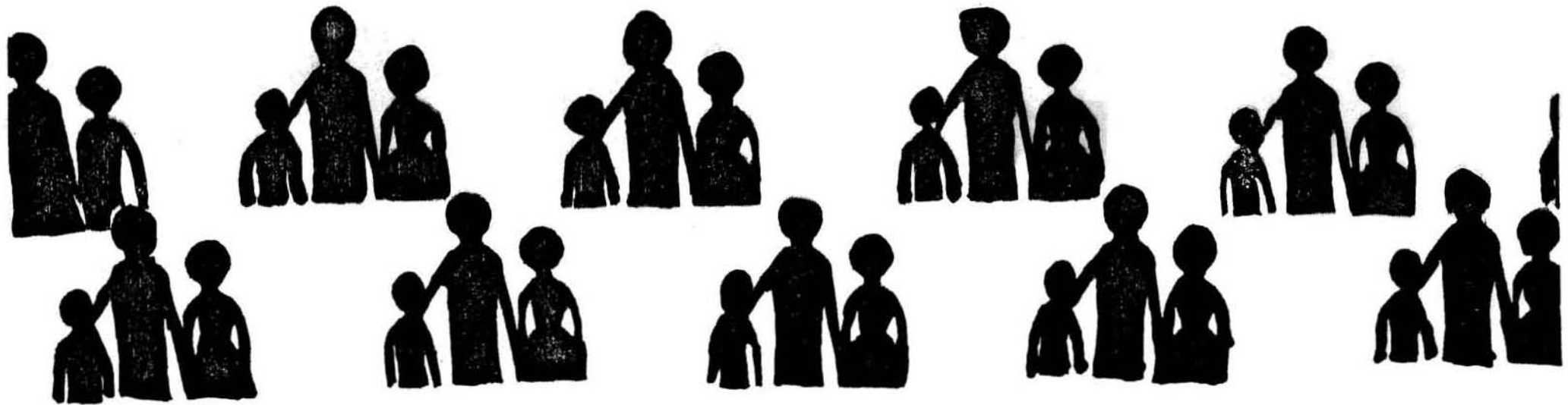

This document continues the series of annual estimates of Maine's population, prepared and published by the Division of Data and Research. Estimates of the population in five age groups are given for each minor civil division (MCD) in the State of Maine. Organized MCD's are arranged in alphabetical sequence within each county, and summaries of each county are displayed as well. Some of the unorganized MCD's are clustered as a single unit of population. The clustered MCD's follow the organized minor civil divisions.

Special acknowledgement is due to the agencies which supplied some of the input data used in the preparation of these population estimates. Religious school enrollment data were supplied by each religious school. Non-religious school enrollment data were supplied by the Department of Education and Cultural Services. Housing Unit data were supplied by the Bureau of Taxation. County controls used in these estimates were prepared by the United States Census Bureau.

HIGHLIGHTS

Total Population:

The estimated population of the State of Maine on July 1, 1985, was 1,163,849. This is an increase of 38,806 or 3.4 percent since April 1, 1980. The number of births exceeded the number of deaths by 31,239 between April 1, 1980, and July 1, 1985. The number of in-migrants exceeded the number of out-migrants by 7,567. During the 12 month period between July 1, 1984, and July 1, 1985, the natural increase was 5,666 and the net migration was 1,698 inward.

County Populations:

All counties except Aroostook and Washington increased in population between April 1, 1980, and July 1, 1985. The largest increase in county population was 13,361 in York County. The largest decrease was a reduction of 2,853 people in Aroostook County.

Ten of the 16 counties had a net migration inward. The largest net migration outward was 6,102 in Aroostook County. The largest net migration inward was 9,141 in York County.

Minor Civil Division Populations (MCDs):

The State of Maine contains 913 Minor Civil Divisions. In this report, certain unorganized MCDs have been clustered, reducing the number of sub-divisions to 536. Both clustered and unique sub-divisions are referred to as MCDs.

Sixty-seven percent of the 536 MCDs had an increase in population between April 1, 1980, and July 1, 1985. The largest increases in population were in the minor civil divisions of Windham (1,485), Brunswick (1,260), and Limestone (1,141). The largest decreases in population were in Orono (-1,560), Waterville (-1,029), and Lewiston (-695).

The largest amount of net migration was 980, in the town of Windham. The largest amount of net migration outward was 1,698, in the town of Orono.

The largest amount of natural increase was 1,302 in the town of Limestone. The smallest amount of natural increase was -74 in the town of Camden.

Age Group Populations:

The amount and direction of change in population from April 1, 1980, to July 1, 1985, varied among the different age groups. The preschool group, age 0-4, increased by 5,194. The school age group, age 5-17, decreased by 19,358. The young adult group, age 18-44, increased by 35,326. The older adult group, age 45-64, increased by 808, while the elderly, age 65+, increased by 16,836.

The age cohort who were 0-4 on July 1, 1985 had a net inward migration of 1,483. The age cohort who were 5-17 on July 1, 1985 had a net inward migration of 5,993. The age cohort who were 18-44 on July 1, 1985 had a net outward migration of -11,016. The age cohort who were 45-64 on July 1, 1985 had a net inward migration of 3,789. The age cohort who were 65 and over on July 1, 1985 had a net inward migration of 7,318.

TECHNICAL NOTES

Methodology:

The method used to produce these estimates is a component method in which the population estimate of each age cohort of each minor civil division (MCD) is equal to the 1980 census count of the cohort, plus the natural increase of that cohort, plus the estimated net migration between April 1, 1980 and July 1, 1985.

The first two components of these estimates are known data. The third component, net migration, is estimated by regression lines based on the previous decade (1970-1980). The dependent variables in this regression analysis are the migration rates of each age group in each area. The independent variables are the ratios of the difference between the actual and expected values of given symptomatic indicators of migration to the expected values. The expected values of these indicators of migration are based on United States trends. After the estimated migration rate of a given cohort of a given MCD is calculated, it is multiplied by the population base of the cohort to obtain the estimated net migration.

Ten variables were tested for use as symptomatic indicators of migration in this methodology. They were births, deaths, AFDC children, housing units, school enrollment, newlyweds, covered employment, old age assistance recipients, military enlistments and voter registration. The best three variables for each age group were selected for use as estimators of migration. Housing units, births and newlyweds were selected for the age cohort 0-4. School enrollment, births, and housing units were used for the age cohort 5-17. School enrollment, housing units, and newlyweds were the best for the age cohort 18-44.

School enrollment, newlyweds, and deaths were used for the age cohort 45-64. School enrollment, deaths and births were selected for the age cohort 65+.

A more detailed description of the methodology is presented in the resource series report titled, "Methodology for Age Group Regression Population Estimates for Minor Civil Divisions",* published by the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics.

Accuracy of Estimates:

Even if one had the perfect methodology for estimating population, the quality of the estimates is limited by the quality of the data used to prepare them. The most important symptomatic indicator of migration is the school enrollment data. In previous years, there have been a number of towns in which certain private schools did not report school enrollment data to the Department of Education and Cultural Services. We used estimates of this missing school data based on the last known enrollment of a missing school. Beginning with these 1985 estimates, we are surveying religious schools to obtain their school enrollment by residence of the student. Overall, the use of this survey data has improved the quality of these estimates. Two exceptions to this overall improvement may be the town of Orono and the city of Waterville. We suspect that we are underestimating the population of Orono and Waterville, possibly because old private school data (1980) erroneously reported non resident students as residents of the location of the school.
