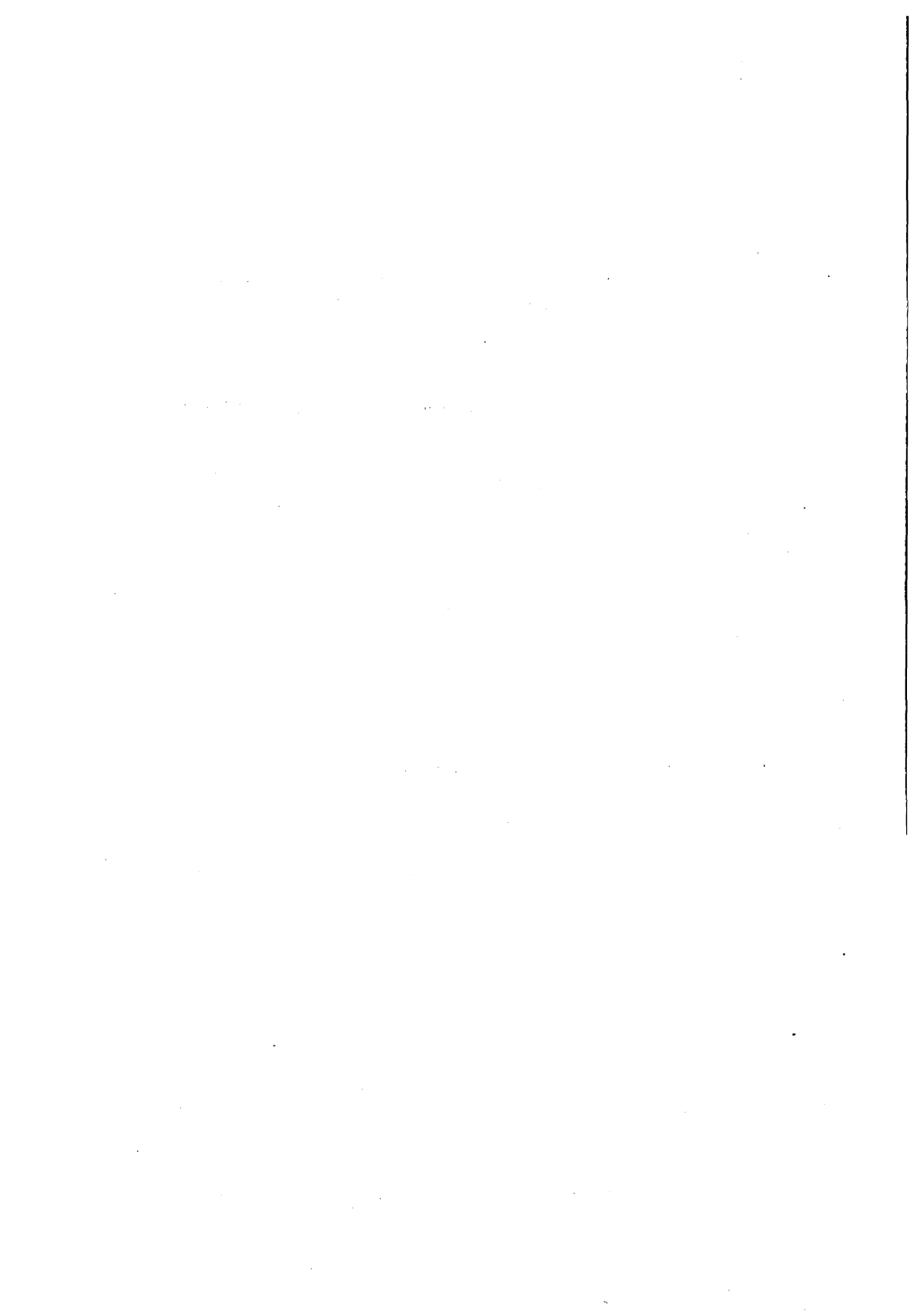

REPORT OF THE DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 1943

Mailings of Transcriptions of Vital Records to the Census Bureau.

Births 20,344; Stillbirths 393; Deaths 11,494.

Births to Non-resident Mothers 196; Deaths of Non-residents 261.

This is a total of 32,688 records filed with the Census Bureau within the calendar year 1943. These items are not identical with figures hereafter reported in the tables of the Annual Report.

From the Census Bureau there were received 545 records of births outside the State to mothers who were residents of the State, and 252 records of death of Maine residents who died outside the State.

GENERAL STATISTICS FOR MAINE, 1943

Live Births 18,883 (1,169 more than in 1942). These include 187 plural births in which at least one child was born alive, 184 sets of twins and 3 sets of triplets. There were 394 Stillbirths. There were 7,248 Marriages (2,476 fewer than in 1942). Of Marriages where at least one party was a resident of Maine there were 6,636 (2,354 fewer than for 1942). The number of Deaths was 10,887 (451 more than in 1942). It should be noted that deaths in the armed forces are reported to the several states only if death occurred within the United States. Such deaths overseas are not made available to the states by the War Department. The number of Divorces was 1,832 (77 more than in 1942, and the greatest number ever recorded).

POPULATION

By official U. S. Census the population of Maine in

1920 was 768,014

1930 was 797,423

1940 was 847,226

War conditions have made the usual method of estimating current population too inaccurate for use. Instead, wherever possible the issue of food ration books has been used as the basis

for each town or city. For a few towns where these figures are not available the 1940 census figures have been used and where used the symbol ('40) is shown. The high rates both of birth and death based on the shrunken population indicate that the child-bearing population as well as the ill and old remained at home. The numerical increase in births, apparently a war time feature, is predicted not to continue through 1944, indeed at this date, September 6, 1944, indications are plain of a sharp drop in births for 1944.

Based on the fairly accurate estimation by ration books indicating a population for the State of 825,975 the rates per 1,000 were:

Birth Rate	22.9
Death Rate	13.2
Marriage Rate	8.0

ALLOCATIONS

Beginning with 1935, births and deaths have been assigned to the place of residence rather than to the place of occurrence. In 1939 upon the adoption of the Standard Certificates of Birth, Death and Stillbirth, the arbitrary rule of one year of residence to determine the allocation is replaced by the simple entry by physician or funeral director of the "usual place of residence". (In the case of a birth or an infant death, the residence is that of the mother.)

INTERPRETATION OF TABLES

- (1) The numbers quoted in this report, regardless of place of event, deal only with residents of the State.
- (2) Deaths and births are assigned to the place of usual residence.
- (3) The residence of an infant is that of its mother.

RATES

The general rates of birth, death and marriage are given as so many to each 1,000 population. Infant death rates and the puerperal (maternal) death rates are the number of such deaths to each 1,000 live births. Specific rates, those for separate death causes, are reckoned as so many to each 100,000 population.
