*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the
Eighty-fifth Legislature:*

The law requires the State Auditor to biennially report to the Legislature on or before the first day of February in the year in which the Legislature meets.

Acceptance of Trust Funds

I recommend that the Legislature formally accept three trust funds which have come into the possession of the State.

When the Maine State Sanatorium Association deeded its property in Hebron to the State in 1916, at the time the State took over this sanatorium, the trustees had on hand a sum of money, a considerable part of which represented balances of the State aid granted by the legislature to that institution. This balance has been covered back into the Treasury and has been placed in a separate savings deposit. When returned to the State it amounted to \$2,874.72, and with interest now amounts to \$3,280.51. I suggest that the legislature designate for what purpose the income shall be expended.

The Godfrey Fund, bequeathed to the State School for Girls at Hallowell by Jessie E. Godfrey of Old Town, amounts to \$893.00. By the terms of the bequest the interest on this fund is paid over to the superintendent of this institution and is expended for the girls there.

The Greene Fund, bequeathed to the Pownal State School by Joseph C. Greene of Auburn, amounts to \$6,000.00. By the terms of the bequest the interest on this fund is paid

over to the superintendent of this institution and is expended for the inmates.

All of the above funds have been deposited in various banks as separate savings accounts.

Another trust fund has been left to the trustees of the Augusta State Hospital by Franklin M. Drew of Lewiston, a former Secretary of State, the income to be used for the purchase of fruit and confectionery for the patients at that institution. This has been deposited by the treasurer of that institution in a separate savings account. The fund had earned \$86.82 to the date of June 30, 1930, no part of it having as yet been used for the purposes for which it was given. The trustees desire to apply the proceeds of the fund to the purposes for which it was given. I recommend that the Legislature formally accept the trust.

Investment of Trust Funds

Since 1923 good progress has been made in setting up in cash deposits or investing in securities various trust funds of the State. These various funds amount to approximately \$1,500,000.00, of which more than forty per cent have now been invested. At the last session of the Legislature an act was passed providing that upon the taking effect of that law, (Chapter 189, Public Laws of 1929), thereafter the amount by which the collateral inheritance taxes exceeded the sum of \$1,000,000.00 should be set aside to place these trust funds at their true amount. In the year ended June 30, 1930, in which the collateral inheritance taxes amounted to \$1,010,179.24, the sum of \$10,179.24 was so used. It is confidently expected that in the current year a sum estimated to be at least \$500,000.00 will be available for this purpose, at which rate the entire amount of these trust funds will be invested in good securities within the next two years.

Municipal Audits

Since my last report, audits have been conducted in the cities of Bangor and Lewiston. As a result of the Bangor audit \$30,000.00 has been recovered for the city. In Man-

chester an audit was conducted and in Bath the trust funds were audited.

The following municipalities have now adopted the uniform State system: Belgrade, Biddeford, Bingham, Bridgton, Calais, Camden, Canton, Carmel, Crawford, Dexter, Durham, Eagle Lake, Etna, Fairfield, Farmingdale, Fort Kent, Glenburn, Houlton, Island Falls, Jay, Kingman, Kittery, Lagrange, Leeds, Lewiston, Lincoln Plantation, Litchfield, Livermore, Livermore Falls, Madawaska, Magalloway Plantation, Mars Hill, Mexico, Monticello, Norridgewock, Oakland, Oxford, Owl's Head, Prentiss, Presque Isle, Rangeley, Rumford, St. Francis Plantation, St. George, St. John Plantation, Standish, Thomaston, Topsham, Van Buren, Wallagrass Plantation, Wayne, Westfield, Winthrop and Winterport.

The proposal has been made from several quarters that the law be made compulsory and I am of the opinion that it should be.

Gasoline Tax

At the last session of the Legislature an act was passed, (Chapter 93; Public Laws 1929), redefining the term "distributor," to be one "who purchases in tank car lots either within or without the state internal combustion engine fuels, as herein defined, for the purpose of resale within the state." This had the effect of increasing the number of distributors, who are required by law to make monthly returns here, from fifty-five to one hundred and thirty. As we audit the books of the various distributors, this, of course, has required more travel and has somewhat increased the cost of administering this division.

Another act passed at the same session required the State Auditor to take samples of gasoline and oil and have them analyzed as to their quality. This was Chapter 210, Public Laws 1929. Under this act there has been taken and analyzed about 2,660 samples of gasoline and oil. The law designated that the analyses should be conducted at the University of Maine. That the law has had a beneficial effect there can be no doubt. Dr. J. M. Bartlett, of the Department of Chemistry at the University, informs me

that there has been an improvement noted in both the gasoline and oil since the law became effective, particularly in the oil. While among the first 175 samples thirty-six per cent of the oils fell below the standard, he found that of the last 175 samples analyzed, after the law had been in effect a year and a half, twenty-two per cent fell below the standard. It must be borne in mind that the analysis reveals not only defects in the basic qualities of the oils, but the dirt, refuse and water, usually introduced through carelessness in storing and handling, is quickly detected.

The first year the gasoline tax act became effective (1923), we collected tax on approximately 45,000,000 gallons of gasoline. Last year we collected tax on approximately 96,000,000 gallons. The receipts from this source for the calendar year 1930 have shown an increase of eleven per cent over the calendar year 1929.

The law authorizes the expenses of collection to be charged to the tax and this aggregates approximately \$30,000.00 a year or about three-quarters of one per cent of the total receipts. About \$160,000.00 a year is refunded because used in an internal combustion engine off the highways. All the remainder is credited to the appropriations of the State Highway Commission.

State Debt

The State debt as of December 31, 1930, was \$23,759,300.00 of which \$21,526,500.00 was for highways and bridges, including the Kennebec bridge loan bonds and the Waldo-Hancock bridge loan bonds. The World War debt which stood at \$4,300,000.00 has now been reduced by the payment of maturing bonds in the sum of \$3,514,000.00, so that there now remains an unpaid balance of \$786,000.00.

State Highway Commission

While the general statute is specific that the State Auditor shall not certify accounts for payment unless there is a sufficient balance in the appropriation therefor, the last Legislature passed an act requiring payments drawn against

the gasoline tax receipts to be paid even in anticipation of the receipt of gasoline taxes, using the expression, "from any moneys then in the treasury not otherwise appropriated." (Chapter 93, Public Laws of 1929). By law fifty per cent of the gasoline tax goes to maintenance and administration of the State Highway Commission and on December 31, 1930, that account was overdrawn on our books by \$746,- 921.86. It will probably require the greater part of the next six months to bring this back to a credit balance.

The Governor and Council by a recent order temporarily transferred \$155,000.00 from the Waldo-Hancock bridge bond sale to a Federal Aid project in Yarmouth-Freeport. It is their plan to transfer it to the Waldo-Hancock bridge loan account again by the time it is required there.
