

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## INTRODUCTION

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This report contains a summary of the Vital Statistics of the State of Maine for the calendar year of 1971. Births are tabulated for each county and all minor civil divisions and deaths are tabulated for each county and 45 selected minor civil divisions.

### ALLOCATION OF VITAL EVENTS

The statistics on births in this report refer to residents of Maine only, regardless of whether or not the birth actually occurred in Maine. With the exceptions of Tables 3 and 9, death statistics also refer to residents of Maine only. Statistics on marriages and divorces in this report include nonresidents as well as residents of Maine, who marry or are divorced in the state.

Births are allocated to the usual residence of the mother and deaths to the usual residence of the deceased. This information is obtained for the certificate by the physician, hospital record librarian, funeral director, or other person responsible for completing the certificate of birth or death. The practice of allocating births and deaths to usual place of residence was initiated in 1935. This method of allocation is made possible by the exchange of transcripts of nonresident births and deaths with other states and Canada.

Marriages and divorces are allocated to the place in Maine where the marriage ceremony was performed or where the divorce decree was granted, rather than the place of residence.

### FACTORS AFFECTING ACCURACY

Several factors may produce certain slight inaccuracies in this report.

Some of the more important of these factors are outlined below;

(1) Completeness of Registration: A birth certificate test conducted in 1950 indicated that about one percent of births in Maine are not recorded. In addition to unrecorded vital events, others may not be included in this report by reason of failure of the person required to report the event to make a timely report, or failure of a municipal clerk to make a timely report to the State Registrar, or failure of other states to make timely exchanges of nonresident transcripts of births and deaths.

(2) Errors in Data: Data in this report are based upon original certificates of births and deaths, copies of original certificates of marriages prepared by city and town clerks, and abstracts of decrees of divorces prepared by the clerks of courts. Errors in data may be introduced by persons giving information for the original certificate, persons involved in the actual preparation of the original certificate, or persons involved in the preparation of the copies or abstracts of the original certificates which are submitted to the State Registrar.

#### POPULATION ESTIMATES

The estimates of county populations on July 1, 1971, which appear in this report, were prepared jointly by the U. S. Bureau of the Census and by the State of Maine, Division of Research and Vital Records of the Department of Health and Welfare. These county estimates are averages of the U. S. Bureau of the Census's Ratio Correlation Method and the Component II Method.

## MORTALITY CLASSIFICATION

The mortality classification used in this report is the 8th Revision of the International Statistical Classification, consisting of a list of 671 categories of diseases and morbid conditions, plus 182 categories for classification of the external cause of injury, and 187 categories for the characterization of injuries according to the nature of lesion.

Under the 8th Revision, the method for selecting the cause of death for statistical purposes remained the same as the method under the 6th Revision. The 6th Revision, introduced in 1949, instituted a method whereby the physician in attendance at death indicates the disease or morbid condition which he considers to be the underlying cause of death. The underlying cause is defined as "(a) the disease or injury which initiated the train of events leading directly to death, or (b) the circumstances of the accident which produced fatal injury."

Two abridged lists of causes of death are presented in this report. Deaths by selected age groups are tabulated in an abridged list of 282 causes and deaths by residence are tabulated in an abridged list of 69 causes.

## RATES

Birth rates and crude mortality rates, unless otherwise specified, are expressed as the number of births or deaths per 1,000 population. Mortality rates attributed to specific diseases are expressed as the number of deaths per 100,000 population. Infant mortality rates are expressed as the number of deaths per 1,000 live births. Maternal mortality rates are expressed as the number of deaths per 10,000 live births.

POPULATION

The population of Maine was estimated to be 1,012,213 on July 1, 1971. This represents a net gain in population of 18,550 or 1.9 percent more than the number of inhabitants enumerated in the 1970 U. S. Census Report. Total civilian population was estimated to be 1,001, 260 on July 1, 1971. This represents a net gain of 19,700 or 2.0 percent in civilian population since April 1, 1970. The natural increase in total population between April 1, 1970 and July 1, 1971 was 9,129 and the estimated net inward migration was 9,421.

## LIVE BIRTHS

There were 17,850 resident live births registered in Maine in 1971. This is 0.1 percent more births than were registered in 1970, but the birth rate decreased from 18.0 to 17.6 per 1000 population. This rate is lower than in any year in the history of the state, except 1968 and 1969.

### SEX

The number of male live births was 9,171 and the number of female live births was 8,679. The sex ratio of live births was 105.7 male live births for every 100.0 female live births.

### PLURAL BIRTHS

In 1971, there were 368 children born alive in plural births.

### RACE

Only 1.4 percent of all resident live births in 1971 were nonwhite. The total number of nonwhite births in 1971 was 257. This is an increase of 12.2 percent of the number of resident nonwhite live births in 1970.

The largest nonwhite group was Negroes, who gave birth to 65 live born children. American Indians gave birth to 61, and persons of other nonwhite races gave birth to 131 live born children. The number of births in 1971 to persons of other nonwhite races increased 84.5 percent, probably due to interracial marriages of Vietnam War Veterans.

### LEGITIMACY

There were 1,383 illegitimate births to mothers who were Maine residents in 1971. Illegitimate live births represented 7.7 percent of all resident live births. This marks the first year since 1959 that the percentage of illegitimate live births has not increased.

## HOSPITAL BIRTHS

The number of resident live births in hospitals and licensed maternity homes in 1971 was 17,772 or 99.6 percent of all resident live births.

## FETAL DEATHS

The number of resident fetal deaths in 1971 was 235, which was 4.5 percent less than the number in 1970. The fetal death rate was 13.2 per 1,000 live births. This is the second lowest fetal death rate in the history of the state.

## GESTATION

The following table shows resident fetal deaths in 1971 by length of gestation and percent of total in each group. Unreported gestation periods have been allocated for this table.

## GENERAL MORTALITY

There were 10,830 deaths of Maine residents in 1971 and the crude mortality rate was 10.7. This is a 2.1 percent decrease in number and a 3.6 percent decrease in rate from 1970.

SEX

In 1971 the number of resident male deaths was 5,858 and the number of resident female deaths was 4,972. The estimated death rate among males was 11.9 per 1,000 male population and among females was 9.6 per 1,000 female population.

INFANT DEATHS

There were 323 infant deaths in Maine during 1971 and the infant death mortality rate was 18.1 per 1,000 live births. This was a 13.4 percent decrease in number and a 13.4 percent decrease in rate from 1970. The infant mortality rate has decreased 28.2 percent since 1960, 42.0 percent since 1950, 65.8 percent since 1940, and 76.0 percent since 1930.

There were 237 neonatal deaths (infant deaths during the first four weeks of life) in 1971 and the neonatal mortality rate was 13.3 per 1,000 live births. This was a decrease in number of 17.4 percent since 1970.

PERINATAL MORTALITY

The estimated perinatal mortality rate in 1971 was 24.9 perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births and fetal deaths of twenty weeks or more gestation.

The perinatal mortality rate is based on the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{Fetal deaths 20 weeks or more} + \text{neonatal deaths}}{\text{Total live births} + \text{fetal deaths 20 weeks or more}} \times 1000$$

The 1971 perinatal mortality rate is based on 213 fetal deaths of 20 or more weeks gestation and 237 neonatal deaths.

MATERNAL MORTALITY

There were 3 maternal deaths in Maine in 1971 and the maternal mortality rate was 1.7 per 10,000 live births, same as 1970.

## MARRIAGES

There were 11,193 marriages in Maine in 1971. This was 218 more than in 1970, and marks the twelfth successive year that the number of marriages has increased. The marriage rate was 11.1 per 1,000 population. 1971 marks the tenth successive year that the marriage rate has increased, and the total number of marriages is the highest since 1946.

## PREVIOUS MARITAL STATUS

There were 7,651 marriages in Maine in 1971 in which both the bride and groom were marrying for the first time. This was 220 more than the number of first marriages in 1970. 75.7 percent of the grooms and 76.4 percent of the brides were married for the first time.

## DIVORCES AND ANNULMENTS

There were 3,905 divorces granted in Maine during the calendar year 1971. This was 1.7 percent more than the number of divorces granted in 1970. The crude divorce rate was 3.9 per 1,000 population. 1971 marks the first year since 1961 that the divorce rate has not increased. There were 20 marriages annulled in 1971.

## SEX OF LIBELANT

The wife was granted the divorce in 3,190 or 81.7 percent of all the divorces granted.

## LEGAL GROUNDS FOR DECREE

Cruelty was the legal grounds for decree in 98.0 percent of all divorces granted in Maine in 1971. Cruelty includes "cruel and abusive treatment" and "extreme cruelty".

## DURATION OF MARRIAGE

The median duration of marriage before 1971 divorces was 6.2 years. The second year of marriage was the peak year during which marriages were ended by divorce.

## MINOR CHILDREN

The divorced couple had one or more minor children in 2,617 or 67.0 percent of 1971 divorces. Eleven divorced couples had 8 or more children.

## LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH

In the following table, "Life Lost" is based on expectation of life from the 1969 United States Life tables for white population. The death of an infant represents a total of 71.3 years "life lost" and the death of a person 85 years of age represents 4.7 years of "life lost".

When one examines the leading causes of death in terms of "life lost" rather than total deaths, an entirely different picture is presented. "Certain diseases of early infancy" which caused only 1.6 percent of total deaths, caused 6.8 percent of the total "life lost" in 1971 and jumped from ninth place in total deaths to fourth place in total "life lost". Congenital Anomalies jumped from twelfth place in total deaths to sixth place in "life lost". Accidents caused only 5.3 percent of total deaths but 11.7 percent of total "life lost". Diseases of the heart caused 40.8 percent of total deaths but only 29.4 percent of total "life lost".

The largest increases in the "life lost" rate over 1970 were cerebrovascular disease which increased 10.4 percent and cirrhosis of the liver which increased 10.3 percent. Accidents increased 7.3 percent. The largest decrease in "life lost" rate was certain diseases of early infancy which decreased 22.6 percent. Bronchitis, emphysema and asthma decreased by 6.5 percent.

ACCIDENTS

Accidents, occurring in Maine in 1971, accounted for 580 deaths. Of these accidents, 48.3 percent happened on Maine's streets and highways and 20.5 percent happened at home. In 9.7 percent of the accidents, the victim was considered to be working, when the accident happened.

The state death rate for accidents occurring in Maine was 57.3 deaths per 100,000 population. Only, Cumberland county had a significantly lower rate. Four counties, Franklin, Hancock, Piscataquis and Washington had significantly higher rates.
