home stations to any other organization for muster.

IV. Blank forms will be supplied from this office through Corps and Regimental headquarters to all commanding officers. All officers concerned are directed to study carefully the entire form and be prepared to give full, prompt and accurate information on all points covered.

V. Uniform for inspection is prescribed as follows: Enlisted men will wear the service coat, breeches, leggins, russet shoes, campaign hat and hat cord with cartridge belt, bayonet and scabbard. Commissioned officers will wear service uniform with campaign hat, hat cord, leggins and side-arms. Overcoats, blankets, ponchos, shelter-halves, olive drab shirts, canteens, haversacks, mess kits, intrenching tools and other articles of personal uniform and equipment will be inspected with the property. The inspection of all property will be made during daylight and will include all uniforms, arms and equipment available for field service or of use in connection therewith or preparatory thereto and which is of the pattern and quality issued to the Regular Army whether the property belongs to the United States or not. During the inspection of property the responsible or other commissioned officer should be present with a sufficient detail of men to handle the same. In order to expedite the work, the property should be previously assorted and neatly arranged for inspection, all unserviceable property being separated from the serviceable. In connection with this property inspection, attention is especially directed to the following instructions to inspecting officers from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs: "No property not actually inspected will be included in the inspection reports, except officers' equipment and United States' Manuals. Memorandum receipts will not be considered." Inspecting officers are under special instructions to give particular attention to the day inspection of rifles and revolvers and to the amount of cleaning material on hand.

As this inspection is made to determine whether the Organized Militia of this State is uniformed, armed and equipped for field service commanding officers will make certain that they have on hand IN THE ARMORY READY FOR INSPECTION the necessary field service uniforms, arms and equipment for the established enlisted minimum strength which is fifty-eight (58) for a company of Infantry and sixty-three (63) for a company of Coast Artillery. All non-commissioned staff officers and enlisted men not attached to companies or detachments must present for inspection all articles of field service uniforms, arms and equipment for which they are responsible.

VI. When the reports of the inspecting officers show that the arrangement of property for inspection has been generally satisfactory, company commanders or other officers detailed to represent them at the inspection of property and company quartermaster sergeants will be allowed pay at State rate for one day. Claims for same should be promptly submitted on Form 33 but no payment will be made to any commanding officer or quartermaster sergeant if the report of the inspecting officer shows that he has failed to follow with reasonable care the instructions given in preparation of property for inspection.

In accordance with Section 19, The Military Law, the Inspector General will proceed forthwith to make the annual inspection for 1913 of the several organizations of the active Militia, giving not less than ten days' notice to the commanding officer of each organization of the date fixed for the inspection of his command, which notice shall be promptly acknowledged to the Inspector General direct.

UNIFORM.

All organizations will parade for inspection in dress uniform. Enlisted men will not wear the breast cord.

MILITARY PROPERTY.

All military property must be in the armory on the day of the inspection. All uniform lockers will be systematically and uniformly arranged and will contain only the military property issued. All other military property will be conveniently arranged for this inspection.

All unserviceable property will be separated from the serviceable. Rifles will be thoroughly inspected and all found in an unsatisfactory condition will be reported by number.

BOOKS AND RECORDS.

A careful inspection of all books, papers, order files and company records will be made and their condition reported. Specific reports will be made upon the condition of the following books and records:

Retained copy of last property return, file of descriptive and assignment cards, correspondence book, document file, order file, retained copies of monthly return (form 47) beginning January, 1912, roll book, company record book, target record book and Treasurer's book.

The following instructions for the preparation of books and records will be observed:

Property return will be kept up to date by entering all invoices and transfers of property since "last return."

Descriptive cards for every enlisted man will be filed so that file of descriptive and assignment cards will be complete.

Briefs of all official correspondence since last State inspection to be entered in the correspondence book.

Document file to contain a copy of all official documents numbered to correspond with correspondence book.

General order file series of 1912 complete, series of 1913 complete to date.

Roll book to contain a record of each drill or other meeting for instruction.

Company record book to contain a record of each business meeting of the company and company orders.

Target record book to contain a complete record of target practice for the season of 1912.

Company treasurer's book to be balanced to date of inspection and audited by the Company Council as provided in G. O. No. 5, A. G. O., series of 1912; bank deposit book showing the amount to the credit of the company with vouchers for all expenditures, to be presented.

HOURS FOR INSPECTION.

Armories, books and records will be inspected during the day of the date set for inspection of each command. Companies will be formed for inspection promptly at 8 o'clock P. M., unless otherwise directed by the Inspector General. Attention is invited to Paragraphs 98 and 745, Infantry Drill Regulations, 1911, relative to inspection.

Commanding officers will see that all property, quarters, books and records are ready for inspection on the afternoon of the date set for inspection and will assist in the inspection and verification of military property.

Companies will be inspected as to their efficiency in drill in school of the squad, close and extended order and such company movements as the size of the drill hall will permit; and the efficiency of officers and non-commissioned officers as instructors.

The following has been adopted by the War Department as the course in Small Arms Practice with rifle and pistol for the Organized Militia, and is hereby adopted for all troops of the State of Maine, with the modifications herein noted, and is published at this time, in advance of the revision of the Small Arms Firing Manual for the information of all concerned:

(PART V.)

COURSES FOR ORGANIZED MILITIA.

The following courses in Small-Arms Firing are prescribed for the Organized Militia:

General Scheme.

Par. 317. The general scheme of instruction for the Organized Militia embraces: First, a certain amount of instruction in the preliminary drills and exercises, followed by gallery practice, with a prescribed test before the soldier can be advanced to practice on the target range; Second, a definite course of instruction practice, under which, by selected scores of five shots each, a soldier must attain a certain proficiency before he can be advanced to fire the Record Practice, Organized Militia, or the Qualification Course, Regular Army; Third, a definite test, either the Qualification Course, Organized Militia, or the Qualification Course, Regular Army, at the discretion of the State authorities, under which the soldier attains a certain grade in marksmanship; Fourth, Long Range Practice:

Preliminary Drills and Instruction.

Par. 318. (a) The periods for indoor instruction will be determined by the State authorities and may extend into or include the entire range practice season:

(b) The essentials of indoor instruction will include: Nomenclature, covering the most important parts and elements.

Manipulation and use of the various working parts.

Care of the arm.

Gallery practice.

Sighting, aiming, positions and trigger squeeze.

The course to be followed in indoor instruction is laid down in Part II, Chapters 1, 2, 3, 4; but in the discretion of the State authorities, any course embracing the elements given above may be adopted and followed. The recording rifle rod outfit or any other suitable device may be used in such a course.

Gallery Practice.

Par. 319. The principal objects of gallery practice are to continue in a different manner the instruction in aiming, positions and trigger squeeze and to determine, in certain cases, whether or not the individual shall be advanced to range practice.

(a) The following course in Gallery Practice is Prescribed:

Where it is impracticable to use ranges of fifty feet, gallery practice may be conducted at a greater distance at a target whose dimensions and divisions have been proportionately increased. Firing will be by scores of five consecutive shots. Except in case of accident, a score once begun will be completed.

(b) QUALIFICATION IN GALLERY PRACTICE.

No officer or enlisted man who has failed to qualify as first-class or better in a previous season, shall be advanced to range practice until he has attained at least 90 points out of a possible 150 in the gallery practice course, by selecting his two best scores of 5 shots at each range. If a gallery range be not available, the recording rifle rod outfit or sub-target gun machine may be used to determine eligibility for range practice, under similar conditions, when specially authorized by the State authorities. (See Modifications.)

KNOWN DISTANCE FIRING.

Par. 320. The Qualification Course is divided into Instruction Practice and Record Practice.

(a) Instruction Practice embraces:

1. A prescribed course in which a certain proficiency must be attained in certain cases, before qualification practice is undertaken; this course may be shot through as many times as is necessary to insure proper instruction.

2. Such further preliminary practice at any range as is considered necessary to prepare the individual for the record practice.

3. Firing for recruits may be held at 100 yards in any position except standing, but does not count in determining proficiency in the instruction practice.

(b) The Instruction Practice and the number of shots at each range upon which eligibility to advance to Qualification Practice is determined are given in the following table:

1. Each shot is marked in slow fire on Target "D." Rapid fire is conducted as prescribed in paragraph 112 except as to scores. At each range a total of 60 per cent of the possible must be attained before advancement to the next range.

2. After eligibility to fire record practice has been determined according to the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e), the record practice may be preceded by further preliminary practice in the discretion of the State authorities.

3. Firing in instruction practice will be by scores of five consecutive shots. A score once begun will be completed, unless accident or conditions of range weather interfere.

(c) The following grades of classification are obtained in instruction practice by selective scores of five consecutive shots each:

First-classmen	150—possible	225
Second-classmen	130—possible	225
Unqualified	Below	130

(d) No individual shall be advanced to Record Practice until he has attained the grade of first-classman; except as provided in paragraph (e).

(e) During the target season 1913, all who fire shall follow the Instruction Practice; thereafter Instruction Practice will be optional with the State authorities for all who have qualified as Marksmen or better in the season immediately preceding.

RECORD PRACTICE.

Par. 321. After completing the Instruction Practice, those who qualify as first-classmen are eligible to fire the Qualification Course, Organized Militia, or the Qualification Course, Regular Army. (See Modifications.)

The choice of Qualification Courses shall be determined by the State authorities. Both courses may be pursued in the same State in the same season, but the course in regiments or in separate smaller tactical units shall be uniform; provided that an individual who qualifies in the Qualification Course, Organized Militia, as sharpshooter or expert rifleman, may be permitted to fire the Regular Army Qualification Course and qualify therein at the discretion of the State authorities.

Par. 322.

This course may be fired three times in any target season, the individual's classification being determined by the best of his three trials, but this provision shall not be construed to permit the formation of a record based on scores selected from two or more trials—the basis of classification must be the result of one complete course in each case.

(b) Coaching is prohibited in Record Practice after the individual has taken his position at the firing point.

(c) Instruction and Record Practice may be fired on the same day, but Qualification Practice once begun must be completed without further instruction firing.

Par. 323. QUALIFICATION COURSE, REGULAR ARMY.

The Qualification Course of the Regular Army shall be carried out by the Organized Militia with a strict adherence to all conditions and provisions required for the Regular Army, except that Instruction and Record Practice may be fired on the same day, but Qualification Practice once begun must be completed without instruction firing.

Par. 324. PRACTICE FOR COAST ARTILLERY RESERVES.

Special Course "A", as described in paragraph 121, will be fired by Coast Artillery Reserves of the Organized Militia, unless other courses be prescribed by the State authorities. (See Modifications.)

Par. 325. LONG DISTANCE PRACTICE.

After the Qualification Courses have been completed, those men who have qualified as experts and sharpshooters may be given Long Distance Practice at the discretion of the State authorities.

Practice for Record may be preceded by Instruction Practice. Record Practice will consist of any selective score of 10 consecutive shots each. The Practice will be conducted as set forth for slow fire, known distance.

No one will be advanced to practice at 1,000 yards until he has attained a minimum total of 40 points at 800 yards in any score of 10 consecutive shots.

When an individual has attained a total of 85 points at 800 and 1,000 yards, including a minimum of 40 at 800 yards, by selective scores of 10 consecutive shots, he shall be considered to be qualified in Long Distance Practice, but is not included in the table of classification, nor in the computation of the figure of merit. He may be rewarded by suitable medals or other devices at the discretion of the State authorities.

Par. 326. PRACTICE WITH TELESCOPIC SIGHTS.

Practice with telescopic sights may be held at the discretion of the State authorities and, when held, will be conducted in accordance with paragraph 117.

Par. 327. MISCELLANEOUS.

(a) The conditions and requirements governing the conduct of target practice, except as modified in Part V, shall be the same for the Organized Militia as for the Regular Army.

(b) *Dress and Equipment.*

The dress and equipment of officers and men participating in target practice shall be prescribed by the State authorities. The cartridge belt will be worn at all times. (See Modifications.)

(c) *Marking.*

The provisions of these regulations governing marking, which are impracticable for the Organized Militia may be modified by the State authorities, except for the qualification Course, Regular Army.

(d) *Scoring.*

Such provisions of these regulations as are impracticable for the Organized Militia may be modified by the State authorities, except for the Qualification Course, Regular Army.

(e) *Estimating Distance.*

Estimating distance will not be required for the Organized Militia, except when firing the Regular Army Course, in which case paragraph 85 will be complied with. State authorities may require commissioned officers to qualify in estimating distance in the Qualification Course, Organized Militia.

(f) *Practice Season.*

The practice season will be determined by the State authorities. (See Modifications.)

(g) *Who Will Fire.*

(h) *Amount of Fire.*

The amount of firing in one day for any individual is not restricted for the Organized Militia in any course.

(i) *Qualification.*

Qualification will be based on the results obtained in either one of the qualification courses or in the instruction practice, as set forth in the following table:

* All who fire a complete course of instruction practice, and all those who fire the Regular Army, Qualification Course and Special Course "A" and in any course fail to qualify as second-class men or better.

1. Officers and enlisted men carried on the records of organizations during the target season, but not participating in target practice will not be included in the above table of qualification.

2. In case authority is given to fire the Qualification Course, Regular Army, after a grade of qualification has been attained in the Qualification Course, Organized Militia, the higher qualification shall be used as the basis of record and medals will be issued in each case.

3. If an individual fails to qualify as marksman or higher in firing the Qualification Course, Organized Militia, his grading shall be first-class. In the Regular Army Course and Special Course "A," the qualification shall be determined by the result of the firing in that course alone.

(j) *Holdover Qualifications.*

Holdover qualifications for the Organized Militia in the qualification courses (Organized Militia and Regular Army) will be limited to expert riflemen. An individual having attained this grade will retain that qualification for three consecutive target years, including the target season in which qualification was made. An individual entitled to holdover qualification as an expert rifleman may be authorized by the State authorities to fire the qualification courses, in which case he forfeits no rights to such holdover qualification. If during such subsequent firing, he again qualifies as an expert rifleman, his holdover privileges will begin from his last qualification. (See Modifications).

(k) *Insignia.*

For the Qualification Course, Organized Militia, bronze badges and pins.

For the Qualification Course, Regular Army, insignia similar to those issued to the Regular Army.

For Special Course "A", Coast Artillery Reserves, bronze pins, marksmen only, when firing this course.

An individual qualifying as marksman, sharpshooter or expert rifleman will wear his badge or pin so long as he retains such a qualification.

(l) *Requalification Bars.*

No requalification bars are issued for marksmen.

Sharpshooters.

Requalification bars shall be issued at the rate of one bar for each three qualifications (not necessarily consecutive) as sharpshooter. The bar bears the last year of qualification.

Expert Riflemen.

Requalification bars are issued at the rate of one bar for each qualification as expert rifleman, holdover qualifications included, provided that when an individual requalifies as expert rifleman during a holdover period, he is entitled to a bar for each three years of actual requalification. The bar bears the last year of qualification.

(m) *Combat Practice.*

Combat practice may be held by the Organized Militia whenever so directed by the State authorities. When held, it will be conducted in accordance with Part III, Small Arms Firing Manual.

(n) *Reports.*

The report of target firing shall be forwarded to the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs, as soon after the close of the practice season as practicable, but not later than March 31 of the following year.

(o) *Figure of Merit.*

In each State there will be a company and regimental figure of merit to be calculated by the methods laid down by the War Department, except that all men who have failed to qualify as second-classmen or better, or who have not fired, or having fired, have failed to complete the course, shall be rated as unqualified, multiplied by 0, and shall be included in the divisor in the computation of the figure of merit. A proficiency test similar to that prescribed for the Regular Army is authorized at the discretion of the State authorities.

Par. 388.

PISTOL PRACTICE.

Preliminary Drills.

(a) All officers and enlisted men belonging to organizations armed with the revolver or pistol shall be instructed in the care, preservation and use of these arms, following the provisions of paragraphs 137-148, modified only as existing circumstances demand, in any case, in the discretion of the State authorities.

(b) The following course in Pistol Range Practice is prescribed for officers and men armed with the Colt's Revolver, Cal. .38, or the Smith and Wesson, Cal. 38, as issued by the Ordnance Department. (See Modifications.)

(c) Rapid fire shall be conducted as prescribed in paragraph 164, except that the revolver is loaded with five cartridges, the hammer being on the empty chamber.

(d) The dismounted course prescribed in paragraph 163, will be substituted for that prescribed above for any organization or individual of the Organized Militia armed with the Colt Automatic pistol, Cal. .45. (See Modifications.)

The qualifications and insignia for firing the course prescribed in paragraph 163 shall be as provided for in paragraphs 215, 220 and 221.

(g) REPORTS.

The number of officers and enlisted men taking pistol practice will be reported on the report of Small-Arms Firing.

MODIFICATIONS.

Par. 319. (a) Paper targets as issued at present will be used. The iron target will not be issued to troops.

Par. 319. (b) In the State of Maine no officer or enlisted man who has failed to qualify as MARKSMAN or better in a previous season shall be advanced to range practice until he has complied with the provisions of this paragraph. No credit will be given to organizations nor will any insignia be issued to an individual for range scores made by any one not recorded as marksman or better in a previous season, unless his gallery practice qualification scores are filed with his range scores. But those holding a qualification of marksman or better in a previous season need not be required to shoot through the Gallery Course.

Par. 321. Owing to the fact that the new course of qualification will not be adopted for the Army, until January 1, 1914, members of the National Guard of this State will not be permitted to fire the Regular Army Qualification Course during the practice season of 1913.

Par. 324. The Coast Artillery Corps of this State will fire the course as herein prescribed. They will NOT fire Special Course "A".

Par. 327. (b) Whenever practicable the service uniform, either cotton or woolen, will be worn at target practice.

Par. 327. (f) The practice season for outdoor range firing shall begin on Patriots' Day, April 19, and close October 31.

Par. 327. (j) No holdover qualifications will be allowed for 1913. Every officer and enlisted man will begin either with the gallery practice course (Par. 319) or if he be a marksman *or better of record of a previous season, with the Instruction Practice of the qualification course (Par. 320).

Par. 388. (b) All officers and enlisted men armed with the pistol will follow the Pistol Practice Course as prescribed in this paragraph.

Par. 388. (d) Qualification with the automatic pistol is NOT authorized for the practice season of 1913. All revolver qualifications must be made with the Colt's or Smith and Wesson revolver, as prescribed in paragraph 388 (b).

RAPID FIRE, RIFLE.

In accordance with the Revised Firing Manual, rapid fire with the rifle will be conducted as follows:

Procedure.—At 200 yards there will be but one man firing at each target. The officer in charge of the line will command "Load". The magazine will be filled, the piece loaded with one cartridge therefrom, and the safety lock turned to "Safe". When all is ready in the pit, the targets to be fired upon will be drawn fully down (the rear targets being blank or targets of another class than those being fired upon), and a red flag hoisted at the center target. When the red flag is displayed, the officer in charge of the firing line will command "Ready", when the safety lock will be turned to the ready and the position of "Ready" standing assumed, with the sling, if used, on the arm. The officer in charge of the firing line will then call so that all may hear: "Ready on the right"; "ready on the left". When the officer in charge calls out "Ready on the right", etc., any one who is not ready must call out: "Not ready on target —". If any soldier fails to so call, it will be assumed that he is ready, and if he fails to fire when the target appears he will be given a total miss for that score.

The firing line being ready, the pit is signalled or telephoned: "Ready on the firing line". When this signal is received in the pit, the red flag is waved and lowered and five seconds thereafter the targets appear, remaining in sight one minute and then disappear. The soldier, without coming to the "Order", takes the kneeling position, as soon as any part of the target appears, begins to fire and attempts to fire ten

shots, reloading with a full clip which is taken from the belt, and continues to fire until ten shots are fired or until the target disappears.

Each unfired cartridge counts a miss.

In case of a defective cartridge or a disabled piece, or when more than ten hits are made on the target, the practice is repeated.

At 300 yards the procedure is the same, except that the soldier assumes the prone position as soon as any part of the target appears, the time limit being 1 minute and 10 seconds.

At 500 yards the procedure is the same, except that the soldier is in the prone position, with the piece at the shoulder, before the target appears, the time limit being 1 minute and 20 seconds.

At all ranges, in rapid fire, firing is from a full clip, and the second clip must be loaded from the belt. In case a clip jams or breaks, cartridges may be loaded singly.

At the expiration of the time limit, the target is pulled down and marked, all hits being given their proper value. In case of more than 10 hits on a target, the target will not be marked, but the firing line will be notified and the firing on that target repeated. In case a soldier fires on the wrong target, only such shots as he may have fired on his own target will be counted on his score. He will be given misses for the remainder of his score.

In firing rapid fire, if more than one target is used, the first order of men at the firing point will fire together, one man at each target, all targets being fired upon at one time.

RAPID FIRE, REVOLVER.

In accordance with the Revised Firing Manual, rapid fire with the revolver will be conducted as follows:

Time.—Time is taken at the firing point by sand glass or watch. The target being up, the soldier stands with pistol at "Raise Pistol". The pistol is loaded, the hammer at the "Safe". Six cartridges are in the magazine. The command "Commence firing" is given and the soldier fires 7 shots within 30 seconds or 15 seconds as the case may be, at the end of which interval the command "Cease firing" will have been given. Unfired shots count as misses. In case of a defective cartridge or a disabled pistol the score is repeated. For each shot fired before the commencement or after the close of the time limit, 10 points will be deducted from the score. Prior to rapid fire practice the soldier should be thoroughly drilled in the manipulation of the pistol.

TARGETS.

The firing prescribed in Part V are on targets "A", "B", "C", "D", and "L". Targets "A" and "B" are those which have heretofore been used under these letters. Targets "C" and "D" are modifications of the former targets under these letters. Target "L" is the target formerly known as Target "N". The targets are described as follows:

Paragraph 227. *Known Distance Targets.*

Target A.—The short-range target, used for 200 and 300 yards, is a rectangle 6 feet high, 4 feet wide, black circular bull's eye 8 inches in diameter, value of hits, 5; center ring, 26 inches in diameter, value of hit, 4; inner ring, 46 inches in diameter, value of hit, 3; outer, remainder of target, value of hit, 2.

Target B.—The mid-range target, used for 500 and 600 yards, is a square 6 feet on a side, black circular bull's-eye 20 inches in diameter; center ring, 37 inches in diameter; inner ring, 53 inches in diameter; outer, remainder of target. Value of hits, same as on target "A".

Target C.—The long-range target, used for 800 and 1000 yards, is a rectangle 6 feet high and 10 feet wide. Black circular bull's-eye 36 inches in diameter; center ring, 54 inches in diameter; inner space outside of center ring bounded by vertical lines two feet from each end of target; outer, remainder of target. Value of hits, same as on target "A".

Target D.—The rapid-fire target, a black silhouette representing a soldier in the prone position placed in the middle of a rectangular target 6 by 6 feet. Value of hits in the figure, 5; in the concentric space 4 inches in width immediately outside the figure, 4; in the concentric space 8 inches in width immediately outside the 4 space, 3; remainder of the target, 2.

Paragraph 229. *Pistol Range Targets.*

Target L.—A rectangle 6 feet high and 4 feet wide, with black circular bull's-eye 5 inches in diameter. Value of hit therein, 10. Seven (7) rings with diameters as follows:

The War Department is not prepared for the present to issue new pattern "C" and "D" targets. The difference between the old and new "C" target is so slight that the necessary alterations can easily be made on the old pattern targets and company commanders will see that their men do not fire on the old targets and receive credit for scores made on targets that have not been changed to conform to these regulations. The new "D" target will be supplied by the State.

II. In accordance with instructions from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs, dated March 1, 1913, paragraph 388 of Part V, Regulations for Small Arms Firing courses for the Organized Militia, published in General Orders No. 6, this office, c. s., is hereby amended so that the time limit for rapid fire at 15 and 25 yards instruction practice shall read 15 instead of 10 seconds.

General Orders, No. 9.

I. *Enlistments Prior to Encampment.* In order to be eligible to receive federal pay at an encampment of the National Guard an enlisted man must have had not less than 60 days' service in the Organized Militia (of this or any other state or territory, or the District of Columbia) including at least fourteen periods of practical, progressive military instruction of at least one and one-half hours each, or an equivalent service in the Regular Army, Navy or Marine Corps, or one academic year's service at a school where military instruction is given (Cir. No. 2, D. M. A., 1913). In accordance with the foregoing no man not eligible to federal pay under conditions set forth above will be permitted to attend any encampment of the National Guard in July or August, 1913, without permission from this office. All requests for permission to take to camp men ineligible to federal pay will be made through channels and will set forth in detail the reason for asking such permission.

II. *Property Accountability.* Paragraphs 350 to 372, inclusive, Regulations for the National Guard of the State of Maine, 1898, are rescinded. In the National Guard accountability and responsibility for public property will be governed by paragraphs 688 to 714, inclusive, Army Regulations (1910) insofar as the same are applicable; in the Naval Reserve, by the Navy Regulations, insofar as the same are applicable. The accounting period is for twelve months and will end on November 30th. The semi-annual return hitherto made on May 31st will be omitted.

III. *Coast Defense Exercises.* The following organizations of the National Guard are designated to take part in Joint Coast Defense Exercises at Fort Williams in the Artillery District of Portland, July 17th-26th, inclusive, 1913:

Headquarters, Band, and twelve companies, Coast Artillery Corps, with attached post non-commissioned staff officers.

Officers of the Medical Corps and Hospital Corps Detachment assigned to Coast Artillery Corps.

The Commanding Officer, Coast Artillery Corps, will issue necessary orders to carry this into effect.

IV. *Infantry Encampment.* The following organizations of the National Guard will encamp at the State Camp-ground, Augusta, Maine, August 4th-13th, inclusive, 1913.

2nd Regiment Infantry.

Officers of the Medical Corps and Hospital Corps Detachment assigned to 2nd Infantry.

The Commanding Officer, Second Infantry, will issue necessary orders to carry this into effect.

V. *Shoes for Field Service.* For the purpose of supplying enlisted men of the National Guard of this State with serviceable shoes for the summer field service, commanding officers are authorized to contract with responsible parties to supply such shoes, but contracts will not be made for other than the "Herman", "Bass" or Foss-Packard shoe without special authority from this office. Commanding officers will deal direct with the manufacturer or his agent and not through this office. The basis of payment will be as follows: \$1.00 per pair will be paid by the State to the contracting manufacturer or his agent direct. The commanding officer will transmit the balance to the contracting shoe manufacturer or his agent upon receipt of State pay for field service, deducting the amount due from the pay of each enlisted man supplied with shoes under this arrangement. Commanding officers will notify this office of the number of shoes supplied under this order for the enlisted men of their commands, but the allowance of \$1.00 per pair to be made by the State will not exceed the number of men actually present for duty for the tour of field service. The entire cost of any shoes in addition thereto must be met from company or other funds. Shoes purchased under this arrangement will become the individual property of the enlisted men at the conclusion of the summer encampment.

VI. *Small Arms Qualification.* General Orders, No. 6, this office, c. s., as amended by paragraph II, General Orders No. 8, this office, c. s., is further amended in accordance with instructions from the Chief, Division of Militia Affairs, War Department, Washington, in the following manner:

Par. 322. Under heading "Record Practice," add after the word "Prone," opposite the 600-yard range, "two sighting shots, sandbag rest."*

VII. *Memorial Day.* In accordance with paragraph 444 of the Regulations for the United States Army, on all armories and stations of the National Guard the national flag will be displayed at half-staff from sunrise till mid-day on Memorial Day. At noon the flag will be hoisted to the top of the staff and will remain there till sunset. Organizations of the Naval Reserve will render the honors prescribed by the Regulations for the Government of the Navy of the United States. To assist in the observance of the day by veteran organizations commanding officers of the National Guard and Naval Reserve will place their commands at the disposal of local representatives of the Grand Army of the Republic on Friday, May 30, 1913.
