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#### SECOND REPORT OF DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE

The Department of Finance makes its second biennial report for the two fiscal years ending June 30, 1936 with a feeling that it has continued through these two years the basic principle of the Administrative Code in conducting the financial affairs of the State in a business-like manner. The various bureaus, under the direction of the Department of Finance, have continued to carry on most efficiently. It is my firm conviction, supported by a most definite proof, that Maine has a financial set-up second to none, and month by month verifies the belief that Maine needed the Administrative Code.

There will be recommendations made under the various bureau reports and I, myself, will touch more on the State activities in my report as State Purchasing Agent.

It has been a pleasure to work with the present Governor and Council and their cooperation and understanding of our problems has been most helpful.

#### BUREAU OF BUDGET

The past two years have seen little change in the supervision over expenditures as provided by budget control. There were no changes in the law by the last legislature and on a whole there seems to be no difficulties that would require any additional legislation.

The general supervision over expenditures has been carried out with the cooperation of all department and institutional heads. It has been possible to keep in close personal touch with all spending agencies and in every case there has been a strong desire to help by all in meeting the financial problems of the State.

The one difficulty that has faced all departments has been the demand for more services by the general public. The improvement in general conditions seems to have created an idea that all departments of State had plenty of money and this in excess of ordinary needs. These demands have been in excess of legislative appropriations or revenue improvement and in most instances could not be met and have been rejected.

The cases where cooperative action was provided between the Federal Government and the State by the legislature have created other problems. The control of Bangs disease in cattle provides a good example. Under the law the State agreed to pay part of the indemnity on condemned cattle. Federal Government through its department of agriculture was to make the necessary blood tests and also pay part of the condemnation price. This plan seemed very satisfactory but the funds available in the Federal department were sufficient to carry on their part of the work in a very rapid manner. The State department of agriculture with a limited appropriation soon found its funds exhausted and were unable to continue and pay its part as provided by law. It was necessary to ask permission of the Governor and Council for the Department of Agriculture, to enter into agreements with the owners of cattle to be tested whereby the owner waived his rights under the State law and was willing to wait for his pay until such time as the State should provide the necessary funds in the future. Joint responsibilities of this kind are not satisfactory and could place the State in a very embarrassing position.

The one problem that has caused the greatest difficulty in maintaining a balanced financial budget has been the support of State paupers and the care of individuals in certain communities unable to care for their own residents.

In providing appropriations for the Bureau of Aid and Relief in the Health and Welfare Department, the Legislature together with the Bureau of Budget felt that with the Federal relief program, State pauper support would not increase any great amount. The Legislature provided an appropriation of \$1,000,000 for the different activities of aid which included \$600,000 for

pauper support, an amount about equal to the expenditures of the previous year of 1933-34.

This appropriation proved entirely inadequate to furnish the necessary assistance to these persons without a known place of residence or State paupers. The number of persons requesting aid from the State increased greatly and it was necessary to overdraw the pauper account \$843,000. The overdraft created was justified for two reasons. Past actions of the Legislature had recognized overdrafts in the same account due to the impossibility of accurate estimates as to actual needs. The second was the humane problem of not allowing residents of Maine to suffer from lack of food, clothing and shelter.

One of the reasons for this large expenditure was the inability of certain towns to care for their own and this was recognized by the legislature in Chapter 1 of the Public Laws of 1935. This law made necessary the expenditure of \$388,811.36 which made up part of the Aid and Relief overdraft. Another reason was the withdrawal of certain Federal relief agencies that were in operation during the last legislative session, which left this kind of aid entirely upon the State.

The expenditures of all other departments have been within estimates and in only a few instances has it been necessary to turn to the contingent fund for assistance and then only for expenditures that were of an emergency nature.

While the expenditures of State government exceeded appropriations \$843,000 there was excess income over estimates of approximately \$200,000 making a net operating deficit of \$642,000 for the past year.

The individual items of revenue have varied to some extent from the estimates. Some items have produced less and some more than anticipated from estimates made prior to the last legislative session. The entire receipts exceeded estimates by approximately \$200,000 which was a healthy condition as far as revenue was concerned.

While receipts have maintained a fairly even return there has been no indication that there will be any real recovery in tax receipts from these items producing general revenue for departmental and institutional appropriation needs.

The last Legislature placed in the hands of the Bureau of Budget the problem of a study of classification of State employees having in view the question of establishing a division of personnel. We have expended much time in reviewing civil service and classification of laws and regulations adopted by other States. From these studies we have formulated a system of classification taking the best of other laws and regulations and adapting them to Maine needs.

The problem seemed to be to a great extent the establishment of payroll titles that would fit Maine employment and establishing rates of pay based on the position and not the employee. It has been possible to establish different titles that would be the same in all departments of State and fixing pay rates within very definite limits. It was also necessary to establish duties that would be typical in all departments, thereby doing away with confusion between departments as to the same kind of employment. The establishment of certain fairly fixed educational requirements together with general experience regulations were established, so that an applicant would be able to know what training was necessary for every position in State employ and also the duties they were expected to perform.

In the establishment of rates and regulations it was necessary to provide for a certain degree of flexibility that a system of this kind could be workable and not made hard and fast to prohibit the use of judgment in the employment of any individual.

The study has been completed and the classification made in all respects ready for definite legislative action to put such personnel standards into operation.

The State's financial position has been maintained satisfactorily in spite of overdrafts for poor relief during the past two years. The credit of the State has been kept on the highest level and all bills against the State have been met promptly and in full. While many receipts from taxes have been delayed in payment there have been no real losses due to failure to pay.

#### BUREAU OF TAXATION

Upon the date of January 1, 1932, the Administrative Code became effective. Under this system, the Bureau of Taxation was created and assigned the work formerly carried on by the State Board of Assessors.

The addition of the Gasoline Tax Administration to this Bureau was part of the recommendation of the code group. In 1933 an Act for the purpose of Licensing Retail Stores was passed by the Legislature and placed under the jurisdiction of the State Tax Assessor. The Legislature of 1935 charged this official with the duty of administering the Game of Skill Law. Constantly increasing activities on the part of those who are engaged, throughout the state, in tax work and constantly increasing tax consciousness on the part of property owners, have greatly increased the work which is directly under the supervision of this Bureau. Declining values, a result of economic conditions, and an apparent public demand for greater tax service, have required the most careful consideration and study by those who are directly responsible to the citizens of this state in the matter of tax assessments.

In 1932 as of December 1, the property owners throughout Maine were given the first general reduction in State Valuation accorded them since Maine had become a State in 1820. This was in recognition of decreased market prices in both real estate and personal property. Fairness and a public policy which might be reasonably well defended seemed to demand this procedure.

Again in 1934, as of December 1, another substantial reduction was made in the valuation of the property in Maine and like the reduction of 1932, applied to nearly all cities, towns and plantations and a substantial reduction was also made in the valuation of Wild Lands where the decreasing market value continued to exist. The value of Maine Property, for State Tax purposes for the years 1935 and 1936, is \$663,532,161, and this indicates a reduction over the four year period of \$93,757,418. When one contemplates the tax rates which prevailed during this four year period, it is obvious that a very substantial reduction has been made to those who carry the tax load; because, even though a reduction in valuation existed, the State Tax Rate as fixed by the Legislature was not increased which is a direct result of gradual depreciation in values rather than a radical decrease, the Legislature being able to absorb, by certain economies, the reduced revenue available because of valuation reduction.

Upon further investigation, should there appear to be a further decline in market values, this Bureau must take cognizance of existing conditions and it is equally true that if our findings, when given proper analysis, indicate an

upward trend, that condition should also be recognized. However, in justice to the taxpaying public, one must be reasonably sure of a continuation of upward trends before any substantial increase should obtain.

It would appear to the writer that, during the past few years, by intensive . study and new methods, we have made marked progress in the much discussed equalization of values between communities. This is not a problem which can be solved over night, neither can it be improved upon to any great extent until this Bureau is given a sufficient number of appraisers or investigators so that our records may be substantially correct and unquestionable. It is true that we are, slowly but surely, collecting data on every community in Maine indicating the system of valuations, for tax purposes, which are carried by local assessors. Only in the most rare cases do we find any attempt to dodge State and County taxes by attempting to carry a valuation below that contemplated by Constitutional and Statutory Provisions. Our relations with the assessing authorities, in practically all of the 515 taxing jurisdictions, are most cordial. A very sincere attempt, on the part of the municipal officers, to cooperate with this Bureau has been of tremendous assistance in preventing a tax crisis during the past four years; and to this group of sturdy citizens, who give generously of their time and in many cases with scant financial remuneration, I would here and now acknowledge my debt, both personal and public.

Private citizens have made a substantial contribution to the administrative activities in this office, by showing their willingness and desire to give information relating to tax conditions, whenever a request has been made. To those citizens and the municipal officers scattered throughout the State, gratitude is due because one could not contemplate effectively administering tax laws without such cooperation.

It is highly essential that a more accurate survey of the ten million acres of wild land should be made. This Bureau is charged with the duty of establishing a value upon this vast area and only when we have before us, the amount of timber available, as well as an estimate of that which is in an early stage of growth, can we be absolutely sure of the true value represented. Guess-work is not good for the taxpayer or the state. Equalization of the tax load, between owners of timber lands, can never be realized until the facts are available, to those charged with the duty of assessment. In the opinion of the writer, a thorough and increased cruising of wild lands is as essential to the owners as it is to the State and because of a peculiar Statute which has existed since 1931, this office has been able to do but little in obtaining information relative to timber tracts. It is necessary that this work, retarded by an undesirable Statute and small appropriation, should no longer be allowed to lapse.

In most cases, we find the land owners willing to cooperate in giving substantial assistance, by placing at our disposal such statistics as may be highly valuable in arriving at a sound and reasonable decision.

The system adopted in 1932, of attempting to set up a ledger account socalled, with each tract of wild land in the state, is proving to be a desirable course to follow. It is the purpose of this Bureau to regionalize these wild land areas. An entirely different valuation might be placed on the same type of timber, location of course being a controlling factor in establishing a just value. This regionalizing theory was tried slightly in 1932, and it is our purpose to continue this system, until the entire ten million acres are properly catalogued.

Those of us who are charged with the duty of equalization, realize the system, as now existing, is not perfect; but apparently the course which we have adopted, if followed, will finally result in a tax fabric much stronger than that which is now existing.

Those who are interested in figures, particularly figures showing reduction in administrative costs, will undoubtedly study with interest the table which is presented, for comparison only, indicating a saving in four years, in the Gasoline Tax Division and in the Property Tax Division, of approximately one quarter of a million dollars.

Only by and with the most ardent cooperation of every person employed in the Bureau of Taxation, could this result have been obtained. Savings have been made many times, through personal sacrifice, on the part of these public servants and to this splendid group, who have guided well the destinies of this Bureau, the writer acknowledges gratitude.

The following comparisons show a substantial decrease in the expenses of the Property Division each year since the Code went into effect:

#### BUREAU OF PURCHASES

The Bureau of Purchases, during the past two years in the furtherance of better business in the affairs of the State, in-so-far as they pertain to maintenance and up-keep of the various State Institutions and Departments, has endeavored to put its affairs on a plane equal to that in the business field of private corporations. I believe we have done this with a resultant saving and without loss of efficiency or any serious curtailment in the State affairs.

The various institution and department heads have been most helpful and only in rare instances has there been any misunderstanding. I would like to call your attention at this time to an apparent misunderstanding between the administrators of the State liquor laws and the administrators of the code—it being the belief of the Liquor Commission that they do not come under the Code in any respect, but it being the belief of the Finance Department that as they interpret the Administrative Code law and the act under which the State Liquor Commission operates that only as far as the purchase of liquor is concerned is there a departure from the regular State routine. It is the belief of the Purchasing Department that all other purchases made in the carrying out of the State liquor law should be made through the State Purchasing Agent, as it is necessary for their approval by the Purchasing Agent before payment by the State Controller.

I sincerely hope that the Legislature may consider this matter in its deliberations.

There has been an average saving of better than thirty percent on purchases as a result of group buying under the direction of the State purchasing agent. In many instances we get a superior article for considerable less money. The spirit of competition among the concerns with which the State is doing business has grown during the past four years to such an extent that I think we can look for even greater savings in time to come. They seem to appreciate the fact that we are trying to be fair to them as well as to the State and in the majority of cases are cooperating with us. Those few, whose motive seemed to be contrary to our conception of business have been weeded out and I feel proud of the list that we send proposals to previous to our bidding dates. Everything is entered into with a spirit of fair play and no odds are asked nor given.

I have reports from other States in which word has been carried by these people as to our methods with requests from these States that our policy and methods be outlined to them, which we have gladly done.

Results have not come to us overnight. It has taken hard and painstaking efforts, by this department with the assistance and cooperation of the heads

of institutions and departments, to make it 100%. Only after four years of very intensive work have such results reached so large a plane.

In my last report, which was the first report of the Bureau of Purchases and the Finance Department under the Administrative Code, I outlined my conception of the ideals of the code and stated that at that time an average saving of 15% had been made in all departments under our direction. In the past two years this has been doubled and as the commodity prices have increased within that period a most worthwhile and necessary saving has been the result.

#### BUREAU OF ACCOUNTS AND CONTROL

The Bureau of Accounts and Control submits its second biennial report for the period July 1, 1934 to June 30, 1936, furnishing detail of the several departments and institutions and also charts that a better analysis and understanding may be had of the State's finances.

This department has operated in the last two years in conformity with the administrative code law, following out the policy as outlined four years ago and trying to extend the value of this department in the proportions which we believe the administrative code intended. During the past two years, improvements have been made in the tabulating machine set-up which is being used, and these improvements have been taken advantage of, thereby speeding up the detail work.

In addition to the various tabulations which appeared in our first biennial report, we are including in this report charts of departmental and institutional expenditures, giving the percentages as to personal service, general operations, grants, pensions, traveling expenses, awards, and construction. This is exclusive of revenue refunds and highway expenditures. The highway chart gives the breakdown by administration, maintenance, construction, etc. The charts show expenditures for the past two fiscal years by a breakdown as to governmental functions: highways; charities; hospitals; debts; education; general government; protection of persons and property; development; conservation of health and sanitation; and non-governmental. Counter to these are the charts showing income and receipts, both including and excluding federal grants.

By authority of Chapter 166, P. L. 1933, the Bureau of Accounts and Control has continued to segregate the excise tax receipts on automobiles by towns and report to the municipal officers the amount which has been collected by their treasurer or collector. The totals for the past two years are as follows: 1934—\$970,975.40; 1935—\$957,139.19. I think this amount could very easily reach the total of \$1,250,000 to \$1,300,000. There seems to be a great misunderstanding of the law—inaccuracies not only showing up in the actual figuring but in the methods used by the collectors. A standard form has been recommended by the Secretary of State, and many of the Towns have taken advantage of this recommendation but still many more have not. One of the chief faults with the forms now in use is the fact that they have not been prenumbered in the printing of the form, leaving it open for the collector to fill in the numbers with the resultant duplication and triplication of numbers. The year in many cases has been left off to be filled in by the collector, and many errors result from this. Considering this phase of

municipal work alone, I feel it my duty to recommend that some consideration be given again this year to municipal compulsory audit, and a State system set-up as designed and installed by the State Auditor, Mr. Hayford. It is interesting to know in this respect that one out of every four municipal audits made by the State Auditor has revealed shortages. During the past year and one-half, municipal audits have revealed two shortages of over \$10,000 each.

Prior to December 22, 1934, the duty of installing and setting up a complete system of accounting, as well as stock control, was necessary on account of the enactment of the liquor laws created under the State Liquor Commission. Once again the value of the tabulating machine was manifested. State Liquor Commission, in the establishment of liquor stores throughout the state with a central warehouse in Augusta, required sales and inventory control—putting a premium on up-to-the-minute sales reports to match with current inventory. A system was devised in which a punched card is filed for every case of liquor in the warehouse, single and multiple cards carried in file for each and every brand of liquor on the list, and these are so handled under this system with the sorting and printing machines that not only are the sales in all stores recorded and put into report form each week, but a perpetual inventory is also the result. Apart from the regular State balance sheet, there has been prepared a balance sheet making the Liquor Commission a separate business in itself, and such balance sheet will be found in this report.

During the summer of 1935, Chapter 130, P. L. 1935 became operative, and that law created the Maine State Racing Commission, the major function of which was to supervise the operation of all kinds of horse racing or meets for public exhibition held in this State. The supervision of sales of parimutuel pools came under its jurisdiction, and it was in this respect that assistance from the Controller's office was requested. In the operation of pari-mutuel pools, very rapid calculation was necessary, and it was up to the various fair associations holding the meets to furnish a calculating, sales, and cashier system for this purpose. For the protection of the public, however, it was the desire of the Racing Commission that a representative of the State Controller's office tabulate and make the calculations on each and every race before pay-offs would be allowed on the winning tickets. has taken from two to eight people at various times for the seasons of 1935 and 1936. The total amount wagered at pari-mutuel pools as of June 30, 1936, amounted to \$574,408.00, and according to the law, ten per cent is deducted, 6½% going to the fair association, and 3½% to the State. The balance is returned to the public with the exception of an item known as breakage, which approximates almost 1% of the total. This comes about through the part of the law that the odd cents of all redistribution to be made on all mutual contributions exceeding a sum equal to the next lowest multiple of five. In other words, payments are in fives or zeros in the cent column on each dollar paid. Almost every instance, calculation which is based on division of the number of tickets held by the amount of money wagered would come to odd cents rather than five or zero. This amount, known as breakage, is held by the fair association. The State received \$19,900.03, this being the  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  for the period ending June 30, 1936.

A continuous check is kept on transportation of State employees with a departmental garage being established and having for its disposal seventyfive automobiles to transport those who have to go to various parts of the state. It would seem that there would be no necessity of paying mileage to any official in or around Augusta at the prevailing rate of five cents a mile for travel from Augusta. The new railroad rates have been considered by the Federal government as well as by many corporations doing business within the state, and it seems to be the consensus of opinion that for direct trips in which the railroad can be used, such should be the case. In many instances, the regulations which I have referred to above have been so much a mile for automobile travel but in no case should it exceed the railroad fare between the traveled points. I appreciate the fact that there are remote spots in Maine in which travel by railroad would be impossible. Hence, it would not seem feasible to make an ironclad rule in this respect. however, the continued cooperation of the various heads of the departments and institutions in giving this thought not only their consideration, but in assisting us in putting it in practice if only in part.

It has been a pleasure to work with the present Governor and Council, as it was with the previous one, and when such a spirit of cooperation prevails as has during these last few years, the under-officials cannot help but benefit from such leadership and direction.

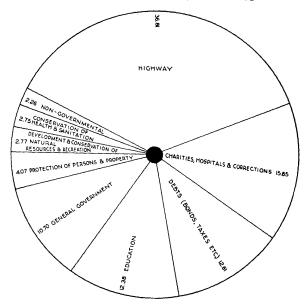

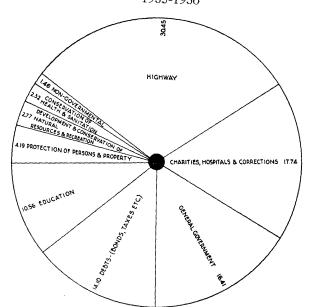

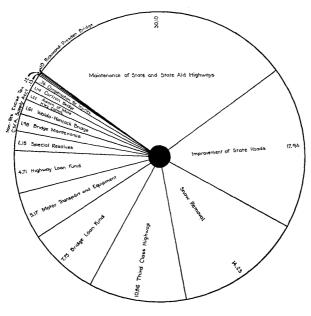
STATE OF MAINE Total Expenditures, 1934-1935



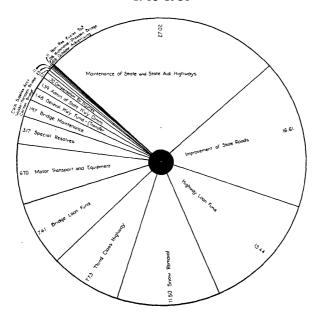

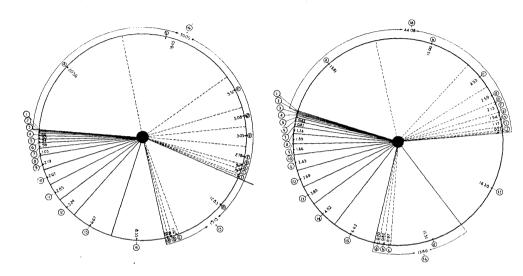


# HIGHWAY EXPENDITURES 1934-1935

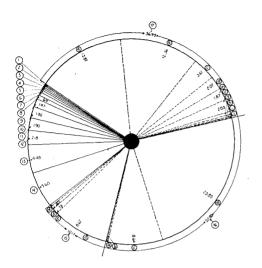

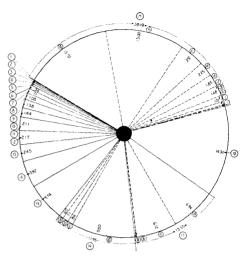
