## REPORT OF DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS

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### Routine Office Work

The shipments of report transcripts to the Census Bureau were as follows:

Births 15,940. Stillbirths 547. Deaths 11,041.

Birth and death transcripts of non-residents 241.

Letters sent out 6,098. Letters received 5,267.

Records called for 7,657. Birth certificates sent out 15,944.

Corrections on Birth Certificates 709.

### REGISTRATION REPORT, 1935

This report presents the results of the registration and tabulation of the births, marriages, divorces and deaths which occurred in the State of Maine during the year 1935.

The number of living births registered in the year 1935 was 15,715; 69 less than in the preceding year.

There were 159 twin-births and 1 triple-births in 1935.

The number of stillbirths was 528.

The number of marriages (number of couples married in 1935) was 7,098; 9 more than in the preceding year.

The number of deaths recorded in the State for the same year was 11,042 (this number includes all premature deaths), a number 49 more than that of the deaths registered in the preceding year.

One thousand, four hundred and eighty-seven divorces were decreed in the year 1935, 552 in 1892; 801 in 1900; 911 in 1910; 1,364 in 1920; 1,475 in 1930.

Bertillon Classification—Nomenclature of the causes of death in this report is the revised Bertillon classification adopted by the International Commission which met in Paris in 1930.

Population—The population of the State of Maine in 1910 as given by the census was 742,371; in 1920 768,014; in 1930 797,423.

During 1935, we have sent duplicate birth and death transcripts of out of State residents with our monthly shipments to the Census Bureau. The Census Bureau acts as a clearing house, allocating to each state transcripts belonging to them.

Including our index cards, births, marriages and death records, also old records prior to 1892, we have filed about 70,000 cards during the year 1935.

**ALLOCATION:** For the first time in the history of the State, deaths have been allocated to the place of residence of the deceased, having been charged in previous years to the place of death. This should insure as near a true rate as possible and have a marked effect on municipalities which are large hospital centers. These cities and towns have been charged with a high rate and small communities without hospital facilities have shown a low rate.

For the first time births have been charged to the residence of the mother, having been charged in previous years to the place of birth.

Deaths from automobile accidents are so treated with the exception of Table 21, where they are allocated to the place of accident or death.
