

REPORT OF FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1951

SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

The number of professional engineers registered in the State of Maine continues to increase very slowly, the total number now registered being 770 or a gain of only 16 from the previous year. It is believed that nearly all the professional engineers who should register are registered, and that there is very little violation of the professional engineers law. The future annual increases in registration will probably be small unless something occurs which greatly increases the number of out of state registrants.

The Board funds at this time amount to \$2,245.61 or \$509.29 less than a year ago due to the smaller number of applications. The expenses of the Board were \$24.60 more than the previous year. The renewal fee has been continued at one dollar per registrant during the past year, altho from the above information, it is obvious that an increase in renewal fees will probably be necessary soon. This is permitted under the present law.

During the year the Board held five meetings, at which time 53 applications were considered, 38 being approved, 11 being denied, and 4 being on the table at the end of the year. There are now 770 registrants in good standing.

In accordance with Section 10, Chapter 74, Revised Statutes of 1944, as amended by P. L. 1945, there is attached hereto a statement of receipts and expenditures of the Board, attested by affidavits of the Chairman and the Secretary.

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE PRACTICE OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER-ING; CREATING A STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR PROFESSION-AL ENGINEERS.

CHAPTER 74, REVISED STATUTES 1944, AS AMENDED BY P. L. 1945.

IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MAINE AS FOLLOWS:

- Sec. 1. General provisions. In order to safeguard life, health and property, any person practicing or offering to practice the profession of engineering, shall be required to submit evidence as hereinafter provided; and it shall be unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice the profession of engineering in the state, or to use in connection with his name or otherwise assume, use, or advertise any title or description tending to convey the impression that he is a professional engineer, unless such person has been duly registered or exempted under the provisions of this act.
- Sec. 2. Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:
- I. The term "professional engineer" shall mean a person who, by reason of his knowledge of mathematics, the physical sciences, and the principles of engineering, acquired by professional education and practical experience, is qualified to engage in engineering practice as hereinafter defined.
- II. The term "practice of professional engineering" shall be held to mean any professional service, such as consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, design, or responsible supervision of construction in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or projects, wherein the public welfare, or the safeguarding of life; health, or property is concerned or involved, when such professional service requires the application of engineering principles and data.
- III. The term "board" shall mean the state board of registration for professional engineers provided for by this chapter.
- Sec. 3. State board of registration for professional engineers; appointment of members; terms. The state board of registration for professional engineers, as heretofore established, shall administer the provisions of this chapter. The board shall consist of 5 professional engineers, who shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the council, from among nominees recommended by the representative engineering societies in the state, and who shall have the qualifications required by section 4.

On the expiration of the term of any member, the governor shall in the manner hereinbefore provided, appoint for a term of 5 years a registered professional engineer, having the qualifications required by section 4, to take the place of the member whose term on said board is about to expire. Each member shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which such member is appointed or until a successor shall have been duly appointed and shall have qualified.

Sec. 4. Qualifications of members of board. Each member of the board shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this state, and shall have

been engaged in the practice of the profession of engineering for at least 12 years, and shall have been in responsible charge of important engineering work for at least 5 years. Responsible charge of engineering teaching may be construed as responsible charge of important engineering work.

- Sec. 5. Compensation and expenses of board members. No members of the board, except as provided in section 9, shall receive any compensation for his services as a member of the board, but shall be reimbursed for all actual traveling and incidental expenses necessarily incurred in carrying out the provisions of this chapter. No clerical expenses shall be allowed any member of the board except as provided in section 9.
- Sec. 6. Removal of members of board; vacancies. The governor with the advice and consent of the council may remove any member of the board for misconduct, incompetency, neglect of duty, or for any other sufficient cause. Vacancies in the membership of the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment by the governor as provided in section 3.
- Section 7. Organization and meetings of the board. The board shall hold at least 2 regular meetings each year. Special meetings shall be held at such time as the by-laws of the board may provide. Notice of all meetings shall be given in such manner as the by-laws may provide.

The board shall elect or appoint annually the following officers: a chairman, a vice-chairman, and a secretary. A quorum of the board shall consist of not less than 3 members. See §16, re duties of secretary.

Sec. 8. Powers of the board. The board shall have the power to make all by-laws and rules, not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter and the constitution and laws of this state, which may be reasonably necessary for the proper performance of its duties and the regulations of the proceedings before it. The board shall adopt and have an official seal.

In carrying into effect the provisions of this chapter, the board may, under the hand of its chairman and the seal of the board, subpoena witnesses and compel their attendance, and also may require the production of books, papers, documents, etc., in a case involving the revocation of registration or practicing or offering to practice without registration. Any member of the board may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the board. If any person shall refuse to obey any subpoena so issued, or shall refuse to testify or produce any books, papers, or documents, the board may present its petition to the superior court, setting forth the facts, and thereupon such court, shall in a proper case, issue its subpoena to such person, requiring his attendance before such court and there to testify or to produce such books, papers, and documents, as may be deemed necessary and pertinent by the court. Any person failing or refusing to obey the subpoena or order of the said court may be proceeded against in the same manner as for refusal to obey any other subpoena or order of the court.

Sec 9. Receipts and Disbursements. The secretary of the board shall receive and account for all moneys derived under the provisions of this chapter, and shall pay the same, as provided by law, to the treasurer of state, who shall keep such moneys in a separate fund to be known as the "professional engineers' fund". The secretary of the board shall receive a salary and allowance for clerical hire as recommended by the board, in addition to the expenses provided for in section 5. The board may make other expenditures from this fund, upon itemized vouchers approved by the chairman of the board which in the

- opinion of the board are reasonably necessary for the proper performance of its duties under the provisions of this chapter.
 - Sec. 10. Records and reports. The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a register of all applications for registration, which register shall show:
 - I. The name, age, and residence of each applicant;
 - II. The date of the application;
 - III. The place of business of such applicant;
 - IV. His educational and other qualifications;
 - V. Whether or not an examination was required;
 - VI. Whether the applicant was rejected;
 - VII. Whether a certificate of registration was granted;
 - VIII. The date of the action of the board; and
 - IX. Such other information as may be deemed necessary by the board.

The records of the board shall be prima facie evidence of the proceedings of the board set forth therein, and a transcript thereof, duly certified by the secretary of the board under seal, shall be admissible in evidence with the same force and effect as if the original were produced.

Not later than August 1st of each year, the board shall submit to the governor a report of its transactions of the preceding year ending June 30 and shall also transmit to him a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the board, attested by affidavits of its chairman and its secretary.

- Sec. 11. Roster of registered engineers. A roster showing the names and places of business of all registered professional engineers shall be prepared by the secretary of the board during the month of January of each year. Copies of this roster shall be mailed to each person so registered, placed on file with the secretary of state and the clerk of courts of each county, and furnished to the public on request.
- Sec. 12. General requirements for registration (amended by 1945, c. 43, §1; c. 293, §13). The following shall be considered as minimum evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant is qualified for registration as a professional engineer, to wit:
- I. (1945, c. 43, §1) Graduation from an approved course in engineering of 4 years or more in a school or college approved by the board as of satisfactory standing; and a specific record of an additional 4 years or more of active practice in engineering work, and indicating that the applicant is competent to be placed in responsible charge of such work; or
- II. (1945, c 43, §1; c. 293, §13). Successfully passing a written, or writen and oral, examination designed to show knowledge and skill approximating that attained through graduation from an approved 4 year engineering course and a specific record of 8 years or more of active practice in engineering work and indicating that the applicant is competent to be placed in responsible charge of such work.

No person shall be eligible for registration as a professional engineer who in the opinion of the board is not of good character and reputation.

Each year of engineering teaching, or postgraduate or research work in an engineering school or college approved by the board as of satisfactory standing, may be considered as a year of active practice in engineering work, except that 2 years of engineering work other than engineering teaching, post graduate or research work in such engineering school or college, and of a character satisfactory to the board shall be required.

The satisfactory completion of each year of an approved course in engineering in a school or college approved by the board as of satisfactory standing, without graduation, shall be considered as equivalent to a year of active practice. Graduation in a course other than engineering from a college or university of recognized standing shall be considered as equivalent to 2 years of active practice. The mere execution, as a contractor, of work designed by a professional engineer, or the supervision of the construction of such work as a foreman or superintendent shall not be deemed to be active practice in engineering work.

The board shall issue certificates of registration only to those applicants who meet the requirements of this section or of section 20.

The board may accept as evidence that the applicant is qualified for registration as a professional engineer a specific record of 12 years or more of lawful active practice in engineering work of a character satisfactory to the board and indicating that the applicant is qualified to design or to supervise construction of engineering work and has had responsible charge of important engineering work for at least 5 years and provided applicant is not less than 35 years of age. Responsible charge of engineering teaching may be construed as responsible charge of engineering work.

Any person having the necessary qualifications prescribed in this act to entitle him to registration shall be eligible for such registration though he may not be practicing his profession at the time of making his application.

Sec. 13. Applications and registration fees. Applications for registration shall be on forms prescribed and furnished by the board, shall contain statements made under oath, showing the applicant's education and detail summary of his technical work, and shall contain not less than 5 references, of whom 3 or more shall be engineers having personal knowledge of his engineering experience.

The registration fee for professional engineers shall be \$15, \$7.50 of which shall accompany application, the remaining \$7.50 to be paid upon issuance of certificate.

Should the board deny the issuance of a certificate of registration to any applicant the initial fee deposited shall be retained as an application fee.

Sec. 14. Examinations. When oral or written examinations are required they shall be held at such time and place as the board shall determine, except that, upon written request by an applicant, a special examination shall be held within 90 days after receipt of such request by the board. The scope of the examinations and the methods of procedure shall be prescribed by the board with special reference to the applicant's ability to design and supervise engineer-

ing works, which shall insure the safety of life, health, and property. Examinations shall be given for the purpose of determining the qualifications of applicants for registration in professional engineering. A notification of the result of the examination shall be mailed to each candidate within 30 days after taking such examination. A candidate failing on examination may apply for re-examination at the expiration of 6 months and will be re-examined without payment of additional fee. Subsequent examination will be granted upon payment of a fee to be determined by the board.

Sec. 15. Certificates; seals. The board shall issue a certificate of registration upon payment of registration fee as provided for in this chapter, to any applicant who, in the opinion of the board, has satisfactorily met all the requirements of this chapter. The certificate shall authorize the practice of "professional engineering." Certificates of registration shall show the full name of the registrant, shall have a serial number, and shall be signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board under seal of the board.

The issuance of a certificate of registration by this board shall be evidence that the person named therein is entitled to all the rights and privileges of a registered professional engineer, while the said certificate remains unrevoked or unexpired.

Each registrant upon registration may obtain a seal of the design authorized by the board, bearing the registrant's name and the legend "registered professional engineer." Plans, specifications, plats, and reports issued by a registrant shall be stamped with the said seal, as prescribed in the rules of the board, during the life of the registrant's certificate, but it shall be unlawful for anyone to stamp or seal any document with said seal after the certificate of the registrant named thereon has expired or has been revoked, unless said certificate shall have been renewed or reissued.

Sec. 16. Expiration and renewals. Certificates of registration shall expire on the last day of December following their issuance or renewal and shall become invalid on that date unless renewed. It shall be the duty of the secretary of the board to notify every person registered under the provisions of this chapter, of the date of the expiration of his certificate and the amount of the fee that shall be required for its renewal for 1 year; such notice shall be mailed at least one day in advance of the date of the expiration of said certificate. Renewal may be effected at any time during the month of December by the payment of a fee designated by the board but which shall not exceed \$3, nor be less than \$1. The failure on the part of any registrant to renew his certificate annually in the month of December as required above shall not deprive such person of the right of renewal, but the fee to be paid for the renewal of a certificate after the month of December shall be increased 10% for each month or fraction of a month that payment of renewal is delayed; provided, however, that the maximum fee for delayed renewal shall not exceed twice the normal renewal fee.

Sec. 16-A. Exemptions from expiration and renewal fees. (New section by 1945, c. 43, §2). Any person holding a valid certificate of registration under the provisions of this chapter on the date of entering employment in the armed forces of the government of the United States during a period of war, or employment in any war time service outside of continental United States, governmental or otherwise, under the United States or any of its allied nations, shall be exempt, for the duration of such employment, from the payment of all renewal fees and his certificate of registration shall remain in full force and effect until the next regular renewal date following the termination of such employment.

- Sec. 17. Forms, partnerships, corporations, and joint stock associations. A firm, copartnership, corporation, or joint stock association may engage in the practice of professional engineering in this state, provided only such practice is carried on by professional engineers registered in this state.
- Sec. 18. Public works. Any department of this state or any of its political subdivisions, any county, city, town, township, or plantation may engage in construction of any public work involving professional engineering without procuring the services of a registered professional engineer, provided that the contemplated expenditure for the completed project does not exceed \$5,000.
- Sec. 19. Exemptions. The following persons shall be exempt from the provisions of this act, to wit:
- I. A person not a resident of and having no established place of business in this state, practicing or offering to practice herein the profession of engineering when such practice does not exceed in the aggregate more than 30 days in any calendar year; provided such person is legally qualified by registration to practice the said profession in his own state or county in which the requirements and qualifications for obtaining a certificate of registration are not lower than those specified in this chapter.
- II. A person not a resident of and having no established place of business in this state, or who has recently become a resident thereof, practicing or offering to practice herein for more than 30 days in any calendar year the profession of engineering, if he shall have filed with the board an application for a certificate of registration and shall have paid the fee required by this chapter. Such exemption shall continue only for such time as the board requires for the consideration of the application for registration; provided that such a person is legally qualified to practice said profession in his own state or county in which the requirements and qualifications for obtaining a certificate of registration are not lower than those specified in this chapter.
- III. An employee or a subordinate of a person holding a certificate of registration under the provisions of this chapter, or an employee of a person exempted from registration by subsections I and II of this section; provided his practice does not include responsible charge or design or supervision.
- IV. Officers and employees of the government of the United States while engaged within this state in the practice of the profession of engineering for said government.
- V. An officer or employee of a corporation engaged in interstate commerce as defined in the act of congress entitled "An Act to Regulate Commerce" approved February 4, 1887, as amended, or in interstate communication as defined in the act of congress entitled "Communications Act of 1934" approved June 19, 1934, while working solely as an employee of such corporation; provided that an officer or employee of such corporation customarily in responsible charge of the engineering work of such corporation within this state shall be a registrant under the provisions of this chapter.
- Sec. 20. Reciprocity. The board may, upon application therefor and the payment of a fee of \$15, issue a certificate of registration as a professional engineer to any person who holds a certificate of qualification or registration issued to him by proper authority of the national bureau of engineering registration, or any state or territory or possession of the United States, or any country, provided that the requirements for registration of professional engineers under which said certificate of qualification or registration was issued do not conflict

with the provisions of this chapter and are of a standard not lower than that specified in section 12.

- Sec. 21. Revocations and reissuances of certificates. The board shall have the power to revoke the certificate of registration of any registrant who is found guilty of:
- I. The practice of any fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration:
- II. Any gross negligence, incompetency, or misconduct in the practice of professional engineering as a registered professional engineer.

Any person may prefer charges of fraud, deceit, gross negligence, incompetency, or misconduct against any registrant. Such charges shall be in writing, and shall be sworn to by the person making them, and shall be filed with the secretary of the board.

All charges, unless dismissed by the board as unfounded or trivial, shall be heard by the board within 3 months after the date on which they shall have been preferred.

The time and place for said hearing shall be fixed by the board, and a copy of the charges, together with a notice of the time and place of hearing, shall be personally served on or mailed to the last known address of such registrant, at least 30 days before the date fixed for the hearing. At any hearing, the accused registrant shall have the right to appear personally and by counsel to cross-examine witnesses appearing against him, and to produce evidence and witnesses in his own defense.

If, after such hearing, 4 or more members of the board vote in favor of finding the accused guilty, the board shall revoke the certificate of registration of such registered professional engineer.

The board, for reasons it may deem sufficient, may re-issue a certificate of registration to any person whose certificate has been revoked, providing 3 or more members of the board vote in favor of such re-issuance. A new certificate of registration, to replace any certificate revoked, lost, destroyed, or mutilated, may be issued, subject to the rules of the board, and a charge of \$3 shall be made for such issuance.

Sec. 22. Violations and penalties. Any person who shall practice, or offer to practice, the profession of engineering in this state without being registered or exempted in accordance with the provisions of this act, or any person presenting or attempting to use as his own the certificate of registration or the seal of another, or any person who shall give any false or forged evidence of any kind to the board or to any member thereof in obtaining a certificate of registration, or any person who shall falsely impersonate any other registrant of like or different name, or any person who shall attempt to use an expired or revoked certificate of registration, or any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 3 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

It shall be the duty of all duly constituted officers of the law of this state or any political subdivision thereof to enforce the provisions of this chapter and to prosecute any person violating same. The attorney-general of the state or his assistant shall act as legal adviser of the board and render such legal assistance as may be necessary in carrying out the provisions of this chapter.

Sec. 23. Other legally recognized professions not affected. The provisions of this chapter shall not be construed to affect or prevent the practice of any other legally recognized profession.

BY-LAWS OF

MAINE STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION

FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS

SECTION 1-GENERAL

(1) Name

The name of this Board shall be STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS. For the purpose of brevity in the succeeding by-laws, this organization shall be subsequently referred to as the "Board."

Headquarters

The headquarters of the board shall be at The State House at Augusta, Maine.

(3) Seal:

The seal of the board shall be as follows: An embossed circular seal two and one-fourth inches in diameter consisting of two concentric circles, the outer circle to be two and one-eighth inches in diameter, the inner one to be one and three-eights in diameter and containing the great seal of the State of Maine, and the words "State of Maine" above, and the words "State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers" below.

(4) Fiscal Qear:

The fiscal year of the board shall end on June 30.

(5) Meetings:
Two stated regular meetings shall be held each year as follows: On the second Wednesday each January, and July at ten o'clock a. m. in the offices of the board, unless otherwise specified by notice. Special meetings may be called at any time by order of the Chairman. Due notice of such special meeting shall be given each member.

The board shall elect or appoint annually at its stated meeting on the second Wednesday of each January the following officers to serve for one year from date of such election or appointment, a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman, both of whom shall be members of the Board.

At the same stated meeting the Board shall elect or appoint a Secretary to serve for one year or until his successor is elected; said secretary may or may not be a member of the Board.

- (a) Executive
- (b) Finance
- (c) Rules and Regulations
- (d) Committees on Examinations
- Information (e)

At the same meeting a Secretary or clerk shall be elected.

(7) Examinations:

When oral or written examinations are required, they shall be held at such time and place as the board shall determine. The scope of the examinations and the methods of procedure shall be prescribed by the board with special reference to the applicant's ability to design and supervise engineering works, which shall insure the safety of life, health and property. Examinations shall be given for the purpose of determining the qualifications of applicants for registration in professional engineering. A candidate failing in one examination may apply for re-examination after six months and will be re-examined without payment of additional fee. Subsequent examinations will be granted upon payment of a fee to be determined by the board. At least two (2) regular scheduled examinations shall be held annually, in the months of January and July, respectively, and at such other times as determined by the board.

SECTION 2-DUTIES

The Chairman:

The chairman shall when present preside at all meetings and shall appoint all committees. He shall otherwise perform all duties pertaining to the office of chairman. He shall sign all certificates, vouchers and other official documents.

(2) The Vice-Chairman:

The Vice-Chairman shall, in the absence or incapacity of the chairman, exercise the duties and shall possess all the power of the chairman.

(3) The Secretary:

The Secretary shall conduct and care for all correspondence in the name of the board and shall record and file all applications, certificates of registration, examinations, registrations and revocations. He shall be in possession of the official seal and affix same to all official documents upon order of the chairman and board. The Secretary shall sign all certificates. He shall keep a record of all meetings, in the form approved by the board, and shall maintain a proper account of all the business of the board. He shall receive and account for all moneys and transfer same to the state treasurer monthly. He shall present to the board annually at the July meeting a report of the transactions of the board of the preceding year, and a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the board, and upon its being approved by the board shall transmit the same to the governor.

He shall prepare a roster showing the names and places of business of all registered professional engineers during the month of January of each year, commencing January 1936. Copies of this roster shall be mailed to each person so registered, placed on file with the secretary of state, and furnished to the clerk of court of all counties and to the public on request. The secretary shall be required to give a surety bond in the amount fixed by the board.

The Secretary shall keep all records of the board in a manner reasonably safe from all fire hazard.

(4) Vacancies:

If for any reason vacancies shall occur in the office of chairman, vice-chairman and/or secretary, the offices or office shall be filled by an election of the board members either at a regular stated meeting or a special meeting called for that purpose. Any officers so elected shall receive not less than three (3) affirmative votes.

(5) Executive Committee:

The executive committee shall consist of three members, of which the chairman of the board shall be chairman. Its duties shall be to transact all business during the interval between meetings and to make a report thereon to the board at its next meeting.

(6) Finance Committee:

The finance committee shall consist of two members, of which the vice-chairman shall be chairman, and shall audit all bills, accounts, income and expense, including the financial records of the secretary, and shall report its action to the board for approval.

(7) Rules and Regulations Committee:

The rules and regulations committee shall consist of two members, and shall from time to time consider and recommend to the board such modification of the by-laws and rules governing examinations, registration and procedure as will give the best operating results.

(8) Examining Committee:

The committee on examinations shall consist of all members of the board. Their duties shall be to prepare the nature and scope of the examinations to be held by the board.

(9) Information Committee:

The committee on information shall consist of three members, and its duties shall be to recommend to the board data for publication and circularization setting forth the policy, purpose and principles of the board.

SECTION 3—PROCEDURE

(1) Quorum:

Three members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

(2) Order of Business shall be as follows:

- 1. Reading of Minutes
- 2. Report of Executive Committee
- 3. Report of Finance Committee
- 4. Report of Rules and Regulations Committee
- 5. Report of Committee on Examinations
- 6. Report of Information Committee
- 7. Report of Special Committees
- 8. Reading Communications
- 9. Reading and Considering Applications
- 10. Unfinished Business
- 11. New Business
- 12. Examinations
- 13. Adjournment

(3) Procedure:

Roberts' RULES OF ORDER shall govern the procedure of the board except as otherwise provided by the by-laws or the act.

(4) Notice:

A notice of each meeting shall be mailed to each member of the board, by the secretary, and shall be deemed full and proper notice thereof.

(5) Amendments:

Amendments to the by-laws must be presented in writing to each member of the Board at least one week in advance of a meeting and shall be voted upon at the next regular or special meeting.

DEFINITIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS

State of Maine

FOREWORD:

The Act makes no specific designations as to the branches of engineering practice for which certificates of registration shall be issued. The Board will recognize each accredited branch of engineering for which degrees are offered in the curricula of engineering schools and colleges approved by the Engineers' Council for Professional Development, and will issue certificates of registration to applicants who demonstrate their qualifications for practice in their particular branch under the provisions of the Act and in conformity with the rules and regulations of the Board.

In administering the Act and formulating its procedures, the Board recognizes two fundamental obligations:

- 1. To respect the right to his means of livelihood of any individual who has prepared himself conscientiously and properly to practice Professional Engineering.
- 2. To protect the public, as far as possible, within the limits of the Actfrom such dangers, affecting life, health and property, as may arise from theattempt of incompetent or unethical persons to practice this profession.

DEFINITIONS:

- A. The term "Act" shall refer to "An Act to Regulate the Practice of Professional Engineering: Creating a State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers", Chapter 74, Revised Statutes 1944 as amended by Public Laws 1945.
- B. The term "Board" shall mean the "State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers".
- C. The term "Professional Engineer" shall mean a person who, by reason of his knowledge of mathematics, the physical sciences, and the principles of engineering, acquired by professional education and practical experience is qualified to engage in engineering practice as defined in Section 2, Chapter 74, Revised Statutes 1944 as amended by Public Laws 1945.

D. The practice of Professional Engineering means any professional service, such as, consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, design or responsible supervision of construction, in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or project wherein the public welfare or safeguarding of life, health or property is concerned or involved, when such professional service requires the application of engineering principles and data.

RULE 1—REGISTRATION

Any person offering to practice professional engineering in the State of Maine after January 1, 1936, shall apply to the Board for a certificate of registration in the branch or branches desired and shall submit evidence of his qualifications to the Board on forms furnished by the board, and, upon the approval of the Board, will be issued a certificate as a Professional Engineer.

Professional Engineers registering under this Act are requested to keep their certificates of registration issued by the Board posted conspicuously in their principal place of business, where the public can examine said certificates.

RULE 2—EXEMPTIONS

Certain exemptions are granted in Section 19 of the Act of 1944 - 1945.

- A. Non-residents of the state having no established place of business in this state, when such practice does not exceed in the aggregate more than thirty days in any calendar year; and provided such person is legally qualified by registration to practice said profession in his own state.
- B. Exemption for thirty days for non-residents of the state, or those who have recently become residents thereof, if they shall have filed application with the Board of registration.
- C. Employees or sub-ordinates of persons holding a certificate of registration; also employees of persons exempt from registration by classes "A" and "B", provided their work does not include responsible charge of design or supervision.
 - D. Officers and employees of the United States.
- E. Officers and employees of corporations engaged in inter-state commerce as defined in an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to Regulate Inter-State Commerce" approved February 4, 1887. Officers or employees of corporations engaged in inter-state communication as defined in the Act of Congress approved June 19, 1934, provided that the officer or employer of such corporations customarily in charge of the engineering work of such corporations in Maine shall be a registrant under this Act.

RULE 3—APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION

Applications for registration shall be made on forms furnished by the board.

Applications shall be made for registration as a Professional Engineer and should designate the branch in which they desire to qualify, such as:

- a. Aeronautical
- b. Chemical
- c. Civil
- d. Electrical
- e. Heating and Ventilating
- f. Industrial
- g. Mechanical
- h. Metallurgical
- i. Mining
- j. Sanitary
- k. Structural

Additional branches or subdivisions thereof may be designated by the applicant. The Board may, at its discretion, designate the branches or subdivisions thereof in which it finds the applicant to be duly qualified.

RULE 4—CLASSES OF APPLICANTS

Each applicant shall designate the classification in the following schedule of minimum requirements, under which he makes application.

Professional Engineer

- Graduates of engineering schools
 From four year engineering course
 With four years of active practice and without examination
- 2. By examination designed to show knowledge and skill approximating that attained through graduation from an approved four year engineering course and a specific record of eight years or more of active practice in engineering work and indicating that the applicant is competent to be placed in responsible charge of such work.

- 3. Non-graduates of engineering courses, who have twelve years of practice, and in responsible charge of work for five years, and thirty-five years of age or over, without examination. Limited to July 6. 1940.
- 4. Practitioners whether active or not at time Act becomes effective, limited to July 6, 1936 without examination and with at least four years professional experience required, or work of a character satisfactory to the Board.
- 5. Registrants of other states with equal standards of requirements. (For full information on general requirements, see Sections 12, 17 and 21 of the Act.)

RULE 5—APPLICATION AND REGISTRATION FEES

Applications for registration should be addressed to Bryant L. Hopkins, Secretary, State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, Waterville, Maine.

The schedule of fees is as follows:

The registration fee for Professional Engineeers shall be \$15.00, \$7.50 of which shall accompany the application, the remaining \$7.50 to be paid upon issuance of certificate.

The Annual fee for renewal of certificates shall be fixed in conformity with the law at the regular meeting on the first Wednesday in July of each year.

A fee of \$15.00 is required for Professional Engineers registered in other states who desire to register in Maine and can meet all requirements of Section 21 of the Act.

Applications received by the Board shall be examined by the Secretary for conformity with the Rules and Regulations governing applications as established by the Board. Applications accompanied by proper fees and in the form prescribed shall be entered in the records of the Board. Applications not accompanied by proper fees or not conforming entirely to the Rules and Regulations shall be returned to the applicant, with instructions as to the correction thereof, or held in abeyance until gotten into proper form as prescribed by the Board.

When applications accompanied by proper fees are accepted by the Secretary and entered in the books of the Board, the Secretary shall proceed to

correspond with such references as deemed necessary and cited in the respective applications, in the manner prescribed by the Board. If replies from the references cited are not received within a reasonable time, the Secretary shall notify the applicant to that effect, requesting additional references. The Secretary shall correspond with such additional references. If an application be based on the reciprocity provisions of the Statute cited, the Secretary shall secure from the examining board by which the certificate of registration involved was issued, complete information as to the basis for the issuance of said certificate, provided, however, that if the certificate offered be a certificate of registration from the National Bureau of Engineering Registration operated by the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners and if said certificate bear as an endorsement thereon proper authentication by the authorized official of the State Board of Engineering Registration of that state in which the holder of the certificate is a resident citizen, such inquiry may be omitted. When all necessary information has been brought together with regard to a given application, the application with all incidental papers shall be brought to the attention of the Board at the first subsequent meeting".

RULE 6-EXAMINATIONS

Examinations shall be held at such times and at such places as the Board shall determine.

Additional examinations may be held at the discretion of the Board and within ninety days of the time any applicant may make such request for such examination.

Written, or written and oral examinations, are required of all applicants who are not graduates of a four (4) year course in engineering in a school or college approved by this Board, and who cannot qualify by reciprocity.

Examinations may be oral or written, or partly oral and partly written. In certain examinations designated by the Board, applicants may use books and reference materials which may be subject to the inspection of the examiner and a list of said references filed with the examination.

The Board will notify the applicant within thirty days after the date of taking such examination. A candidate failing on examination may apply for re-examination in any subject at the expiration of six months and will be re-examined without payment of additional fee. All subsequent examinations will be given upon payment of a fee to be determined by the Board.

A candidate applying for re-examination after the expiration of six months shall file a new application, accompanied by the required fee.

The Board may, at its discretion, notify any applicant in any classification to appear personally and give opportunity for discussion and consideration of his application.

RULE 7—REFERENCES

Each applicant shall list the names of at least five persons, three of whom shall be engineers, who can verify all or a part of the information submitted by the applicant.

RULE 8—REJECTION

Any person whose application has been rejected shall be so notified within thirty days of the time of his examination, or the consideration of his credentials.

The board shall, upon request of the applicant, advise him of the reasons for such rejection and applicant may then submit additional evidence for consideration by the Board. A rejected applicant will be given reasonable opportunity to secure re-consideration of his application.

RULE 9—CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION AND REGISTRATION CARD

The Board will issue to each successful applicant a Certificate of Registration and a card certifying that the applicant holds a Certificate of Registration. Each Certificate shall be numbered in the order in which applications are approved by the Board and shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board and the Secretary.

Any person registered under this Act and doing business with the public on his own account or as chief executive, or as consultant, should keep his Certificate of Registration posted conspicuously in his place of business where the public can readily examine said Certificate.

In the event a Certificate of Registration or card indicating registration is lost, destroyed or mutilated, a duplicate will be issued upon payment of a fee of three dollars (\$3.00) and submission of a statement explaining the loss or destruction of the original document.

RULE 10-REGISTRATION SEALS

Each registrant, upon notification of registration, is authorized to obtain an official seal of a size and design prescribed by the Board; and to affix the seal to any document he may prepare.

Said seal shall be impressed in the proper location in the following cases.

- A. On all plans or documents filed or offered for filing with any public body or agency.
- B. Registered Engineers engaged in private or consulting practice shall affix their seal to plans, specifications and reports.

- C. Seals need not be affixed on any engineering documents which are inter-company routine.
- D. Seals shall be affixed to all plans and documents formally submitted to contractors for bids or estimates.

Any registered engineer may impress his seal on any plans or documents, whether made by him or others, provided he takes full responsibility therefor, whether adequate compensation is received or not.

Where drawings or documents are bound together, the application of the seal on the first sheet or page shall be considered sufficient, but said first sheet must bear a statement of the number of sheets covered by the seal.

The seal shall be affixed oved the signature or title of the responsible professional engineer.

Each registrant will be held responsible for the proper use of his seal.

RULE 11—EXPIRATIONS AND RENEWALS

All certificates of registration expire on December thirty-first of each year following their issuance or renewal, and unless renewed, shall become invalid after that date, making practice illegal.

The Secretary of the Board shall notify each person registered under this Act of the date of expiration of his certificate and the amount of the fee required for its renewal, which notice shall be mailed not later than December thirtieth of each year. Renewal of a certificate may be affected at any time during the month of December upon payment of a fee of two dollars (\$2.00). Upon payment of said fee the Secretary of the Board shall issue a card indicating renewal of registration.

Failure to renew a certificate of registration shall not deprive any registrant of the right of renewal, but the fee to be paid after December thirty-first shall be increased ten percent for each month or fraction of a month such registration is delayed, but in no case greater than twice the annual renewal fee.

RULE 12-NATIONAL COUNCIL

The Board shall affiliate with the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners. The Secretary shall be, ex-officio, a Delegate of the Board to the Council. He shall attend each annual meeting of the Council at the expense of the Board.

NATIONAL BUREAU OF ENGINEERING REGISTRATION

PURPOSE AND ADMINISTRATION

Registered engineers who require registration or license in several states will find that their application for registration is greatly expedited and, in most cases, promptly approved when they have been certified by the National Bureau of Engineering Registration and endorsed by their State Board of Registration. The National Bureau of Engineering Registration is operated as a function of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners, under the direction of a standing committee of the Council, with an Advisory Board of representatives from national engineering societies. It was established primarily to minimize the effort and expense of registered engineers desiring to secure registration or license in more than one state.

The By-Laws of the National Council and the registration laws or regulations of most states provide for recognition and acceptance of the Certificates of Qualification issued by the National Bureau of Engineering Registration as competent, but not necessarily sole, evidence of qualification for registration as a professional engineer. When an engineer has been issued a Certificate of Qualification by the Registration Bureau his application for registration in any state should be accompanied by a photocopy of his Certificate of Qualification bearing the embossed seal of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners. All except a few Member Boards of the National Council have specifically stated that they will accept such certification.

An engineer may possess qualifications that meet the minimum requirements for registration in a particular state, especially under a former "grandfather clause" of the state law, and is given state registration; whereas, national certification requires an independent verification by the Registration Bureau of the engineers entire record, evaluation of his record and certification as to meeting the Bureau requirements for a Certificate of Qualification, a review by his own State Board and endorsement or certification by it for registration in other states.

The Registration Bureau is a fact finding and certifying agency, acting as a clearing house for state registration authorities and as a reliable source of verified information regarding the professional records of engineers. It does not legally register anyone and does not grant any authority or issue any license or registration, this being the proper function of State Boards only. All State Boards of Engineering Registration reserve the right to take whatever action they deem necessary to conform with the requirements of their laws and regulations in connection with any application for registration in their state.

Under the Constitution of the United States there can be no national or Federal registration of any profession, the authority to legally register or license citizens to practice a given profession being vested in the several states. Certification by the Registration Bureau, therefore, is not a prerequisite for registration in any state nor is it binding upon the State Boards of Registration, nor does the Bureau assume any responsibility to the applicant in securing his legal registration authorizing the practice of engineering in any state.

PROCEDURE AND REQUIREMENTS

Certificate of Qualification

Any registered engineer desiring a Certificate of Qualification must submit to the Bureau on its prescribed form his complete record, including education, engineering experience, legal registration, membership in professional or scientific societies, and references as to character and experience.

Before proceeding with the verification and certification of the professional record of an applicant, his application will be submitted by the Bureau to the Registration Board in the state of which he is a resident, or in some cases, in the state in which he is practicing; and that Board at its discretion may require the applicant to furnish additional information or to pass such written or oral examination as may be deemed necessary. When in the opinion of the Board the applicant is so entitled his Certificate of Qualification will be endorsed by the Board. The Bureau will then make an independent investigation of every item in this record and will either verify each one or indicate on the record the items which have not been verified, with reasons.

After verification, the Bureau will evaluate the professional record or the applicant and will issue a Certificate of Qualification if he meets the requirements of one of the following provisions:

2b. Engineers Qualified Through Written Examination—The Applicant shall be not less than twenty-seven years of age, have a specific record, verified by the Registration Bureau, of ten years or more in the practice of engineering, as defined in the Model Law and of a character satisfactory to the Registration Bureau; and shall have successfully passed a written examination, approved by the Registration Bureau, given by a Member Board of NCSBEE. The applicant's experience record shall show responsible charge of engineering work for at least two years and progressive advancement in the character of work performed. Experience gained prior to his reaching the age of seventeen years shall not be credited as a part of the required engineering experience. Graduation in an engineering curriculum accredited by ECPD shall be considered equivalent to four years of engineering experience. Credit may also be given for other educational work, but in general such credit shall not be on an equivalent year for year basis. Credit shall not be given for more than

a total of four years experience because of undergraduate educational qualifications; or

2c. Engineers Qualified Through Practice—The Applicant shall be not less than thirty-five years of age and have a specific record, verified by the Registration Bureau, of fifteen years or more in the practice of engineering, as defined in the Model Law and of a character satisfactory to the Registration Bureau. The applicant's experience record shall show responsible charge of engineering work or at least five years and progressive advancement in the Experience gained prior to his reaching the character of work performed. age of seventeen years shall not be credited as a part of the required engineering experience. Graduation in an engineering curriculum accredited by ECPD shall be considered equivalent to four years of engineering experience. may also be given for other educational work, but in general such credit shall not be on an equivalent year for year basis. Credit shall not be given for more than a total of four years of experience because of undergraduate educational qualifications.

Qualifying Experience—Determination of applicants' competency will be based less on length of experience (provided the minimum is met in each case) than on the breadth, quality, and importance of pertinent experience, degree of progression, evidence shown of ability to accept increasing responsibilities, and of the possession of personal qualifications required for successful engineering work. Engineering teaching may be construed as engineering experience.

The term practice of engineering shall mean any professional service or creative work requiring engineering education, training, and experience and the application of special knowledge of the mathematical, physical and enengineering sciences to such professional services or creative work as consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, design, and supervision of construction for the purpose of assuring compliance with specifications and design, in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works, or projects.

It is interpreted that the practice of engineering does not include the work ordinarily performed by persons who operate or maintain machinery or equipment, or whose only experience has been in the execution, as a contractor, of work designed by a professional engineer or the supervision of the construction of such work as a foreman or superintendent.

Experience Records Must Be Up-to-Date — State Boards of Registration require that experience records submitted to them with applications for registration be up-to-date. Photocopies will not be furnished of Certificates or Qualification that have been issued more than five years, or if the holder of the certificate has made a major change in employment or business, until the experience record is amended. (See item 3 on page 29).

FEES AND APPLICATIONS

The Bureau is a non-profit agency and the fees charged represent only the actual cost of clerical work, printing and postage. All payments of fees and for additional copies must accompany applications and orders. If application is not approved fee will not be refunded.

The charges for the services of the Registration Bureau are as follows:

- 1. Certificate of Qualification—Fee for verification and certification, including one photostatic copy of completed Verified Professional Record, Certificate of Qualification and State Board Endorsement (One document)—\$35.00.
- 2. Additional copies of Certificate of Qualification, with embossed seal, the document referred to in No. 1—\$2.00 each.
- (NOTE: It should be noted that each photocopy of an original Certificate of Qualification must have the seal of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners embossed on copy after it is made, in order to be officially acceptable to State Boards of Registration).
- 3. The original professional record in a Certificate of Qualification will be brought up to date any time upon request and a photocopy of the revised Certificate of Qualification will be furnished—\$5.00 to \$15.00.
- 4. One set of one photocopy of Certificate of Qualification and one each of the answered questionnaires from the five references given in Section 1 of the Bureau application, to be mailed direct to a State Board. (Required by few State Boards.)—\$5.00.

The Bureau does not issue a certificate suitable for framing but only the document referred to in No. 1 and 2.

An investigation such as that conducted by the Bureau often requires considerable time. It is suggested, therefore, that an engineer should not wait until he actually needs a Certificate of Qualification or Verified Professional Record. He should, in fact, file his application with the Bureau as early as practicable so that certification by the Bureau may be available for presentation to State Boards of Engineering Examiners or Registration with which he desires registration or for other appropriate purposes.

Applications must be submitted on forms prescribed by the Bureau and must be filed with the National Bureau of Engineering Registration, P. O. Drawer 1404, Columbia, South Carolina.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The office of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners will furnish upon request any specific information available regarding the legal registration or licensing of professional engineers that may be required in addition to the following.

Engineers who wish to secure legal registration or professional license in any particular state must communicate directly with the state board or department in that state and request its application form and regulations. All the states, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and the Provinces of Canada have registration laws regulating the practice of engineering.

The state engineering registration laws are not uniform due to local conditions, date of enactment, etc. Most state laws, however, require either graduation in an accredited engineering curriculum, a written engineering examination, adequate engineering experience, or a combination of these.

INTERSTATE REGISTRATION

Registered engineers who require registration or license in several states will find that their application for registration is greatly expedited and, in some cases, promptly approved when they have been certified by the National Bureau of Engineering Registration and endorsed by their State Board of Registration. The National Bureau of Engineering Registration is a function of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners, under the direction of a standing committee of the Council, with an Advisory Board of representatives from national engineering societies. It was established primarly to minimize the effort and expense of registered engineers desiring to secure registration or license in more than one state. The "Information Pamphlet" of the Registration Bureau containing the Purpose, Procedure, Requirements and Fees can be secured from the Executive Secretary at the address given on Page 31.

ROSTER OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS

REGISTERED UNDER CHAPTER 189, PUBLIC LAWS OF 1935, OR CHAPTER 74, REVISED STATUTES 1944, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS of 1945. THIS ROSTER IS REVISED TO FEBRUARY 1, 1952, AS PROVIDED FOR IN SECTION 11 OF THE ACT

This roster lists the names of all professional engineers in Maine whose certificates were renewed on or before February 1, 1952. There is also here printed a list of professional engineers whose certificates expired for non-renewal.

The registered engineers whose certificates have been renewed for the current fiscal year have been provided with a 1952 renewal card. Reinstatement affected in accordance with the act since this publication was prepared, is evidenced by a renewal card and can be verified by the Secretary. Section 16 of the Act deals with expirations and renewals and specifies the penalties for delay in renewing registration. Engineers who wish to renew registration for the year will avoid the penalties by doing so promptly. The Board appreciates the very fine cooperation which has been shown by registrants in renewing their certificates in accordance with the provisions of the law. If your name or title does not appear as you wish, please advise the Secretary immediately. It is mutually advantageous that he be notified of any change in position or address of the registrants.

The Board wishes to extend a cordial invitation to members of the engineering profession to call at the office of the Secretary or write direct to the Chairman, supplying any information which may affect the operation of the law or its administration. Section 22 of the Act deals with violations and penalties and specifies the duties of the elected officers of the law in prosecuting persons violating it. The Board invites the cooperation of engineers and others in supplying information relative to violations.

NOTE: The Maine act is of the so-called broad classification type. The registrants under the act are not restricted to any particular branch of engineering. All registrants are obliged to qualify in one or more of the designated branches of the profession. Many of the registrants have qualified in several different branches of the profession. In this roster, no registrant is listed under more than two branches of the profession.
