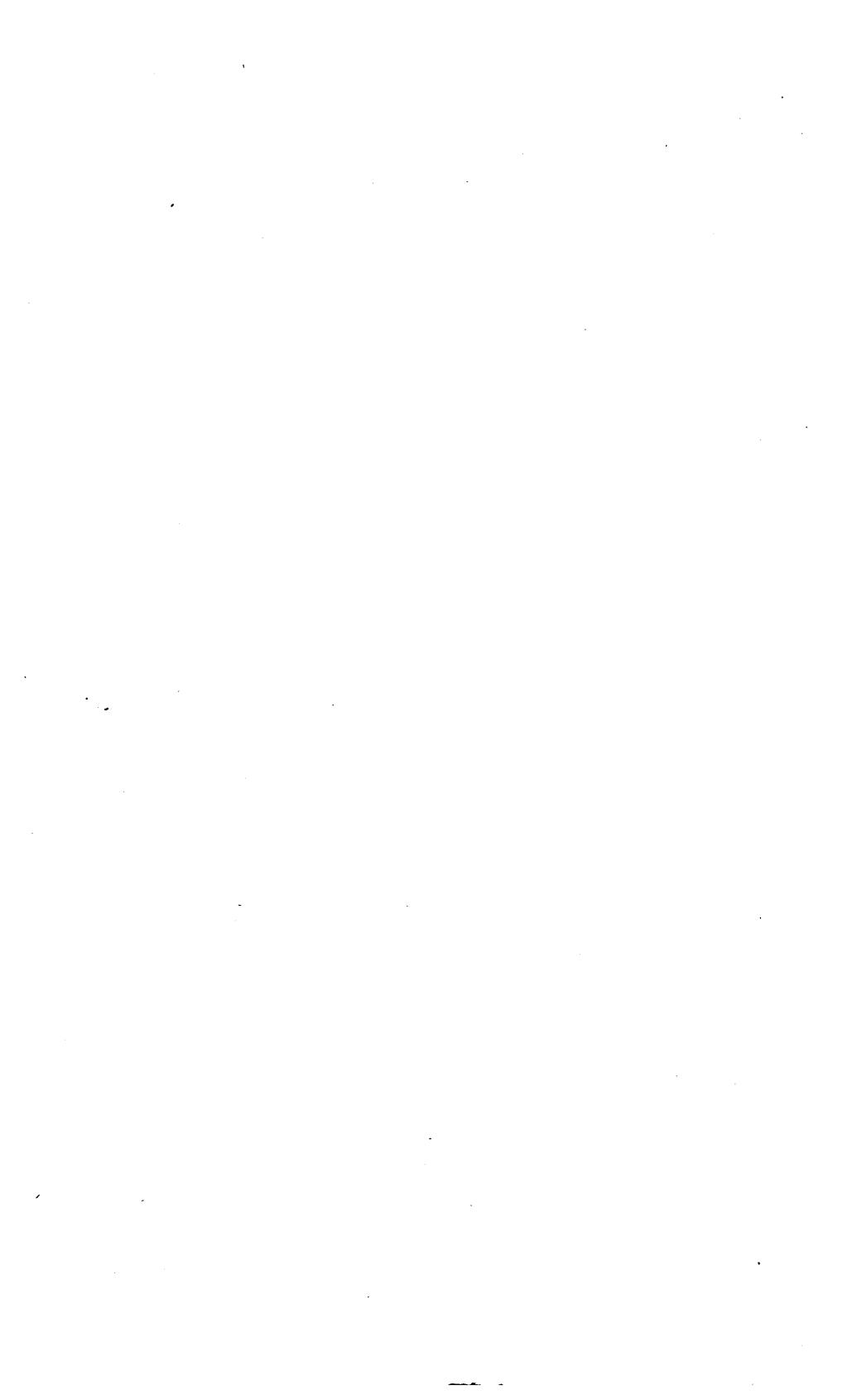

REGISTRATION REPORT, 1916.

This report presents the results of the registration and tabulation of the births, marriages, divorces and deaths which occurred in the State of Maine during the year 1916.

The number of births registered in that year is 726 less than in the preceding year. The number of births recorded in each of the registration years 1892-1916 is 14,028, 14,604, 14,607, 15,430, 15,429, 15,142, 15,121, 14,475, 14,709, 14,615, 15,166, 15,130, 15,405, 16,005, 16,585, 16,595, 16,914, 16,735, 16,469, 16,300, 16,583, 16,408, 16,731, 17,359 and 16,633.

The number of marriages (number of couples married) in 1916 was 6,576, 96 less than in the preceding year. The number of marriages registered in the State in each of the years 1892-1916 is, respectively, 5,726, 5,795, 5,591, 5,729, 5,579, 5,331, 5,144, 5,329, 5,482, 5,735, 5,905, 6,200, 6,208, 6,264, 6,498, 6,380, 5,904, 6,011, 5,900, 5,878, 6,550, 6,622, 6,707, 6,672, and 6,576.

The number of deaths recorded in the State for the same year was 11,772, a number 231 more than that of the deaths registered in the preceding year. The number of deaths in each year thus far recorded is: in 1892, 12,147; in 1893, 11,134; in 1894, 11,012; in 1895, 10,464; in 1896, 10,626; in 1897, 11,236; in 1898, 10,956; in 1899, 11,370; in 1900, 11,389; in 1901, 11,133; in 1902, 10,673; in 1903, 11,009; in 1904, 11,346; in 1905, 11,381; in 1906, 11,427; in 1907, 11,803; in 1908, 11,664; in 1909, 11,295; in 1910, 12,439; in 1911, 11,731; in 1912, 11,390; in 1913, 11,552; in 1914, 11,648; in 1915, 11,541, and in 1916, 11,772.

Bertillon Classification.—Nomenclature of the causes of death in this report is the revised Bertillon classification adopted by the International Commission which met in Paris in July, 1909.

Population.—The population of the State of Maine in 1910, as given by the twelfth census was 742,371. In 1900, the population of the State was 694,466. There was therefore, a gain of 47,905 in the decade between the last two census enumerations.

Relation of Births to Deaths.—As the total number of births registered in Maine in the year 1916 was 16,633, and the number of deaths was 11,772, the natural increase of births over deaths, was 4,861.

NOTES ON BIRTHS.

In the year 1916, 16,633 births were registered in the state, including stillbirths, (14,082 in 1892, 14,604 in 1893, 14,607 in 1894, 15,430 in 1895, 15,429 in 1896, 15,142 in 1897, 15,121 in 1898, 14,475 in 1899, 14,709 in 1900, 14,615 in 1901, 15,166 in 1902, 15,130 in 1903, 15,405 in 1904, 16,005 in 1905, 16,585 in 1906, 16,595 in 1907, 16,914 in 1908, 16,735 in 1909, 16,469 in 1910, 16,300 in 1911, 16,583 in 1912, 16,408 in 1913, 16,731 in 1914, and 17,359 in 1915.)

The number of living children born was 15,919 and the number of stillbirths was 714.

Of the whole number of living children of which the sex was certified 8,253 were males and 7,662 were females. In 2 births the sex was not stated. For each 100 girls born there were 107.8 boys (106.7 in 1892, 107.4 in 1893, 104.7 in 1894, 106.4 in 1895, 105.3 in 1896, 102.3 in 1897, 106 in 1898, 104.4 in 1899, 103.2 in 1900, 105.6 in 1901, 105 in 1902, 105.3 in 1903, 104.2 in 1904, 104.1 in 1905, 106 in 1906, 104.3 in 1907, 107.2 in 1908, 104.7 in 1909, 103.8 in 1910, 105.5 in 1911, 106.9 in 1912, 104 in 1913, 104.4 in 1914 and 105.7 in 1915.)

Birth-rate.—The birth-rate of living children for the State was 20.45 for each 1,000 of population.

Table No. 12 shows the number of births in each city with the birth-rate of each. The average birth-rate in the cities per 1,000 population was 21.29 as compared with 20.03 the birth-rate of the rest of the state.

The birth-rate of the different counties varied widely. As it invariably has been every year since the registration began, it was the highest in Aroostook, 29.50, and the lowest in Knox, 13.86. In three counties, Aroostook, Oxford and Washington, the birth-rate was above that of the whole State.

The birth-rate in each county is shown in Tables No. 3 and 7.

Parentage.—Of the whole number of births in the state, 61.59 per cent. were of native parents; 17.96 per cent. were of foreign parentage; 19.31 per cent. were of parents one of whom was foreign, while in 1.14 per cent. the nationality was not stated.

Hancock county had the largest percentage of native-born parents, to wit, 88.64 per cent., and only 2.24 per cent. in which both parents were foreign-born. Waldo followed with 88.20 per cent. of native parentage, and only 2.14 per cent. in which both parents were foreign-born.

In Lincoln county in 87.71 per cent. of the births the parents were native-born, and in 2.73 per cent., foreign-born.

In Knox county the percentage of native-born parents was 77.34; in Sagadahoc, 71.26; in Piscataquis, 70.96; in Franklin, 69.20; in Washington, 68.20; and in Penobscot, 66.22.

Comparatively high percentages of foreign-born parents are found in Oxford county, 31.53; in Androscoggin, 30.88; in York, 27.14; and in Cumberland, 25.07.

The percentages of parentage, whether American-born or foreign-born, may be found for the other counties in Table No. 13.

Comparing the percentage of births in our twenty cities with that of the rest of the state, we find that in the cities 58.08 per cent. of the births were of American parentage, while in the rural parts of the State, the percentage of American-born children was 67.98.

The largest percentage of foreign-born parents was in Biddeford, 45.56 and in Lewiston, 39.81. For further comparisons see Table No. 14.

Seasons and Births.—The largest number of births in any one month in 1916 was 1,495 in May; the smallest was 1,164 in November; the largest quarterly total was 4,257 in the second quarter; the smallest 3,609 in the last quarter. The three consecutive months in which the largest number of births occurred were March, April and May, 4,400.

The following is a tabular statement of the number of births in each month of the twenty-five years 1892-1916.

Twin-Births.—In 1916, 204 twin-births occurred; in 52 instances twins were both boys; in 58 both girls; and in 94 a boy and a girl.

In 121 cases the parentage was American; in 45 foreign; in 36 instances the parentage was mixed; and in two it was not stated.

Of the 408 children 366 were born alive, and 42 stillborn.

A triple birth of American parentage occurred in Harrington, one male and two females, all living children.

Stillbirths.—Of the 714 stillborn children, 393 were males and 316 were females. In 5 instances the sex was not stated. With the exception of 2 stillbirths as to which the nativity of the mother was not stated 527 were of American mothers, and 185 of foreign mothers.

The largest number of stillbirths occurred in Aroostook county, 110; while the minimum number, 11, was reported in Lincoln county.

The largest number of stillbirths, 77, was returned in March; the smallest number, 47, in September. See Tables No. 17 and 18 for other details.

NOTES ON MARRIAGES.

The number of marriages registered in the state during the year 1916 was 6,576 (5,726 in 1892, 5,795 in 1893, 5,594 in 1894, 5,729 in 1895, 5,579 in 1896, 5,331 in 1897, 5,144 in 1898, 5,329 in 1899, 5,482 in 1900, 5,735 in 1901, 5,905 in 1902, 6,200 in 1903, 6,208 in 1904, 6,264 in 1905, 6,498 in 1906, 6,380 in 1907, 5,904 in 1908, 6,011 in 1909, 5,900 in 1910, 5,878 in 1911, 6,550 in 1912, 6,622 in 1913, 6,707 in 1914, and 6,672 in 1915.) We have therefore for the year 1916 a marriage-rate of 16.90 (persons married) to every 1,000 population, or at the rate of 8.45 marriages per 1,000 persons.

Marriage-Rates.—The marriage-rate was higher in Androscoggin county than elsewhere in the state, it being for that county 10.61 per 1,000. The lowest rate, that of 6.72 per 1,000, was in Lincoln county. See Table No. 3.

Nativity.—Of the 6,576 records of marriage in which there was a statement of birthplace, in 73.43 per cent., the groom and bride were both American; in 8.63 per cent., both were of foreign birth; in 8.07 per cent., the groom was American and the bride of foreign birth; while in 9.65 per cent., a foreign groom and American bride were united.

Seasons.—The largest number of marriages, 820 was solemnized in June, while the smallest number in any one month, 351 occurred in February. See Table No. 21.

Ages of the Married.—The largest number, both of grooms and brides was between 20 and 25 years of age. While still under 15 years of age, 19 brides were married; in the age-period, 15-20 years, there were 339 grooms and 1,869 brides; in the period, 20-25 years, 2,582 men and 2,420 women were married; from 25-30, 1,660 men and 1,015 women; from 30-35, 724 men and 447 women; from 35-40, 410 men and 305 women; from 40-45, 260 men and 171 women; from 45-50, 204 men and 129 women; from 50-55, 138 men and 93 women; from 55-60, 104 men and 44 women; from 60-70, 118 men and 49 women;

from 70-80, 32 men and 11 women; 80 and over 1 man. The ages of four grooms and four brides were not stated. See Table No. 23. In 5,459 marriages the groom was older than the bride; while in 1,117 the bride was older than the groom; 691 widowers and 536 widows were remarried; 446 men and 494 women were remarried after having been divorced from a former marriage.

Table No. 24 exhibits the fact that 5,436 men and 5,542 women were married for the first time; that 1,017 men and 941 women were married for the second time; that 114 men and 89 women were united in the third marriage; that 6 men and 3 women contracted marriage for the fourth time, and 1 man was married for the fifth, and 1 for the sixth time.

The oldest groom was 80 years of age, and the oldest bride was 78. The youngest groom was 15 years of age, and the youngest bride was 12. At the age of 15 years 1 groom was married; at 16 years, 7; at 17 years 23; at 18 years, 101; and at 19 years, 206.

At the age of twelve years, 1 bride was married; at 13 years, 1; at 14 years, 17; at 15 years 57; at 16 years, 218; at 17 years, 332; at 18 years, 629; at 19 years, 630.

At 16 years of age 1 bride was married for the second time, and 1 bride was married for the third time at 23. In one instance a groom of 22 was married for the second time; one at 30 for the third time; at 45 years one groom contracted marriage for the fifth time.

NOTES ON DIVORCES.

Six hundred ninety-eight divorces were decreed in the year 1916. (552 in 1892, 627 in 1893, 674 in 1894, 681 in 1895, 668 in 1896, 722 in 1897, 764 in 1898, 790 in 1899, 801 in 1900, 808 in 1901, 905 in 1902, 946 in 1903, 906 in 1904, 848 in 1905, 787 in 1906, 887 in 1907, 904 in 1908, 957 in 1909, 911 in 1910, 985 in 1911, 1,081 in 1912, 1,092 in 1913, 1,030 in 1914, and 1,006 in 1915.) In 1916 there was decreed in Maine one divorce for every nine marriages solemnized.

Some of the causes for which divorces were granted are: Cruel and abusive treatment, 244 or 35.00 per cent. of the whole number; desertion, 205 or 29.36 per cent.; adultery, 115 or 16.47 per cent.; intoxication, 77 or 11.03, per cent.; non-support, 36 or 5.16 per cent.

The other divorces were granted for multiple or associated causes.

The wife was the libellant in 506 divorces, and the husband in 192.

In the divorces granted for cruel and abusive treatment, the husband was the libellant 37 times, and the wife 207 times.

For desertion, the husband was the libellant 85 times, and the wife 120. For adultery, the husband was the libellant in 64 cases, and the wife in 51.

For intoxication, the husband was the libellant in 4 instances, and the wife in 73.

For non-support, the wife was the libellant in the 36 divorces decreed for that cause.

One divorce was granted before six months of married life. Eleven were granted before one year's marriage; 170 after from 1 to 5 year's marriage; 193 after from 5-10 years; 224 after from 10-20 years; 80 after from 20-30 years; 18 after more than 30 years of married life; while in one case it was not stated how many years the parties had been married. One divorce was granted after 53 years of marriage.

NOTES ON DEATHS AND THE CAUSES OF DEATHS.

The number of deaths registered in the year 1916, was 11,772. This was 231 less than for the preceding year, 1915. A glance at the following tabulation will show that the death-rate, based upon the estimated population of all but the census year, 1910; has, upon the whole, lessened considerably. In the year for which this report is made, however, the death-rate is higher than for the preceding year, namely, 15.38.

By referring to Table No. 3, it will be seen that the lowest death-rate was in Piscataquis county, being only 12.22. The counties Androscoggin, Aroostook, Franklin, Hancock, Lincoln, Oxford, Piscataquis, Washington and York had lower death-rates than that of the whole state; while the counties Cumberland, Kennebec, Knox, Penobscot, Sagadahoc, Somerset and Waldo had death-rates larger than that of the state. The highest county death-rate was that of Kennebec, 17.77.

The death-rate in the cities was 17.51 (20.46 in 1892, 19.89 in 1893, 19.65 in 1894, 18.36 in 1895, 18.78 in 1896, 20.11 in 1897, 19.74 in 1898, 18.10 in 1899, 18.34 in 1900, 17.90 in 1901, 17.03 in 1902, 17.16 in 1903, 18.00 in 1904, 16.79 in 1905, 17.25 in 1906, 18.18 in 1907, 17.03 in 1908, 16.63 in 1909, 19.13 in 1910, 17.78 in 1911, 17.79 in 1912, 17.52 in 1913, 17.25 in 1914, and 16.34 in 1915), as compared with that of the rest of the state with the cities omitted, which death-rate was 13.83, (17.46 in 1892, 15.54 in 1893, 15.39 in 1894, 14.77 in 1895, 14.93 in 1896, 15.68 in 1897, 15.24 in 1898, 15.52 in 1899, 15.47 in 1900, 15.13 in 1901, 14.58 in 1902, 13.39 in 1903, 15.54 in 1904, 15.49 in 1905, 14.71 in 1906, 15.60 in 1907, 15.54 in 1908, 14.85 in 1909, 14.96 in 1910, 14.74 in 1911, 13.83 in 1912, 14.11 in 1913, 14.06 in 1914, and 14.15 in 1915.)

Seasons and Mortality.—The largest number of deaths occurred in February, 1,200. The smallest number of deaths in any one month was 819 in November. During the spring months 3,189 deaths occurred; during the summer, 2,566; during the autumn, 2,703; in the winter, 3,313. NOTES ON DEATHS AND CAUSES OF DEATHS.

Table No. 27 exhibits the total number of deaths which occurred in each county for the years 1909-1916. The number of deaths for 1916 in each month by counties is shown in Table No. 30.

Sex and Mortality.—Of the 11,772 decedents, 6,139 were males and 5,633 females; there were 284 more deaths among boys under 5 years of age than among girls within the same age-period. At the age-periods from 5 to 80 years, there was also a preponderance of deaths among males, but from 80 to 100, more among females. At the age of 100 years and over six males and six females died. See Table No. 30.

The Causes of Death.—Compared with 1915, among the chief causes of death there were in 1916, 51 more from whooping cough, 27 more from diarrheal diseases, 33 more from cancer, 50 more from pneumonia, 4 more from nephritis and Bright's disease, and 239 more from influenza.

On the other hand there were 48 less from tuberculosis, 31 less from diabetes, 17 less from diseases of nervous system, 31 less from diphtheria and croup, 64 less from diseases of heart.

2 less from measles, 16 less from bronchitis, 13 less from rheumatism, 9 less from scarlet fever, and 15 less from typhoid fever.

The next table gives a cursory view of the relative mortality in 1915 and 1916 from some of the leading causes of death.

This year diseases of the nervous system occupy first place. The various diseases of the nervous system have occupied the first place among the causes of death except in 1892, when pneumonia had the first place, until 1913 and 1914 when it took second place. Again this year as in 1915, it occupies first place.

Pulmonary tuberculosis was the next most prominent cause until 1898 when it was reduced to the third place in the list; in 1899 and 1900 it occupied the fourth place; in 1901, the third place; in 1902, 1903, 1904, 1905, 1906, 1907, 1908, 1909, 1910, and 1911 it occupied the fourth place; in 1912 it had fifth place; in 1913 it declined to the sixth place, and has held that place through the years 1914, 1915 and 1916. Pneumonia has the third place.

By referring to Table No. 32 it will be noticed that the causes of death are arranged by counties under fourteen classes. The following notes on some of the classes and individual causes of death will be arranged in accordance with the classification shown in this Table No. 32.

Infectious Diseases.—The lists of the infectious diseases usually include smallpox, measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, whooping cough, diphtheria and croup. The following table shows the number of deaths which resulted from these diseases in the several counties of the state.

By consulting the following table it will be seen that the number of deaths from diphtheria and croup, typhoid fever, tetanus, scarlet fever and measles was smaller than in 1915.

There was a larger number of deaths from influenza and whooping cough, while no deaths from smallpox occurred during the year.

Smallpox.—No deaths were due to this disease from 1892, when our system of registration went into effect, until 1899, when there were three deaths; in 1900, 2; in 1902, 12; in 1903, 7; and in 1904, 3. In 1915, as in 1911, 1910, 1909, 1908, 1907, 1906, 1905 and 1901, there were no deaths from smallpox. In 1912 there were 4 deaths from this cause, all children, in 1913, 2 deaths occurred, and in 1914, 2 again, one of which was a man 44 years of age, the other an infant. Again in 1916 no deaths are due to this disease.

Yellow Fever—For the first time during our registration years yellow fever was reported.

The case was that of a soldier, returned from the Mexican border, and occurred in Aroostook county.

Measles.—This disease caused the death of 13 persons of whom 8 were males and 5 females. The deaths from measles were 29 in 1892, 55 in 1893, 21 in 1894, 8 in 1895, 32 in 1896, 22 in 1897, 41 in 1898, 39 in 1899, 84 in 1900, 26 in 1901, 28 in 1902, 36 in 1903, 22 in 1904, 32 in 1905, 105 in 1906, 33 in 1907, 21 in 1908, 36 in 1909, 95 in 1910, 29 in 1911, 59 in 1912, 65 in 1913, 40 in 1914, and 15 in 1915. The death-rate for the state was 0.17 and for the cities 0.16.

Scarlet Fever.—The total mortality from this disease was 4 (36 in 1892, 80 in 1893, 29 in 1894, 25 in 1895, 33 in 1896, 38 in 1897, 43 in 1898, 48 in 1899, 35 in 1900, 18 in 1901, 13 in 1902, 18 in 1903, 10 in 1904, 7 in 1905, 5 in 1906, 14 in 1907, 17 in 1908, 32 in 1909, 40 in 1910, 15 in 1911, 16 in 1912, 17 in 1913, 16 in 1914, and 13 in 1915) all females. Except in one instance these deaths occurred at the age-period 1-5. There was one death in January, 2 in March, and 1 in April.

Aroostook county had 2 deaths from scarlet fever; Kennebec, 1; and Oxford, 1. No deaths from this disease occurred in the cities.

Whooping Cough.—The number of deaths from whooping cough was 126 (54 in 1892, 51 in 1893, 20 in 1894, 82 in 1895, 111 in 1896, 46 in 1897, 44 in 1898, 96 in 1899, 99 in 1900, 28 in 1901, 51 in 1902, 110 in 1903, 54 in 1904, 38 in 1905, 109 in 1906, 72 in 1907, 80 in 1908, 58 in 1909, 104 in 1910, 77 in 1911, 54 in 1912, 35 in 1913, 85 in 1914, and 75 in 1915,) of which 55 were males and 71 females. Typhoid Fever.—There were 83 deaths from typhoid fever. Of these 51 were males and 32 were females. As indicative of the loss which the state incurs from typhoid fever, it is well to bear in mind that the age distribution of the decedents shows that the deaths from this disease are principally among those active and productive age-periods when human life is of most value; 77 per cent. died between 10 and 50 years of age.

Ages: 1-5, 3; 5-10, 1; 10-20, 10; 20-30, 25; 30-40, 16; 40-50, 12; 50-60, 8; 60-70, 8.

The largest number of deaths, 15, occurred in the month of September, while the month of June had 2, the smallest number. By quarters, 19 were in the first quarter, 12 in the second, 28 in the third, and 24 in the last quarter of the year.

The typhoid death-rate of 1.38 in the cities is much greater than that in the villages and rural towns, which is 0.90. The rate for the state is 1.02.

Malarial Diseases.—About every year a few deaths have been reported to the department as having been caused by malaria, or malarial disease. Almost without exception when there was good reason to believe that the deaths had malarial cause, the infection was contracted outside the State. For the year 1910, no deaths were reported as having been caused by malaria, for 1911 only 3, for 1912, 2; for 1913, 4; for 1914, 5; for 1915, 1; and for 1916, 1.

Infantile Paralysis.—An epidemic of infantile paralysis caused 26 deaths in 1916,—12 males and 14 females. Of this number 1 was in Androscoggin county, 1 in Aroostook, 1 in Cumberland, 2 in Hancock, 14 in Knox, 2 in Penobscot, 1 in Piscataquis, 3 in Washington, and 1 in York county. Distributed by months: 1 for January, 1 for May, 5 for August, 10 for September, 6 for October and 3 for November.

The number of deaths from infantile paralysis by age-groups were: Under 1, 2; 1-5, 8; 5-10, 7; 10-20, 5; 20-30, 4.

The special death-rate per 10,000 from the disease was 0.33.

Cerebrospinal Meningitis.—In 1916 fifteen deaths from cerebrospinal meningitis occurred in the state,—8 males and 7 females. Of the decedents 10 were under five years of age.

The death-rate per 10,000 from this cause was 0.19.

Pellagra.—In the year 1916 there were 15 deaths from pellagra. In the years 1915, 1914, and 1913, there were 10 deaths in each year; in 1912, 4; and in 1911, 1. No deaths from that disease were recorded prior to 1911.

Of the 15 deaths which occurred in 1916, 3 were in Androscoggin county, 2 in Aroostook, 1 in Hancock, 2 in Kennebec, 2 in Oxford, 1 in Penobscot, 2 in Washington, and 2 in York county.

By months, the deaths from pellagra were: January, 1; February, 1; March, 1; May, 1; June, 2; July, 2; August, 2; October, 2; November, 2; and December, 1. Seven of the decedents were males and 8 females; and the ages at the date of death were: between 30-40 years, 3; 40-50, 5; 50-60, 1; 60-70, 4; 70-80, 1; 80-90, 1.

Tuberculosis.—In 1916 tuberculosis in its various forms was the cause of 885 deaths—442 males and 443 females. The death-rate per 10,000 from this cause was 11.32.

Pulmonary Tuberculosis.—(Consumption.)—From this cause 716 deaths were registered in 1916, which is equivalent to a death-rate of 9.16 per 10,000 of population. The death-rate for the cities was 11.09.

There were in 1916, 636 fewer deaths than in 1892, 583 fewer than in 1893, 546 fewer than in 1894, 479 fewer than in 1895, 456 fewer than in 1896, 412 fewer than in 1897, 305 fewer than in 1898, 299 fewer than in 1899, 311 fewer than in 1900, 317 fewer than in 1901, 254 fewer than in 1902, 185 fewer than in 1903, 300 fewer than in 1904, 178 fewer than in 1905, 199 fewer than in 1906, 234 fewer than in 1907, 177 fewer than in 1908, 114 fewer than in 1909, 173 fewer than in 1910, 126 fewer than

in 1911, 64 fewer than in 1912, 20 fewer than in 1913, 4 more than in 1914, and 14 fewer than in 1915.

It is thus shown in this report, that the smallest number of deaths occurred at the age-periods 1-5 and 5-10 years, and that of the decedents 92 per cent. died at those ages when their deaths entailed the greatest loss to the state.

As to the sex, 349 of the decedents, or 48.74 per cent., were males; and 367, or 51.25 per cent., were females.

Centenarians.—Among the persons whose decease occurred in 1916, six men and six women had exceeded the age of 100 years. Their names, together with a few facts relating to their life history are as follows:

Eliza Wentworth Merrill of Gray, widow of Enoch Merrill, died February 20, 1916, aged 105 years, 2 months, 20 days. She was born in Bridgton, December 31, 1810, daughter of William Wentworth and Betsey Merrill, both born in Buxton. Cause of death, fall, causing fracture of femur.

Benjamin Priest, died in Canaan, May 20, 1916, at the age of 104 years. He was a farmer, born in Clinton, Maine, son of Joel Priest and Betsey Clark, both natives of Massachusetts. Cause of death, acute bronchitis.

William Brawn, a laborer, of American birth, parentage unknown, died of general debility at Winslow, March 23, 1916, aged 103 years.

Elnathan Freeman Duren, son of Elnathan Duren, native of Massachusetts, and Elizabeth Freeman of Portland, Maine, died in Bangor, November 9, aged 102 years, 8 months and 26 days. He was born in Boston and followed the occupation of a bookseller. Cause, arteriosclerosis.

Columbia Rawson Parris, widow of Virgil D. Parris, died of old age at Paris, June 18, aged 102 years, 3 months, 21 days. She was born in Paris, Maine, daughter of Samuel Rawson and Polla Freeland, both natives of Massachusetts.

Sophonria Holman, widow of Orville White, died of bronchopneumonia in New Sharon, December 27, 1916, aged 101 years, 3 months, 26 days. Her parents, Elisha Holman and Phila Packard, were both natives of Massachusetts. She was born in Weld, Maine.

Lydia Ranco Loring, a Canadian of Indian parentage, widow of Frank Loring, died of debility and old age at Indian Island, Old Town, October 21, 1916, at the age of 101 years.

Lucy McGregor Chandler, born in Palermo, daughter of Abel McGregor, a native of New Hampshire, and Joanna Miller, native of Connecticut, died of senility in East Corinth, January 19, aged 100 years, 11 months, 8 days. She was the widow of Moses Chandler.

Martha A. Briggs, a widow, aged 100 years, 5 months, 26 days, died in Corinna, March 2. She was a native of Massachusetts, daughter of David Buxton and Lydia Johnson, also natives of that state. Cause of death, old age and catarrh of stomach.

William S. Taylor died in Parsonsfield, May 5, aged 100 years, 3 months, 5 days. He was born in Parsonsfield, son of Curtis C. Taylor and Patience Dow, both of American birth.

Joseph Welch, a farmer, born in Gray, died in Freeport, April 29, 1916, aged 100 years, 26 days. Nativity of parents not stated. Cause of death, senile debility.

Louis Francis, an Indian hunter and basket maker, born in North Dakota, fell from a piazza in Foxcroft causing his death on July 29, 1916. His father, Peter Francis, was also native of North Dakota.

Of these 51 were in the cities. The death-rate from the several diseases grouped under this head was 1.28.

Of these 325 were in the cities. The state's death-rate from apoplexy was, therefore, 12.77; that of the cities, 12.47.

The largest number of deaths from apoplexy, 291, occurred in the winter; the largest number in any one month was 108 in February.

In 1894, 1896, 1900, 1905, 1906, 1908, 1909, and 1911, the greatest mortality from this cause occurred in the spring; in 1892, 1893, 1895, 1897, 1899, 1901, 1903, 1904, 1907, 1910, 1912, 1913, 1914, and 1915 in the winter; in 1898 in the winter and spring; and in 1902 in the summer.

Conversely, the smallest number of deaths, 71, was in July; the smallest number in any one season was 217 in the summer months. Over 80 per cent. of the deaths were of persons 60 years of age and upward.

Bronchitis.—From this cause, including both acute and chronic bronchitis, 163 deaths were registered (287 in 1892, 197 in 1893, 209 in 1894, 225 in 1895, 220 in 1896, 237 in 1897, 210 in 1898, 233 in 1899, 262 in 1900, 222 in 1901, 241 in 1902, 209 in 1903, 223 in 1904, 218 in 1905, 187 in 1906, 190 in 1907, 154 in 1908, 214 in 1909, 229 in 1910, 204 in 1911, 205 in 1912, 161 in 1913, 164 in 1914, and 179 in 1915). Among these decedents 66 were males and 97 were females.

Of these 163 deaths, 60 were in the cities.

The largest number of deaths in any one month was 22 in March.

The smallest number for one month, 3, occurred in both July and September. The largest number of deaths in three consecutive months was 58 in January, February and March; the smallest number in three consecutive months was 11 in July, August and September. The number of deaths by quarters was 58, 49, 11 and 45.

A reference to the following table will show the number of deaths which occurred in each month as well as the number in each county, and the county death-rates, for this cause. There were in the first quarter of the year but 20 deaths from this cause; in the second quarter, 40; in the third quarter, 294; and in the fourth quarter, 75.

The largest number of deaths in one month occurred in August, that being 138.

Of the children dying from this cause, 60 per cent. were less than six months old, and another 31 per cent. were less than 1 year of age, making 91 per cent. of deaths within the first year of age.

Peritonitis.—There were 13 deaths from this cause (129 in 1892, 151 in 1893, 137 in 1894, 125 in 1895, 116 in 1896, 117 in 1897, 102 in 1898, 83 in 1899, 105 in 1900, 99 in 1901, 81 in 1902, 55 in 1903, 63 in 1904, 90 in 1905, 59 in 1906, 60 in 1907, 64 in 1908, 59 in 1909, 62 in 1910, 36 in 1911, 36 in 1912, 22 in 1913, 40 in 1914, and 32 in 1915), 4 males and 9 females. Seven of them were in the cities. The following shows the county, month and age distribution of the deaths from this cause:

Appendicitis.—Of the deaths classified under this cause, 101 in number, 52 were males and 49 females. The number of deaths in each month was: January, 7; February, 9; March, 12; April, 4; May, 8; June, 9; July, 9; August, 7; September, 9; October, 11; November, 9; December, 7.

Ages: From 1-5, 7; 5-10, 12; 10-20, 26; 20-30, 13; 30-40, 12; 40-50, 11; 50-60, 8; over 60, 12.

Cirrhosis of the Liver.—Sixty-three deaths were ascribed to cirrhosis of the liver—those of 41 men and 22 women. Of these 63 deaths, 25 were in the cities, and 38 in the rural parts

of the state. The death-rate in the state from this one cause was 0.81 per 10,000 (0.19 in 1892, 0.18 in 1893, 0.29 in 1894, 0.50 in 1895, 0.33 in 1896, 0.45 in 1897, 0.58 in 1898, 0.52 in 1899, 0.79 in 1900, 0.63 in 1901, 0.63 in 1902, 0.92 in 1903, 0.66 in 1904, 0.62 in 1905, 0.60 in 1906, 0.82 in 1907, 0.89 in 1908, 0.75 in 1909, 0.79 in 1910, 0.41 in 1911, 0.65 in 1912, 0.75 in 1913, 0.68 in 1914, and 0.74 in 1915).

Nonvenereal Diseases of the Genitourinary System and Adnexa.—There were 1,007 deaths referred to the diseases under this group, equivalent to a death-rate of 12.88.

Nephritis.—Acute nephritis caused the death of 96 persons, 48 males and 48 females. The death-rate from nephritis was, therefore, 1.23.

Ages: Under 1, 3; 1-5, 4; 5-10, 1; 10-20, 4; 20-30, 9; 30-40, 11; 40-50, 8; 50-60, 10; 60-70, 24; 70-80, 17; over 80, 5.

**Bright's Disease.*—This was the cause of 784 deaths (204 in 1892, 217 in 1893, 219 in 1894, 234 in 1895, 282 in 1896, 231 in 1897, 250 in 1898, 262 in 1899, 443 in 1900, 471 in 1901, 523 in 1902, 573 in 1903, 575 in 1904, 599 in 1905, 652 in 1906, 661 in 1907, 600 in 1908, 595 in 1909, 714 in 1910, 768 in 1911, 694 in 1912, 665 in 1913, 780 in 1914, and 782 in 1915), 450 males and 334 females. Of these deaths 331 were in the cities.

The Puerperal State.—Under this class of accidents and diseases of reproduction, 109 deaths were registered, not including puerperal fever, (69 in 1892, 50 in 1893, 41 in 1894, 36 in 1895, 56 in 1896, 62 in 1897, 51 in 1898, 40 in 1899, 50 in 1900, 52 in 1901, 69 in 1902, 94 in 1903, 72 in 1904, 51 in 1905, 76 in 1906, 80 in 1907, 66 in 1908, 56 in 1909, 63 in 1910, 99 in 1911, 65 in 1912, 72 in 1913, 60 in 1914, and 87 in 1915). This is equivalent to a special death-rate of 1.39.

Deaths from External Causes.—Under this class there were 684 deaths.

Absorption of deleterious gases (conflagration excepted) caused 6 deaths.

Accidental drowning caused 118 deaths.

The number of deaths referred to food poisoning was 6. With one exception the statement in all instances was ptomaine poisoning.

Acute poisoning caused 12 deaths. These deaths distributed under the various toxic agencies were as follows: Strychnine, 3; patent medicine, 2; mercury, 2; acetanolid tablets, 1; other poisons, 4.

Burns and scalds caused 34 deaths—11 were from clothing taking fire, 9 scalded with hot water; 2 from overturned lamp; 4 from explosion of kerosene; 1 each from steam, explosion of gasoline flatiron, overturning bottle of nitric acid, and burning arm on stove. Four were unspecified.

Conflagration caused 21 deaths.

Electricity caused 1 death.

Excessive cold caused 9 deaths.

Four persons died from excessive heat.

Fractures (cause not specified) caused 16 deaths.

Injuries by animals caused 10 deaths.

Lightning caused 4 deaths.

There were 6 homicides in the state.

Other external violence (accident or traumatism unqualified) caused 26 deaths.

Traumatism by cutting or piercing instruments caused 2 deaths; by fall, 119; by firearms, 28; by machines, 17; in mines and quarries, 4. Of the 136 deaths caused by other crushing (vehicles, railroads, landslides, etc.) 54 were caused by steam railroad accident, 7 by electric railroad, 40 by automobile, 13 by other vehicle, 14 by lumbering operations, and 8 by various means.

The death-rate in the state under this class was 8.42.

Suicide.—Within the year 110 persons took their own lives (59 in 1892, 59 in 1893, 39 in 1894, 66 in 1895, 81 in 1896, 71 in 1897, 56 in 1898, 93 in 1899, 66 in 1900, 81 in 1901, 73 in 1902, 77 in 1903, 107 in 1904, 84 in 1905, 85 in 1906, 87 in 1907, 121 in 1908, 94 in 1909, 79 in 1910, 100 in 1911, 110 in 1912, 99 in 1913, 112 in 1914, and 118 in 1915), 86 males and 24 females. Of the males the occupation of 28 was farmer; of 15 laborer; of 4 merchant; of 4 salesman; 3, fisherman; 3, carpenter; of 2 each, painter and shoemaker; of 1 each, baker, barber, bookkeeper, cabinet-maker, clerk, engineer, expressman, insurance agent, janitor, laundryman, loom-fixer, moulder, nurse, policeman, proprietor of lodging house, reporter, soldier, student and teamster. Five men had retired from business, and in one instance no occupation was given.

Of the females, the occupation of 11 was given as housewife; of 5 as housekeeper; of 1 each, milliner, nurse, student, waitress, clerk and insurance agent. In 2 cases no occupation was given.

As to the means employed, 20 committed suicide by hanging; 50 by firearms; 14 by poison; 8 by drowning; 11 by cutting instruments; 6 by gas asphyxiation; 1 by other means.

The highest death-rate from suicide was in Kennebec county. The rate for the state per 10,000 of population was 1.40.
