REPORT OF DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS

ROUTINE OFFICE WORK

The shipments of report transcripts to the Census Bureau were as follows:

Births 15,620. Stillbirths 559. Deaths 10,998.

Birth and death transcripts of non-residents 243.

Letters sent out 5,897. Letters received 5,086.

Records called for 7,475. Birth certificates sent out 15,226.

Corrections on Birth Certificates 676.

Names and addresses sent to congressmen 12,360.

REGISTRATION REPORT, 1934

This report presents the results of the registration and tabulation of the births, marriages, divorces and deaths which occurred in the State of Maine during the year 1934.

The number of living births registered in the year 1934 was 15,784; 714 more than in the preceding year.

There were 189 twin-births and 0 triple-births in 1934.

The number of stillbirths was 558.

The number of marriages (number of couples married in 1934) was 7,089; 830 more than in the preceding year.

The number of deaths recorded in the State for the same year was 10,993 (this number includes all premature deaths), a number 163 less than that of the deaths registered in the preceding year.

One thousand, four hundred and eighty-five divorces were decreed in the year 1934; 552 in 1892; 801 in 1900; 911 in 1910; 1,364 in 1920; 1,475 in 1930.

Bertillon Classification—Nomenclature of the causes of death in this report is the revised Bertillon classification adopted by the International Commission which met in Paris in 1930.

Population—The population of the State of Maine in 1910 as given by the census was 742,371; in 1920, 768,014; in 1930, 797,423.

During 1934, we have sent duplicate birth and death transcripts of out of State residents with our monthly shipments to the Census

Bureau. The Census Bureau acts as a clearing house, allocating to each state transcripts belonging to them.

The first of every month during 1934 we have forwarded our three congressmen, the names and addresses of all mothers in their district giving birth to children during the preceding month, that they might receive the Child Welfare Literature, published by the U. S. Department of Labor.

Including our index cards, births, marriages and death records, also old records prior to 1892, we have filed over 80,000 cards during the year 1934.

Malarial Disease—Nearly every year a few deaths have been reported to the department as having been caused by malaria, or malarial disease. Almost without exception when there was good reason to believe that the deaths had malarial cause, the infection was contracted outside the state. For the year 1934 there were no deaths.

Infantile Paralysis—An epidemic of Infantile Paralysis caused 26 deaths in 1916, 12 males and 14 females. In 1917, 5 deaths occurred from this disease. In 1918, 7; in 1919, 3; in 1920, 10; in 1921, 15;

in 1922, 3; in 1923, 6; in 1924, 13; in 1925, 10; in 1926, 9; in 1927, 22; in 1928, 13; in 1929, 7; in 1930, 27; in 1931, 12; in 1932, 6; in 1933, 7; while in 1934 there were five deaths.

Pellegra—In the year 1934 there were 4 deaths from pellegra. No deaths from that disease were recorded prior to 1911.

Appendicitis—Of the deaths classified under this cause, there were 116. Death-rate 1.44.

Diseases of the Genitourinary System—There were 857 deaths referred to the diseases under this group.

Nephritis—Acute nephritis caused the death of 24 persons. Rate 0.29.

Bright's Disease—This was the cause of 706 deaths (204 in 1892; 443 in 1900; 714 in 1910; 795 in 1920 and 761 in 1930). Death-rate 8.75.

The Puerperal State—Under this class of accidents and diseases of reproduction, 94 deaths were registered. Rate 59.6 per 10,000 live births.

Deaths from External Causes—Under this class there were 837 deaths. Rate 10.38.
