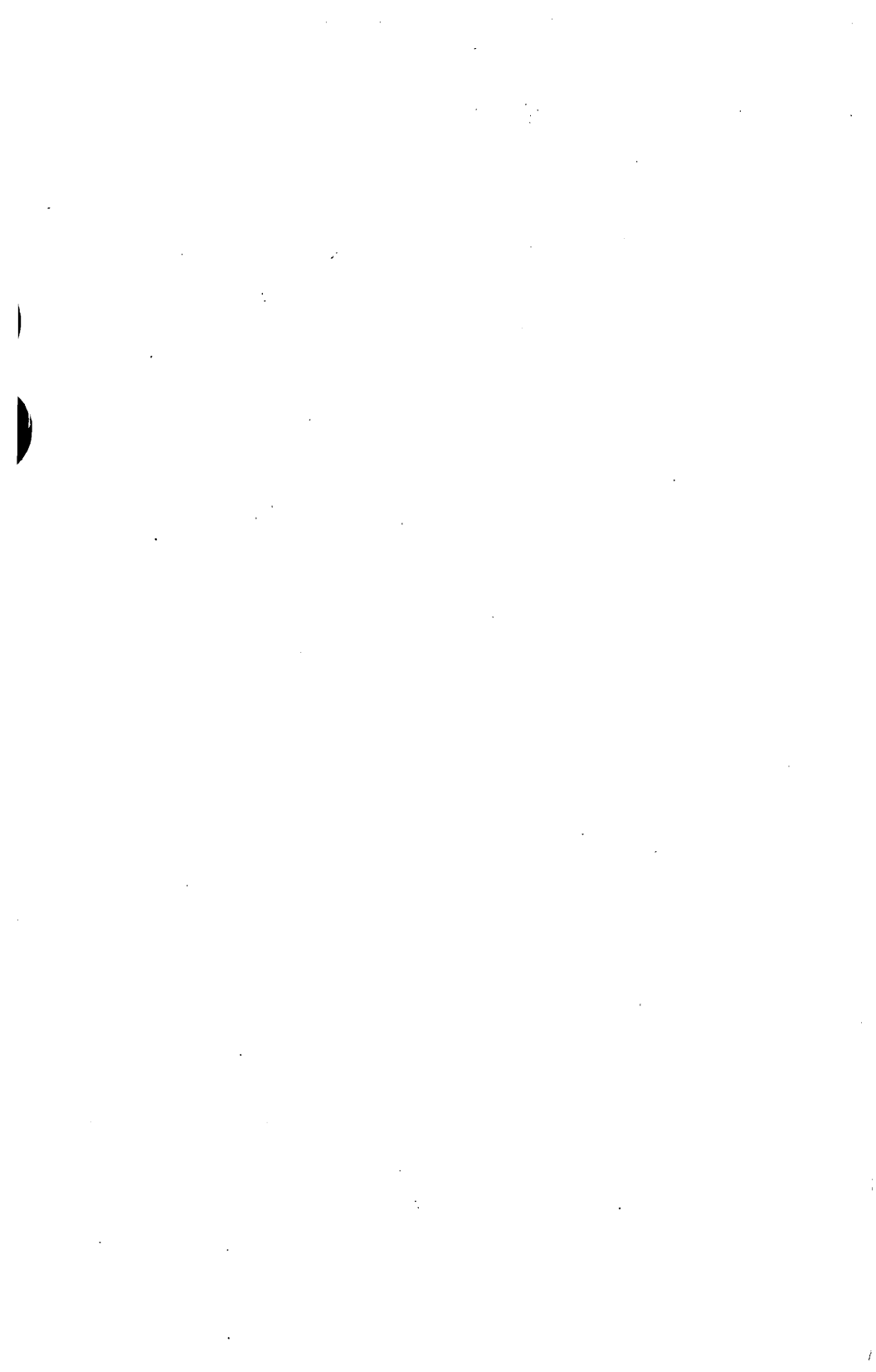

The following table shows the results of the experiment. The first column is the number of trials, the second column is the number of correct responses, and the third column is the percentage of correct responses.

The results show that the number of correct responses decreases as the number of trials increases, and then increases again. This suggests that the experiment is not a simple random process, but rather a more complex one.

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the
Eighty-sixth Legislature:*

Herewith is submitted a report for the one and a half year period July 1, 1930, to December 31, 1931. The Administrative Code became effective January 1, 1932. The last detailed report of the State Auditor covered the biennium July 1, 1928 to June 30, 1930. The State Controller, to whom was delegated the control and audit of all bills and accounts against the State prior to payment, is required by law to hereafter publish the detailed report of receipts and expenditures. This Department is now only required to print an annual report "in summary form" of the continuous post audit of the accounts, books, records, and other evidences of financial transactions kept in the Department of Finance, and in the other departments and agencies of the State government.

The State Controller appends to this report a statement of assets and liabilities as of June 30, 1932, also a statement of appropriation accounts for the six months period immediately following the year and a half period included in the report of the Department of Audit, the two reports covering a full biennium.

The list of salaries of State officers and employees has been published as a separate pamphlet. These salaries are shown as of December 31, 1932, as it was believed, that while that date is not strictly within the provisions of law governing other parts of this report, that it was desirable to have late and up-to-date information on this point. The Governor and Council, by the authority vested in them by statute, made a deduction of two weeks pay from the salaries of all officials and employees in the period July 1-October 10, 1932. This plan was likewise adopted by those

officials whose salaries are fixed by law, who all contributed in like proportion. This resulted in a saving to the State of approximately \$104,000.00.

The graph depicting the State of Maine tax dollar, showing the source of our receipts for the past fiscal year and how the money is expended, is a new feature, and it is believed will be of interest to all.

The Reserved Land Fund having now been invested in accordance with the act of 1917, it now appears to be a proper time for a complete tabulation showing by years the various loans made, the investments in bonds, payments on principal and interest, amount of the fund in savings deposits, and cost of administration. A tabulation showing the various transactions relative to this fund appears in this report.

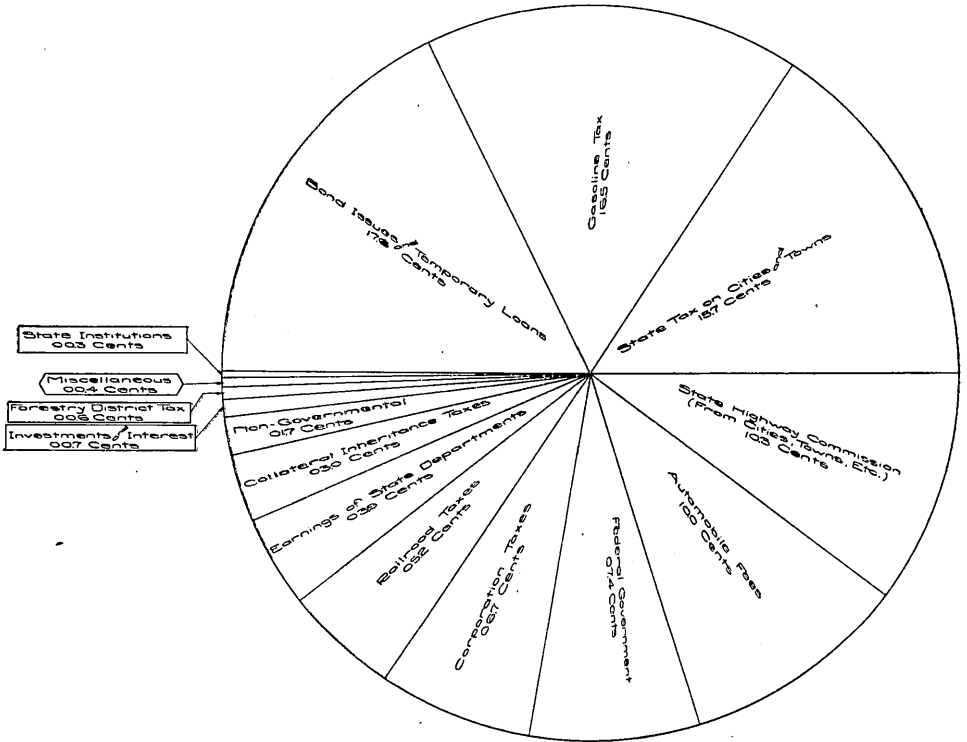

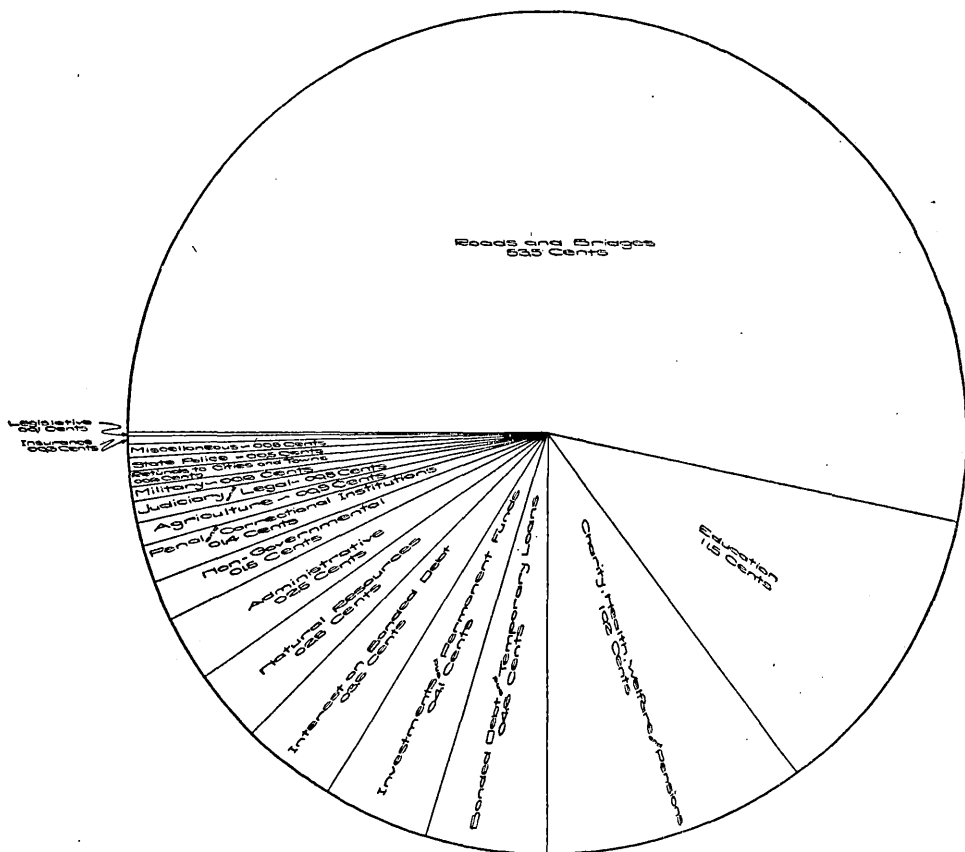

*The Farm Lands Loan Commission, by authority of Chapter 58, Revised Statutes, invested a part of the fund known as Lands Reserved for Public Uses in State Highway bonds. These bonds have matured at the rate of \$22,000.00 a year. To November 1, 1930, the proceeds of such maturities from November 1, 1927, or \$88,000.00, have been deposited in savings accounts at four per cent in various banks in the State.

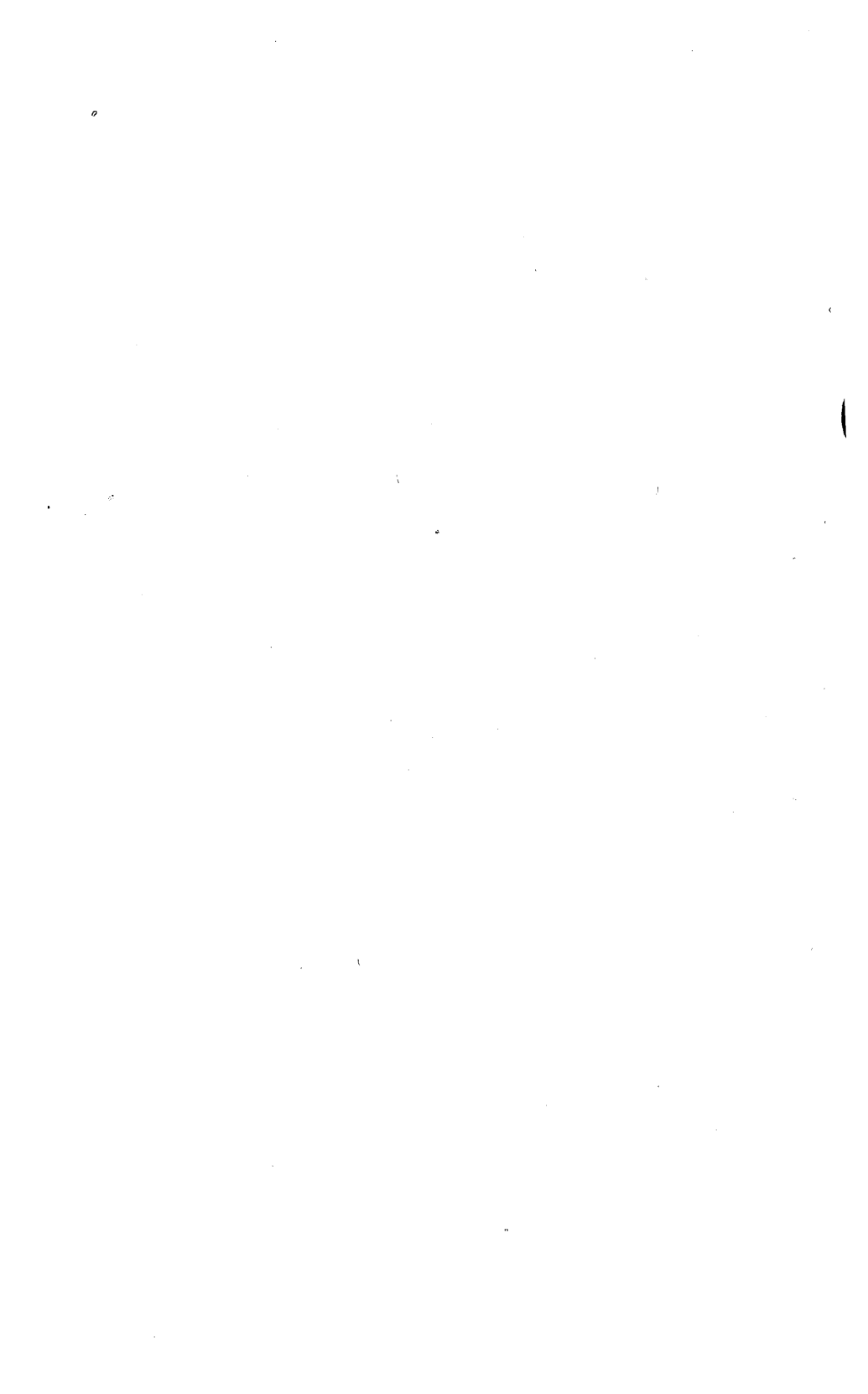

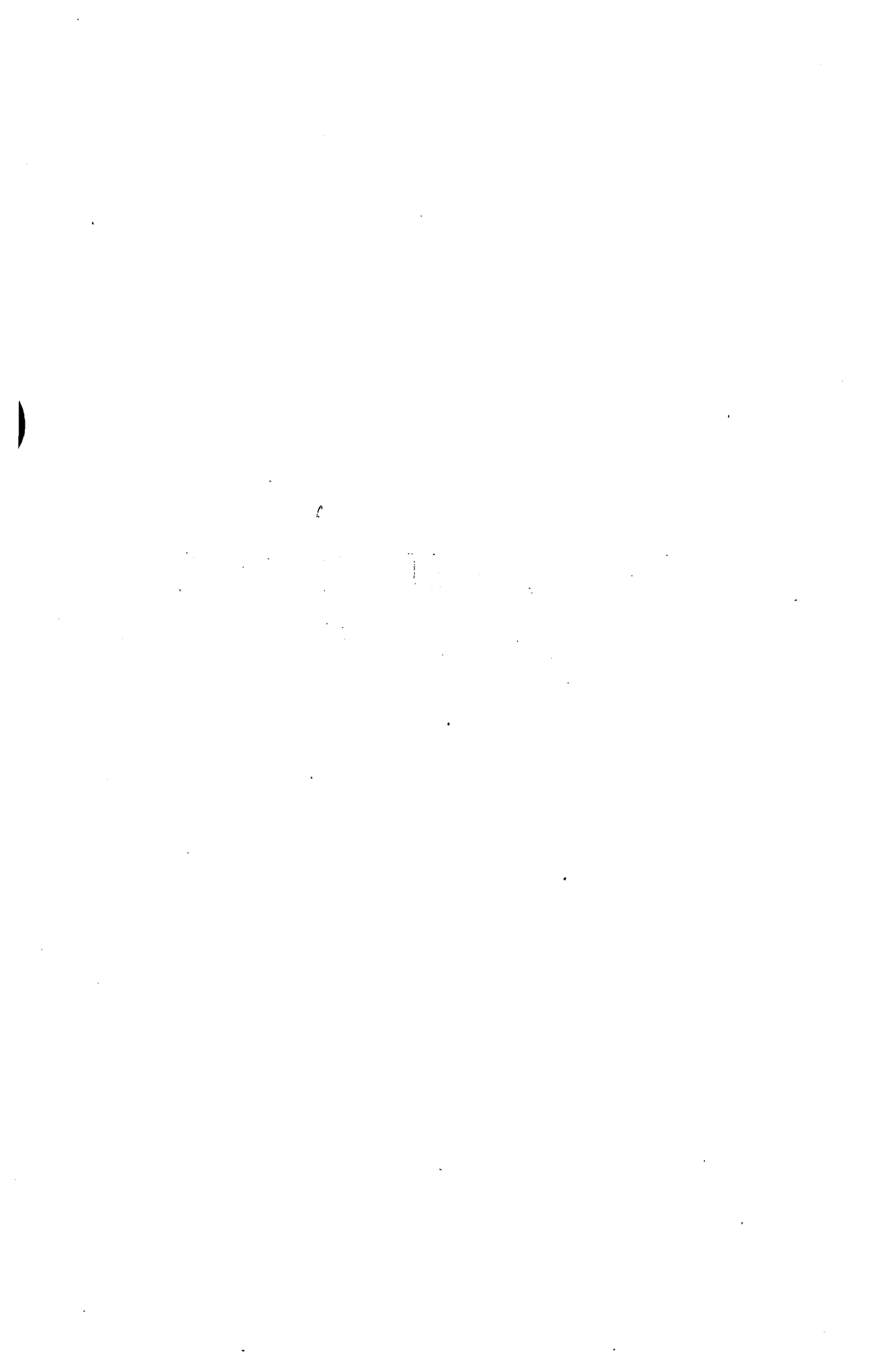
