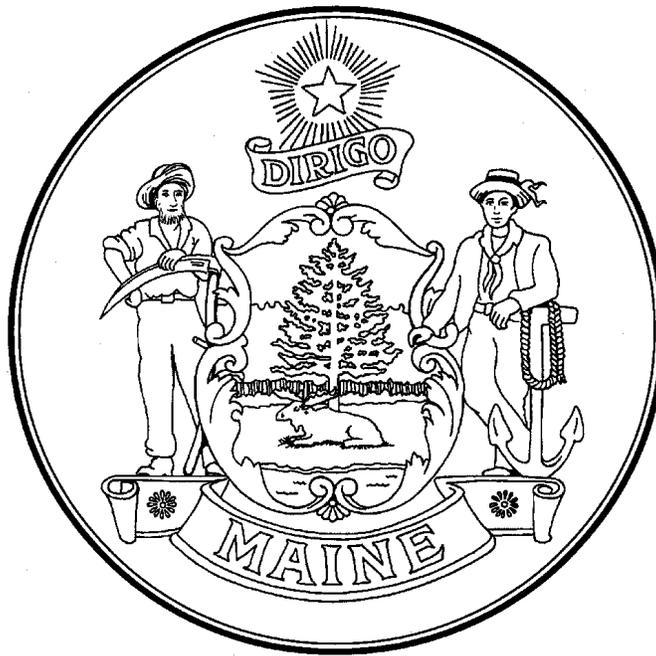

*To His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council:*

Gentlemen: In accordance with the provisions of Sect. 50, Chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, I herewith submit annual report of this department for the year ending November 30, 1916.

The combined assets and number of each class of institutions now under my supervision are as follows:

By an inspection of the comparative statement of liabilities and resources as existing on September 25th, 1915, with the same statement as of September 30, 1916, you will notice a material increase in the resources of our banks.

## TRUST COMPANIES.

On May 29th, 1916, the Kenduskeag Trust Company, located in Bangor, voluntarily liquidated, and thereafter the business was taken over by the First National Bank of Bangor.

At the time of the liquidation of the Kenduskeag Trust Company a branch existed at Newport. Application was made for the establishment of a trust company in that town, and after notice and hearing, charter was granted to the Newport Trust Company to take over the business, assets and good will of the existing branch. Business was commenced on April 26, 1916, with a capital stock of \$25,000, and paid in surplus of \$12,500.

On December 30th, 1915, the Mercantile Trust Company of Portland made application to change its name to Casco-Mercantile Trust Company.

Permission to do this was granted and thereafter the Casco National Bank liquidated and became a part of the Casco-Mercantile Trust Company, having a capital stock of \$500,000, paid in surplus of \$200,000 with total resources of \$7,368,709.

Under date of February 3rd, 1916, the Augusta Trust Company made application for the right to establish a branch in the town of Richmond. Permission being given, this bank took over the business, assets and good will of the Richmond National Bank, and was then conducted as a branch of the Augusta Trust Company.

At the present time applications are pending to charter trust companies to be located in the cities of Auburn and Lewiston.

## LOAN AND BUILDING ASSOCIATIONS.

On the 10th day of April, 1916, application having previously been made, permission was given to establish a loan and building association in the town of Orono, viz: the Orono Loan and Building Association.

## SAVINGS BANKS.

There has been no change in the number of savings banks in the State during the last year.

## RECOMMENDATIONS.

As a result of nearly two years experience in office, I am firmly impressed with the idea that the necessities of the banking department should receive attention by the passage of much needed legislation at the coming session.

The department has direct supervision over 156 institutions with combined resources of \$204,361,420.43, and with depositors or shareholders, including loan and building associations, aggregating 436,516.

These institutions paid into the Treasury of the State in the way of taxes during the past year \$621,677.53, and when it is considered that the appropriation for this department, including special appropriation for verification of savings deposits aggregates only seventeen thousand dollars, it is the opinion of well informed bankers and business men throughout the State, in which I concur, that it is now time to reorganize this important department.

The department should be able to give as many and as thorough examinations of the banks under its supervision as are now given to national banks. In order that this may be done additional examining and office force must be provided for.

That this additional supervision, above recommended, may be put into practical effect, it will be necessary to employ at least one additional examiner and one extra clerk. I therefore recommend a department force made up as follows: Bank Commissioner, Deputy Bank Commissioner, two Examiners, and three clerks.

By adopting the above recommendation it will give two men, besides the Commissioner, who will be available at all times for the work of physical examinations of the various institutions, in addition to an examiner assigned to the special work of verification of savings deposits already provided for.

I further recommend that the Deputy Bank Commissioner be given all the authority of the Commissioner for and during such time as the Commissioner may be absent from the office.

If the above recommendations are adopted and the department is to be reorganized and made more efficient, then the Bank Commissioner should be a man trained for the position,

capable of giving proper supervision over the increased force, able to study the needs of the institutions under his jurisdiction and to properly supervise and regulate the conduct of their business.

The Commissioner should devote substantially all of his time to the affairs of the department, and for the demand made upon his time, and by reason of the increased force over which he must exercise supervisory powers, and his added responsibilities, he should receive salary sufficient to properly compensate him for such services, and I believe that the salary should be fixed at not less than four thousand dollars per year, continuing existing provisions of law governing traveling expenses and expenses of his office.

In order that this office may achieve the greatest efficiency, it should be removed from political control and fixed for a definite term with a provision for removal from office by the Governor and Council, for cause.

#### LEGISLATION.

Chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes is commonly spoken of as the "Banking Laws," as it governs the operations of the banking department, its relations to the various financial institutions in the State, the conduct of the affairs of the different banks and provides methods by which all banks may invest their funds.

The present banking law, so called, is the result of many amendments coupled with the old statutes, and owing to the changed conditions in financing and banking methods, much of our law is obsolete, many parts of the law are not in harmony each with the other, and certainly need attention at once.

I therefore recommend the appointment of a commission, to serve under pay, charged with the duty of studying banking needs and conditions of the State, and presenting their recommendations to the legislature to convene in January, 1919.

In order that there may be some immediate relief touching upon various parts of our banking laws, I recommend the passage of the following acts or resolves:—

An act to provide a seal for the Banking Department, and regulate its use.

An act to change the time of issuing new deposit books, where the original is lost, from six months to thirty days.

An act to make legal the opening of joint accounts in savings banks with a maximum deposit double the present maximum for individual accounts.

An act to provide for the equal taxation of all savings deposits whether in state or national institutions.

An act to allow trustees of savings banks to receive compensation for their services.

An act to make short time notes, issued by counties, cities or towns within the State, tax exempt in the same manner and form as bonds as now tax exempt.

An act to provide that checks or orders calling for the payment of moneys, signed by parties afterwards declared to be of unsound mind, shall be legal unless notice of such incapacity has been given to the bank.

An act governing the deposit of money in banks by married women or by minors.

An act to provide a time within which signature to check or order may be denied by the owner of the deposit.

An act to amend statutes relative to the place of deposit of securities owned by any bank.

An act to enlarge the list of states in the bonds of which the banks shall be permitted to invest.

An act to permit savings banks to invest in the electric railroad bonds of certain states.

An act to provide for the making of joint utility and other public utility bonds legal investments for savings banks.

An act to provide penalties for any bank official making a false report to the Bank Commissioner.

An act to give the Bank Commissioner authority to allow increase in capital stock of trust companies organized under special act of the legislature.

An act to permit Loan and Building Associations to make loans to each other.

An act to provide that where husband and wife jointly own stock in loan and building associations, on the death of either, the surviving party may withdraw full value of shares.

An act to prohibit trust companies from re-hypothecating collateral taken as security for loans.

An act to provide a penalty for any officer or employee of a bank making copies of its records for his own use.

An act to make first mortgage collateral trust bonds a legal investment.

### RECEIVERSHIPS.

While it is to be hoped that the necessity will not arise for the appointment of a receiver for any of the banks in the State, yet it must be admitted that such a contingency may arise at any time.

The history of receiverships in this State has been far from satisfactory to the depositors in the banks affected, owing to the long delay in winding up the affairs of the institutions, thus keeping the depositor from having the use of his money, and this delay has been the cause of a great deal of anxiety and vexation to the department.

I believe that material change should be made in our present law governing liquidation of insolvent institutions, and I therefore recommend the enactment of a statute similar to the statute now in force in New York, under which the Commissioner may, believing the bank to be insolvent, immediately take possession of the institution, appoint a Deputy Commissioner, to serve under a per diem compensation, to manage the institution for so long as it is necessary and if advisable liquidate its affairs.

I believe that the Commissioner should have all final orders and decrees approved by a Judge of the Supreme Court, to whom we should also go for a final order of dissolution or for assessment on the stockholders.

Appended hereto, you will find comparative tabulations of the various banks of the State, as well as the individual report of each financial institution. Also the reports of the receivers having charge of banks in liquidation, and a condensed report of the Deputy Bank Commissioner, George F. McFarland, relative to the verification of savings deposits.

I desire to express my appreciation for the very courteous treatment accorded to the Commissioner and the various subordinates in the Department by all of the institutions and individuals with whom the department has been brought in

contact during the past year, and to again emphasize that whatever success the department has had during the year last past has been due in no small part to the loyal and faithful service of the various subordinates connected with it.

## VERIFICATION OF SAVINGS ACCOUNTS.

AUGUSTA, MAINE, November 29, 1916.

*Hon. I. E. Vernon, Bank Commissioner, Augusta, Maine.*

DEAR SIR:—During the year 1916, Savings Accounts of seventeen Trust Companies and Branches, and accounts of twenty-three Savings Banks were verified.

Total number of accounts in Trust Companies and Savings Banks visited, 69,051.

Total number of accounts actually verified, 19,655.

Average percentage of accounts verified, about 30%.

Several differences in trial balances were found, and in most cases adjusted. As a whole the books and records of the various banks were found to be in good order. In a few cases suggestions regarding the installing of modern methods have been made and undoubtedly will be adopted.

The addresses of depositors, in some cases, were found to be incomplete and this matter has also been brought to the attention of the banks with the suggestion that they endeavor to secure addresses of all depositors.

At the beginning of the work of verification, slips were sent to about one-third of the depositors,—later this number was increased to one-half and it was found that this would in nearly all cases take care of all accounts of any consequence.

The method used in verifying the accounts met with the general approval of the banks.


