REPORT OF DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS

Routine Office Work

Mailings of transcriptions of Vital Records to the Census Bureau were as follows:

Births 15,367. Stillbirths 487. Deaths 11,766.

Transcriptions of births and deaths of non-residents, 599. These reports are not identical with the births, deaths and stillbirths reported hereafter under the tables for 1937.

Letters mailed 6,522. Letters received 5,511.

Calls for records 12,103. Birth notifications issued 14,846.

Corrected birth notifications 630.

GENERAL STATISTICS FOR MAINE, 1937

Live births recorded 15,363 (21 more than in 1936). These include 182 twin-births and 2 triple-births (in each plural birth at least one child was a live birth). There were 456 stillbirths (17 more than in 1936).

1,552 divorces were granted as compared with 552 in 1892; 801 in 1900; 911 in 1910; 1,364 in 1920; and 1,475 in 1930.

Population

By Official Census, the Population of Maine:

1910 was 742,371

1920 was 768,014

1930 was 797,423

For this Annual Report the population for the State and all its minor population units has been estimated on the supposition that the growth since 1930 has been the same as the actual growth between the Censuses of 1920 and 1930. Where no growth, but a loss, has occurred, as in the case of Sagadahoc, Lincoln, Knox, Waldo, Hancock and Washington counties, no change in population has been calculated. It is plain that only approximation of correctness is possible by this method and that in making rates to two

decimal places, we are guilty of "fictitious accuracy". As a particular example of the probability of large errors, there can be cited the case of Portland. By the usual method of estimation, the city's 1929 population was calculated as 78,903, which was used in that Annual Report as a basis for the many rates applying to Portland. Later the 1930 Census proved that this figure was about 8,200 too high, making more than ten per cent error in all the rates figured on that basis. Accordingly the student or research worker for accurate rates should re-estimate his populations after every official Census. It will be seen that small errors in the earlier part of the decade will become very considerable at the end of the decade, which is to say rates calculated on an estimated population in 1931 will be more dependable than those in 1937 and proportionately nearer correct than those of 1938 and 1939. Only the 1940 Census will prove how close the estimations have come to true figures.

By this, the usual arithmetical method, the population of Maine as of July 31, 1937 was 827,000.

By new and still unproved method, the Census Bureau has calculated the population for the same date as 853,000.

For this reason, statistical rates issued by the Bureau will vary considerably from those found in the following tables.

Only by re-estimating after the 1940 Census will be known which method was better.

Allocations

Previous to our Annual Report for 1935, all births and deaths were simply assigned to the place of occurrence. Because birth and death rates are used as a crude index of public health, it was seen that the rates for hospital centers were too high both for births and for deaths and at the expense of towns without hospitals. Rates for small population units for the State made previous to 1935 are accordingly not very significant. Moreover in considering certain institution deaths, notably in tuberculosis hospitals, it was plainly only reasonable to assign such deaths to the place where the illness was contracted. Accordingly, deaths that occur in the three tuberculosis hospitals at Hebron, Fairfield, and Presque Isle are "allocated" to the place of former residence, no matter how long the deceased were inmates. In a like manner also have been added to this category deaths at the State Insane Hospitals at Augusta and

Bangor and those from the State Welfare Home "Willowcrest" in Pittston. Other institutions might reasonably be added.

Interpretation of Tables

- 1—This report concerns itself only with residents of Maine.
- 2—Residence is determined by stay of one year.
- 3—The residence of an infant is that of its mother.

An understanding of these statements is needed for intelligent reading of this report. A few examples will serve. The death of a resident of Auburn in New Hampshire is charged to Auburn. A New Hampshire resident dying in the hospital at Kittery is not included in this report but in the New Hampshire deaths. A resident of Auburn moving to Lewiston and dying before a year is passed, is charged to Auburn. In a like manner a birth is allocated to the residence of its mother and not to the place of birth unless that place has been the mother's residence for at least one year.

Few changes have been made from previous Annual Reports. The tables relating to death from Cancer have been expanded fully in accordance with the primary site. The other changes are self explanatory.

Rates

Following the practice of the Bureau of Census, births, deaths and marriages are rated as so many per one thousand of population. To avoid a common cause of confusion, it is to be understood that the marriage rate is based on the number of marriages rather than on the number of persons marrying. Infant mortality is the number of deaths under one year for each thousand live births. The puerperal (or maternal) death rate is the number of such deaths for each 10,000 live births. Specific rates, those reckoned for separate death causes, are reckoned as so many per each 100,000 inhabitants, not for each 10,000 as in previous Annual Reports.

Old Records

Sections 38 and 39 of Chapter 72, 1930, Revised Statutes, provided for filing of old birth, death and marriage records by town clerks. At this time a separate file of such records contains upwards of 300,000 received since the law became effective, July 15, 1927.

This is a summary of births, deaths and marriages in Maine in 1937. Population as of July 1, 1937 estimated by the usual method 827,000. Estimated by the United States Census Bureau, 853,000.
