#### To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the Eightyfourth Legislature:

The Legislature has provided that the Governor, State Auditor, State Treasurer and the Chairman on the part of the Senate and the House of the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs shall act as a Committee on the Budget. In accordance with the provisions of this Act and the practices of the last few years, the Committee on the Budget during November held public hearings at Presque Isle, Bangor, Portland, Lewiston and Augusta. Notices of these meetings were sent to all the State Departments and Institutions and other Institutions which have previously received state aid and to the Members-elect of the Eightyfourth Legislature.

The Governor-elect is not designated as a member of the Committee on the Budget but was invited to sit with the Committee and attended the public hearings in the various parts of the State. He did not, however, feel it wise to attend the executive sessions of the Committee in formulating the Budget and so is not affected with responsibility for the recommendations herein made.

The budget for the State Departments represents an increase of approximately five per cent over the recommendations in the budget of two years ago. For the State institutions there is proposed a sum approximately twelve per cent greater than the amount proposed two years ago. The State institutions have been given practically all that was requested for maintenance for the coming two years. This reflects to a large extent the increases to be expected as a result of the building program for the State institutions that has been carried out under the legislative authorization of two years ago.

Following the precedent of previous years, no recommendations have been made for State-aided institutions but provision is made in the estimates for duplicating the appropriations of 1927.

The revenues of the State from the tax upon railroads and from one branch of the inheritance tax are now materially reduced and provision must be otherwise made for the loss in revenues that results. The other indirect revenues of the State, however, are showing a healthy growth reflecting the development that is in progress.

The budget, as submitted, contemplates tax rates of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  mills for the first year and  $6\frac{3}{4}$  mills for the second year. This compares with rates of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  mills for each of the last two years and 7 mills for the two preceding years. This carries, therefore, a net increase of  $\frac{1}{4}$  mill for the

next two-year period which is considered conservative in view of the considerable increase in demands.

The finances of the State have been in an increasingly healthy condition whether one considers the situation from the standpoint of available cash or the standpoint of the bookkeeping reserves. Balances in cash of two and one-half to three million dollars have been carried throughout the greater part of the year. These balances naturally decline toward the close of the calendar year when the heaviest drafts are made for highway purposes and also for disbursements to the various cities and towns, but the cash balances will again steadily increase from the low point which is always reached in the last month of the calendar year.

Comparisons may be made either on the basis of available cash or bookkeeping balances at any given period which will take proper account of seasonal fluctuations that approximate the same from year to year.

During the past two years the building program, as authorized by the last legislature as funds should become available from the surplus for this purpose, has been provided for by the setting aside of \$981,152.00.

In addition, under authority granted by the last legislature, \$1,914,000 has been used to increase the highway program of the State with most gratifying results. These withdrawals will total \$2,895,152 with certain charges still to accrue.

The report of the State Auditor indicates a balance in the Sinking Fund Reserve on December 31, 1928, of \$694,498.87. In addition there is \$196,920.60 in the State Contingent Fund or a total of \$891,419.47.

After service of bonds and provision for contingencies that may be reasonably anticipated during the remainder of the fiscal year the State Auditor estimates that on July 1, 1929, there should be available and unencumbered in the Sinking Fund Reserve and the State Contingent Fund the sum of \$1,288,257.04.

This will indicate the excellent financial condition of the State.

Four years ago the legislature prudently limited the Contingent Fund to \$300,000 in any fiscal year. Time seems to have demonstrated the adequacy of this provision for any ordinary emergencies that may arise.

Two years ago, however, the legislature left certain matters unprovided for and certain other appropriations inadequate to serve the existing provisions of the law. These have now mounted until they almost equal the amount of the Contingent Fund and are not subject to the control of the Governor and council.

It would seem necessary that the present legislature should make provision for these necessities that are not fairly chargeable to the State Contingent Fund.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BUDGET

The following estimates are made by the State Auditor's office as to the requirements during the next six months:

\$196,920.60 is being left in the State Contingent Fund, but these drafts will leave the administration with inadequate provision for contingencies that may arise.

In accordance with previous practice no recommendation is made as to new construction at the various State institutions but a tabulation is included of the requests that have been filed.

No recommendations for changes in the appropriations have been made as this seemed primarily a matter for legislative consideration. The State highway program is in this class since it is almost entirely a matter of statute and consequently is not considered by the budget committee in any way.

With annual expenditures of \$20,000,000 drawn directly or indirectly from every citizen of Maine there is a growing recognition of the need of intelligent and constant attention to public finances. The sharp increase in expenses requires even more careful scrutiny of the benefits received.

This budget represents the considered conclusions of the Budget Committee as to what is adequate and prudent at this time.

The original act, however, pledging the faith and credit of the State to the payment of these bonds is ample authority to provide for their payment, and such payments have been made from their proceeds of this one mill tax, set aside to pay obligations imposed by war.

(2) The report of the Committee on Budget two years ago pointed out that there appeared to be no warrant for such an excessive provision of a sinking fund to retire the War Loan Bonds as then existed under the terms of Chapter 221, Public Laws of 1921. At the session of the Legislature in 1927 this act was amended by Chapter 162, P.L. 1927, which defers until 1932, the setting aside of funds to meet the issue of \$500,000.00 due in 1937. There is therefore available in the next two years \$492,750.00 over and above the amount of one mill on the present State valuation, which amount may be applied to general expenditures of the State.
