Department of the Attorney General.

Augusta, December 1, 1928.

*To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine:*

The Revised Statutes of this State, as well as time honored custom, require that the Attorney General shall make a report of the amount and kind of official business done by his department and by the several county attorneys, stating in that report the amount of criminal and civil business, the number of persons prosecuted for alleged offenses and the results.

In compliance therewith, I, therefore, submit herewith my report for the fiscal periods July 1, 1926 to June 30, 1928, together with statement showing the present status of any pending cases.

HOMICIDE CASES IN WHICH THE ATTORNEY  
GENERAL TOOK PART. 1926-1928.

STATE v. WILLARD GUPTILL.

Indictment for murder of Fay Tibbetts at Berwick, at the May Term 1925, of the Supreme Judicial Court for York County. Trial at May Term 1925, plea self defense. Verdict guilty of murder as alleged, sentence life. Motion for new trial filed and denied. Law on appeal and exceptions. Argued at the June Law Term 1926. Exceptions allowed by the Law Court in May 1927. Assigned for trial at the September Term 1927, Plea guilty of manslaughter offered and accepted. Sentence 10 to 20 years. See 126 Maine 239.

STATE v. BENJAMIN H. TURNER.

Indictment for murder of J. D. Hallen of Portland found at November Term 1928 of the Cumberland Superior Court. On motion of respondent committed for observation at State Hospital at Augusta. Returned for trial January Term 1927. Trial January 1927. Plea insanity. Verdict guilty as alleged. Sentence life. Law on exceptions to admission of certain evidence. Argued at June Law Term 1927. Exceptions overruled and judgment for the State. See 126 Maine 376.

STATE v. EARL W. PERHAM.

Arrested and held by Bangor Municipal Court January 25, 1927 for the killing of Earl Finch at Patten. Case investigated and presented to Grand Jury of Superior Court for Penobscot County. May Term 1927. No indictment found.

STATE v. C. K. DONNELL.

Indictment for murder of Blanche Louise Williams as result of alleged illegal operation found at June Term 1927 of the Superior Court for Androscoggin County. Trial at June Term 1927. Verdict not guilty.

## STATE v. EUGENE A. FOGG.

Arrested and held on complaint for murder of Charles R. Adams on August 7, 1927 at New Vineyard. At the September Term 1927 of Supreme Judicial Court for Franklin County indictment found for manslaughter. Plea guilty. Sentence two to four years.

## EDGAR M. WARD, PETITIONER v. STATE.

Petitioner now serving sentence at Thomaston. See State v. Ward, 119 Maine 482. Petition for writ of error for alleged irregularities in trial. Hearing on petition January Term 1927 Supreme Judicial Court, Knox County. Petition denied. Law on exceptions. Exceptions overruled. Judgment for State.

## STATE v. PERLEY JONES.

Indictment for murder of Dexter B. Wentworth in Lincolnville, May 20, 1927, found at September Term 1927, Supreme Judicial Court, Waldo County. Trial at September Term 1927. Verdict guilty as alleged. Sentence life.

## STATE v. LELAND WELLMAN.

Indictment for murder of Dexter B. Wentworth, found at September Term 1927, Supreme Judicial Court, Waldo County. Plea September Term 1927, guilty. Sentence life.

## STATE v. JAMES P. KELLEY.

Indictment for murder of Lillian G. W. Casey on July 11, 1927, found at September Term 1927 of Superior Court for Cumberland County. Trial at September Term 1927. Verdict guilty as alleged. Sentence life. Law on exceptions. Exceptions overruled.

## HARRY WOOD, PETITIONER.

This was a petition filed by the respondent in State v. Harry Wood, indicted at November Term 1927, Supreme Judicial Court, Aroostook County, for leave to disinter body of Lee H. Parker, and for second autopsy. Petition dismissed by presiding justice.

Exceptions. Argued at June Law Term, 1928. Exceptions allowed and second autopsy ordered. Autopsy held, and report submitted, confirming results of first autopsy. See 127 Maine 197.

STATE v. HARRY WOOD.

Indicted at November Term 1927 of the Supreme Judicial Court for Aroostook County for killing of Game Warden Lee H. Parker. Trial November Term 1927. Verdict guilty of manslaughter. Sentence ten to twenty years. Motion for new trial filed and denied. Appeal. Argued at June Law Term 1928. Motion overruled. Judgment for the State. Reported in 127 Maine.

STATE v. RAYMOND PETIT.

Indictment found in Sagadahoc County at the January Term 1928 of Supreme Judicial Court, for murder of Maria E. White of Topsham. Respondent formerly inmate of State Hospital for Insane and on parole when killing occurred. Committed to Hospital at Augusta for observation at January Term 1928. Reported by Hospital Superintendent as insane.

Trial May Term, 1928, no defense offered. Following the instructions of court the jury found the respondent "not guilty by reason of insanity", and respondent was committed to building for Criminal Insane at Augusta.

STATE v. SELDEN ADAMS.

Indictment for murder of Payson Randall at Norridgewock on June 19, 1927, found at September Term 1927, Supreme Judicial Court, Somerset County. On motion of respondent committed to State Hospital at Augusta for observation. Trial, April Term at Skowhegan, 1928. Verdict of guilty as alleged. Sentence life imprisonment. Motion for new trial denied. Appeal and exceptions. To be argued at next term of Law Court.

STATE v. ALFRED GORDON.

Indictment for murder of Margaret Wing on April 17, 1928 at Lewiston, found at June Term of Androscoggin Superior

Court. Trial at June Term. Verdict guilty of murder. Sentence life.

STATE v. DR. ROBERT L. MAYBURY.

Indictment for death of Yvonne Boutin by illegal operation at Saco on February 10, 1927, found at May Term 1928, York Supreme Judicial Court. Plea of manslaughter accepted. Fine \$1,000.00.

STATE v. THEOVALD EVERETSON GREP.

Indictment for murder of Henry Gustafson on Schooner "Edw. B. Winslow" in Portland Harbor, September 4, 1298. Indictment found Cumberland Superior Court, September Term 1928. Confession obtained. Plea on arraignment, guilty. Sentence life.

STATE v. ROBERT GUSTAFSON.

Indictment for accessory before fact to murder of Henry Gustafson on Schooner "Edw. B. Winslow" found at September Term 1928, Cumberland Superior Court. Confession. Plea guilty when arraigned. Sentence life.

STATE v. ERNEST O. HADDAD.

Indictment for murder of Maynard Curtis, August 23, 1928 found at September Term 1928, Supreme Judicial Court, York County. Plea on arraignment, guilty. Sentence life.

STATE v. ASA WINSLOW.

Held on complaint for murder, for action of Grand Jury in matter of death of Dennis O. Morton, June 20, 1928. Investigation made and facts presented to Grand Jury, October Term 1928, Supreme Judicial Court, Lincoln County. No indictment found.

In addition to the foregoing cases, this Department has also taken part in numerous criminal matters other than homicides. These were cases where the prosecution has been conducted by the various county attorneys and reported in the statistical tables; one of the most important cases being State v. Percy K. Snow,

Aroostook County, where this Department conducted the investigation leading to the apprehension and arrest of respondent for conducting an alleged "bucket shop" at Houlton. Other investigations conducted by this department during the past two years in assisting sheriffs and county attorneys were for incendiary fires, burglaries, deaths in automobile accidents, sales of worthless stock, and otherwise obtaining money under false pretenses, sales of intoxicating liquors, deaths from suspected illegal operations, and other apparent breaches of the criminal law. It has always been the policy of the Department of the Attorney General to aid county officials in every case and in any manner possible where requests for assistance are received. The attention of the Governor and Council is respectfully called to the fact that the records clearly show that at no time in the history of the State has there been a more competent force of county officials in each and every county than during the past two years; and your attention is further called to the fact that this Department has assisted in or taken charge of fifteen indictments for murder during the past two years wherein thirteen convictions for murder or manslaughter were obtained. In one case only was a verdict of not guilty found, and that a case for an alleged illegal operation, the other acquittal being under instruction from the court where respondent was undoubtedly insane, and the respondent was as a result committed to the State Hospital at Augusta. This Department is satisfied that there should be no return to capital punishment. Careful preparation for trial, and jurors of better quality than in many of our sister states, gives assurance that no "crime wave" will reach Maine. It is the certainty of punishment and not the severity that is the deterrent of crime.

#### CIVIL CASES.

The Attorney General's Department in the past was primarily concerned with the trial of homicide cases, but today the criminal side occupies but little time when compared to the work done in civil matters.

The certificate of organization of each new corporation must be passed upon to the end that it "conforms to the constitution and the laws", and while in a majority of instances this work is



more or less routine, many declarations of purposes require time for consideration.

The opinions requested by the heads of the various departments, not only on matters pertaining to construction of statutes but also matters involving the methods and manner of business and procedure of the departments themselves, grow in number annually, and while few of the questions asked are of great public interest or importance, each problem requires time for thought and study.

The Department also acts in an advisory capacity to town officials who daily call at the State House for assistance, and each mail brings one or more inquiries from municipal officials on questions of law or procedure. While there is no authority requiring the Department to advise the town officer, and the Department hesitates to express its opinion, each letter must be answered, and each request must be respected, with the result that the Department has adopted the policy of making "suggestions" with the request that the local attorney for the town be consulted.

The civil docket of this Department increases with each legislature and the necessity for an additional appropriation to provide a salary or salaries for one or more additional assistant attorneys general is apparent to all who are familiar with the work. The Highway Department daily requires the services of an attorney, the building of each bridge and the construction of each new piece of highway raise many legal problems of property rights. The State should also be represented at frequent hearings before the Public Utilities Commission and the Industrial Accident Commission, because the State is now a party in all too many cases, due in large measure to ill considered and far reaching legislation. It is also undoubtedly true that if one assistant could devote all his time to the work of one department such as Department of Public Welfare, many times his salary could annually be saved to the State.

Some of the more important civil matters handled by this Department during the past two years are the following:

#### GASOLINE INVESTIGATION.

At the request of the Governor and Council made May 1927, this Department conducted for several months an investiga-

tion of prices of gasoline in all sections of the State. Dealers were interviewed, books were examined whenever permission was granted, and while no violations of law were found, the facts obtained were presented to the Federal Trade Commission at Washington, which Commission sent representatives into the State to assist this Department. The objective of the Governor and Council was obtained through the agitation caused, and the investigation resulted in a reduction of price on the commodity in every part of the State. Gasoline is not named as a "necessity" under the Profiteering Act of 1919, and whether or not direct authority should be given to the Attorney General to investigate prices in this and other commodities is a matter for legislative consideration.

#### JAMES H. KERR v. STATE.

This was an action of assumpsit for \$200,000.00 brought by James H. Kerr under and by virtue of Chapter 237 of the Resolves of 1927 to recover for losses claimed by said Kerr in building Hancock-Sullivan Bridge for the Highway Commission.

The State admitted that it owed Mr. Kerr the balance of contract price, approximately \$2,400.00. The contractor claimed \$183,000.00 for extra work in excavation and losses due to alleged errors of State engineers. Action was brought in Kennebec Supreme Judicial Court at the October Term 1927. Hearing was held November 3, 1927. Argued by the Attorney General at the December Law Term. The Law Court sustained the contentions of the State and gave judgment for the plaintiff in the sum of \$2,480.00. The case is reported in 127 Maine 142.

#### LEWIS BORNSTEIN, APPELLANT.

From Decree of Commissioner of Agriculture.

Appeal from finding of the Commissioner of Agriculture revoking license to manufacture and sell at wholesale a carbonated beverage known as Whistle. Appeal was taken from the finding of the Commissioner. Appeal entered April Term, 1927, Supreme Court, Androscoggin County. Upon appeal the Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court sitting in the County where the appellant resided found that the beverage Whistle contained artificial

color and the bottles or containers used were not labelled or crowned as required by law. The Commissioner's decision revoking the license was affirmed. Appellant took exception to the rulings of said Justice. Exceptions overruled by Law Court. Case reported in 126 Maine 532.

EAST COAST MFG. CO. v. GEORGE A. BUKER, WARDEN.

This was an action brought against the Warden of the State Prison in the sum of \$200,000., under the provisions of the Statutes relating to the Prison. The plaintiff had a contract with the Warden and Prison Commission for the manufacture of shirts by prison labor. Plaintiff claimed damages for not furnishing sufficient men as provided by terms of contract. Heard May 24, 1928 by Chief Justice Wilson, and Justices Pattangal and Philbrook as referees. Judgment for the State.

F. M. FISH, WARDEN, v. ELMER D. AND GEORGE M. FOGG,  
UNDER FIRM NAME OF LEWISTON BROOM COMPANY.

This action was brought for the Prison Warden to recover for labor furnished at the State Prison under contract for making brooms, at the April Term 1927 of the Supreme Judicial Court for the County of Knox. An offer of settlement in the sum of \$2,000.00 was made and the acceptance authorized and directed by the Warden and Prison Commission.

GEORGE H. STARRETT v. STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION.

This was a petition brought in Knox County Supreme Judicial Court against the Highway Commission, by George H. Starrett of Thomaston for alleged damages in raising the grade at the end of a bridge in Thomaston, built under the provisions of the Bridge Act. The evidence was reported to the Law Court and the decision is printed in 126 Maine at 206. The Court rendered judgment for the State.

PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION v. BOOTHBAY HARBOR  
AND WISCASSET STEAMBOAT CO.

This action brought in the name of the Public Utilities Commission was an action on the case under the provisions of Chapter 55, Section 66 of the Revised Statutes to recover a penalty of

\$1,000., for failure to file returns. Writ entered at October Term 1928 of the Supreme Judicial Court for Kennebec County. By agreement of counsel and by authority of the Commission a docket entry of default and continued for judgment was made, with the understanding that default to be taken off if defendant complied before judgment with the statute and orders of the Commission.

BENJAMIN G. WARD v. EDGAR C. SMITH, SECRETARY OF STATE.

Petition for mandamus to compel the Secretary of State to place upon the official ballot for Cumberland County at the September election 1928 the name of petitioner as nominee for the office of Judge of Probate. After informal hearing before Mr. Justice Sturgis at Portland the petition was withdrawn.

STATE v. H. P. CUMMINGS CONSTRUCTION COMPANY.

Action against contractor for damages due to alleged faulty construction of marbleoid floor in Home for Feeble Minded. Writ entered March Term 1928, Kennebec Supreme Judicial Court. This case is now under reference to three justices of the Court.

PORTSMOUTH-KITTERY BRIDGE.

The legislature of Maine by Chapter 44 of Resolves of 1919 appropriated \$500,000., for a bridge between Kittery and Portsmouth. The legislature of New Hampshire appropriated \$500,000. The Maine resolve of 1919 provided that "this State and the State of New Hampshire shall not agree upon a location for said proposed bridge until the Federal Government has been asked to make an appropriation for the same purpose, for the reason that the most expensive location is the one which will best serve the Navy Yard." Subsequently, on July 11, 1919, the Federal Government appropriated \$250,000., and on July 1, 1922 it appropriated \$250,000. more. These appropriations totaling \$1,500,000. would build a bridge from shore to shore at one location, but the Navy authorities insisted upon having the bridge built at another and present location; and the sum of \$1,500,000. was not sufficient to build from shore to shore, but only from the Portsmouth approach to Badger's Island (leaving thirteen hundred

feet and approach at Kittery to be built by the State of Maine). In other words, the bridge over the channel was nine hundred feet long and cost \$1,500,000. and joined the Portsmouth Approach with Badger's Island. The distance from Badger's Island to the approach on the mainland at Kittery was built by the State of Maine, and cost \$132,292.88 additional, paid from contingent fund. The City of Portsmouth furnished its own approach. Maine furnished the approach at Kittery, and in addition thereto built thirteen hundred feet of bridge from this approach to the main structure on Badger's Island.

The State of Maine spent, therefore, between 1921 and 1924 approximately \$132,000. more than either of the other two governments.

After the completion of the bridge, and during the administration of the present Attorney General, the American Bridge Company made demand of the three governments for payments of \$64,900., which included \$10,664.80 for extras, and also a balance under the original contract. On the other hand the States of Maine and New Hampshire claimed a penalty of \$45,000., for not completing the contract within the time specified. On November 21, 1927, a hearing was held before Secretary of the Navy Wilbur at Washington, at which hearing the Attorney General represented the State of Maine. All the claims of the Bridge Company for extras were disallowed by the Secretary, and the Secretary further gave it as his opinion that the penalty of \$45,000. should be imposed upon the contractor. There was at the time of the hearing in Washington a balance of \$34,773. in the Portsmouth Bridge Account of the Federal Treasury with all bills paid, and the Attorney General met with the members of the Maine delegation in Congress to explain the situation, with the result that a bill is now pending in Congress to transfer to the State of Maine this balance as part payment for the excess amounts paid by this State to provide the Badger's Island-Kittery approach.

#### COLLECTION OF INHERITANCE TAXES.

During the fiscal years 1926-1928 the sum of \$922,518.78 has been collected by this Department from non-resident estates and the sum of \$1,463,276.37 from resident estates. The law

relating to estates that are subject to the Federal Estate Tax, and passed by the last legislature in order to obtain the credit allowed (Public Laws 1927, Chapter 116) has brought to the State Treasurer the sum of \$121,327.53.

It is respectfully called to your attention that the reciprocal law (Public Laws 1927, Chapter 231) providing that no tax shall be assessed on a non-resident estate if the decedent was a resident of a state which demands no tax from a decedent of Maine, will make a great reduction in the amount to be received in the future from non-resident estates.

The Department takes pleasure in informing the Governor and Council that it will have no cases pending on the dockets of any court at the end of the present year with the exception of one criminal appeal which may or may not be perfected, and if carried forward will not be in order for argument until the March Law Term. Arrangements have been made for three justices as referees to hear the only remaining civil case during the last week in December.

I take this opportunity, at the close of my four years of service as Attorney General, to again thank my Deputy and Assistant for their efficient aid and counsel. I also extend grateful appreciation to each member of the Department's clerical force for faithful efficiency.

The following are some of the more important opinions rendered by the Department during the years 1927-1928, which may be of public interest.

December 30, 1927.

*Hon. Frank P. Washburn, Commissioner of Agriculture, Augusta, Maine.*

DEAR MR. WASHBURN: Section 5 of Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 61 of the Laws of 1927, provides that any person or combination of persons who shall sell or deliver milk or cream as a business from a wagon or other

conveyance, *dépot* or store, to any other person, or who shall sell or deliver milk to a hotel, restaurant, boarding house or any public place, shall be considered a milk dealer and shall register with the Commissioner of Agriculture. The provisions of the section, however, do not apply "to milk or cream delivered to a creamery or butter or cheese factory."

In the first place, therefore, registration must be made by anyone who as a *regular business* sells or delivers milk to any of the persons or places named or described in the first part of the section. The statute is plain and easily understood with the possible exception of the words "depot", "public place" and "creamery".

A "depot" as defined by the courts in numerous cases is "any place of deposit for storing goods, or a place where goods are held in storage ready for transportation and delivery, such as a warehouse."

A "public place" is a "place where the general public has a right to go or be. It is not an absolute but a relative term, and is used in contradistinction to the term "private place." A city square would clearly come within the definition; while a theatre or a store, an office, a hotel or a church might or might not be depending on the day or time of day and various other conditions. This must be determined from the facts of each particular case as the occasion arises.

A "creamery" is ordinarily supposed to be "an establishment where butter and cheese are made, or where milk and cream are prepared for market." The only difficulty here is in those instances where the "creamery" so-called, is apparently more of a depot or warehouse. The Commissioner will, in close questions, have to use his best judgment. He might not require registration on the part of the man delivering to the "creamery", as the rights of the public would be protected if he required the so-called "creamery" to register as "a depot or store."

DEAR GENERAL HANSON: As I understand the facts contained in your letter of March 20th, the Sheriff of the County of Aroostook issued a call for the National Guard to engage in the search for a man lost in the woods in that county, November 1927. The bills including payroll, amount to \$1043.59, and the County of Aroostook refuses to pay.

I cannot see how the County of Aroostook can be compelled to pay these expenses under the provisions of Sections 9 and 47 of Chapter 174, Public Laws of 1923, as amended. I can find nothing that would prevent the County of Aroostook from paying if the Commissioners of the County are agreeable.

The statute provides that when the National Guard is called forth in aid of civil authorities in case of insurrections, invasion, tumult, riot, mob or body of men acting together by force to resist the laws of the State, the expense shall be paid by the county where such services are rendered. The statute does not contemplate that the Guard shall be called out for any purpose not expressed therein, and compel compensation from the county.

It would seem to me that this is a matter that would have to be attended to by the next legislature so that the money may be appropriated for your department to pay these expenses.

I would respectfully suggest that the National Guard is not subject to call from the civil officers except in the cases specified in the statute, and if a call is made, definite arrangements in the nature of a contract should be made with the county before the troops are allowed to take part in any search or other purpose outside of the purposes listed in the statute.

DEAR MR. STETSON: In answer to your inquiry as to



"whether railroad taxes should be accrued in advance of the assessment or whether the tax paid covers the period until another assessment", I wish to advise that the general rule is as between the State and tax payer, the latter is liable for the tax on such taxable property as he owned on the date fixed by law for the completion of the assessment. Consequently in the absence of statute, no liability for taxes attaches during the current year until after the next regular date for assessment.

In relation to the excise tax on railroad companies under Chapter 9, Sections 25, 26, and 27, of the Revised Statutes, the amount of tax is determined each year by the amount of transportation receipts, received during the preceding year.

You also ask "if a railroad ceases to do business during the calendar year, the corporation is dissolved, and it does not make any return as of December 31st, would there be any tax liability?"

It is my opinion that if the corporation was legally dissolved, there would be no corporation on which to assess the tax.

DEAR MR. HAYFORD: This department is in receipt of your inquiry relative to the expenses to be allowed active retired Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court under Section 5 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 87 of the Public Laws of 1921, and by Chapters 71 and 157 of the Public Laws of 1927.

The two above mentioned statutes of 1927 are to be construed together (*Stuart v. Chapman*, 104 Maine 22), one amendment being passed for the purpose of increasing the salaries of the Justices to \$8,000., and one for the purpose of providing reimbursement to each Justice for "expenses actually and reasonably incurred for clerical assistance" to an amount not exceeding one thousand dollars annually.

Section 7 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 47 of the Public Laws of 1923, and by Chapter 55 of the Public Laws of 1927, provides for retirement of Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court upon attaining the age of seventy years, and also for the appointment by the Governor of retired Justices for active service. The manner and amount of service to be performed by such active retired Justice depends entirely upon the order and direction of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court.

In view of these several statutes, this Department sees no reason why all the necessary legal expenditures of an Active Retired Justice should not be paid by the State, including reimbursement for clerical assistance under Chapter 71 of the Laws of 1927. The Active Retired Justice is by express statutory enactment made "a part of the Court from which he has retired", and if as a part of the Court he renders service at the direction of the Chief Justice he should be reimbursed for all his necessary legal expenses.

DEAR SIR: Answering your letter of November 10th, regarding the amount for which one can charge  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  a month interest under the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 298 of the Public Laws of 1917, I am pleased to inform you that after some investigation of the matter, I am satisfied that a person making a loan in excess of \$300. is governed by the provisions of the general interest law.

If the loan is for \$300. or less, he can operate under the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 298 of the Public Laws of 1917, and is limited to the rate of 12% per year unless license is obtained from the Banking Department, which will permit him to charge interest up to  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  per month.

Under the provisions of said Chapter 298, it is not intended that a person can make several loans to the same person aggre-

gating over \$300. and thereby secure 3½% per month on an amount in excess of the express limitation of said statute.

DEAR SIR: In answer to your inquiry whether the office of Recorder of a Municipal Court is incompatible with the office of County Treasurer, this department makes the following reply:

The constitution of Maine provides in Section 2 of Article III that no person belonging to any of the three departments of government shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others; and Section 2 of Article IX, after listing certain officers, provides that the acceptance of one vacates the other.

The offices specifically mentioned in the constitution do not include either of the offices of recorder or county treasurer, nor are we able to find any decision of our court directly deciding the point in question.

Our court has held, in *State v. Leclair*, 86 Maine 531, that a recorder is not a judicial officer in the sense contemplated by the constitution, and, in the *Opinion of the Justices*, 68 Maine 594, it was determined that a Trial Justice is not to be considered "a justice of an inferior court." In *Stubbs v. Lee*, 64 Maine 195, holding that one who accepts a commission as deputy sheriff thereby vacates the office of Trial Justice, the court say "that two offices are incompatible when the holder cannot in every instance discharge the duties of either:\*\*\*\*\*as if one be under the control of the other."

Although there does not seem to be a direct constitutional prohibition to hold both offices in question, the matter is not free from doubt in the light of some of the decisions.

The functions of the two offices may be inconsistent, as one may be "under the control of the other", so that the court

might properly hold under such circumstances that the acceptance of one of these offices vacates the other.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: Article III, Section 2 of the Constitution of Maine provides with reference to the three distinct departments of Government:

"No person or persons, belonging to one of these departments, shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others, except in the cases herein expressly directed or permitted."

Article IV, Part Third, Section 10, provides:

"No senator or representative shall, during the term for which he shall have been elected, be appointed to any civil office of profit under this State, which shall have been created, or the emoluments of which increased during such term except such offices as may be filled by elections of the people, provided, that this prohibition shall not extend to the members of the first legislature."

Article IX, Section 3 states:

"No person holding the office of justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, or of any inferior court, attorney general, county attorney, treasurer of the state, adjutant general, judge of probate, register of probate, register of deeds, sheriffs or their deputies, clerks of the judicial courts, shall be a member of the legislature; and any person holding either of the foregoing offices, elected to, and accepting a seat in the Congress of the United States, shall thereby vacate said office; and no person shall be capable of holding or exercising at the same time within this state, more than one of the offices before mentioned."

Our court has held in *Stubbs v. Lee*, 64 Maine, 195, "that two offices are incompatible when the holder cannot in every instance discharge the duties of either\* \* \* \* as if one be under the control of the other."

The following offices have been held incompatible by the Supreme Judicial Court of Maine:

Municipal Court Judge and member of the legislature.

Trial Justice and Deputy Sheriff.

The design of the constitutional provisions was to prevent union and exercise of judicial and executive powers in the same person at the same time.

Mathews v. Houghton, 11 Maine 380.

In view of the foregoing constitutional provisions as construed by our court, it is the opinion of this department that a member of the State Highway Commission may hold the office of recorder of a municipal court, nor does there seem to be any reason or authority why a county attorney cannot be at the same time Public Administrator.

A member of the legislature, however, cannot hold at the same time the office of Medical Examiner, Trial Justice or Public Administrator.

It has been repeatedly held that the acceptance of an incompatible office thereby vacates the office first held as completely as by an accepted resignation.

In answer to your recent inquiry regarding the membership of the aforesaid Board, I have the pleasure to inform you that under the provisions of Chapter 144, Section 1 of the Revised Statutes, it is provided in substance, that the government of the State School for Boys and of the State School for Girls is vested in a board of Trustees, consisting of five men and one woman, inhabitants of the state, who shall be known as Trustees of Juvenile Institutions, and that the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall annually appoint a member of said Board to hold office for a term of six years. I fail to find any amendments to the aforesaid section.

It appears that on the present board there are four men and two women, which is clearly not in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid statute.

I, therefore, suggest that a man be appointed to take the place on the Board of Lilla Elliot at the expiration of her term of office, which appears to be May 6, 1927.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: Under Chapter 1, Section 6, subdivision III, "Words giving authority to three or more persons authorize a majority to act when the enactment does not otherwise determine." I do not find that Chapter 195, Public Laws of 1917, "otherwise determines".

Under said Chapter 195 the Board of Prison Commissioners consists of three members, and the Warden, Chaplain and Physician of the prison are appointed by the Commission to hold office during its pleasure.

If there is any question in the minds of the Prison Commission in relation to the validity of any act or appointment by the Commission while there were only two members of the Commission and pending the qualification of the third member, it would be a very simple matter for the Commission to take a vote at its first full Board meeting, although it is the opinion of this department that such action is not necessary where the "majority" have already acted.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: I have your inquiry relative to the construction of a Resolve passed by the last legislature in favor of the town of Skowhegan, which resolve reads as follows:

"Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars to aid the town of Skowhegan in the construction of a bridge across the Kennebec river, at some point below the existing railroad bridge.

This bridge shall be constructed under the provisions of the bridge act, so-called, and construction work shall be started in the year nineteen hundred twenty-seven."

This resolve appropriates \$25,000. "to aid" Skowhegan in constructing a bridge "at some point below the existing railroad bridge", and by the resolve the legislature says "this bridge shall be constructed \*\*\* and construction work shall be started in the year nineteen hundred twenty-seven." Further, the legislature has determined that it shall be constructed "under the provisions of the bridge act".

The Bridge Act, so-called, is Chapter 319 of the Public Laws 1915 (printed as an appendix to the Revised Statutes) as amended by Chapter 304, Public Laws 1917; Chapters 140, 162, and 243, Public Laws 1919; Chapters 50 and 143, Public Laws 1921, and Chapter 193, Public Laws 1923.

Under the Bridge Act either the municipal officers of the town, the county commissioners of the county, or the State Highway Commission may petition, and form a joint board composed of these three bodies, to determine the "public convenience and necessity" of building or rebuilding a bridge "on a main thoroughfare", and to determine the type of construction, the general dimensions, cost, etc. The State Highway Commission prepares for this joint board all plans and specifications and estimates of costs. "On each question arising in all meetings of joint boards each component body shall have one vote." See Chapter 193, Public Laws 1923.

It is a familiar rule of construction of statutes that the legislative intention is to control; and when in one act or resolve a reference is made to an existing law in prescribing the general manner in which a particular thing shall be done, only those parts



of the existing law which are necessary to carry out the intent are construed as incorporated into the new law.

Under the terms of this resolve, therefore, the public convenience and necessity for a bridge has been determined by the legislature. Where the bridge is to be built is not determined. Neither is the type of construction, nor the cost. The legislature has only said that a bridge shall be constructed somewhere across the Kennebec River below the existing railroad bridge and work commenced sometime in the year 1927. Upon these undecided points, the joint board, on petition of either the municipal officers of the town of Skowhegan, the County Commissioners of Somerset County, or the State Highway Commission, must meet and act, before any work is started on any bridge at any point as a result of this legislation.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: In relation to the construction of Chapter 71, approved April 4, 1927, and Chapter 157, approved April 15, 1927, of the Public Laws passed by the last legislature, this is to advise you that it is the opinion of this Department that both of these acts take effect ninety days after adjournment of the session and should be construed together.

Courts have uniformly held even where one act takes effect previous to the other that there is no implied repeal where the acts were passed at the same session of the legislature. Effect should be given, if possible to do so, to all statutes enacted at the same legislative session and where two acts relating to the same subject are enacted at the same session, "The courts will exhaust all resources of interpretation before coming to the conclusion that there is irreconcilable repugnance between them, and that one repeals the other." As was stated by the Massachusetts Court in *Com. vs. Huntley*, 156 Mass. 236, 15 L. R. A. 839, "It is to be borne in mind that these two statutes were both passed at the same session of the legislature and took effect on

the same day. This is strong evidence that they were intended to stand together." The fundamental rule in construing statutes is to ascertain and give effect to the intention of the legislature as expressed in the statutes, and amendments are construed together with the original act to which they relate as constituting one law.

The intention of the legislature as expressed in these two laws is plain. By Chapter 71 an amendment is made by striking out the word "county" in Section 5 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes and inserting in place thereof the word "town" and by adding at the end of said section the provision that each Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall be reimbursed to the extent of one thousand dollars for clerical assistance. The remainder of Chapter 71 provides for a repeal of Chapter 159 of the Public Laws of 1925, relating to court reporters and strikes out the last sentence in Section 167 of Chapter 87 relating to duties of the reporter for the Chief Justice.

These are the only amendments provided for in Chapter 71, the salary of the Justices not being changed by these amendments. By Chapter 157, however, the annual salary of the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court is increased by changing the words "six thousand" to "eight thousand" and no reference is made in this chapter to the amendments considered and adopted by the legislature a few days previously. These amendments are not repugnant or inconsistent. The Legislature intended to provide for clerical assistance, to increase the salaries, and to provide for payment of expenses of Justices when holding court in towns other than the place of residence, and to change the law applicable to court stenographers.

"It is perfectly evident that the legislature intended to make two amendments\*\*\*\*. This it did by two separate acts, each one of which in reciting the section as amended necessarily recited it as though the other act did not exist, because such other act had not become a law and non sequitur that it ever would become one. Both, however, finally by the approval of the governor became statutes of the State at the same time." Mr. Justice Powers in *Stuart v. Chapman*, 104 Me. 24.

In re State and State Aid Highways.

Answering your inquiry regarding the authority of the Highway Commission to lay out, construct and maintain a system of state and state aid highways, I am pleased to inform you that Section 7 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 258 of the Public Laws of 1917, provides as follows:

"The commission shall lay out, construct and maintain a system of state and state aid highways substantially as herein described, and the expense of constructing such state highways shall be borne wholly by the state, except as otherwise provided in section twenty-two. The commission shall be sole arbiter of the designation of the state and state aid highways, but shall, as to state highways, after reasonable notice by publication give all parties interested an opportunity to be heard thereon before commencing such construction. Except as provided in section twenty-two, the construction of state highways shall be paid for wholly from the proceeds of the state bond issue and the fund for the construction of state highways herein provided for and such proceeds of the aggregate of such bonds and such state highway fund shall be expended equitably among the various counties."

In Section 6 of said Chapter 25, as amended by Chapter 258 of the Public Laws of 1917, and by Chapter 215 of the Public Laws of 1921, it is provided as follows:

"The commission may from time to time make and shall enforce rules and regulations relating to construction and maintenance of all state and state aid highways and relating to the manner of conducting all investigations and hearings and the administration of its office, powers and duties, subject to the provisions of this chapter; and shall, with the approval of the governor and council, direct the expenditure of all moneys for construction and maintenance of all state and state aid highways."

From the foregoing, it is evident that the Commission has exclusive power to lay out a system of state and state aid highways, and that they shall, with the approval of the governor and council, direct the expenditure of all moneys for construction and maintenance of all such highways.

In Section 13 of said Chapter 25, it is provided that:

"The commission may alter, widen or change the grade of any state or state aid highway whenever in its judgment the public exigency may

require, and may lay out, establish and open a new highway as a state or state aid highway. It may also discontinue a highway as a state or state aid highway and the same shall be thereafter maintained by the town or county originally liable therefor except as herein otherwise provided."

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: I have examined the letter dated May 20, 1927 from Edward P. Warner, Acting Secretary of the Navy, which letter contains offer of disposal to the State of Maine under Act of June 7, 1926, of site of the former U. S. Naval Coal Depot on Frenchman's Bay, containing fifty-five acres, at an appraised value of fifty-seven hundred fifty dollars. Under "An act to authorize the disposition of lands no longer needed for naval purposes" 44 Stat. 700, the state has six months option after said date of May 20, 1927, to acquire this property at the appraised value, or to notify the Secretary of the Navy that the State desires to exercise the option but has not the money available, in which case it would be held for a period of two years to enable the State to exercise the option, and to pay. The property is limited to the use "for public purposes", and "upon cessation of such retention and use shall revert to the United States without notice."

Under Chapter 164 of the Public Laws of 1925, relating to the contingent fund, the Governor and Council have authority "to pay bills arising out of some emergency\*\*\*not provided for by the legislature", upon warrants drawn upon the contingent fund, duly audited. The question of whether or not this is desirable property for the State to own is a matter for the Governor and Council to decide, and without expressing any opinion as to the legal right under the Laws of Maine of the Governor and Council to acquire valuable property for the State

at a low figure, I call the attention of Your Excellency to the fact that during the previous administration the Governor of this State was notified by the War Department of unused forts which were offered for sale under similar conditions, and the legislature not being in session within the time limit prescribed, the properties were purchased by the then Governor and Council for and in behalf of the State, and the purchase tacitly approved by the legislature in Chapter 183 of the Public Laws of 1925.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: The jurisdiction of a State bordering on the sea over the waters thereof is that of an independent nation, except so far as it would conflict with that of the United States, and extends for a marine league from the shore and over the bays and arms of the sea within the limits defined by international law.

This principle has been applied to the law relating to fisheries, to the criminal laws, to statutes giving the right of action for death by wrongful acts, to statutes authorizing state authorities to fill in land under water where navigation will not be materially affected thereby, to the building of piers and wharves as authorized by the state legislatures.

It has been held in many jurisdictions, including the Federal Court, that the State has the absolute power to grant its lands under water, unless prohibited by its constitution or some statute. The reason for this is that no title to the soil under navigable waters was conferred by the constitution to the Federal Government so far as the original states were concerned, but the title remained in the respective states. The Federal Government, of course, has the right to regulate navigable waters so far as commerce is concerned and permission must be obtained from it where there is to be a permanent and material obstruction to navigation.

Under Chapter 45 of the Public Laws of 1927, if and when

the same shall go into effect, the Governor and Council have the power and authority to lease the rights to gather kelp on the submerged lands and reefs within the jurisdiction of this state, namely, to a point not exceeding a marine league from the shore. Leases, however, shall not be executed for a period of more than thirty years at an annual rental of not less than \$3., per annum per square mile. The prospective lessee should file a petition together with plan showing the location of the territory desired, upon which the Governor and Council should order notice and hold hearing.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: Under Article XXXI, Section 16 of the Constitution of Maine, popularly known as the Referendum, it is provided that no act or resolve, except emergency legislation, shall take effect "until ninety days after the recess of the legislature passing it"; and Section 17 of the same Article provides that a non-emergency act or resolve shall not take effect at the end of this ninety-day period, if ten thousand electors of the state within the ninety days lawfully petition for a reference of the law to the whole electorate. Then if the people at an election approve of the law as passed by the legislature, it takes effect thirty days "after the governor shall have announced by public proclamation that the same has been ratified by a majority."

Article XXXI, Section 17, says: "As soon as it *appears* that the effect of any act \* \* \* \* *has been suspended* by petition \* \* \* \* , the governor by public proclamation shall give notice thereof, and of the time when such measure is to be voted on."

Ten thousand electors, by filing petitions, may prevent any law from *taking effect* until after a general or special election. If petitions duly signed and verified by not less than the constitutional number are filed, the law is suspended and does not go into effect at the end of the ninety day period. *Kehail v.*

Tarbox 112 Me. 328. The Governor alone has the power to determine and declare whether the petitions filed are valid and bear the necessary number. Opinion of the Justices, 116 Me. 581. It is not, however, the Governor's proclamation that suspends the law. If in fact ten thousand electors properly petition, the law is suspended until after an election, although the Governor may require a reasonable time to satisfy himself of that fact.

In reference to the pending proposition in regard to Chapter 251 of the Public Laws of 1927, relating to an increased tax on gasoline, where petitions purporting and appearing to bear a sufficient number of signers have been filed in the office of the Secretary of State asking for reference to the people the only question to be decided is the question of fact, and the fact must, under the constitution, be found by the Governor.

There has not been sufficient time to determine, in the manner authorized in the Opinion of the Justices reported in 116 Maine 557, the validity and sufficiency of the petitions, and the ninety days have expired. The Secretary of State, however, reports that more than twelve thousand persons whose names are certified by various clerks of cities and towns in Maine, have apparently signed the petitions on file, and that the petitions ask for a reference of said act to the people under Article XXXI of the Constitution.

The extra one cent per gallon assessed as an excise tax under Chapter 251, is important to the State, as the revenue would be increased thereby approximately, \$500,000. annually. On the other hand, individual rights of countless residents of our own State, as well as the rights of persons temporarily here, would be seriously violated if attempts were made to collect an unauthorized and therefore illegal tax.

This department sees no reason why, under the circumstances, Your Excellency may not issue a proclamation, if the incomplete examination you have made satisfies you that *prima facie* "It appears that the act in question has been suspended." You may desire further investigation as to the validity and sufficiency of some of the petitions, which investigation might change your first impressions, and it would, therefore, be well to state this in your proclamation. In other words, your proclamation would

temporarily at least announce the suspension of the law and give notice of the time when the measure is to be voted on.

MY DEAR GOVERNOR: The Eighty-second legislature, by Chapter 191 of the Public Laws of 1925, repealed Chapter 217 of the Public Laws for the year 1919, which law provided for upkeep and extensions of the several normal schools "for which purpose there shall be appropriated the sum of sixty thousand dollars beginning with the year 1921, and the same amount annually thereafter to be expended under the direction of the Board of State Normal School Trustees for extensions in buildings, repairs and equipment."

This general law of 1919 thus provided that each succeeding legislature after 1921 should appropriate sixty thousand dollars annually for the extensions in buildings at the normal schools. The legislature of 1925 repealed this general law.

The Eighty-third legislature in 1927, by "an act to appropriate money for the expenditures of the Government and for other purposes" appropriated "For normal school upkeep and extensions sixty thousand dollars, 60,000."

The question is (1) whether or not a provision in an appropriation bill has the effect of law, and (2) whether under this appropriation bill the Governor and Council are authorized to give authority to the Trustees of the State Normal Schools to make a contract for an extension at Castine to be used in connection with the State Normal School conducted there.

In answer to the first proposition, it is universally understood that unless there is a constitutional prohibition, as in some states, an appropriation bill may contain any form of legislation. 36 Cyc. 967; *Mathews v. People*, 202 Ill. 389, 63 L. R. A. 73. See also Vol. 4, *Hinds Precedents*, 382-463, Par. 3578-3916, where the history, authorities and rules of the National House



in relation thereto are fully discussed. Congress has from its earliest history included in appropriation bills various "riders" and occasionally does now in spite of House rules to contrary. See Hinds Precedents cited above. There is no such limitation, constitutional or otherwise, in this State. The provision relating to normal schools as passed in the Appropriation Bill by the last legislature is valid without a special or additional act of legislation specifically authorizing it. No legislature can bind another legislature, nor can any legislature bind itself. 4 Hinds 388. Sawyer v. Gilmore, 109 Me. 180. Opinions of Justices, 103 Me. 508. Sutherland on Statutory Construction, Par. 136. The repeal in 1925 of the general law of 1919 which attempted to make it obligatory on every legislature to pass an annual appropriation for upkeep and extensions could not *prevent* the same or succeeding legislature from making an appropriation. "Special provisions in an appropriation act are presumed to be of temporary effect." Sutherland on Statutory Construction, Par. 136, 218, and cases there cited.

As to the second question; it is fundamental that the intention of the legislature is to govern in the construction of all acts passed. The intention as contained in the "Act to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of the Government and for other purposes" is clearly expressed: "the governor with the advice of the Council is hereby authorized at any time prior to the thirty-first day of December nineteen hundred and twenty-eight to draw his warrant on the state treasurer \* \* \* \* \* for normal school upkeep and extensions sixty thousand dollars."

This department can see no reason therefore why the Governor and Council under this law may not in their discretion authorize the Trustees of State Normal Schools to make a contract for upkeep or extensions at Castine Normal, the form and purpose of contract of necessity to be satisfactory to the Executive as he only has the authority "to draw his warrant" for payment.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: I am in receipt of papers from the prison physician and State Department of Health concerning condition of Albert Barker, a life inmate of the Maine State Prison who is suffering from tuberculosis.

I call your attention to Section 37 of Chapter 142 of the Revised Statutes, which section gives authority to "inspectors and warden" of the State Prison to cause any convict suffering from a "contagious sickness" to be removed to some suitable place of security where they shall receive all necessary care and medical assistance, "to be returned as soon as may be to the prison."

I also call attention to Section 9 of Chapter 19 of the Revised Statutes, which declares tuberculosis to be an infectious and communicable disease, or in other words, contagious disease within the meaning of Section 37.

This department, therefore, advises that full authority seems to be given to inspectors and warden to remove this man to any place of security for suitable care and medical assistance.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: I am in receipt of your inquiries relative to the State Highway Police established under Chapter 144 of the Public Laws of 1925.

Section 1 of this Act provides that the Chief shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council, to serve "during their pleasure." The Chief, therefore, may be removed at any time by the Governor and Council, with or without cause, and without the necessity of formal hearing.

In regard to the appointment of a Chief of the State Highway Police, the statute provides that the Governor "shall appoint" and it would appear under Article 5, Section 8 of the Constitution

of Maine that it is necessary, in order, to make the appointment valid, that nomination be made seven days prior to the appointment.

With relation to the suggestion that the person now holding the office of Adjutant General may be selected at some time in the future to serve also as Chief of the State Highway Police, this Department advises that there does not appear to be any legal reason to prevent one person from holding both of said offices. The constitution of Maine, Article 9, Section 2, prohibits the Adjutant General from holding the office of Judge, Register of Probate, Register of Deeds, Sheriff, Deputy Sheriff, or member of the legislature; and Article 3, Section 2, provides that no person belonging to any one of the three Departments of the Government shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others. The fact that under some circumstances the Chief of the Highway Police may have the same "powers" as sheriffs would have no weight, because the legislature might give similar "power" to officers of the National Guard. The office of Adjutant General is an office under the Executive Department, as is also the office of Chief of the State Highway Police. Under Section 15 of Chapter 174 of the Public Laws of 1923, the Adjutant General has express authority to perform the duties ex officio of the "Chief of Staff, Quartermaster General, and Paymaster General"; and the same paragraph, by inference at least, recognizes the fact that the Adjutant General may have other duties, and provides that the senior officer during absence or disability may perform the offices of the Adjutant General. In other words, there is nothing that indicates that either the Adjutant General or the Chief of the Highway Police is a full time official, and the only incompatibility if there is any, is practical rather than constitutional. Whether one man can properly perform the duties of both offices is a question that the Governor and Council must decide.

MY DEAR GOVERNOR: The Federal Government is exceedingly exacting in the expenditure of its funds. Under the direction of the Federal authorities in charge of the Federal Aid Funds for road building, there was incorporated in our State Highway contracts several years ago the following provision:

"Preferred employees. The Contractor in the construction of the work shall give preference in the employment of mechanics and laborers to citizens of the State of Maine, except as otherwise stated in the following paragraph for work on Federal Aid Projects.

In the employment of labor in the performance of the contract, preference shall be given, other conditions being equal, to honorably discharged soldiers, sailors and marines, but no other preference or discrimination among the citizens of the United States shall be made. (Sec. 6 of the Act of Congress approved February 28, 1919, entitled 'An Act making appropriations for the service of the Post Office Department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, and for other purposes.' Public No. 299—65th Congress)."

This provision has been continued without change since that time and I am informed that these requirements and provisions were again approved by the Federal Bureau of Good Roads about one year ago.

Immediately following the announcement by you that preference would be given to workmen who were residents of Maine in State Highway construction work, the agent for this State of the Federal Bureau of Good Roads advised the Chief Engineer of the State Highway Commission that in his opinion it would be improper for the Commission to make the proposed preference for Maine citizens on Federal Aid Projects under existing specifications, and that it might mean the loss of Federal funds.

Under an act of November 9, 1921, Chapter 119, Sec. 18; 42 Stat. 216, Title 23, "Highways", Revision of 1926, Paragraph 19, the Secretary of Agriculture shall prescribe and promulgate all needful rules and regulations for carrying out the provisions of the statute relating to Federal Aid Highways and under the same act, printed as Section 6 of Title 23, Revision of 1926, the Secretary of Agriculture appears to have full

authority in the matter of approval or disapproval of Federal Aid Projects.

Under the Act of February 12, 1925, Chapter 219, Section 1; 43 Stat. 889, printed in Title 23, "Highways", Section 44, Revision of 1926, the approval of any project by the Secretary of Agriculture within three years after the act of 1925 "shall be deemed a contractual obligation of the Federal Government."

Under these circumstances and in view of the authority which the Secretary of Agriculture undoubtedly possesses, it did not seem to me proper for the State of Maine to proceed over the objection of the Federal representative in this State.

The Federal representative in this State is the one with whom we necessarily must deal and his interpretation of the regulations of the Federal Government is the one by which we should be guided, pending further direction to him by competent authority.

Immediate action in Washington regarding this matter would seem to be essential in order to make it prudent for the State to proceed with the provisions that it desires to give preference to Maine workmen. The appropriate course would seem to be for the proper Federal department to advise the Federal representative in this State that there is no objection on their part to the preference that is proposed.

DEAR SIR: Your recent communication addressed to His Excellency, the Governor, has been handed to this Department for reply.

You ask an interpretation of the word "necessity" as the same occurs in the existing Sunday law which is Section 35 of Chapter 126 of the Revised Statutes. The statute in question is as follows:

"Whoever, on the Lord's Day, keeps open his shop, workhouse, warehouse or place of business, travels, or does any work, labor or business

on that day, except works of necessity or charity; uses any sport, game or recreation; or is present at any dancing, public diversion, show or entertainment, encouraging the same, shall be punished by fine not exceeding ten dollars."

An examination of the authorities shows that Sunday legislation commenced more than fifteen centuries ago, when Constantine the Great commanded that the inhabitants of *cities* should "rest on the venerable day of the Sun". Similar statutes were passed at an early date in England, but the statute known as 29 Car. 11 c. 7, passed in the reign of King Charles the Second, which provided that "no person is allowed to work on the Lord's Day or use any boat or barge or expose any goods to sale, except meat in public houses or works of necessity or charity" is undoubtedly the basis of the Colonial ordinances from which the Maine statute is derived.

(4 Blackstone 64.)

All of the Sunday statutes have been upheld as constitutional on the ground that they are essentially civil and not religious regulations, as they have for their object the promotion of the health and good order of society by insisting upon a periodical day of rest. *Donahoe v. Richards*, 38 Maine 405. *Hinge v. Crowley*, 113 U. S. 703; 28 L. Ed. 1145; L. R. A. 1917-B, 93 note.

While the Statutes of the various states in the Union differ in their attempt to regulate observance of Sunday, and prohibit secular labor and business on that day, they apparently all exempt from their operation works partaking of necessity and charity. The question of what constitutes a work of necessity is one that has been much discussed. A definition that is apparently most satisfactory is the one given in the early Massachusetts case of *Commonwealth v. Knox*, 6 Mass. 76, where the Court say: "By the word 'necessity' we are not to understand a physical and absolute necessity; but the moral fitness or propriety of the work or labor done, under the circumstances of any particular case." This definition has been followed by our own court in *Cleveland v. Bangor*, 87 Maine 266, in which opinion, after citing the above case of *Commonwealth v. Knox*, the Court say:

"The primary object of such legislation has been to secure to private citizens the quiet enjoyment of Sunday as a day of rest, and to encourage

the observance of moral duties on that day, but not to authorize any arbitrary or vexatious interference with the private habits and comfort of individuals. *Hamilton v. Boston*, 14 Allen, 475. In accordance with these views was the decision of the court in *McClary v. Lowell*, 44 Vt. 117, holding that it was not unlawful for a father to ride eight miles on Sunday to visit his minor sons and attend to their welfare in another town. And it has been repeatedly held in this State and Massachusetts that walking or riding in the open air in a quiet and civil manner with no object of business or pleasure except the enjoyment of the air and gentle exercise and the consequent promotion of the health, is not in violation of the Sunday law. *O'Connell v. Lewiston*, 65 Maine 34; *Davidson v. Portland*, 69 Maine 116; *Sullivan v. M. C. R. R.* 82 Maine 196 supra; *Barker v. Worcester*, 139 Mass. 74."

It is impossible to lay down any general rule as to what are and are not works of necessity and charity. Changing needs of human life are so numerous and diversified that it is impossible to classify them. Each case must depend upon its own facts, or in other words,

"This exception may properly be said to cover everything which is morally fit and proper under the particular circumstances of the case." *Sullivan v. M. C. R. R.* 82 Me. 196; *State v. Morin*, 108 Me. 303; *Eaton v. Insurance Co.* 89 Me. 573.

The various state statutes known generally as "Sunday Laws" were never intended to interfere arbitrarily with the comfort or conduct of individuals when necessary to the promotion of health. The prohibition is against unnecessary work, and the jury under proper instructions of the court must determine the question on the circumstances presented to them in each individual case. It seems to be essentially a question of "moral fitness and propriety."

The following are some of the instances where courts of this and other states have held under certain circumstances that work done on Sunday was necessary and therefore lawful; going to a store for prescription in case of sickness; barbering; operation of passenger trains, freight trains, street cars; bathing in the surf; fishing; furnishing food and refreshments; furnishing of heat, water and electric lights; repairing of highways; the making of repairs in a factory so as to prevent employees from losing time; repairing a railway track on Sunday to avoid delay of trains on week days; pumping an oil well where permanent loss and injury to the owner would otherwise ensue; keeping open a hotel, running a restaurant, or dining room; the operation

of an ice factory; harvesting a tobacco crop in danger of frost; carrying mails and express freight; delivery of milk to customers, the hauling to market of fruit or produce to avoid its spoiling; walking and riding to church; walking or riding in the open air for health.

Sports, games, dancing, shows and entertainments are clearly prohibited by the statute, and yet in some instances courts of last resort have held certain games and entertainments to be outside the contemplation of the law, especially where no admission fee is charged. Each case stands and must stand on its own merits, and the question is always a question for the court and jury to decide.

Any unnecessary acts of individuals which disturb or interfere with the rights of that portion of the general public who stay at home on Sunday, and endeavor to observe the day as a day of complete rest and relaxation, would undoubtedly be considered breaches of the law; for example, there might be no legal harm for two or even more persons to pass a baseball from hand to hand in order to derive benefit from out door exercise, provided it did not cause annoyance to others; but for two teams to engage in a regular game with the usual accompanying disturbance would not be considered as legally proper under the existing law.

It is, of course, apparent to everyone that this and similar statutes, aimed to compel the observance of a day of rest, and upheld as constitutional because they are civil and not religious, must be reasonably interpreted to fit the social conditions of today. It is impossible to construe them strictly and literally. If literally construed, the clergy would be fined each Monday for work done on the Sabbath, and every housewife would find herself a criminal because of some act done that she should have performed on the preceding Saturday. Again, under the interpretation advocated by some of our colonial ancestors, many or all of our Sunday School concerts would be considered "entertainments" and every person who attended subject to penalty.

Trusting that this letter may in a measure answer your inquiry, I am

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: In answer to your request for the "form of procedure in relation to filling a vacancy caused by the death or resignation of a Judge of Probate", this Department respectfully calls your attention to the following:

Section 7 of Article 6 of the Constitution of Maine, is as follows:

"Judges and registers of probate shall be elected by the people of their respective counties, by a plurality of the votes given in at the biennial election, on the second Monday of September, and shall hold their office for four years, commencing on the first day of January next after their election. Vacancies occurring in said offices by death, resignation or otherwise, shall be filled by election in manner aforesaid, at the September election next after their occurrence; and in the meantime, the Governor with the advice and consent of the council, may fill said vacancies by appointment and the persons so appointed shall hold their offices until the first day of January thereafter."

This provision of the Constitution is supplemented by Chapter 6, Section 23 of the Revised Statutes, which provides that:

"\*\*\*\*\*in case vacancy occurs in any office which is to be filled at the next biennial state election, for which no nomination has been made at the primary election held on the third Monday in June of the same year, a special primary election shall be ordered by proclamation of the governor, at such date as he deems best, conforming as near as may be practicable to the provisions of this chapter, but in that event the governor in said proclamation shall fix the time within which nomination papers shall be filed and the time for transmitting to town clerks lists of candidates proposed for nomination and the time within which and when the returns shall be received and the result declared. If the time is insufficient therefor said nomination may be supplied in the manner provided in section twenty-two." (Section 22 provides for filling vacancies by convention of delegates or by class committees.)

Chapter 67, Section 3 of the Revised Statutes, also states that Judges of Probate are "elected or appointed as provided by the constitution." Their election is effected and determined as is provided respecting county commissioners, and the section relating to county commissioners is to be found in Revised Statutes, Chapter 83, Section 3, which reads as follows:

"When no choice is effected, or a vacancy happens by death, resignation or removal from the county, or at the expiration of any present term of office at the end of any year in which no biennial election is held,

the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy, who shall hold office until the first day of January after another has been chosen to fill the place."

Under this provision of the constitution, it seems clear that where a vacancy has occurred in the office of the Judge of Probate by either death or resignation, the vacancy must be filled by the people at the general election next following.

It is the duty of the Governor in the meantime, with the advice and consent of the council, to temporarily fill the vacancy by appointment, the appointee to hold office until the first day of January following the election of a successor by the people.

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: In answer to your inquiry as to whether a member of the Board of Registration appointed to fill a vacancy caused by death or resignation of the incumbent, holds for the full term of four years, or whether the appointment is to fill the vacancy in the term, I call your attention to the opinion of the court in *Wilson, Attorney General v. McCarron*, 112 Me. 181, where our court holds that when an office is created by statute which provides that it shall be filled by election or appointment for a term of years and is silent in regard to the time when the term shall commence, and there are no special provisions for filling a vacancy in the office, the term of office begins when the appointee is appointed and qualified and he holds office for the full term, unless sooner removed.

In other words, the court holds that unless the statute otherwise provides, "there is a vacancy in the office and not in the term."

The statute in question, Revised Statutes, Chapter 5, Section 6, provides that a member of the Board of Registration shall be appointed and commissioned by the Governor, by and with the consent of the council, for a term of four years. There is no special provision for filling a vacancy in the office so filled by

the Governor, and under the decision of the Court above cited, it would appear that the appointment was "for the term of four years."

DEAR GOVERNOR BREWSTER: In regard to the order of the Eighty-third legislature providing for the appointment of a Committee to make investigation of facts and phases of the operations of the Workmen's Compensation law, this department respectfully calls your attention to pages 524 and 1206 of the Legislative Record for 1927, and to the fact that the Committee duly appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House has reported that an investigation necessary to make a full report as called for in the order will mean an expense to the State of approximately \$60,000.00.

I have been unable to find that the last legislature made any provision for the payment of the expenses of this Committee and the expense would necessarily have to be paid out of the Contingent Fund.

It is extremely doubtful if the Contingent Fund contemplates an expenditure of this nature under the circumstances and in view of the working of the original order. The order called for a full report on or before October 1st, 1928. The preliminary report of the Committee making an estimate of the expense to the State was filed September 27, 1928.

DEAR SIR: Answering your recent oral inquiry in regard to license being required to hunt foxes.

I call your attention to Chapter 199, Public Laws of 1927, which provides "whoever hunts, captures or traps any fur bearing animal or animals anywhere in the State shall annually procure a license therefor from the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, etc."

It is my opinion that a fox is a fur bearing animal, and I do not find any exception in the statute to the foregoing or which specially permits the hunting of foxes without license with dog and gun, except as appears in the latter part of the aforesaid Chapter 199.

DEAR SIR: I am in receipt of your inquiry "Do the words 'ordinary mode' appearing in Section 24 of Chapter 219, Public Laws of 1917, as amended by Chapter 218, Public Laws of 1921, apply both to the manner of angling and the implements used?"

The statute as amended, reads as follows:

"Whoever fishes for, takes, catches, kills or destroys any fish, with fish spawn, or grapnel, spear, trawl, weir, gaff, seine, trap, (or set lines, except when fishing through the ice, and then with not more than five set lines to a family in the day time, or five set lines to a person during November and December when fishing for pickerel,) or takes any kind of fish, except suckers, eels, hornpouts, yellow perch, white fish and cusk, as hereinafter provided, with any device or in any other way than by the ordinary mode of angling with single-baited hook and line, artificial flies, artificial minnows, artificial insects, spoonhooks and spinners, so-called, shall pay a fine, etc."

It is the opinion of this department that application is intended both to manner and implements.

What is or is not the "ordinary mode" of angling, or what is or is not the ordinary device is a question of fact and will have to be decided in each individual instance.

It was evidently the intention of the legislature to prohibit the use of all forms of trawls, weirs, seines and traps, or other device which is not the common, customary and usual method of angling with hook and line.

DEAR SIR: Answering your recent inquiry regarding sewers built by private individuals running in streets, I am pleased to inform you that the general law is as follows:

"The municipality has control of the space below the surface of the street, wherever and so far as public use requires, and may regulate or prevent its use for private drains or sewers, or it may permit an individual to construct under proper circumstances and restrictions a private drain or sewer in its streets, to the use of which when constructed he will have the exclusive right. A license for this purpose is usually revocable. A drain neither constructed nor controlled by the municipality is not a public sewer but one constructed by private persons may pass to the public by dedication and acceptance. Private sewers cannot be taken or destroyed by a municipality in its construction of public sewers without making compensation to the owner for their value, as in the case of other private property taken for public use."

With reference to entering a private sewer by other persons, I call your attention to Section 23 of Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes of Maine which is as follows:

"When a person, at his own expense, lays a common drain or sewer, all who join or enter it, shall pay him their proportion of such expense; and the expense of opening and repairing shall be paid by all benefited, to be determined in each case by the municipal officers subject to appeal to the county commissioners."

DEAR MADAM: In your letter of December 14th, you ask if there is any reason why pupil nurses in training schools cannot be sent out for public health work under the supervision of a registered, trained public health nurse, and also if there is any reason why school or industrial nurses should not come under the requirements of the State Credential Committee.

Answering said inquiry, I am pleased to inform you that under the provisions of Chapter 102, Public Laws of 1923, being Section 3 of said chapter, and appearing as additional section in your pamphlet of information and regulations, the qualifications of the nurse doing public health work is to be determined, approved and certified by a committee composed of three registered nurses, etc., which committee is constituted a board to determine who shall be employed in such work.

The last sentence of said section appears to include graduate nurses, but does not apparently exclude any other nurses who may be found competent and qualified by your committee. I do not see any reason why school or industrial nursing should not come under the requirements of the aforesaid committee as such nursing evidently has reference to the public health.

DEAR SIR: This Department has received your question "Can a plumber collect at law for work not done in accordance with the department's rules and regulations?"

The general rule of law is that a right of action is not destroyed even when the plaintiff has violated the statute.

I call your attention to the foregoing cases decided by the Supreme Court of Maine where analogous questions have arisen:

Hamilton v. Goding, 55 Me. 419.

Cumberland v. Central Wharf Co. 90 Me. 95.

Cohen v. Manuel, 91 Me. 274.

Bliss v. Winslow, 80 Me. 274.

It is the opinion of this Department, therefore, that while a plumber might be prosecuted for failing to live up to certain regulations made by the Department of Health, this would not effect his contractual relations with the person by whom he was employed; and especially is this so where there is no statute that states that he shall lose his right of action under such circumstances.

Of course, it is possible to conceive of cases where the amount recovered might be lessened because regulations have not been complied with and therefore, the work might be considered of an inferior grade or not up to contract requirements, but this does not effect our answer to the general question which you ask.

DEAR MADAM: Answering your letter of September 11th, I beg to inform you that Chapter 268, Public Laws of 1917, provides that a dental hygienist "may operate in the office of any registered or licensed dentist or in any public or private institution under the general supervision of a registered or licensed dentist."

This law does not appear to require the supervising dentist to be a resident of any particular place or locality.

The law appears to make supervision the requisite to enable the hygienist to legally operate in a public institution. Actual supervision appears to be the test and it is not limited to locality. As far as the law is concerned in the case you mention, a dentist

at Farmington or a dentist in Portland may have the supervision, provided the supervision is actual.

DEAR SIR: In answer to your oral inquiry regarding the establishing of town hospitals for the housing and care of persons who are ill with contagious diseases, I am pleased to advise you that Section 95 of Chapter 19 of the Revised Statutes, provides that:

"A town may establish therein one or more hospitals for the reception of persons having the smallpox or other diseases dangerous to the public health; or its local board of health may license any building therein as a hospital, which shall be under the control of said board."

Section 97 of the same chapter provides:

"When smallpox or other disease dangerous to the public health breaks out in a town, the local board of health shall immediately provide such hospital or place of reception for the sick and infected, as they judge best for the accommodation and safety of the inhabitants; such hospitals and places are subject to their regulations the same as established hospitals; and they shall cause such sick and infected to be removed thereto, unless their condition will not permit it without imminent danger; in which case, the house or place where the sick are, shall be deemed a hospital for every purpose aforesaid; and all persons residing in, or in any way concerned with it, are subject to hospital regulations."

Construing Section 29 of Chapter 14 of the Revised Statutes of 1871, in case of *Haverty v. Bass*, reported in 66 Maine, page 71, the court said: "when the smallpox breaks out in a town they (the municipal officers) are to provide hospitals for the sick and infected; they shall cause the sick and infected 'to be removed' thereto, unless their condition will not admit of it without imminent danger; they may make a hospital of any man's house, where a sick or infected person is found (if deemed best), subject to hospital regulations; and the municipal officers must act 'immediately', and with 'all possible care' for the public safety."



Section 29 of Chapter 14 aforesaid was amended by Section 27 of Chapter 123, Public Laws of 1887, so as to make "municipal officers" read "local board of health", as it now reads in said Section 97.

It will be noticed that said Section 95 enables the town to *establish* therein hospitals for the reception of persons etc; or its local board of health may license any building therein as a hospital, etc.

Said Section 97 enables the local board of health when small-pox or other disease dangerous to the public health breaks out in a town, to immediately *provide* such hospital etc., as they judge best etc.

It does not appear that either of the foregoing sections gives the local board of health the power to purchase property, in the name of the town, for the aforesaid purposes, their only powers being in the one case to *license* a building therein as a hospital, and in the other "to provide such hospital or place of reception for the sick \* \* \* \* \* as they deem best."

The municipal officers do not appear to have any power to act in the premises except as they are authorized by the town, the language of the statute being "the town may establish."

In cases where the town has not established a hospital, as provided in Section 95, or where the local board of health has not licensed a hospital, as provided in said section, said board of health may in cases of emergency provide such hospital in accordance with the provisions of Section 97, and use same as long as the necessities of the case require, but in my opinion the statute does not give the board power to bind the town by the purchase of the property.

GENTLEMEN: In answer to your request for an opinion from this Department as to whether it is necessary for the State Highway Commission to advertise for bids when purchasing machinery

and implements for highway work, this Department makes the following reply:

Chapter 13 of the Public Laws of 1911, inserted in the Revised Statutes as Section 104 of Chapter 2, provides:

"All materials and supplies purchased in wholesale quantities by the state, or on the credit of the state, for any state department or institution, shall be purchased by competitive bids under the direction of the governor and council, whenever in their judgment it is advisable to adopt such a method of purchasing supplies."

Section 36 of Chapter 49 of the Revised Statutes, provides that contracts for constructing, altering, repairing or equipping State buildings or public works shall be awarded to the lowest bidder who is financially responsible. This section, however, does not apply to construction or repairs amounting to less than one thousand dollars, or to emergency work or to State road work, as expressed therein.

Chapter 130, Section 7, Public Laws of 1913, which established the Highway Commission, as incorporated in the Revised Statutes as Section 6 of Chapter 25, and as amended by Chapter 258 of the Public Laws of 1917, and as further amended by Chapter 215, Public Laws of 1921, and Chapter 159, Public Laws of 1923, provides under each amendment that:

"The commission may from time to time purchase, lease or hire all machinery, tools, implements and property necessary for highway engineering and construction and for the administration and execution of its duties, and may contract for such labor, materials and property as it may deem necessary for the examination, building and construction of state and state aid highways."

As will be seen, the law relating to the rights and duties of the State Highway Commission in relation to purchasing materials, tools and implements for highways was passed after the law relating to supplies purchased at wholesale for State departments and institutions, and was a part of the act establishing the State Highway Commission.

The Supreme Court has often decided that the more recent provision of law controls in the event of conflicting provisions, and that the true intent can often be best ascertained by examining the original draft of the law. Further, the court has said that the purpose of revision of a statute is to condense as much as

possible and that a mere change of phraseology is not to be considered as a change of the law as originally enacted.

The original law as printed in the Public Laws of 1913, Chapter 130, Section 7, says:

"The commission shall have full power from time to time to purchase, lease or hire all machinery, tools, implements and property necessary for highway engineering and construction and for the administration and execution of its duties, and to contract for such labor, materials and property as it may deem necessary for the examination, building and construction of state and state aid highways."

For the reasons above stated, the statute and amendments relating to the duties of the Commission having been passed after the passage of the statute requiring bids from State institutions and departments, there does not seem to be any necessity for the State Highway Commission to advertise for bids when purchasing "machinery, tools, implements and property necessary for highway engineering and construction."

GENTLEMEN: Attention: Mr. Paul D. Sargent, Chief Engineer.

Answering your inquiry of June 1st, about building driveway culverts, I beg to advise you that Chapter 22, Section 26, provides that the municipal officers of a town may, at the expense of the town, construct ditches and drains to carry water away from any highway or road therein, etc., and any wilful interference therewith shall be punished in the same way as provided by statute for obstruction in a travelled road.

In Chapter 215, Public Laws of 1921, it is provided that:

"In all state and state aid highway construction and maintenance, the commission shall have all the powers of municipal officers conferred by Section 26 of Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, relating to construction and maintenance of ditches and drains."

Section 13 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes, provides that the Commission may alter, widen or change the grade of any state or state aid highway whenever in its judgment the public exigency may require and may lay out, establish and open a new highway as a state or state aid highway.

Section 80 of Chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes, provides that:

"No road commissioner without written *permission from the municipal officers* shall cause a water course to be so constructed by the side of a way as to incommode any person's house", etc.

You will notice by this section, the municipal officers are not precluded from constructing necessary water courses in public ways so that said section is not in conflict with the provisions of Section 26 of said Chapter 22, the road commissioner being the only person precluded by Section 80, where he acts without permission of the municipal officers.

Section 81 of said Chapter 24, indicates that the abutter on a public highway shall not change the drainage thereof or deposit within or along any ditch or drain in a public way any material that shall obstruct the flow of water in such ditch or drain or otherwise obstruct said way; provided, however, that with the written consent and in accordance with specifications of the legal authorities having supervision of such ditch or drain any person may, to provide egress and regress to and from lands occupied by him, lawfully construct and maintain a bridge across such ditch or drain.

I do not find any statute which requires the municipal officers of a town, or the Highway Commission in the case of state and state aid highways, to construct driveway culverts for abutting owners along the highways. It does not appear that our court has ever passed on this particular question, but the court said in the case of *Sherburne v. Inhabitants of Sanford*, 113 Maine, page 72, that:

"It is well settled that when land is taken for a way and damages are assessed, the damages are presumed to include not only the value of the land taken, but the diminished value of the remainder of the tract caused by the taking. And the likelihood that surface water from the road may be turned into the adjacent lands is one of the elements to be considered in assessing land damages. And after the assessment, it is to be conclusively presumed that it was taken into consideration, but

there is one consideration, the consequences of which are not presumed to have been considered in the original assessment. And that is this. After a road has been built and grade practically established, and when it may be presumed that the adjoining owners have adjusted their property, their fences, buildings, walks, and so forth, to that grade, if a town raises or lowers the road to the injury of the adjoining owner, it must pay the damages."

I can imagine cases where in making drains and ditches along the side of the highway, it might be equitable for the Commission to arrange with the owner to bear a fair portion of the expense of constructing the necessary driveways over said ditch or drain, and I have in mind such as lead to one's house or lawn. I think in most cases amicable arrangements can be made to the satisfaction of the abutting owner.

GENTLEMEN: Answering a question which recently arose as to whether or not a town can raise to be expended on third class highways in any one year, the sum of \$3,500., and whether if such an amount is raised and expended by the town in any one year, the State can pay to such town its part of the state highway fund that year and each succeeding year for several years until said yearly fund amounts to the amount expended, namely, \$3,500., and also as to whether or not said sum can be raised by the town at a special meeting, I am pleased to inform you that Section 57 of Chapter 4 of the Revised Statutes, provides that "The voters at a legal town meeting may raise the necessary sums for the support of schools and the poor, making and repairing highways, town ways and bridges." Under this provision, it is my opinion that the amount may be raised at any legal town meeting.

The matter of third class highway fund is largely governed by Chapter 263, Public Laws of 1919, Special Session, as amended

by Chapter 216, Public Laws of 1923. Section 3 of said Chapter 216, provides for the apportionment among towns as follows:

"The administration and expenditure of the third class highway fund shall be under the general supervision of the state highway commission and shall be apportioned among the various towns according to the number of miles of third class roads contained therein, as determined by the highway commission, provided, that such towns shall have appropriated for the current year in addition to the appropriation for state aid work and appropriation under the so-called bridge act, an amount not less than four mills on the valuation of such town, for roads and bridges, summer and winter."

Section 5 of said Chapter 216, provides that the apportionment of the fund shall be made in accordance with the returns made on or before April 15th, annually. Said section being as follows:

"The apportionment of the third class highway fund herein created shall be made in accordance with the returns which shall have been made by the several towns desiring participation on or before April fifteenth of each year, and no town whose selectmen or other officials authorized by law have not made the returns required by the state highway department on or before said April fifteenth shall be entitled to any apportionment of said fund."

There appears to be no provision whereby the State Highway Commission is authorized to enter into any binding agreement with the towns to the effect that if the town raises in any one year an amount of money in excess of the amount required by the statute to be raised in order to secure the state stipened for the purpose of completing any given third class road which has been properly designated, that the State will pay during the years following any given amount as the State's contribution based on the larger expenditure as aforesaid. Any arrangement entered into by the town with the State Highway Commission could, in my judgment, be nothing more than a gentleman's agreement and that a conditional agreement, because the legislature might change the third class highway apportionment or it might repeal all the provisions of the statute with reference to the same.

The second question which arose was as to whether or not a town can at a special meeting appropriate money for state aid work.

Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes, provides as follows:

"Annually between the fifteenth day of July and the fifteenth day of August in each year, municipal officers shall prepare and file with the commission suggestions for the improvement during the calendar year of state aid highways located in each town accompanied by plans so far as practicable, setting forth the location of the highway and the nature of the improvement desired. The commission shall examine and report thereon with its recommendations to such municipal officers on or before the twentieth day of February following. Such report shall be submitted to the voters of such towns at the next regular meeting of such town. The municipal officers shall insert in the warrant for each annual town meeting an article calling upon the voters to vote 'yes' or 'no' on the question of the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for state aid highways for that year. If any such town then appropriates money for work contemplated in such report and for the purpose of securing state aid as provided in this chapter the municipal officers shall forthwith notify the commission of the amount so appropriated.\*\*\*\*\*"

It will be noticed that there are certain things that must be done at the annual town meeting, namely, that the report of the Commission with its recommendations shall be submitted and that there shall be inserted in the warrant for such annual town meeting an article calling upon the voters to vote "yes" or "no" on the question of the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for state highways for that year.

If all the provisions of said section which are required to be done before or at the annual meeting are complied with and the only thing left is the appropriation of the money necessary for the work contemplated, it is my opinion that the necessary money may be appropriated at any legal town meeting.

GENTLEMEN: Attention: Hon. Clyde H. Smith, Chairman.

This department is in receipt of your inquiry relative to the rights of a Telephone Company to maintain its poles along the right of way of a highway when the State Highway Commission has determined that public convenience and necessity require the widening of the road beyond the limits previously occupied.

Your attention is called to the provisions of Chapter 60, of the Revised Statutes, Section 27, which provides that companies incorporated for the transmission of intelligence, heat, light or power by electricity shall first obtain a written permit from the municipal officers before constructing lines upon and along highways, and the same section provides, after the erection of the lines "such officers may direct any alteration from the original permit."

It is the opinion of this department that as nothing is paid for the valuable privilege of occupying and using the soil of public roads and highways, that the Telephone Company has no further or other rights except to occupy the right of way by permission of the municipal officers and that such right is a mere revocable license. The primary duty of the State is to maintain streets and highways in a safe and proper condition for public travel and the State can at all times regulate the size and location of the poles, height of wires from the surface of the ground and their location in the streets. The State also has power for good cause to terminate the right to occupy any particular street or streets, and leave the Company to find a new location.

GENTLEMEN: Attention: Lucius D. Barrows, Chief Engineer.

Your letter of August 28th, regarding your authority to give permission to erect a fence within the limits of a highway, received.

My understanding of the law is that you do not have authority to grant such permission. The rule as laid down both by our statutes and courts is that the easement of the public is co-exten-



sive with the exterior limits of the way and that any obstruction placed within the limits of the way amounts to a nuisance both at common law and by statute.

The public is not necessarily limited to the travelled part of the right of way, but have the right to go outside the travelled part without hindrance and our court has held that any traveller whose rights are interfered with by any obstruction may remove same to secure his passage for himself, agents and servants, provided in the removal of the obstruction he uses due care so as not to do any more damage to the same than is necessary to secure passage over the way.

Answering your letter of August 27th, in regard to the erection of stop signs under the provisions of Chapter 138, Public Laws of 1927, which act provides that the State Highway Commission may designate certain state and state aid highways as through ways, and it is further provided that no such designation of a through way shall become effective to traffic at such point of intersection until the State Highway Commission shall have caused suitable warning signs and signals to be erected at or near points of intersection.

It is my opinion that the State Highway Commission is not compelled, personally or by its employees, to erect the stop signs, but that the Commission may employ the selectmen of a town to erect these signs.

You will note that the designation of through ways is confined to state and state aid highways which, in the case of ways in villages, may not be applicable. The chief thing to ascertain is as to whether or not any particular way is in fact a state or state aid highway. If it is, the Commission have the right to designate such highway as a through way whether in village, city or open

country, and having made such designation, may cause the necessary stop signs to be erected.

DEAR SIR: This department is in receipt of your inquiry relative to the rights, duties and authority of members of the State Highway Police under Section 2 of Chapter 144, Public Laws of 1925.

The section in question reads as follows:

"The specific duties of the state highway police shall be to patrol the state highways and other important ways, especially outside the compact portion of cities and towns, for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this act and all laws relating to motor driven and horse drawn vehicles and all rules and regulations in regard thereto, and of arresting all violators thereof and prosecuting all offenders against the same. The chief and members of the state highway police shall have the same power to serve criminal processes against such offenders as sheriffs and also the same power as sheriffs have to arrest without warrant and detain persons found violating or attempting to violate any other penal law of the state until a legal warrant can be obtained. They shall immediately report by telephone or other expeditious means to the proper authorities all information and complaints by them received concerning the commission of any crime, and shall have the same rights as sheriffs to require aid in executing the duties of their office. They may serve any subpoenas, notices and processes issued by the secretary of state or the state highway commission under authority of this act or chapter two hundred and eleven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one and acts amendatory thereof. They shall also at all times be subject to the call of the governor for emergency purposes at his discretion.

The state highway police, sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, constables, city marshal and deputy marshals and police officers of cities and towns shall so far as possible cooperate in the detection of crime, the arrest and prosecution of criminals, and the preservation of law and order throughout the state."

A careful examination of this section of the statute makes it apparent that the legislature intended that the state highway police force should be primarily a force to patrol the highways for the purpose of enforcing all laws relating to motor driven and horse drawn vehicles, and so far as the enforcement of provisions of Chapter 211 of the Public Laws of 1921 and acts amendatory thereof, the highway police have full and complete authority.

The second sentence of the section states that the chief and members have the same power to serve criminal processes against such offenders as sheriffs. The last part of the same sentence provides that they have "the same power as sheriffs have to arrest without a warrant and detain persons found violating \* \* \* \* any other penal law," but this portion of the sentence gives the state highway police no further rights than the right possessed by any individual citizen. A citizen may arrest any person that he sees violating a criminal law. The danger, however, to an individual, and the same danger may exist so far as members of the highway police are concerned, is that if a person is arrested for violating some other penal law, and the court afterwards finds that as a matter of fact there was no violation, the individual or the highway police officer might be obliged to respond in damages for false arrest.

That this seems to be the intention of the legislature is made more apparent by the next sentence which provides that they shall report by telephone to the "proper authorities" any information received concerning the commission of any crime.

The situation, of course, is different in the case where a sheriff or deputy sheriff requires aid of the highway police; and it would appear that the only safe way for the members of the highway police force to act in case of violation of any law, other than the motor vehicle law, is to accompany some sheriff, deputy sheriff or police officer.

DEAR SIR: I am in receipt of your letter asking the following question:

"Has a town any right to elect a fire chief, in absence of any by-laws to that effect?"

This Department is of the opinion that no town has the right to elect a fire chief without an ordinance or by-law, for the reason that it is well established that a "town does not possess the power to create or abolish offices unless such power has been expressly delegated to it by the constitution or by statute."

Chapter 30, Section 1 of the Revised Statutes, provides that any town may by ordinance or by-law prescribe rules and regulations for the care and management of fire apparatus and "for the appointment of officers \* \* \* and may prescribe their style, rank, powers and duties."

Section 2 of the same chapter provides that "the engineers or other officers chosen by any town under any ordinance or by-law, shall in addition to the powers thereby conferred, exercise all powers and duties of fire wards."

Section 6 of Chapter 30, however, permits each town without an ordinance or by-law, to "elect as many fire wards as it deems necessary".

It would seem necessary, therefore, unless there is a special law applying to the particular locality, as suggested in Section 9, to have an ordinance or by-law authorizing the same before the town can elect a chief engineer or fire chief with authority to act. A fire chief is not a "usual town officer" as provided for in Sections 12 and 14 of Chapter 4.

employees cannot be legally employed eleven hours a night for four nights and ten hours a night on the fifth night, the same being in violation of Section 1 of Chapter 350 of the Public Laws of 1915, as amended by Chapter 198 of the Public Laws of 1923, which provides:

"No female shall be employed in any workshop, factory, manufactory, or mechanical establishment or laundry more than nine hours in any one day; except if a different apportionment of the hours of labor is made for the sole purpose of making a shorter day's work for one day of the week."

DEAR MR. DUNNACK: In answer to your inquiry relative to taxation of property belonging to Waldoboro Public Library Association, I understand that the Library Association owns a block in the town of Waldoboro, a portion of which block is used by the library for public library purposes, and a portion being rented by the Association to others.

Your question relates to whether or not this property is taxable or whether it is exempt under the provisions of Paragraph III of Section 6 of Chapter 10, as amended. It is a fundamental rule laid down by our Court that "taxation is the rule and exemption the exception." The statute exempts property of literary institutions, but it does not exempt property owned by libraries and other literary institutions from which revenue is derived. I call your attention to the following cases: Foxcroft v. Straw, 86 Maine 76; Foxcroft v. Campmeeting Assn. 86 Maine 78; and Auburn v. Y. M. C. A., 88 Maine 244, which cases decided that property of literary and religious institutions is taxable, so far as it is not used or occupied by the Association for its own purposes, or is rented for the sake of obtaining revenue therefrom.

In other words, only such parts of the property as are occupied and used by the institution itself are exempt from taxation.

DEAR MR. HASTINGS: I am in receipt of your letter of June 3rd, asking for the opinion of this Department relative to the question of time off for good behavior to persons confined in the State Prison.

This is a very important matter and the Department has given the matter serious consideration for a long time as the same question was informally asked some months ago by one of the officers of the Prison.

Section 15 of Chapter 142 of the Revised Statutes, which relates to the duties of the Warden, provides as follows:

"He shall keep a record of the conduct of each convict, and for every month during which it thereby appears that such convict has faithfully observed all the rules and requirements of the prison, the warden may recommend to the executive, a deduction of seven days from the term of said convict's sentence, except those sentenced to imprisonment for life.\*\*\*\*\*"

which section has since its original enactment in 1866, given the Warden permission to recommend to the executive, a deduction from the term of sentence.

Section 30 of Chapter 137 of the Revised Statutes, passed by the legislature of 1913, as amended by Chapter 59 of the Public Laws of 1919, reads, however:

"Sec. 30. The board of prison commissioners may adopt such rules as it may deem wise or necessary properly to carry out the provisions of sections twenty-five to forty-five, both inclusive, of this chapter and may amend such rules at pleasure. Provided, that prisoners, under the provisions of said sections, shall be eligible to parole only after the expiration of their minimum term of imprisonment."

The Sections 25 to 45 of Chapter 137 above referred to, provide for indeterminate sentences in place of definite terms as formerly, and for paroles to be granted to those who are eligible to be set at liberty upon "parole or conditional release" when such person has kept the rules and regulations established by the Board.

The question that you ask has been answered by the courts of last resort in other jurisdictions where the statute is similar to ours. The question has arisen under mandamus proceedings, habeas corpus proceedings, and in proceedings to hold the warden in contempt of court for allowing a prisoner to be released before the expiration of the minimum term. I call your attention to one case in particular entitled *Rogers v. Board of Prison Commissioners of Kentucky*, reported in 161 Ky. Rep. 612, where W. B. Rogers was confined in the penitentiary for an indeterminate term, and before the expiration of the minimum term for which he was sentenced brought mandamus proceedings to compel the Board of Prison Commissioners to grant him a parole.

Rogers claimed that "as a commutation of seven days in each calendar month would reduce a twelve month term to approximately nine months, it was the intention of the legislature that the commutation for good behavior should be deducted from the minimum sentence." The Court of Appeals of Kentucky, however, said, "The parole act specifically says that no person shall be eligible to parole until he shall have served the minimum term of imprisonment. If it were the legislative intention that there should be deducted from the minimum term provided by law the commutation allowed to persons convicted before the passage of this act, we should expect to find such intent definitely expressed therein. The legislature has not seen fit to make such provision."

The Kentucky court further said that the provision of the statute which was in effect at the time the parole or indeterminate law was passed had no relation to paroles. The old statute affected prisoners who had previously been confined under a straight sentence law.

It is the opinion, therefore, of this Department that the legislature of Maine intended to provide that a prisoner shall

be eligible to parole only after he had served his minimum term of imprisonment, as stated in Section 30 of Chapter 137.

MY DEAR BUKER: Your letter, with reference to road construction crew and the furnishing of extra commissary supplies for the benefit of the men, received.

I do not know of any provision of statutes which authorizes you to furnish such supplies.

Section 2 of Chapter 195, Public Laws of 1917, provides that the Board of Prison Commissioners shall make and establish such rules and regulations not inconsistent with law as it may deem expedient for the direction of the officers of the prison and the performance of their duties; for the government, discipline, instruction and employment of the inmates; for the supply of food, clothing, bedding therein, and have the custody and preservation of the property connected therewith.

Section 5 of said Chapter provides that said Commission may authorize the employment of able bodied prisoners sentenced for any term less than life in the construction or improvement of highways or on such public works within the State under such arrangements as may be made with the State Highway Commission or other department of the State having such public works in charge, and said Commission shall prescribe such rules and conditions as it deems expedient to insure the proper care and treatment of the prisoners while so employed and of their safe keeping and return. Prisoners while so employed shall not be required to wear clothing which will materially distinguish them from other workmen.

There does not appear to be anything in the statute with reference to food and supplies other than the above. Of course, it is understood that the statute provides that punishment in the



State Prison by imprisonment shall be confined at hard labor.

DEAR SIR: In relation to your inquiry relative to a law regarding the making of presents of money to inmates of the Maine State Prison, this Department wishes to advise you that there is no statute relating to the question of presents by friends or outside agencies to inmates of the State Prison.

The laws of Maine prohibit any system of pay to prisoners. The Revised Statutes provide that "punishment in the State Prison by imprisonment shall be by confinement to hard labor", and no authority has been given the Commission to make any rules or regulations or to do any acts inconsistent with the existing law.

The Prison Commission cannot make payment to a prisoner either directly or indirectly. If a man, however, has paid his debt to the State in any one day by working the number of hours or doing the task assigned, there is no statute that I know of that prohibits him to receive a present for extra interest taken in his work, provided it is merely a present and comes from a source outside of the prison and from a source not connected with the state or any department of the state.

You allow money to be deposited in the Warden's office for the benefit of an inmate sent by friends, and I see no distinction between that and permitting the man to receive a present from some organization whether that organization is charitable or not.

DEAR MR. CRIE: I have had so many inquires relative to renewals and revocation of lobster licenses, that I think I ought to write you supplementing my letter to you of October 23rd, last.

The legislature of 1921, by Chapter 98, amended Section 17 of Chapter 45, so that no person, firm or corporation is entitled to a renewal of a license that has expired where there has been any violation of the law, for a period of one year from the date of the conviction.

Section 20 of Chapter 45, as amended by Chapter 98, Laws of 1921, relates to a license revoked by the Director of Sea and Shore Fisheries Commission. After revocation no person is entitled *of right* to receive a license for a period of one year, although I have no doubt that for cause the Commission might restore a license revoked within a shorter period.

If you remember correctly, my letter to you of last October was in answer to your telephone inquiry as to which law took precedence—the law as it appears in the revision of the statutes of 1916, or the amendments, and I intended to convey to you my conclusion that the amendments control. This letter is to call your attention, however, to the fact that there is a distinction made in regard to renewals and revocations.

DEAR SIR: Under Chapter 51, Section 107 of the Revised Statutes, every foreign corporation other than "a bank, savings bank, trust company, surety company, savings deposit company, insurance company or public service company", shall before doing business in this state, appoint a resident of the State as its true and lawful attorney etc., and under Section 108, it shall file with

the Secretary of State, a copy of its charter, by-laws, etc.

These provisions of the statute apply to corporations that are not engaged in banking, surety, insurance or public service.

A company that intends to do a banking business within the meaning of Chapter 193, Public Laws of 1925, is within the jurisdiction of the Bank Commissioner.

If the Commercial Credit Corporation limits its activities to the purchase of chattel mortgages, contracts and leases and does not in any manner "solicit, receive or accept money or its equivalent on deposit", or in any other manner violate Section 2 of Chapter 52 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 193 of the Laws of 1925, it would not be "deemed to be doing a banking business."
