REPORT OF THE DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 1942

Mailings of Transcriptions of Vital Records to the Census Bureau.

Births 15,321; Stillbirths 398; Deaths 9,449.

Births to Non-resident Mothers 200; Deaths of Non-residents 244.

This is a total of 25,612 records filed with the Census Bureau within the year 1942. These items are not identical with the figures hereafter reported in the tables of the Annual Report.

From the Census Bureau there were received 331 records of births outside the State to mothers who were residents of the State, and 204 records of death of Maine residents who died outside of the State.

GENERAL STATISTICS FOR MAINE, 1942

Live births, 17,714 (1,668 more than in 1941). These include 154 twin births in which at least one child was born alive. There were no other plural births. There were 451 Stillbirths. There were 9,724 marriages (168 fewer than in 1941), but of the marriages in which at least one party was a resident of Maine there were 8,990 (238 more than in 1941). There were, accordingly, 406 fewer marriages of non-residents in 1942 than in 1941, the former year being the first full year since the pre-marital blood test law became effective. The number of deaths was 10,436 (62 fewer than for 1941, and the smallest number ever recorded). The number of divorces was 1755 (28 more than in 1941, and the greatest number ever recorded).

POPULATION

By official U. S. Census the population of Maine in

1920 was 768,014

1930 was 797,423

1940 was 847,226

For calculating rates the usual method of estimating populations, which is to consider that the growth between the two previous censuses will continue at the same rate, is

quite inaccurate. This is made so by the movement of those in war and defense work out of the State. Moreover those who died in service outside of continental United States are not recorded among our dead and their records will not be made available by the War Department.

In considering the error of the rate of birth it is plain by the very sharp increase in births, that whatever loss of population has taken place is evidently not from among the women of child-bearing age. The fallacy here is the basic one of reckoning birth rates as so many per thousand population rather than by the number of women of child-bearing age.

For lack of better information populations of all population units have been estimated in the usual way, whereby the State is reckoned to have a July 1st, 1942 population of 857,187. On that base, and subject to the errors noted, the rates per 1,000 population were:

Birth Rate	20.7
Death Rate	12.2
Marriage Rate	10.5

ALLOCATIONS

Beginning with 1935, births and deaths have been assigned to the place of residence rather than to the place of occurrence. In 1939 upon the adoption of the Standard Certificates of Birth, Death and Stillbirth, the arbitrary rule of one year of residence to determine the allocation is replaced by the simple entry by physician or funeral director of "the usual place of residence." (In the case of a birth or an infant death, the residence is that of the mother.)

INTERPRETATION OF TABLES

- (1) The numbers quoted in this report, regardless of place of event, deal only with residents of the State.
- (2) Deaths and births are assigned to the place of usual residence.
- (3) The residence of an infant is that of its mother.

RATES

The general rates of birth, death and marriage are given as so many to each 1,000 population. Infant death rates and the puerperal (maternal) death rates are the number of such deaths to each 1,000 live births. Specific rates, those for separate death causes, are reckoned as so many to each 100,000 population.
