In order to carry on our work successfully we must have chairs to re-seat and mattresses to make and renovate. We must also have a market for our brooms, mattresses and other products.

We give instruction in typewriting and reading of embossed print, Braille or Moon Type. Any blind desiring to read by touch may receive instruction in their homes. We would like information regarding any who have not had the advantages offered by this Institution
