the Honorable Executive Council:*

GENTLEMEN:—In obedience to the Constitution of the State I have the honor to submit my annual report of the financial transactions of this Department, together with a brief statement of a few other matters of public interest.

BONDED DEBT.

On January 1, 1917, the total bonded indebtedness of the State was \$1,983,300.00.

In accordance with Section 30 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913 an issue of thirty year state highway bonds amounting to \$200,000.00 dated May 1, 1917 with interest at four per cent and due serially from 1937 to 1946 was sold at the Treasurer's office on May 1, 1917. The entire issue was awarded to the Fidelity Trust Company of Portland at 101.47, they being the highest bidders. The principal and interest on these bonds will be paid from the fees received by the Secretary of State as provided by Section 31 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

In accordance with Chapter 187 of Public Laws of 1917 an issue of twenty year State of Maine War Loan Bonds amounting to \$500,000.00 dated May 1, 1917 with interest at four per cent and due May 1, 1937 was sold by public subscription at

the office of the Treasurer on May 1, 1917 at 102. These bonds are subject to call after May 1, 1927.

The total amount subscribed was \$1,800,000. They were apportioned on the following scale:

All individual subscriptions up to \$2,000 in full.

Over \$2,000, 20%.

All banks, banking institutions and bond houses, 15% of their subscription.

All denominations were delivered as follows:

## TEMPORARY LOAN.

No temporary loan was made in 1917, and none exists.

## TAXES.

All State taxes assessed against the several cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1917 have been paid in full.

This is the first time that this has occurred since the law changing the date on which they were due from January 1st to December 1st, in other words the full tax was collected in the period of thirty-one days.

## CONCLUSION.

I wish at this time to make a few remarks regarding the changes which have taken place in this Department, also the large increase in the amount of business that has been added in the year 1917. The increase has been brought about by the large number of extra checks that have been paid out. Checks for the year 1916 amounted to 50,000; for the year 1917 they amounted to very nearly 70,000. This has been caused by the salaries within the State House having been paid weekly since April 1, 1917 where in former years they were paid monthly. In 1918 it will show a still larger increase as all salaries of the different State institutions are to be paid on the weekly plan. The method of disbursements which have formerly been paid to the Treasurers of the different institutions by having one check sent from this Department to the Treasurer of each institution has been changed. We are now paying all bills direct from this office twice a month where in former years they have only been paid monthly. This has been the cause of a large increase in the amount of work. The weekly payments were established on recommendation of His Excellency and have proven a great success.

All income from the institutions are to be paid over to the State Treasurer daily. The date set for the Council Meeting to take care of the salary warrant is on every Wednesday. Council Meetings to take care of the regular warrants are on the tenth and twenty-fifth of each month, but in some cases where the weekly meeting comes within a day of the semi-

monthly meeting a change is made to take care of both warrants. All bills are audited first. In former years, in some cases, bills have been paid before receiving the approval of the Auditor. All cash discounts are taken. These changes have been the cause of the increase of the clerical force, up to the present time, of one clerk, but on April 1st we will have to add one more. All checks from this Department have been sent out on the same day as the warrant is signed which causes no delay. This has met generally with the approval of the different State institutions.

We have six banks which we use for our active accounts:

Portland National Bank, Portland  
Casco Mercantile Trust Company, Portland  
Augusta Trust Company, Augusta  
State Trust Company, Augusta  
Merrill Trust Company, Bangor  
Manufacturers National Bank, Lewiston.

We have been receiving  $2\frac{1}{2}\%$  per annum on checking accounts and have on time deposit \$410,000. which we are receiving  $4\%$  per annum on. The receipts from the interest accounts on money deposited during the year has been the largest in the history of the State, \$46,002.04.

DEAR SIR:—This is to certify that the cash on hand in the Treasurer's office at the close of business December 31, 1917 as counted, amounted to \$114,913.46 and that the books of the office now show deposits in the several banks of the State amounting to \$1,747,294.59, making a total cash on hand and in the banks of \$1,862,208.05.

I have also examined the securities held for Trust Funds and Trust Deposits and find the coupons properly attached to bonds and all securities complete as shown in the Treasurer's list, a summary of which is hereto attached, amounting to \$532,314.58.

## TRUST FUNDS

The Trust Funds of the State, deposited in the State Treasury, as distinguished from trust deposits listed elsewhere in this report, amount to \$1,908,890.65 and are herewith described.

### AUGUSTA STATE HOSPITAL.

#### ABNER COBURN FUND—\$50,000.

The sum of \$50,000 was bequeathed to the Maine Insane Hospital, now the Augusta State Hospital, by Abner Coburn in 1887. Under the provisions of Chapter 70 of the Resolves of 1887, the Treasurer of State issued to said hospital one unnegotiable registered bond for the sum of \$50,000 bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, payable on the first days of January and July in each year. This bond was renewed July 1, 1917, for 30 years. Chap. 39 P. L. 1917.

#### ROBIE LIBRARY FUND—\$2,000.

As provided by Chapter 42 of the Resolves of 1911, authorizing the acceptance of a gift from ex-Governor Frederick Robie, of Gorham, there is held in trust for the benefit of the Maine Insane Hospital, now Augusta State Hospital, twenty shares of stock of the First National Bank of Portland, said gift to be held as a permanent library fund, the yearly income thereof to be paid semi-annually to the treasurer of the hospital to be used for the benefit of the institution in accordance with the several terms of the gift, or as the trustees of said institution from time to time determine.

#### COLONEL BLACK FUND—\$2,000.

By the will of Col. John Black, the Maine Insane Hospital received a bequest of \$3,000. By the terms of the will, "\$3,000 shall be received by the Trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital, for the sole and express purpose of forming a library for the benefit of the inmates of said institution."

On April 15, 1915, a part of this fund, represented by 20 shares of stock of the First National Bank of Portland, was deposited in the State Treasury by the Treasurer of the Augusta

State Hospital, in trust, as a part of the library fund of that institution.

Based upon information gathered from reports of the Trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital it should be stated here that \$500 of the Col. Black fund was early expended on account of the library, and that \$500 is deposited in the name of the Trustees in the Augusta Savings Bank.

JOSEPH H. WILLIAMS LEGACY—\$1,000.

By the will of Joseph H. Williams, of Augusta, the sum of \$1,000 was bequeathed to the State of Maine for the benefit of the Maine Insane Hospital, now the Augusta State Hospital, and upon condition that a sum of money not less than \$40 shall be appropriated from time to time by the State Legislature and paid annually to the Trustees of said hospital, to be expended from time to time in the purchase of articles of art or use for the diversion of patients in this institution. By the provisions of Chapter 220 of the Resolves of 1892 the bequest was accepted by the 68th Legislature.

HELEN A. GILMAN LEGACY—\$1,000.

By the will of Helen A. Gilman, of Portland, the State of Maine was bequeathed \$1,000, to be held in trust for the promotion of the pleasure and comfort of the patients of the State Hospital for the Insane at Augusta, upon the condition that a sum not less than \$50 a year shall be appropriated by the Legislature to be expended annually. As provided by Chapter 131 of the Resolves of 1905, the 72nd Legislature accepted the bequest and the sum of \$50 is annually paid to the Trustees of the Augusta State Hospital.

ORNE AMUSEMENT FUND—\$1,000.

Mrs. S. A. Orne, of Orneville, bequeathed to the Maine Insane Hospital \$1,000, to be expended by the Trustees for the benefit of the patients. Since 1882 the amount of this trust has been represented by a demand note for \$1,000, dated December 1, 1882, with annual interest at the rate of five per cent., and signed by "R. W. Soule, Treas. Maine Insane Hospital."



This note was replaced by the Trustees of the Augusta State Hospital in 1917 by American Telephone and Telegraph Co. coupon bond for \$1,000.

### BANGOR STATE HOSPITAL.

#### ROBIE AMUSEMENT FUND—\$2,000.

As provided by Chapter 42 of the Resolves of 1911, authorizing the acceptance of a gift from ex-Governor Frederick Robie, of Gorham, there is held in trust for the benefit of the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital, now Bangor State Hospital, twenty shares of stock of the First National Bank of Portland, said gift to be held as a permanent amusement fund, the yearly income thereof to be paid semi-annually to the treasurer of the hospital to be used for the benefit of the institution in accordance with the several terms of the gift, or as the trustees of said institution from time to time determine.

### STATE SCHOOL FOR GIRLS.

These several bequests were deposited in the State Treasury by the trustees of the Maine Industrial School for Girls, in accordance with Chapter 174 of the Public Laws of 1909. The law provides for interest at 5% payable semi-annually.

#### AUGUSTUS HOPKINS LEGACY—\$1,000.

This fund, amounting to \$1,000, was bequeathed to the Maine Industrial School for Girls by Augustus Hopkins, of Gardiner, the income only to be used in such way as seems best for the girls in this institution.

#### PETER LANE LEGACY—\$1,156.75.

This fund was bequeathed to the Maine Industrial School for Girls by Peter Lane of Leeds.

#### ELIZA MUSTARD LEGACY—\$3,912.50.

A fund, amounting to \$4,000, was bequeathed to the Maine Industrial School for Girls by Eliza Mustard, of Richmond, the income to be held to help pay the current expenses of the institution. Less Collateral Interitance Tax, this fund now amounts to \$3,912.50.

## NELLIE F. SHAW FUND—\$4,750.

By the will of Nellie F. Shaw, of Boston, the sum of \$5,000 was bequeathed to the Maine Industrial School for Girls, to be known as the Nellie F. Shaw Fund. Under the laws of Massachusetts the estate of the testator was subject to an inheritance tax of 5%. A balance of \$4,750 represents the bequest.

## UNIVERSITY OF MAINE.

## BEQUEST OF ABNER COBURN—\$100,000.

As provided by Chapter 105 of the Resolves of 1887, the Treasurer of State was authorized and directed to receive from the Maine State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts, in trust, the sum of \$100,000, bequeathed to said college by Abner Coburn. In accordance with said Resolve, an unnegotiable registered bond for this amount was issued, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent, payable on the first days of January and July in each year at the Treasurer's office. This bond was renewed July 1, 1917 for 30 years. Chap. 47, Resolves 1917.

## LAND GRANT FUND—\$118,300.

By authority of Chapter 226 of the Resolves of 1889, the Treasurer of State issued to the State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts, now the University of Maine, one unnegotiable registered bond, bearing date of June 1st, 1889, for the sum of \$118,300. This is a thirty year, five per cent bond. Said Resolve provides that the Treasurer of State shall pay to the Treasurer of said College the interest on said bond from time to time in equal semi-annual payments.

This fund of \$118,300 is derived from the sale of land scrip apportioned to the State by Act of the 37th Congress, approved July 2, 1862, entitled "An Act donating Public Lands to the several States and Territories which may provide colleges for the benefit of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts."

## MISCELLANEOUS.

## HOULTON ACADEMY—\$2,000.

As provided by Chapter 370 of the Resolves of 1864, there is deposited in the State Treasury the sum of \$2,000 for the use and benefit of Houlton Academy, said sum being a part of the funds arising from the sale of timber and lumber on a township for educational purposes. Interest on this fund at the rate of six per cent is annually paid to the trustees of the institution.

## FOXCROFT ACADEMY—\$1,000.

As provided by Chapter 277 of the Resolves of 1868, there is deposited in the State Treasury \$1,000 for the use and fit of Foxcroft Academy. Annual interest on this fund at the rate of six per cent. is paid to the trustees of the institution.

## HEBRON ACADEMY—\$1,000.

As provided by Chapter 277 of the Resolves of 1868, there is deposited in the State Treasury \$1,000 for the use and benefit of Hebron Academy, and annual interest thereon at the rate of six per cent. is paid to the Trustees of that institution.

## ISAAC SANFORD LEGACY—\$1,300.

In 1854 the sum of \$1,300 was paid into the State Treasury in accordance with the will of Isaac Sanford. Seven hundred dollars of this amount was bequeathed to the State Reform School, and \$600 was given for the benefit of the indigent blind and deaf and dumb, said beneficiaries to be natives of the state.

As provided by Chapter 197 of the Public Laws of 1856, a sum of money equal to six per cent of the amount bequeathed to the State Reform School is appropriated annually for the support of the library, said sum to be paid in the month of February.

Under the provisions of Chapter 43 of the Resolves of 1911, the state annually sets apart a sum equal to six per cent. of the interest upon the legacy of \$600, as aid toward the education of the deaf, dumb and blind natives of Maine, in institutions established for the education of such persons.

## MADAWASKA TERRITORY SCHOOL FUND—\$5,000.

As provided by Chapter 100 of the Private and Special Laws of 1861, there is held in trust the sum of \$5,000, for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Madawaska Territory, as their shares of the surplus revenue distributed to the inhabitants of the State in 1837, said sum to constitute a permanent fund, on which six per cent. shall be paid annually for the support of schools in said territory.

## SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2, MADISON—\$1,000.

This fund of \$1,000 is derived from a bond of the State of Maine, which by Resolve of March 25, 1863, the Treasurer of State was directed to receive from Mahlan D. Spaulding, of Boston, the coupons thereon to be paid to the legal agent of the district as they became due, and at maturity of said bond five per cent of the amount to be paid annually for all time to come.

## PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND—\$482,994.25.

In the early years of the State of Maine, among the reservations of public lands were lots in the various townships known as "State Lots." These lands were appropriated for the support of common schools, and the money which has been derived from the sale of such reserved lands constitutes A Permanent School Fund, the interest upon which at six per cent forms a part of the State school fund, which is annually distributed among the several cities, towns and plantations according to the number of children therein between five and twenty-one years of age.

On December 31, 1917, this fund amounted to \$482,994.25.

## LANDS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC USES—\$474,585.33.

In accordance with the early regulations governing the public lands in the State of Maine, adopted in 1832, there has been reserved in each township a certain tract of land to be permanently held as a trust fund for school purposes. By the terms of such regulations the State is trustee of the fund in all unin-

corporated townships, and long term permits to cut timber and grass have been sold and the proceeds of such sales credited to the several townships.

All rights under such permits cease when the township is organized for plantation purposes. The care of these reserved lands is then placed with the Land Agent, who deposits with the Treasurer of State the net proceeds of sales of timber and grass from such lands, to be added to the fund of the township, and the plantation receives each year six per cent interest on its trust fund.

When the township is incorporated, however, the title to these lands passes directly to the town, together with the accumulated fund in the State Treasury, to be held by the town as a trust fund and the income only used for school purposes.

On December 31, 1917, this fund amounted to \$474,585.33.

#### CARLETON FUND—\$1,229.95.

This fund of \$1,000 was a gift from James H. Gregory, late of Marblehead, Massachusetts, in memory of Marcus Manard Carleton, for the promotion of scientific orcharding in Maine. This gift was accepted by the 75th Legislature under the provisions of Chapter 60 of the Resolves of 1911, and consists of one Salt Lake & Ogden Railway Company, first mortgage, five per cent twenty-five year gold bond, due February 1, 1934. The interest on this fund is deposited in the Bangor Savings Bank, and on every fifth year, in accordance with the conditions of the gift, beginning with the year 1914, there shall be paid from the interest accrued the sum of \$200 as a premium for the most thrifty and well kept orchard of one acre or more apple trees, five years from planting.

#### THE JORDAN FUND—\$1,000.

This fund, amounting to \$1,000, represents a gift from Benjamin C. Jordan, of Alfred, accepted by the 74th Legislature under the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Resolves of 1909. The purpose of this gift is to encourage the cultivation of forest trees. In consideration of said gift, the State, once in eighteen years shall offer five prizes to be called the "Jordan Forestry Prize," amounting to \$1,000.

## PASSAMAQUODDY INDIAN FUND.

This fund is derived from proceeds of sales by the Land Agent of timber and grass, together with certain rights of flowage on Indian Township in Washington County since 1853, and now amounts to \$99,759.20.

## PENOBSOT INDIAN FUND.

The amount to the credit of this fund is \$88,092.44. Fifty thousand dollars of said sum was received from the sale of four townships of land purchased by the State of said tribe in 1833, to which have since been added receipts from leases of the shores of several islands in Penobscot river now occupied by the tribe.

## LEVI M. STEWART FUND—\$75,000.

This fund was a gift to the Maine State Sanatorium Association at Hebron, in trust, for the benefit of that institution. The gift was accepted by the Trustees of the Sanatorium January 18, 1913 in the language of the following receipt:

“Received of David B. Stewart, executor and residuary legatee of Levi M. Stewart, late of Minneapolis, deceased, *Seventy-five Thousand dollars in trust*, for the benefit of the *Maine State Sanatorium Association at Hebron*, to be called ‘*The Levi M. Stewart Fund*,’ the principal to be safely invested, and the yearly interest to be used for the benefit of the Sanatorium in such manner as the trustees shall determine.”

This fund was deposited in the State Treasury by His Excellency, Oakley C. Curtis, Governor, and was receipted for by the Treasurer of State October 19, 1915. Governor Curtis received the fund at the hands of the trustees of the Maine State Sanatorium Association at the time of the transfer of the Sanatorium property at Hebron to the State, by deed dated October 5, 1915, and recorded in the Oxford Registry of Deeds, Book 331, Page 219

## SCHOOL FUNDS.

The laws of Maine provide for three school funds, with provisions for the apportionment and distribution of the same among the several cities, towns and plantations. These funds may briefly be described as follows:

### STATE SCHOOL FUND.

The State School Fund apparently had its beginning under the provisions of Chapter 82 of the Public Laws of 1833. At the present time this fund is derived from six per cent interest on the permanent school fund, and one-half the sum received by the State from the tax on the franchise of savings banks, and one-half the sum assessed upon deposits of trust and banking companies. This fund is annually appropriated to the support of common schools and distributed among the several towns according to the number of children therein between five and twenty-one years of age.

### SCHOOL MILL FUND.

The School Mill Fund was created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 43 of the Public Laws of 1872, which provides for a tax of one mill on a dollar upon all the property in the State according to the valuation thereof, to be known as the mill tax for the support of common schools.

Under the provisions of Chapter 111 of the Public Laws of 1907, the School Mill Fund is now based upon a tax of one and one-half mills on a dollar upon the total valuation of the State.

As amended by Section 1 of Chapter 150 of the Public Laws of 1915, the law provides that the State School Fund and the School Mill Fund shall be distributed by the Treasurer of State on the first day of December, annually, to the several cities, towns and plantations according to the number of scholars therein.

All of the School Mill fund not distributed or expended during the financial year, shall at its close be added to the permanent school fund.

## COMMON SCHOOL FUND.

The common school fund had its origin under the provisions of Chapter 177 of the Public Laws of 1909, which provides for a tax of one and one-half mills on a dollar annually to be assessed upon all the property in the State according to the valuation thereof, to be known as the tax for the support of the common schools.

As amended by Section 2 of Chapter 150 of the Public Laws of 1915, the law provides that one-third of this fund shall be distributed by the Treasurer of State on the first day of December, annually, to the several cities, towns and plantations according to the number of children therein, and two-thirds according to the valuation of the State, as the same shall be fixed by the State Assessors for the preceding year.

All of the common school fund not distributed or expended during the financial year, shall at its close be added to the permanent school fund.

The following table shows the amounts in the several school funds, the sources of the same and the deductions made in accordance with law, for the year 1917.
