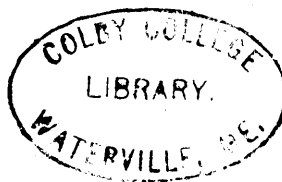

EXPLANATORY

This report covers work of the Department for the period of two years, commencing July 1, 1918 and ending July 1, 1920, with exception of the directory of labor unions, manufacturing establishments and the table giving the number of minors between the ages of 14 and 16 years employed in manufacturing, mechanical, mercantile and other establishments in the State. These three subjects have been revised to conform with the statistics gathered to December 1, 1920.

The next biennial report, for which statistics are now being secured, will cover a period extending from July 1, 1920 to July 1, 1922.

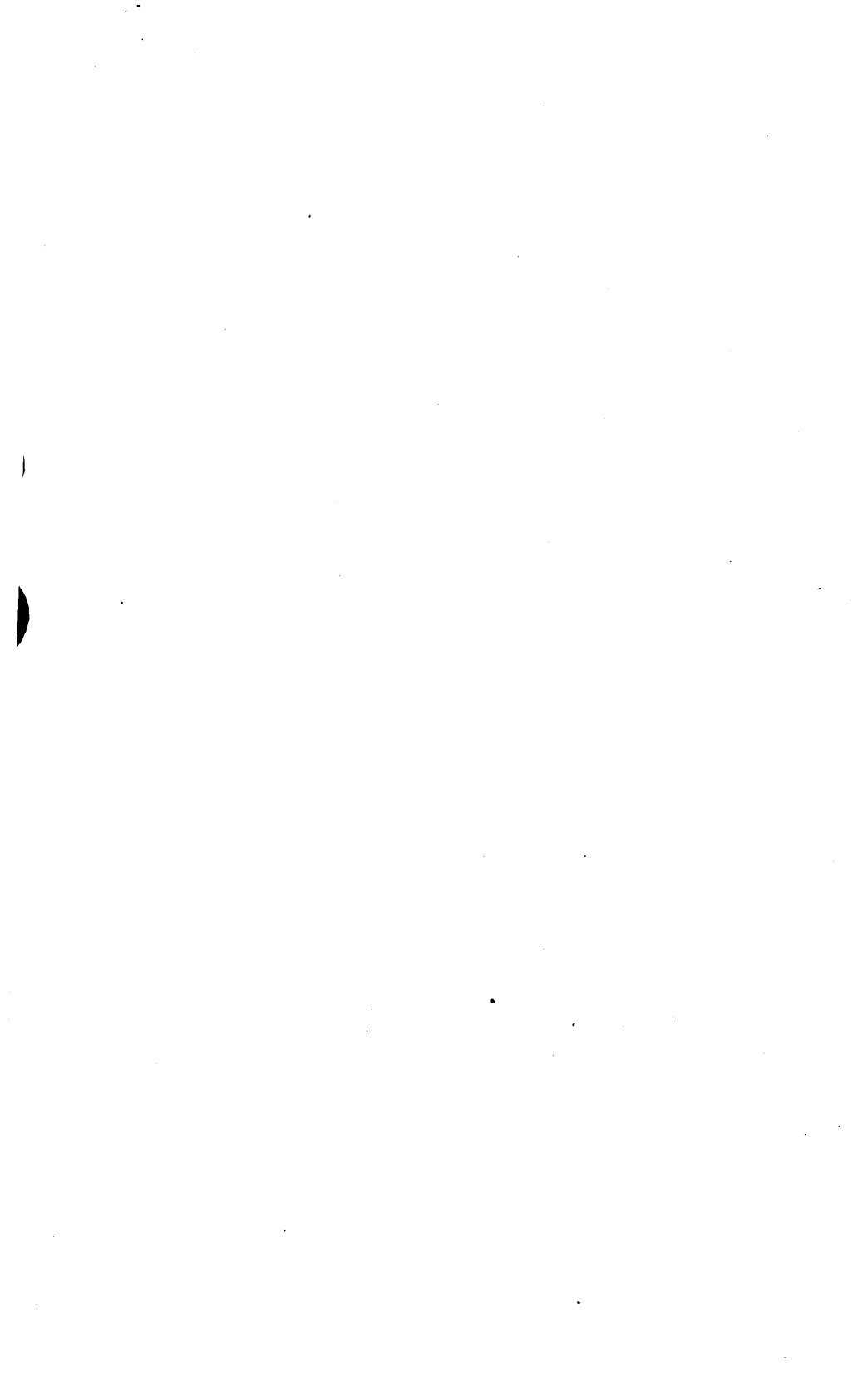

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES IN MAINE

The subjoined table classified by industry has been prepared for the purpose of listing separately similar industries, which will be a convenience when it is desired to obtain information with reference to any particular industry of the State. We have received many requests that the manufacturing directory when published again be classified by industries instead of by cities and towns as previously arranged. After due consideration and advice from competent authorities, we did not deem it wise to make the change because it would impair the directory for many of the purposes for which it is now obtained and used. It is believed that the addition of this table will care for the deficiency complained of as it shows under one heading all industries of that group and the counties in which they are located, the number of employees of each industry in each county, the total number of employees of each industry in the state and the total number of employees of all industries in the state.

The 1917-1918 report showed the total number of persons employed in the manufacturing industries of the State to be 113,410. This table shows the number to be 110,875 which is a decrease of 2535 employees since our last report. The decreases and increases were as follows: A decrease of 457 in the Cotton industry, 4089 in the Shipbuilding industry and 714 in all other manufacturing industries and an increase of 967 employees in the Boot and Shoe industry, 188 in the Woolen industry and 1570 in the Pulp and Paper industry.

State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation.

REPORT

During the year 1919, Hon. Alton C. Wheeler, of South Paris, was Chairman of the board, Hon. John Houston, of Guilford, was the employer member and Edward A. Cartret, of Westbrook, was the employee member, the latter having been Secretary during the two years covered by this report. On the resignation of Mr. Wheeler, Frank H. Ingraham, of Rockland, was appointed January 7, 1920, by Governor Milliken to fill the vacancy his term expiring September 25, 1921. Otherwise, the membership of the board has remained the same for the two years, Mr. Ingraham having been elected Chairman.

Section 1 of Chapter 49 of the Revised Statutes provides that "it shall be the duty of the board to endeavor to settle disputes, strikes and lockouts between employers and employees" and the following sections to and including section 6 provide in detail in regard thereto. Section 7 of the same chapter provides regulations for advertisements and solicitations by employers during the continuance of labor troubles among their employees and it is stipulated that such provisions "shall cease to be operative when the State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation shall determine that the business of the employer, in respect to which the strike, or other labor trouble occurred, is being carried on in the normal and usual manner and to the normal and usual extent." This question is to be determined as soon as may be upon the application of the employer and section 8 provides that whoever violates section 7 "shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five, nor more than fifty dollars." This report, therefore, should properly take up first, the matter of the settlement of labor controversies and second, the determination of questions as to whether or not the business in respect to which the labor trouble occurred was being carried on in the normal and usual manner and to the normal and usual extent.

LABOR CONTROVERSIES

The services of the State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation have been at the disposal of employers and employees throughout the state during the years 1919 and 1920, and have been offered in all cases where the members of the Board have learned of labor troubles but have been little sought for, either by those who employ, or those who are employed, in the settlement of controversies that have arisen. In most cases where the good offices of the Board have been tendered the parties in controversy have declined to accept the same, employers particularly feeling that they were able to handle the situation without any assistance.

In the city of Portland, where labor is well organized, there has been a disposition to settle matters locally, rather than to invoke the assistance of the State Board.

The Mayors of cities and the Selectmen of towns rarely comply with the provisions of law requiring them to notify the state board when a strike is seriously threatened, or actually occurs, and there have been several instances where strikes of considerable magnitude have taken place without the board learning thereof until after the controversy had ended. Almost without exception, the first information that has reached the board has come through some member reading in a newspaper of the labor trouble.

In 1919, the board gave a hearing to the Marston & Brooks Co. of Hallowell, and their employees, relative to a controversy then existing between them. The board awarded an advance in wages of 10% to the employees which was carried out by the employers and proved satisfactory to both parties concerned, it is believed.

In 1920, the members of the board conferred with J. L. Walker Co., of Lewiston, and their employees, relative to a strike that was of quite long duration and the Secretary had conferences with the Casco Tanning Co., of Portland, and its employees, relative to labor troubles existing between them.

Correspondence was had, relative to labor controversies between the following concerns and their employees: The Jordan Lumber Co. and Wing & Engel Company, of Old Town, Den-

nett & Prince Co. of Eastport, The Casco Tanning Co., D. E. McCann's Sons and C. P. Buker, of Portland and J. L. Walker Co., of Lewiston. Other labor troubles that were learned of were investigated by the member of the board nearest to the place of the controversy. For the reasons stated, it has not been possible to make a complete list of strikes that have taken place, but it is hoped that this may be done in ensuing years.

DETERMINATIONS AS TO BUSINESS AGAIN BEING NORMAL
AND USUAL

On the respective applications of the Hyde Windlass Co., of Bath, and the Lewiston Bleachery & Dye Works, of Lewiston, the board, after hearing and investigation, in each case, determined that the business of each corporation in respect to which a strike had occurred was, at the respective times of determination, being carried on in the normal and usual manner and to the normal and usual extent. There are other labor controversies that have occurred in which the board will soon receive applications to take similar action, and correspondence has been had with several concerns, relative to these matters and in reference to the application of sections 7 and 8 of said chapter 49, as to concerns advertising, or soliciting for help following labor troubles.

These sections are the only sections of the law relating to this board that have any penalties attached and are, therefore, the provisions to which the most attention is given. The attention of the board has been called, in several instances, to violations of the provisions of section 7 and the matter has been taken up with the concerns at fault, but no prosecutions have been instituted, the violations apparently not having been wilful.

In conclusion, it is felt that, while there have been few industrial controversies during the period covered by this report, the services of the board have been of value to the state and the fact of its availability in time of need, is of consequence, especially to those who are concerned with the interests of employers and employees, and may be highly important and of far reaching effect should the emergency arise. The Massa-

chusetts State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation has existed for thirty-five years and is much used in that state, especially in connection with controversies relative to trade agreements, successfully acting as arbitrator, as well as in conciliating and as mediator. It is to be hoped that those involved in labor controversies in this state may more frequently avail themselves of the services of their state board.
