REPORT OF THE DIVISION OF VITAL STATISTICS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR, 1951

GENERAL STATISTICS FOR MAINE, 1951

Births to mothers residents of Maine numbered 21,142 (97 fewer than for 1950, but exceeded only by the numbers for the previous four years). In this number were 224 plural births in which at least one child was live born. These include three sets of triplets. There were 356 Stillbirths. The 8,027 Marriages were fewer by 590 than the number in 1950. There were 10,139 Deaths of Maine residents (177 more than in 1950). Of these deaths 652 were of children under one year of age, giving an Infant Death Rate of 30.8 per 1,000 Live Births, a low rate for Maine. Divorces and Annulments numbering 2,040, were the least in the last eight year period.

POPULATION

The Seventeenth Decennial Census, reckoned as of April 1st, 1950, gave Maine a population of 913,774. Assuming the gain or loss of population in the several counties has continued as from 1940 to 1950, the July 1st, 1951 population for the State is reckoned as 922,092. This number is used to compute rates for this report.

ALLOCATIONS, INTERPRETATION AND RATES

Beginning with 1935, births and deaths have been assigned to the place of residence rather than to the place of the event. In 1939 upon adoption of the Standard Certificates of Birth, Death, and Stillbirth, the arbitrary rule of one year of residence is replaced by the entry by the physician or funeral director of the "usual place of residence." (In the case of a birth or infant death, the residence is that of the mother). The numbers quoted in the following tables accordingly, regardless of the place of the event, deal only with residents of towns and cities of the state. It should be understood that among the states of the Union and with the several provinces of Canada there is interchange of the records of birth and death, and in the case of marriages of non-

residents there is an exchange among the states of New England. The general or "crude" rates of birth, death, and marriage are reckoned as so many to each 1,000 population. Infant death-rates and puerperal or maternal death-rates are the number of such rated to each 1,000 live births. Specific death-rates, those for separate death causes, are reckoned as so many to each 100,000 population. A reference to the U. S. Census of 1950 shows that Maine's population has reached an age where 10.2% of the whole are 65 years old or older. Within the State this percent varies widely from place to place and from county to county. In Aroostook only 6.4% have reached 65 while Lincoln County has 14.5%. From this it is plain that "crude" death rates are by no means good guides to the state of general health.

NEW CONCEPT OF ASSIGNMENT OF CAUSES OF DEATH

With 1950 began the use of the Sixth Revision of the International Lists of Diseases and Causes of Death, fashioned by the World Health Organization at the Geneva Assembly in 1948. The Manual of its classification has been so broadened into detail that the costs of printing have forced a condensing into the "Intermediate List of 150 Causes for Tabulation of Morbidity and Mortality." This scheme, adequate for most purposes, obliges researchers in special fields to obtain their information by letter to this office. Now after five cause-of-death classifications but all using the same manner of determination, the Sixth Revision alters radically both the classification and determination of the cause-of-death assignment. As a consequence, certain death causes (notably diabetes mellitus, nephritic diseases and deaths by accident) from 1950 will not be comparable with assignments of years before 1950.
