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## INTRODUCTION

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This report contains a summary of the Vital Statistics of the State of Maine for the calendar year of 1975. Births are tabulated for each county and all minor civil divisions and deaths are tabulated for each county and 45 selected minor civil divisions.

### ALLOCATION OF VITAL EVENTS

The statistics on births in this report refer to residents of Maine only, regardless of whether or not the birth actually occurred in Maine. With the exceptions of Tables 3 and 9, death statistics also refer to residents of Maine only. Statistics on marriages and divorces in this report include nonresidents as well as residents of Maine, who marry or are divorced in the state.

Births are allocated to the usual residence of the mother and deaths to the usual residence of the deceased. This information is obtained for the certificate by the physician, hospital record librarian, funeral director, or other person responsible for completing the certificate of birth or death. The practice of allocating births and deaths to usual place of residence was initiated in 1935. This method of allocation is made possible by the exchange of transcripts of nonresident births and deaths with other states and Canada.

Marriages and divorces are allocated to the place in Maine where the marriage ceremony was performed or where the divorce decree was granted, rather than the place of residence.

### FACTORS AFFECTING ACCURACY

Several factors may produce certain slight inaccuracies in this report. Some of the more important of these factors are outlined below:

(1) Completeness of Registration: A birth certificate test conducted in 1950 indicated that about one percent of births in Maine are not recorded. In addition to unrecorded vital events, others may not be included in this report by reason of failure of the person required to report the event to make a timely report, or failure of a municipal clerk to make a timely report to the State Registrar, or failure of other states to make timely exchanges of nonresident transcripts of births and deaths.

(2) Errors in Data: Data in this report are based upon original certificates of births and deaths, copies of original certificates of marriages prepared by city and town clerks, and abstracts of decrees of divorces prepared by the clerks of courts. Errors in data may be introduced by persons giving information for the original certificate, persons involved in the actual preparation of the original certificate, or persons involved in the preparation of the copies or abstracts of the original certificates which are submitted to the State Registrar.

#### POPULATION ESTIMATES

The estimates of county populations on July 1, 1975 which appear in this report, were prepared jointly by the U. S. Bureau of the Census and by the State of Maine, Division of Research and Vital Records of the Department of Human Services. These county estimates are averages of the U. S. Bureau of the Census's Ratio Correlation Method, the Component II Method and the Administrative Records Method.

## MORTALITY CLASSIFICATION

The mortality classification, used in this report, is the 8th Revision of the International Statistical Classification, consisting of a list of 671 categories of diseases and morbid conditions, plus 182 categories for classification of the external cause of injury, and 187 categories for the characterization of injuries according to the nature of lesion.

Under the 8th Revision, the method for selecting the cause of death for statistical purposes remained the same as the method under the 6th Revision. The 6th Revision, introduced in 1949, instituted a method whereby the physician in attendance at death indicates the disease or morbid condition which he considers to be the underlying cause of death. The underlying cause is defined as "(a) the disease or injury which initiated the train of events leading directly to death, or (b) the circumstances of the accident which produced fatal injury."

Two abridged lists of causes of death are presented in this report. Deaths by selected age groups are tabulated in an abridged list of 282 causes and deaths by residence are tabulated in an abridged list of 69 causes.

## RATES

Birth rates and crude mortality rates, unless otherwise specified, are expressed as the number of births or deaths per 1,000 population. Mortality rates attributed to specific diseases are expressed as the number of deaths per 100,000 population. Infant mortality rates are expressed as the number of deaths per 1,000 live births. Maternal mortality rates are expressed as the number of deaths per 10,000 live births.

POPULATION

The population of Maine was estimated to be 1,057,955 on July 1, 1975. This represents a net gain in population of 64,292 or 6.5 percent more than the number of inhabitants enumerated in the 1970 U. S. Census Report. Total civilian population was estimated to be 1,047,825 on July 1, 1975. This represents a net gain of 66,265 or 6.8 percent in civilian population since April 1, 1970. The natural increase in total population between April 1, 1970 and July 1, 1975 was 29,414 and the estimated net inward migration was 34,878.

## LIVE BIRTHS

There were 15,232 resident live births registered in Maine in 1975. The number of live births increased 0.8 percent from 1974, but the birth rate remained the same, at 14.4 per 1,000 population. This is the lowest birth rate in the history of the State of Maine.

### SEX

The number of male live births was 7,760 and the number of female live births was 7,470. There were 2 live births of unknown sex. The sex ratio of live births was 103.9 male live births for every 100.0 female live births.

### PLURAL BIRTHS

In 1975, there were 234 children born alive in plural births.

### RACE

Only 1.2 percent of all resident live births in 1975 were nonwhite. The total number of nonwhite births in 1975 was 190. This is an increase of 26.7 percent from the number of resident nonwhite live births in 1974.

The largest nonwhite group was Negroes, who gave birth to 56 live born children. American Indians gave birth to 53, and persons of other nonwhite races gave birth to 81 live born children.

### LEGITIMACY

There were 1,496 illegitimate births to mothers who were Maine residents in 1975. Illegitimate live births represented 9.8 percent of all resident live births. With the exception of 1971, the percent of illegitimate births has increased in every year since 1959.

## HOSPITAL BIRTHS

The number of resident live births in hospitals and licensed maternity homes in 1975 was 15,167 or 99.6 percent of all resident live births.

## TERMINATIONS OF PREGNANCY

The number of resident terminations of pregnancy in 1975 was 611, which was 40.8 percent more than the number in 1974. The termination of pregnancy rate was 40.1 per 1,000 live births, which is an increase of 39.7 percent over 1974. Abortions accounted for 67.9 percent of the terminations of pregnancy. More hospitals are reporting abortions, which is reflected in the substantial increase in terminations under 13 weeks of gestation. However, the reporting of abortions is still very deficient in most areas of the state.

The following table shows resident terminations of pregnancy in 1975 by length of gestation and percent of total in each group. Unreported gestation periods have been allocated for this table.

## GENERAL MORTALITY

There were 10,253 deaths of Maine residents in 1975 and the crude mortality rate was 9.7. This is a 4.2 percent decrease in number and a 4.9 percent decrease in rate from 1974.

## SEX

In 1975 the number of resident male deaths was 5,607 and the number of resident female deaths was 4,646. The estimated death rate among males was 10.9 per 1,000 male population and among females was 8.6 per 1,000 female population.

## INFANT DEATHS

There were 201 infant deaths in Maine during 1975 and the infant death mortality rate was 13.2 per 1,000 live births. This was a 17.6 percent decrease in number from 1974 and a 18.0 percent decrease in rate. The infant mortality rate has decreased 47.6 percent since 1960, 57.7 percent since 1950, 75.0 percent since 1940, and 82.5 percent since 1930.

There were 137 neonatal deaths (infant deaths during the first four weeks of life) in 1975 and the neonatal mortality rate was 9.0 per 1,000 live births. This was a decrease in number of 27.9 percent since 1974.

## PERINATAL MORTALITY

The estimated perinatal mortality rate in 1975 was 19.6 perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births and terminations of pregnancy of twenty weeks or more gestation.

The perinatal mortality rate is based on the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{Terminations of pregnancy 20 weeks or more} + \text{neonatal deaths}}{\text{Total live births} + \text{terminations of pregnancy 20 weeks or more}} \times 1000$$

The 1975 perinatal mortality rate is based on 165 terminations of pregnancy of 20 or more weeks gestation and 137 neonatal deaths.

## MATERNAL MORTALITY

There was one maternal death in Maine in 1975.

## MARRIAGES

There were 11,190 marriages in Maine in 1975. This was 356 less than in 1974, continuing the downward trend since 1973. The marriage rate was 10.6 per 1,000 population, a decrease of 3.6 percent from 1974.

## PREVIOUS MARITAL STATUS

There were 6,561 marriages in Maine in 1975 in which both the bride and groom were marrying for the first time. This was 531 less than the number of first marriages in 1974. 67.3 percent of the grooms and 68.9 percent of the brides were married for the first time.

## DIVORCES AND ANNULMENTS

There were 5,526 divorces granted in Maine during the calendar year 1975. This was 13.9 percent more than the number of divorces granted in 1974 and the highest number of divorces granted in the history of the State. The crude divorce rate was 5.2 per 1,000 population, which again reflects the trend of increase since 1961. There were 17 marriages annulled in 1975.

## PLAINTIFF

The wife was the plaintiff in 73.3 percent of the divorces, the husband in 20.4 percent and 6.3 percent were cross suits.

## LEGAL GROUNDS FOR DECREE

Cruelty was the legal grounds for decree in 94.4 percent of all divorces granted in Maine in 1975. Cruelty includes "cruel and abusive treatment" and "extreme cruelty". Differences was legal grounds for decree in 4.8 percent of the divorces.

## DURATION OF MARRIAGE

The median duration of marriage before 1975 divorces was 5.8 years. The second year of marriage was the peak year during which marriages were ended by divorce.

## MINOR CHILDREN

The divorced couple had one or more minor children in 3,542 or 64.1 percent of 1975 divorces. Eight divorced couples had 8 or more children.

## LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH

In the following table, "Life Lost" is based on expectation of life from the 1973 United States Life tables for white population. The death of an infant represents a total of 72.2 years "life lost" and the death of a person 85 years of age represents 5.3 years of "life lost".

When one examines the leading causes of death in terms of "life lost" rather than total deaths, an entirely different picture is presented. "Certain diseases of early infancy" which caused only 0.9 percent of total deaths, caused 4.3 percent of the total "life lost" in 1975 and jumped from thirteenth place in total deaths to fifth place in total "life lost". Congenital Anomalies jumped from fourteenth place in total deaths to sixth place in "life lost". Accidents caused only 4.7 percent of total deaths but 11.8 percent of total "life lost". Diseases of the heart caused 39.9 percent of total deaths but only 30.1 percent of total "life lost".

The only leading causes that increased in "life lost" rate over 1974 were aortic aneurysm (non-syphilitic) which increased 10.0 percent and influenza and pneumonia which increased 5.9 percent. The largest decrease in "life lost" rate was certain diseases of early infancy which decreased 31.6 percent. Bronchitis, emphysema and asthma decreased by 17.4 percent. Diabetes decreased by 14.3 percent.

## ACCIDENTS

Accidents occurring in Maine in 1975, accounted for 501 deaths. Of these accidents, 47.1 percent happened on Maine's streets and highways and 22.4 percent happened at home. In 8.8 percent of the accidents, the victim was considered to be working at the time.

The state death rate for accidents, occurring in Maine, was 47.4 deaths per 100,000 population. Androscoggin County had a significantly lower rate in 1975 than the state. Lincoln and Piscataquis Counties had significantly higher rates.
