

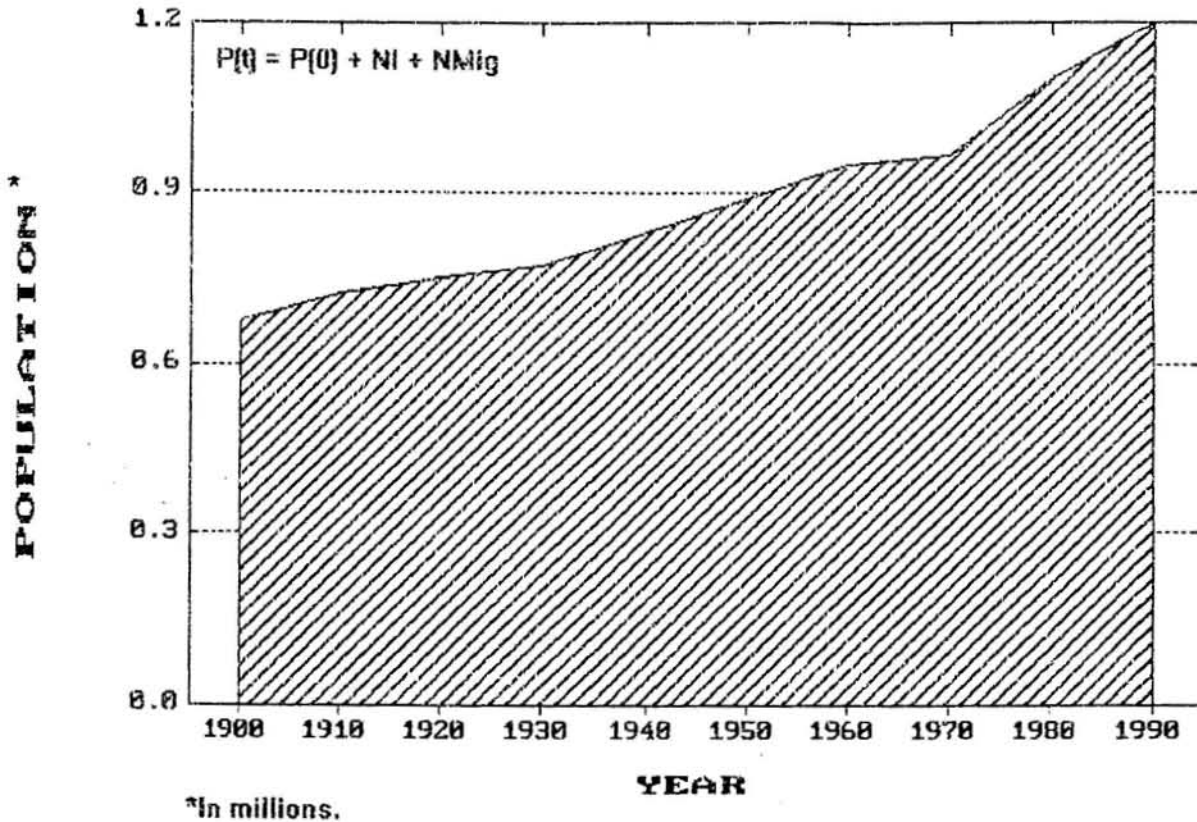

INTRODUCTION

This report contains postcensal estimates of Maine's population on July 1, 1992, for the State, counties and minor civil divisions (MCDs). Organized MCDs are arranged in alphabetical order within each county, and summaries of each county are displayed as well. Contiguous unorganized MCDs within the same county are clustered as a single unit of population. Within each table, the unorganized MCDs follow the organized minor civil divisions.

A component method was used to produce these estimates. The estimated population of each minor civil division is equal to the sum of the 1990 census count, the natural increase and the estimated net migration from April 1, 1990 through June 30, 1992.

The first two components of these estimates were known data. The third component, net migration, was estimated using a regression line based on the experience of the previous census decade (1980-1990). For each area, the dependent variable in the equation was the net migration rate. The independent variables were the ratios of the difference between the actual and expected values of given symptomatic indicators of net migration (births, school enrollment and housing units) to the expected values. The expected values of these indicators were based on United States trends. After the estimated net migration rate of a given MCD was calculated, it was multiplied by the population base to obtain the estimated net migration. The estimated net migration was added to the sum of the 1990 census count and the natural increase to obtain an unadjusted estimate. The unadjusted estimates were then adjusted to sum to independently generated county-level estimates. For this report, county-level estimates prepared by the United States Census Bureau were used as controls.

Prior to publication, the estimates were reviewed by a panel of technical advisors. Adjustments were then made, as needed.

The ten-year prediction equation used to estimate net migration rates was:

$$Y = 0.08552X_1 + 0.46512X_2 + 0.31857X_3 + 0.06219, \text{ where}$$

Y = the net migration rate, X_1 = the independent variable for births, X_2 = the independent variable for K-12 school enrollment, and X_3 = the independent variable for total housing units.

Using the new regression line to estimate net migration rates, two sets of test population estimates for April 1, 1990 were prepared. One set was adjusted to sum to the enumerated county totals from the 1990 census; while the other set was not. These data provide a measure of the expected accuracy of ODRVS postcensal estimates for the decade of the 1990s (Text Table I).
