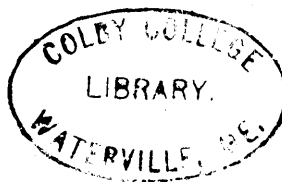

REPORT OF DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS

ROUTINE OFFICE WORK

The shipments to the Census Bureau were as follows:

Births, 19,394 Deaths, 11,694

Eight thousand, six hundred and ninety-nine letters and abstracts have been sent out during 1920. Five thousand, six hundred and fifty-three received. Dunning letters to delinquent clerks, frank letters to doctors, undertakers and ministers for more complete records, and a large number to parents to secure the Christian names of children whose birth record came in before the child was named.

The number of requests for information and copies of records of births, marriages, divorces, and deaths seem to increase each year.

Requests: From State School for Girls, Hallowell; New England Home for Little Wanderers, in Waterville, and throughout New England; Children's Home Society; Red Cross; State Labor Department; State Charities and Corrections; also many other charitable organizations in other States. We have sent records in answer to requests from individuals in nearly every State, also throughout Canada.

We have many calls from Insurance Companies, people making Sanitary Surveys, also Societies of Child Hygiene and other Public Health workers, for special birth and death tabulations.

Requests from Librarians of other States for our yearly report are referred to the State Librarian. The first of every month during 1920 we have forwarded to Congressmen, Carroll L. Beedy, W. H. White, Jr., and John A. Peters, the names and addresses of all mothers in their districts giving birth to children during the preceding month, that they might receive the Child Welfare Literature, published by the U. S. Government.

The work of copying the old records on the form now used, work on the divorce and marriage index and filing records has been carried on when time could be spared from the routine work. Each year we have over thirty thousand birth, marriage, and death records to sort and put into their permanent file. We receive reports from five hundred and twenty cities, towns,

and plantations in Maine, which records have to be corrected, sorted and filed by this department monthly.

REGISTRATION REPORT, 1920.

This report presents the results of the registration and tabulation of the births, marriages, divorces, and deaths which occurred in the State of Maine during the year 1920.

The number of births registered in the year 1920 was 2,290 more than in the preceding year. The number of births, recorded in each of the registration years 1892-1920 is 14,028, 14,604, 14,607, 15,430, 15,429, 15,142, 15,121, 14,475, 14,709, 14,615, 15,166, 15,130, 15,405, 16,005, 16,585, 16,595, 16,914, 16,735, 16,469, 16,300, 16,583, 16,408, 16,731, 17,359, 16,633, 16,985, 16,290, 15,205 and 17,495.

There were 209 pair of twins and one set of quadruplets born in 1920.

The number of Stillborn children was 750.

The number of marriages (number of couples married) in 1920 was 7,884, 605 more than in the preceding year. The number of marriages registered in the State in each of the years 1892-1920 is, respectively, 5,726, 5,795, 5,591, 5,729, 5,579, 5,331, 5,144, 5,329, 5,482, 5,735, 5,905, 6,200, 6,208, 6,264, 6,498, 6,380, 5,904, 6,011, 5,900, 5,878, 6,550, 6,622, 6,707, 6,672, 6,576, 7,095, 5,950, 7,279, and 7,884.

The number of deaths recorded in the State for the same year was 11,850, (this number includes all premature deaths) a number 931 more than that of the deaths registered in the preceding year. The number of deaths in each year thus far recorded is: in 1892, 12,147; in 1893, 11,134; in 1894, 11,012; in 1895, 10,464; in 1896, 10,626; in 1897, 11,236; in 1898, 10,956; in 1899, 11,370; in 1900, 11,389; in 1901, 11,133; in 1902, 10,673; in 1903, 11,009; in 1904, 11,346; in 1905, 11,381; in 1906, 11,427; in 1907, 11,803; in 1908, 11,664; in 1909, 11,295; in 1910, 12,439; in 1911, 11,731; in 1912, 11,390; in 1913, 11,552; in 1914, 11,648; in 1915, 11,541; in 1916, 11,772; in 1917, 11,407; in 1918, 14,187; in 1919, 10,919; in 1920, 11,850.

One thousand, three hundred and sixty-four divorces were decreed in the year of 1920. (552 in 1892, 627 in 1893, 674 in 1894, 681 in 1895, 668 in 1896, 722 in 1897, 764 in 1898, 790 in 1899, 801 in 1900, 808 in 1901, 905 in 1902, 946 in 1903, 906 in 1904, 848 in 1905, 787 in 1906, 887 in 1907, 904 in

1908, 957 in 1909, 911 in 1910, 985 in 1911, 1,081 in 1912, 1,092 in 1913, 1,030 in 1914, 1,006 in 1915, 698 in 1916, 1,080 in 1917, 847 in 1918, and 1,230 in 1919. In 1920 there were decreed in Maine one divorce for every 6 marriages solemnized.

Bertillon Classification. — Nomenclature of the causes of death in this report is the revised Bertillon classification adopted by the International Commission which met in Paris in July, 1909.

Population.—The population of the State of Maine in 1910 as given by the twelfth census was 742,371. In 1900 the population of the State was 694,466. In 1920, 767,996. There was, therefore, a gain of 73,530 since 1900.

Smallpox.—There were no deaths from smallpox in 1920. No deaths were due to this disease from 1892, when our registration went into effect, until 1899, when there were three deaths; in 1900, 2; in 1902, 12; in 1903, 7; in 1904, 3. In 1918 as in 1917, 1916, 1915, 1911, 1910, 1909, 1908, 1907, 1906, 1905, and 1901, there were no deaths from smallpox. In 1912 there were 4 deaths from this cause, all children, in 1913, 2 deaths occurred, in 1914, 2; and in 1919, 2 again.

Measles.—This disease caused the death of 25 persons of whom 12 were males and 13 females. Typhoid Fever.—There were 68 deaths from typhoid fever. Of these 42 were males and 26 were females. As indicative of the loss which the state incurs from typhoid fever, it is well to bear in mind that the age distribution of the decedents shows that the deaths from this disease are principally among those active and productive age-periods when human life is of most value; 68 per cent died between 10 and 50 years of age.

Malarial Disease.—Nearly every year a few deaths have been reported to the department as having been caused by malaria, or malarial disease. Almost without exception when there was good reason to believe that the deaths had malarial cause, the infection was contracted outside the state. For the year 1910, no deaths were reported as having been caused by malaria, for 1911 only 3; for 1912, 2; for 1913, 4; for 1914, 5; for 1915, 1; for 1916, 1; for 1917, 0; for 1918, 2; for 1919, 0; and for 1920, 2.

Infantile Paralysis.—An epidemic of infantile paralysis caused 26 deaths in 1916,—12 males and 14 females. In 1917, 5 deaths occurred from this disease, in 1918 there were 7 deaths, in 1919 there were 3 deaths, while in 1920 there were 10 deaths.

The death-rate per 10,000 from this disease was 0.13.

Cerebrospinal Meningitis.—In 1916, 15 deaths from cerebrospinal meningitis occurred in the state, in 1917 there were 24 deaths, in 1918 there were 31 deaths, in 1919 there were 23 deaths, while in 1920, 12 deaths were attributed to that cause—7 males and 5 females.

The death-rate per 10,000 from this cause was 0.16.

Pellagra.—In the year 1920 there were 5 deaths from pellagra. In 1919 there were 4 deaths, in 1918, 16 deaths, in 1917, 19 deaths, in 1916, 15 deaths, in 1915, 1914, 1913, there were 10 deaths in each year; in 1912, 4; in 1911, 1. No deaths from that disease were recorded prior to 1911. Two of the decedents were males and 3 were females.

Bronchitis.—From this cause, including both acute and chronic bronchitis, 101 deaths were registered (287 in 1892, 197 in 1893, 209 in 1894, 225 in 1895, 220 in 1896, 237 in 1897, 210 in 1898, 233 in 1899, 262 in 1900, 222 in 1901, 241 in 1902, 209 in 1903, 223 in 1904, 218 in 1905, 187 in 1906, 190 in 1907, 154 in 1908, 214 in 1909, 229 in 1910, 204 in 1911, 205 in 1912, 161 in 1913, 164 in 1914, 179 in 1915, 163 in 1916, 171 in 1917, 145 in 1918, and 122 in 1919.) Among these decedents 44 were males and 57 were females.

Of these 101 deaths, 34 were in the cities. The death-rate for the state was 1.32; for the cities, 1.23.

Deaths from External Causes.—Under this class there were 538 deaths.

Absorption of deleterious gases (conflagration excepted) caused 3 deaths.

Accidental drowning caused 80 deaths.

The number of deaths referred to food poisoning was 19. All due to ptomaine poisoning.

Acute poisoning caused 15 deaths. These deaths distributed under the various toxic agencies were as follows: Strychnine, 1; Kerosene Oil, 2; wood alcohol, 8; other poisons, 4.

Burns and scalds caused 25 deaths—8 were from clothing taking fire; 7 scalded with hot water; 3 playing with matches; 5 from explosion of kerosene; 2 were unspecified.

Of the 97 deaths caused by other crushing (vehicles, railroads, landslides, etc.) 33 were caused by steam railroad accident, 3 by electric railroad, 47 by automobile, 5 by other vehicle, 1 by undermining earth, and 8 by other means.
