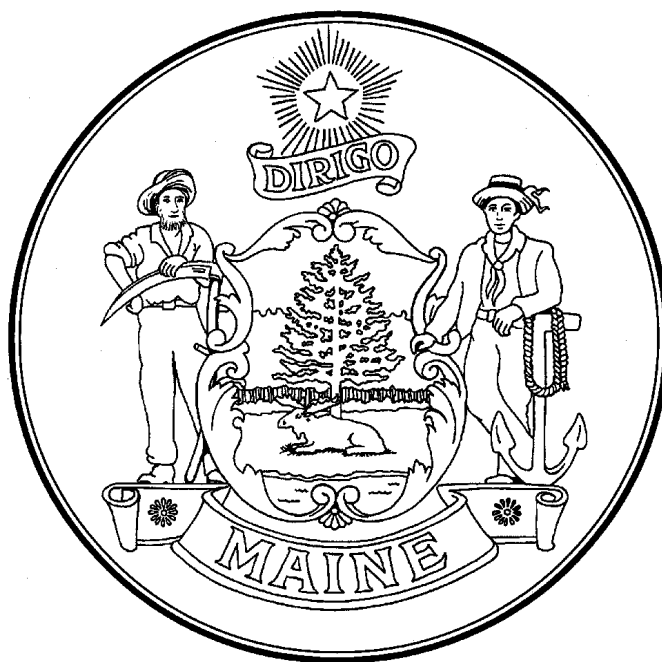

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INTRODUCTION

This report contains a summary of the Vital Statistics of the State of Maine for the calendar year of 1978. Births are tabulated for each county and all minor civil divisions and deaths are tabulated for each county and 45 selected minor civil divisions.

ALLOCATION OF VITAL EVENTS

The statistics on births in this report refer to residents of Maine only, regardless of whether or not the birth actually occurred in Maine. With the exceptions of Tables 3 and 9, death statistics also refer to residents of Maine only. Except for Table 18, statistics on marriages include non-residents as well as residents of Maine, who marry in the State. All statistics on divorces include non-residents as well as residents who are divorced in Maine.

Births are allocated to the usual residence of the mother and deaths to the usual residence of the deceased. This information is obtained for the certificate by the physician, hospital record librarian, funeral director, or other person responsible for completing the certificate of birth or death. The practice of allocating births and deaths to usual place of residence was initiated in 1935. This method of allocation is made possible by the exchange of transcripts of non-resident births and deaths with other states and Canada.

All occurrence data for marriages and divorces are distributed to the place in Maine where the marriage ceremony was performed or where the divorce decree was granted, rather than the place of residence.

FACTORS AFFECTING ACCURACY

Several factors may produce certain slight inaccuracies in this report. Some of the more important of these factors are outlined below:

(1) Completeness of Registration: A birth certificate test conducted in 1950 indicated that about one percent of births in Maine are not recorded. In addition to unrecorded vital events, others may not be included in this report by reason of failure of the person required to report the event to make a timely report, or failure of a municipal clerk to make a timely report to the State Registrar, or failure of other states to make timely exchanges of nonresident transcripts of births and deaths.

(2) Errors in Data: Data in this report are based upon original certificates of births and deaths, copies of original certificates of marriages prepared by city and town clerks, and abstracts of decrees of divorces prepared by the clerks of courts. Errors in data may be introduced by persons giving information for the original certificate, persons involved in the actual preparation of the original certificate, persons involved in the preparation of the copies or abstracts of the original certificates, or persons involved in coding and computer processing of the data.

POPULATION ESTIMATES

The estimates of county populations on July 1, 1978 which appear in this report, were prepared jointly by the U. S. Bureau of the Census and by the State of Maine, Division of Research and Vital Records of the Department of Human Services. These county estimates are averages of the U. S. Bureau of the Census's Ratio Correlation Method, the Component II Method and the Administrative Records Method.

MORTALITY CLASSIFICATION

The mortality classification, used in this report, is the 8th Revision of the International Statistical Classification, consisting of a list of 671 categories of diseases and morbid conditions, plus 182 categories for classification of the external cause of injury, and 187 categories for the characterization of injuries according to the nature of lesion.

Under the 8th Revision, the method for selecting the cause of death for statistical purposes remained the same as the method under the 6th Revision. The 6th Revision, introduced in 1949, instituted a method whereby the physician in attendance at death indicates the disease or morbid condition which he considers to be the underlying cause of death. The underlying cause is defined as "(a) the disease or injury which initiated the train of events leading directly to death, or (b) the circumstances of the accident which produced fatal injury."

Two abridged lists of causes of death are presented in this report. Deaths by selected age groups are tabulated in an abridged list of 282 causes and deaths by residence are tabulated in an abridged list of 69 causes.

RATES

Birth rates and crude mortality rates, unless otherwise specified, are expressed as the number of births or deaths per 1,000 population. Mortality rates attributed to specific diseases are expressed as the number of deaths per 100,000 population. Infant mortality rates are expressed as the number of deaths per 1,000 live births. Maternal mortality rates are expressed as the number of deaths per 10,000 live births.

POPULATION

The population of Maine was estimated to be 1,091,535 on July 1, 1978. This is a net gain in population of 97,813 or 9.8 percent more than the number of inhabitants enumerated in the 1970 U. S. Census report. Total civilian population was estimated to be 1,080,821 on July 1, 1978. This is a net gain of 10.1 percent in civilian population since April 1, 1970. The natural increase in total population between April 1, 1970 and July 1, 1978 was 45,386 and the estimated net inward migration was 52,427.

LIVE BIRTHS

There were 15,919 resident live births registered in Maine in 1978. The number of live births decreased 2.0 percent from 1977, and the birth rate decreased 2.7 percent, to 14.6 per 1000 population.

SEX

The number of male live births was 8,148 and the number of female live births was 7,771. The sex ratio of live births was 104.9 male live births for every 100.0 female live births.

PLURAL BIRTHS

In 1978, there were 241 children born alive in plural births.

RACE

Only 1.6 percent of all resident live births in 1978 were nonwhite. The total number of nonwhite births in 1978 was 255. This is an increase of 23.2 percent from the number of resident nonwhite live births in 1977. This large increase in nonwhite births was peculiar to both Negroes and other nonwhites but not to American Indians.

The largest nonwhite group was Negro, who gave birth to 86 live born children. American Indians gave birth to 69, and persons of other nonwhite races gave birth to 100 live born children.

LEGITIMACY

There were 1,944 illegitimate births to mothers who were Maine residents in 1978. Illegitimate live births represented 12.2 percent of all resident live births. With the exception of 1971, the percent of births that are illegitimate has increased in every year since 1960.

HOSPITAL BIRTHS

The number of resident live births in hospitals in 1978 was 15,668 or 98.4 percent of all resident live births

TERMINATIONS OF PREGNANCY

Due to the passage of a State law prohibiting the reporting of residence on abortion reports, we do not have resident counts of terminations of pregnancy. The total number of terminations of pregnancy reported as occurring in Maine in 1978 was 4,464, of which 145 were fetal deaths, 312 were spontaneous abortions and 4,011 were induced abortions. This is an increase of 719.1 percent in the number of terminations of pregnancy reported in 1977. This large increase is a result of the state law making it mandatory to report induced abortions.

The following table shows a distribution of terminations of pregnancy occurring in Maine by type of termination by length of gestation.

GENERAL MORTALITY

There were 10,168 deaths of Maine residents in 1978. The crude mortality rate was 9.3 per 1000 population which was the same as in 1977.

SEX

In 1978 the number of resident male deaths was 5,528 and the number of resident female deaths was 4,640. The estimated death rate among males was 10.4 per 1,000 male population and among females was 8.3 per 1,000 female population.

INFANT DEATHS

There were 162 infant deaths in Maine during 1978 and the infant death mortality rate was 10.2 per 1,000 live births. This was a 5.9 percent increase in number from 1977 and 8.5 percent increase in rate. The infant mortality rate has decreased 51.2 percent since 1970, 59.5 percent since 1960, 67.3 percent since 1950, and 80.7 percent since 1940.

There were 95 neonatal deaths (infant deaths during the first four weeks of life) in 1978 and the neonatal mortality rate was 6.0 per 1,000 live births. This was a decrease in number of 4.2 percent since 1977.

PERINATAL MORTALITY

The estimated perinatal mortality rate in 1978 was 14.4 perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births and terminations of pregnancy of twenty weeks or more gestation.

The perinatal mortality rate is based on the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{Terminations of pregnancy 20 weeks or more} + \text{neonatal deaths}}{\text{Total live births} + \text{terminations of pregnancy 20 weeks or more}} \times 1000$$

The 1978 perinatal mortality rate is based on 137 estimated terminations of pregnancy of 20 or more weeks gestation and 95 neonatal deaths.

MATERNAL MORTALITY

There were two maternal deaths in Maine in 1978.

MARRIAGES

There were 11,658 marriages occurring in Maine in 1978. Of this number, 10,974 or 94.1 percent were marriages in which the bride and/or the groom were residents of Maine. The occurrence marriage rate was 10.7 per 1,000 population, an increase of 0.9 percent from 1977.

There were 10,772 resident brides in 1978, of which 73.5 percent were natives of Maine. There were 10,271 resident grooms of which 71.5 percent were natives of Maine. About 28.3 percent of the resident brides, and 12.3 percent of the resident grooms were under 20 years of age. About 65.9 percent of the resident brides were married for the first time and 64.0 percent of the resident grooms were married for the first time.

Civil ceremonies were performed in 37.9 percent of the resident marriages in 1978. There were 135 resident mixed marriages in 1978, an increase of 17.4 percent over last year.

DIVORCES AND ANNULMENTS

There were 6,164 divorces granted in Maine during the calendar year 1978. This was 509 more than the number of divorces granted in 1977, and is the highest number of divorces granted in the history of the State. The crude divorce rate was 5.6 per 1,000 population. There were 28 marriages annulled in 1978.

PLAINTIFF

The wife was the plaintiff in 67.2 percent of the divorces, and the husband in 22.7 percent and 10.1 percent were cross suits.

LEGAL GROUNDS FOR DECREE

Cruelty was the legal grounds for decree in 47.3 percent of all divorces granted in Maine in 1978. Cruelty includes "cruel and abusive treatment" and "extreme cruelty". Differences was legal grounds for decree in 51.6 percent of the divorces. This is a significant change from last year in which 91.0 percent were cruelty and only 8.1 percent were differences.

DURATION OF MARRIAGE

The median duration of marriage before divorce in 1978 was 6.1 years. The third year of marriage was the peak year during which marriages were ended by divorce.

MINOR CHILDREN

The divorced couple had one or more minor children in 3,646 or 58.9 percent of 1978 divorces. Fourteen divorced couples had 6 or more minor children.

LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH

In table 7, "Life Lost" is based on expectation of life from a 1976 United States Life table for white population. The death of an infant represents a total of 73.5 years of life lost. The death of a 50 year old person represents 27.4 years of life lost and the death of a 90 year old person represents 2.6 years of life lost.

When one examines the leading causes of death in terms of "Life Lost" rather than total deaths, an entirely different picture is presented. "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy" which caused only 0.6 percent of total deaths caused 3.0 percent of total "Life Lost" in 1978, and jumped from a tie for 14th place in total deaths to 6th place in total life lost. "Congenital Anomalies" which was in a tie for 14th place in total deaths, was in seventh place in total "Life Lost". Death from "Suicide" was in tenth place in total deaths but in 5th place in total "Life Lost". The most prominent shift in the other direction was arteriosclerosis which was in 8th place in total deaths and in 13th place in total "Life Lost".

The "Life Lost" rates for "Accidents," "Influenza & Pneumonia", and "Diabetes" increased over 1977 by 13.0%, 25.0% and 21.1% respectively. The largest decrease in "Life Lost" was "Diseases of the Heart", which decreased 9.2% over 1977.

Of the ten leading causes of death in 1970 in terms of "Life Lost" only one, "Bronchitis, Emphysema and Asthma" was not on the 1978 list. Bronchitis, Emphysema and Asthma" was replaced by "Diabetes" in 1978. There appears to be a high negative correlation between the decrease in deaths diagnosed as "Bronchitis, Emphysema and Asthma" and the increase in deaths diagnosed as "Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease".

ACCIDENTS

Accidents occurring in Maine in 1978, accounted for 538 deaths. Of these accidents, 45.0 percent happened on Maine's streets and highways and 24.5 percent happened at home. In 8.2 percent of the accidents, the victim was considered to be working at the time of occurrence.

The state death rate for accidents, occurring in Maine, was 49.3 deaths per 100,000 population.

Lincoln County had a significantly higher rate in 1978 than the State.
