#### **INTRODUCTION**

The statutory mission of the Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions (Bureau), as set forth in 9-B M.R.S. § 111, is to ensure the strength, stability and efficiency of the financial institutions it regulates, encourage the development and expansion of financial services, ensure reasonable and orderly competition, protect consumers against unfair practices, provide consumer education, and encourage the development of economically sound credit practices.

In 2022, the Bureau provided regulatory supervision to 40 state-chartered financial institutions, including 17 banks, 12 credit unions, and 11 limited purpose banks consisting of ten nondepository trust companies and one merchant bank. As of June 30, 2022, assets held by Maine state-chartered institutions supervised by the Bureau totaled approximately \$33.1 billion. Maine state-chartered banks (including limited purpose banks) recorded \$29.7 billion in assets, representing a year-over-year increase of \$1.2 billion, or 4.3%. Maine state-chartered credit unions recorded \$3.4 billion in assets, representing a year-over-year increase of \$268 million, or 8.5%.

The Bureau's two distinct divisions are responsible for the administration of the Maine Consumer Credit Code (Title 9-A) and the Maine Banking Code (Title 9-B). The Research, Administration, and Legal Affairs Division issues regulatory guidance, promulgates rules, responds to consumer complaints, reviews and processes applications to charter new financial institutions or merge existing institutions, and interacts with the Maine Legislature during legislative sessions. The Supervision and Examination Division conducts periodic on-site examinations of each state-chartered financial institution to evaluate financial strength, risk management processes, and compliance with state and federal laws and regulations. Bureau examiners conduct on-site safety and soundness, compliance, trust, information technology, Bank Secrecy Act/ Anti Money Laundering, and holding company examinations.

During the twelve-month period from November 1, 2021 to October 31, 2022, the Bureau received and processed 17 applications and notifications. Among these applications and notifications, 10 were related to branching activity, including the establishment of five new branches by Maine state-chartered financial institutions. Other applications processed included the merger of a federally-chartered credit union into a Maine state-chartered credit union, a change-in-control application to acquire indirect control of a Maine nondepository trust company, and an application for an out-of-state bank to acquire additional equity in a Maine state-chartered nondepository trust company. Also, the Bureau received two notices from Maine state-chartered credit unions to expand their fields of membership, one notice from a Maine state-chartered bank to engage in a closely related activity, and one notice of merger of a Maine nondepository trust company into a New Hampshire-chartered nondepository trust company.

The Bureau dedicates resources to consumer outreach and complaint mediation. During the fiscal year ending 2021, the Bureau's Consumer Outreach Specialist responded to 377 consumer complaints and inquiries, of which 176 required Bureau intervention. Complaints involved deposit account activities, fee disputes, consumer loans and credit cards. In addition to responding to consumer complaints, the Bureau actively monitors the latest scam and data breach activity, informing consumers and financial institutions of the illicit activity when appropriate through targeted email distribution lists and press releases. The Consumer Outreach Specialist also participated in outreach events related to financial services, including a virtual seminar for aspiring financial institution employees hosted by a local adult education program.

The following report contains summary financial data for financial institutions doing business in Maine. It includes information on assets, deposits/shares, and loans, as well as office and branch location information. While this Annual Report should be helpful as a point-in-time resource for data on financial institutions, the Bureau's website (<u>http://www.maine.gov/pfr/financialinstitutions/</u>) continues to provide access to both current and archived information.

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## SECTION I APPLICATION ACTIVITY

Pursuant to Maine law, potential organizers must file an application to charter a new institution and existing financial institutions must submit an application or provide notice to the Bureau prior to branching, merging, acquiring other organizations, or engaging in certain other business activities.

Over the twelve-month period from November 1, 2021 to October 31, 2022, application activity for Maine's state-chartered financial institutions focused primarily on branching activity, accounting for 10 of the 17 applications and notifications processed. The 10 branch-related items included five new branches by Maine state-chartered financial institutions, with four of the branches located in Maine and one in New Hampshire. Maine state-chartered financial institutions also notified the Bureau of two branch closures in the towns of Brunswick and Buckfield and a branch consolidation in Augusta. Further, a nationally-chartered financial institution notified the Bureau of its intent to establish a branch in Maine and a New Hampshire-chartered credit union notified the Bureau of the Bureau of its intention to relocate a branch to Maine.

The Bureau processed the following applications: a) to merge Maine Harvest Federal Credit Union with and into Five County Credit Union, which was approved by the Bureau on September 9, 2022 and effective on December 11, 2022; b) for a Change in Control by Moses Ultimate Holdings, LLC to acquire indirect control of Clearstead Trust, LLC, which was approved by the Bureau on January 31, 2022; and c) for BayCoast Bank to acquire additional equity in Plimoth Trust Company, LLC, which was approved by the Bureau on October 18, 2022.

There were also two notices from state-chartered credit unions to expand their fields of membership, one notice from a state-chartered bank to engage in a closely related activity, and lastly a charter termination for Bar Harbor Trust Services as a result of a merger with and into a New Hampshire-chartered nondepository trust company controlled by Bar Harbor Bankshares.

## SECTION II CONSUMER OUTREACH PROGRAM

Since 1987, the Bureau has had a Consumer Outreach Program with a designated Outreach Specialist on staff. The Outreach Specialist is available to answer questions related to the business of financial institutions, mediate complaints against financial institutions, participate in training programs, and make referrals to other regulatory agencies.

The Consumer Outreach Specialist maintains the consumer resources found on the Bureau's website. There, consumers find links to a variety of financial topics, answers to frequently asked questions, and lists of the financial institutions doing business in the State. Consumers may also file complaints through the website, which are either handled by the Consumer Outreach Specialist or referred to the appropriate federal supervisory authority. If a consumer issue pertains to a nationally-chartered bank or federally-chartered credit union, a referral is made to the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) or the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA).

During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, the Bureau responded to 377 consumer complaints and inquiries. Of these, 176 required Bureau intervention. The Bureau is most successful when intervening in disputes involving its state-chartered financial institutions, though consumers of nationally-chartered institutions are nonetheless encouraged to contact the Consumer Outreach Specialist who can provide valuable information and discuss possible outcomes.

## SECTION III SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AUTHORIZED TO DO BUSINESS IN MAINE

There were 94 financial institutions authorized to do business in Maine as of June 30, 2022. Included among them were 17 state-chartered banks, 12 state-chartered credit unions, and 11 state-chartered limited purpose banks consisting of ten nondepository trust companies and one merchant bank. Total assets of state-chartered banks (including limited purpose banks) increased from \$28.5 billion on June 30, 2021 to \$29.7 billion on June 30, 2022. Total assets for state-chartered credit unions increased from \$3.2 billion to \$3.4 billion during the same period. The following tables show assets, deposits, and loans by institution type over the reporting period, including the number and location of branches held by each institution.

Sec. C-1. 20-A MRSA §13013-A, as amended by PL 2021, c. 398, Pt. JJ, §1 is further amended to read:

1. **Department of Education salary supplement.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of Education shall provide a public school teacher, or a teacher in a publicly supported secondary school, or a teacher employed by an education service center as authorized <u>under Title 20-A</u>, <u>Chapter 123</u> who has attained certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, or its successor organization, with an annual national board certification salary supplement for the life of the certificate. The salary supplement must be added to the teacher's base salary and must be considered in the calculation for contributions to the Maine Public Employees Retirement System. If a nationally certified teacher is no longer employed as a teacher, the supplement ceases. The amount of the salary supplement is:

A. For fiscal year 2012-13, \$2,500;

B. For fiscal year 2013-14, \$2,750;

C. For fiscal year 2014-15 and succeeding years, except for a teacher under paragraph D, 33,000; and

D. For fiscal year 2020-21 and succeeding years, for a teacher who is employed in a school in which at least 50% of students qualify for a free or reduced-price lunch under chapter 223, subchapter 7 during the year that the supplement is provided, \$5,000.

**1-A. Funding revenue**. The National Board Certification Salary Supplement Fund is established as a nonlapsing dedicated fund within the Department of Education beginning in fiscal year 2012-13. The salary supplement under subsection 1 must be funded from fees collected by the department pursuant to section 13007, subsection 1.

**2. Local filing; certification**. On or before October 15th annually, the superintendent of schools of a school administrative unit, or the chief administrative officer of a publicly supported secondary school, an education service center or a career and technical education region shall file with the commissioner a certified list of national board-certified teachers eligible to receive the salary supplement pursuant to subsection 1.

**3. Payment**. If there are available resources, the department shall provide the salary supplement to school administrative units, <u>and</u>-publicly supported secondary schools<u>and</u> <u>education service centers</u> for eligible teachers no later than February 15th of each year. The salary supplement paid may be prorated.

**4. Expend funds**. A school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center may expend funds received through the salary supplement under subsection 1 without calling for a special meeting of the local legislative body.

**5.** Scholarship fund. The National Board Certification Scholarship Fund is established as a nonlapsing dedicated fund, referred to in this subsection as "the scholarship fund," within the Department of Education to encourage teachers to apply to and enroll in the certification program offered by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or its successor organization,

referred to in this subsection and subsection 6 as "the certification program." A school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center may request scholarship funds on behalf of its teachers who meet the requirements set forth in subsection 6. The department shall award funds according to this subsection.

A. In fiscal year 2012-13, the department shall allocate \$50,000 from fees collected by the department pursuant to section 13007, subsection 1 to the scholarship fund. The department shall award an amount equal to the cost of the certification program less any other funds received by the applicant on a first-come first-served basis for the first 20 teachers accepted into the certification program annually.

B. Beginning in fiscal year 2013-14, the department shall allocate \$75,000 from fees collected by the department pursuant to section 13007, subsection 1 each fiscal year to the scholarship fund. The department shall award an amount equal to the cost of enrollment in the certification program less any other funds received by the applicant to not more than 30 teachers accepted into the program annually.

**6. Eligibility requirements.** In order to receive scholarship funds according to subsection 5 on behalf of a teacher, the school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center must certify to the department that the teacher:

A. Is currently employed by a school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school<u>or an education service center;</u>

B. Has completed at least 3 years of teaching in the State;

C. Has agreed to mentor at least one other teacher employed in the State through the national board certification process to apply to and enroll in the certification program;

D. Has provided documentation of acceptance into the certification program; and

E. Has disclosed any other funds received to cover the cost of the certification program.

**7.** Nonlapsing funds. Any unencumbered balance of the National Board Certification Scholarship Fund under subsection 5 remaining at the end of a fiscal year may not lapse but must be carried forward to be used for the same purpose.

C. The funds for adjustments under paragraph A are limited to the amount appropriated by the Legislature for that purpose.

D. A school administrative unit may expend the funds from the adjustment under paragraph A without seeking approval of the school administrative unit's legislative body.

Sec. C-12. Authorization of payments. If the State's continued obligation for any individual component contained in those sections of this Act that set the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 and the local and state contributions for that purpose exceeds the level of funding provided for that component, any unexpended balances occurring in other programs may be applied to avoid proration of payments for any individual component. An accredited Maine community college, college or university must document for the student information required for purposes of the educational opportunity tax credit, including, once the student has earned the degree, the total principal of loans the student received as part of that student's financial aid package related to course work completed at the accredited Maine community college, college or university. B. "Earned income" has the same meaning as in the Code, Section 32(c)(2).

C. "Employer" has the same meaning as the term "employing unit," as defined in Title 26, section 1043, subsection 10.

D. "Financial aid package" means financial aid obtained by a student for attendance at an accredited community college, college or university for an associate, bachelor's or graduate degree obtained by the student from an accredited community college, college or university after December 31, 2007. "Financial aid package" may include private loans or less than the full amount of loans under federal programs, depending on the practices of the accredited community college, college or university.

E. "Qualified individual" means an individual, including the spouse filing a joint return with the individual under section 5221, who is eligible for the credit provided in this section. An individual is eligible for the credit if the individual:

(1) Obtained an associate, bachelor's or graduate degree from an accredited community college, college or university after December 31, 2007;

(2) During the taxable year, was a resident individual as defined in section 5102(5); and

(3) During the taxable year had earned income of at least the State minimum wage, as defined in Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 664, subsection 1, as adjusted for cost of living increases, as determined on January 1 of the taxable year, multiplied by 936 hours. The assessor may adopt rules reducing this amount if a portion of the taxable year falls within a disaster period. Rules adopted pursuant to this subparagraph are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

F. "Regional accrediting association" means a regional accrediting association that is either (1) any of the United States accrediting associations/commissions that comprise the Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions, or (2) an equivalent non-United States accrediting association,

commission, or government entity that is a reliable authority on the quality of the education or training provided by the institutions of higher education it accredits or charters and that applies standards substantially equivalent to those utilized by the associations/commissions that comprise the Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions.

**2. Credit allowed.** For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2022, a qualified individual is allowed a refundable credit against the tax imposed by this Part in accordance with the provisions of this section. The credit, with respect to a qualified individual, is equal to the amount of loan payments made directly by the taxpayer to the lender during the taxable year plus the amount of any carryover allowed in accordance with paragraph C, up to a maximum of \$2,500. The credit is created to implement the Job Creation Through Educational Opportunity Program established under Title 20-A, chapter 428-C.

A. A taxpayer may claim a credit under this section based on loan payments made directly by the taxpayer to a relevant lender or lenders only with respect to loans that are part of the qualified individual's financial aid package and only with respect to loan payment amounts paid directly by the taxpayer during that part of the taxable year that the qualified individual was a resident individual. Refinanced loans or consolidated loans that are part of the refinanced loans or consolidated loans that are part of the refinanced loans or consolidated loans that are part of the refinanced loans or consolidated loans that are part of the refinanced loans or payments that are otherwise eligible under this section.

B. Loans obtained from a person related to the qualified individual or from any person by reason of a loan under any qualified employer plan or under a contract referred to in the Code, Section 72(p)(5) do not qualify for the credit under this section. For purposes of this paragraph, a person is considered related to the qualified individual if that person meets the criteria listed in the Code, Section 267(b) or Section 707(b)(1). As used in this paragraph, "qualified employer plan" has the same meaning as in the Code, Section 72(p)(4).

C. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2022 and before January 1, 2027, a qualified individual with unused carryover credits pursuant to section 5217-D, subsection 2, paragraph A from the credit for educational opportunity generated in the past 10 years, may carry over and apply to the credit amount allowed pursuant to this section the portion, as reduced from year to year, of any unused credits.

D. A qualified individual may only receive a credit otherwise allowed pursuant to this section up to a total lifetime credit cap amount of \$25,000.

Sec. H-15. 36 MRSA §5122, sub-§ 2, ¶ FF, as amended by PL 2013, c. 525, §14, is repealed.

**Sec. H-16. Application.** The section of this Part that repeals Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 5122, subsection 2, paragraph FF applies to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2022.

# PART H SUMMARY

This Part replaces the current credit for educational opportunity with a broader and simpler credit of up to \$2,500 for an individual's repayment of student loans for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2022. Unused credit carryover amounts from the credit for educational

opportunity may be claimed and applied to the new credit by a qualified individual for tax years beginning before January 1, 2027, subject to the annual credit limit of \$2,500. This also repeals the insurance premiums tax credit for educational opportunity for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022.

Sec. L-2. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$682,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Administrative & Financial Services, COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Fund account for the purpose of providing payments to help eligible Maine citizens recover from economic impacts from the epidemic related to coronavirus disease 2019, referred to in this Part as "the COVID-19 pandemic." At the close of fiscal year 2023-24, amounts remaining in the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account must be transferred to the Budget Stabilization Fund.

**Sec. L-3. COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program established.** The COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program is established to help Maine people respond to the economic fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic and enable Maine people to combat rising costs due to pandemic-induced inflation and supply-chain impacts. This relief payment can be utilized by eligible Maine citizens to offset expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, including, without limitation, personal, family, living or funeral expenses.

**1. Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

- A. "Assessor" means the State Tax Assessor.
- **B**. "Eligible Maine citizen" means an individual who:
  - (1) Filed, by October 31, 2022, a Maine income tax return as a full-year resident of the State for the tax year;

(2) Has federal adjusted gross income for the tax year of less than:

(a) For individuals filing married joint returns or surviving spouses permitted to file a joint return, \$150,000;

- (b) For an individual filing as a head of household, \$112,500;
- (c) For a single individual, \$75,000; or
- (d) For married persons filing separate returns, \$75,000; and

(3) May not be claimed as a dependent on another taxpayer's return for that tax year.

**C.** "Fund" means the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account established by the State Controller pursuant to section 1.

**D.** "Relief payment" means the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment determined pursuant to subsection 2.

**E.** "Tax year" means a tax year beginning on or after January 1, 2021 but not later than December 31, 2021.

Any other terms used in this section have the same meaning as when used in a comparable context in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, Part 8 relating to Maine income taxes, unless different meanings are clearly required.

**2. COVID Pandemic Relief Payment.** The assessor shall make COVID Pandemic Relief payments in accordance with this subsection.

A. The assessor shall identify each eligible Maine citizen, as defined pursuant to subsection 1.

B. Beginning as soon as administratively feasible and not later than December 31, 2022, the assessor shall make a \$850 relief payment to each eligible Maine citizen. Funds for the relief payments must come from the Fund and are not subject to setoff to debts owed to agencies of the State.

C. An individual who has not received a payment under paragraph B may provide documentation to the assessor by March 31, 2023 showing that the individual is an eligible Maine citizen. The assessor shall review the documentation, determine if the individual is an eligible Maine citizen and notify the individual of any adverse determination. This determination is final agency action not reviewable pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 151.

D. By June 30, 2023, the assessor shall make a \$850 relief payment to each eligible Maine citizen determined eligible pursuant to paragraph C. Funds for the relief payments must come from the Fund and are not subject to setoff to debts owed to agencies of the State.

**Sec. L-4. State income tax subtraction modification.** For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022 but not later than December 31, 2023, in determining the taxable income of a resident individual, within the meaning of the Maine Revised Statues, Title 36, section 5122, federal adjusted gross income shall be reduced by an amount equal to the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment received by the taxpayer pursuant to this Part, to the extent the payment is included in federal adjusted gross income for the taxable year.

**Sec. L-5. Designation as unclaimed property.** For purposes of the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program, COVID Pandemic Relief Payment checks that remain undeposited on January 1, 2024, are to be treated as unclaimed property, not subject to the notice and receipt provisions set forth in 33 M.R.S. § 2101 and the one-year dormancy period set forth in 33 M.R.S. § 2061, as applied to such checks. The State Treasurer shall use unclaimed property systems and networks to find the proper recipients of such checks as quickly as possible to reduce the adverse economic consequences of COVID-19.

## PART L SUMMARY

This Part creates the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program to provide COVID Pandemic Relief Payments to eligible Maine citizens to promote the general welfare of the citizens of the State for reasonable and necessary unreimbursed expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic disaster. To fund the program, this Part creates the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account and transfers \$682,000,000 to the Fund from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund. The Fund may be used for a \$850 payment to each eligible Maine citizen and the costs of administration, programming, mailing, public outreach, and taxpayer assistance associated with the program.

E. Establishing a child death and serious injury review panel for reviewing deaths and serious injuries to children. The panel consists of the following members: the Chief Medical Examiner, a pediatrician, a public health nurse, forensic and community mental health clinicians, law enforcement officers, departmental child welfare staff, district attorneys and criminal or civil assistant attorneys general and the ombudsman pursuant to section 4087-A or a designee of the ombudsman.

The purpose of the panel is to recommend to state and local agencies methods of improving the child protection system, including modifications of statutes, rules, policies and procedures. Beginning January 1, 2023 and every 2 years thereafter, the department shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters;

## Sec. BB-2. 22 MRSA §4004, sub-§1, ¶E is amended to read:

3-A. Confidentiality. The proceedings and records of the child death and serious injury review panel created in accordance with section 4004, subsection 1, paragraph E are confidential and are not subject to subpoena, discovery or introduction into evidence in a civil or criminal action. The commissioner shall disclose conclusions of the review panel upon request and recommendations pursuant to section 4004, subsection 1, paragraph #, but may not disclose data that is otherwise classified as confidential.

## Sec. BB-3. 22 MRSA §4087-A, sub-§2 is amended to read:

2. Program established. The ombudsman program is established as an independent program within the Executive Department to provide ombudsman services to the children and families of the State regarding child welfare services provided by the Department of Health and Human Services. The program shall consider and promote the best interests of the child involved, answer inquiries and investigate, advise and work toward resolution of complaints of infringement of the rights of the child and family involved. The program must be staffed, under contract, by <u>a full-time director who is</u> an attorney or a master's level social worker <del>who must have with</del> experience in child <u>welfare</u>, development and advocacy<del>, and support staff as determined to be necessary</del>. The program shall function through <del>the</del> staff of the program <del>and volunteers recruited and trained</del>, at the discretion of the program.

**3. Contracted services; terms.** The program shall operate by contract with a nonprofit organization that the Executive Department determines to be free of potential conflict of interest and best able to provide the services on a statewide basis. The contract must include funds for the nonprofit organization to provide health insurance benefits to the staff of the ombudsman program. The ombudsman may not be actively involved in state-level political party activities or publicly endorse, solicit funds for or make contributions to political parties on the state level or candidates for statewide elective office. The ombudsman may not be a candidate for or hold any statewide elective or appointive public office. The contract must include funds for the nonprofit organization to provide health insurance benefits to the staff of the ombudsman program. The contract must be for a term of 5 years, except that the contract may be terminated consistent with the terms of the contract.

Services.** The program shall provide services directly or under contract to persons and families involved with child welfare services and may provide input on the State's child welfare system to the department and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters. The first priority in the work of the program and any contract for ombudsman services must be case-specific advocacy services. In performing services under this section, the program, as it determines to be appropriate, may create and maintain records and case-specific reports. Any work on systems improvements or lobbying must be adjunctive to case-specific activities. The program may:

A. Provide information to the public about the services of the program through a comprehensive outreach program. The ombudsman shall provide information through a toll-free telephone number or numbers and a publicly accessible website;

B. Answer inquiries, investigate and work toward resolution of complaints regarding the performance and services of the department and participate in conferences, meetings and studies that may improve the performance of the department;

C. Provide services to persons to assist them in protecting their rights;

D. Inform persons of the means of obtaining services from the department;

E. Provide information and referral services;

F. Analyze and provide opinions and recommendations to agencies, the Governor and the Legislature on <u>current or proposed</u> state programs, rules, policies and laws;

G. Determine what types of complaints and inquiries will be accepted for action by the program and adopt policies and procedures regarding communication with persons making inquiries or complaints and the department;

H. Apply for and utilize grants, gifts and funds for the purpose of performing the duties of the program; and

I. Collect and analyze records and data relevant to the duties and activities of the program and make reports as required by law or determined to be appropriate.

The department or designee of the department shall notify the ombudsman of any statewide policy changes affecting the State's child welfare system before the changes take effect.

Sec. BB-6. 22 MRSA §4087-A, sub-§12 is enacted to read:

**12. Notification of child fatality required**. The department shall notify the ombudsman of a fatality of a child if:

A. The child was involved with child welfare services at any time; or

B. The fatality is suspected of being the result of abuse or neglect.

Notification under this subsection must occur within 48 hours of a determination by the department that this subsection applies to the fatality. The notification may be provided by oral or electronic communication.

# PART BB SUMMARY

This Part makes the following changes to the laws governing the child welfare services ombudsman program.

- 1. It includes the ombudsman or the ombudsman's designee as a member of the child death and serious injury review panel established by the Department of Health and Human Services.

- 9. It clarifies that the ombudsman program may provide input on the State's child welfare system to the Department of Health and Human Services and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters.
- 10. It clarifies that the ombudsman program provides services to persons and families involved with the State's child welfare system.
- 11. It requires that the Department of Health and Human Services to notify the ombudsman program of any statewide policy changes affecting the State's child welfare system before the changes take effect.
- 12. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to notify the ombudsman program of certain child fatalities.

This Part directs the Department of Health and Human Services to make supplemental payments to the Maine Veterans' Homes in fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 to offset budget shortfalls. As a condition of receiving the supplemental payments, Maine Veterans' Homes must commit to continue providing services in the Caribou and Machias homes.

## PART TT

Sec. TT-1. 4 MRSA §1610-I is amended to read:

#### §1610-I. Additional securities; Judicial Branch

Notwithstanding any limitation on the amount of securities that may be issued pursuant to section 1606, subsection 2, the authority may issue additional securities from time to time in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$95,600,000 outstanding at any one time for the purposes of paying the costs associated with the planning, purchasing, financing, acquiring, constructing, renovating, furnishing, equipping, improving, extending, enlarging and consolidating new and existing facilities and projects relating to the Judicial Branch in the counties of Oxford, Waldo and York, acquiring and improving property relating to the Judicial Branch in Hancock County, replacing and upgrading ventilation systems in Presque Isle, Lewiston, Rockland, Skowhegan, and West Bath, and planning for other court facilities.

## PART TT SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the Judicial Branch to use funds from issued securities to replace and upgrade ventilation systems in Presque Isle, Lewiston, Rockland, Skowhegan and West Bath facilities.

Sec. UU-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Bureau of Policy and Management Lobster Fisheries Litigation Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$3,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Marine Resources, Bureau of Policy and Management Lobster Fisheries Litigation Fund, Other Special Revenue Fund account to support litigation costs in defense of the State's lobster fishery. ### PART UU SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$3,000,000 on or before June 30, 2022 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Marine Resources, Bureau of Policy and Management Lobster Fisheries Litigation Fund, Other Special Revenue Fund account to support litigation costs in defense of the State's lobster fishery. The Department is requesting the one-time transfer to support the increase in legal services related to pending litigation in the Federal Court regarding the protection of right whales and the authorization of the Maine lobster fishery by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. This funding will support the Department's intervenor status in two active cases (CBD v. Ross, MLA v. NMFS) as well as involvement in other active cases. #### Sec. VV-1. 5 MRSA §131 as amended by PL 2019, c. 326 §1 is amended to read:

**2. Certain payments not immediate.** Notwithstanding subsection 1, payments from a department or agency of the State made to the State Treasury through the use of automated procedures, electronic processes and computer-driven technology must be deposited in the State Treasury in accordance with the requirements established in rules adopted by the Treasurer of State and the State Controller. The Treasurer of State and the State Controller shall adopt rules to implement this subsection, including rules outlining procedures for the use of automated procedures, electronic processes and computer-driven technology for the collection of these payments pursuant to this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection may not waive prohibitions against deductions on account of salaries, fees, costs, charges, expenses, refunds, claims or demands of any description whatsoever. #### §4763. Emergency Housing Relief Fund

- 1. **Creation**. The Emergency Housing Relief Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established within the Maine State Housing Authority. The fund may receive money from any other available state, federal or private sources. The fund may not lapse, but must be carried forward to carry out the purposes of this subchapter.
- 2. **Program**. The Emergency Housing Relief Fund Program, referred to in this section as "the program," is established within the Maine State Housing Authority.
- 3. Uses of the funds. The funds may be used for short-term or long-term solutions. The funding will focus on:
- A. Providing rental assistance or appropriate housing for those who are currently staying in hotels as a short-term housing solution;

- B. Supplementing or creating a similar program to the federal American Rescue Plan, HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) program to purchase and convert appropriate buildings to housing to address the needs of those who are homeless or facing other immediate housing needs;

- E. Any other use that will address the immediate housing emergency facing the state.

Sec. WW-2. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Emergency Housing Relief Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall transfer \$22,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine State Housing Authority, Emergency Housing Relief Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account to provide rental assistance, supplement other programs addressing the needs of the homeless or those facing other immediate housing needs, supplement other short-term rental assistance programs, create additional supportive housing along the housing first model for people with disabilities, mental health challenges, or substance use disorders, and support other uses that will address the immediate housing emergency facing the state.

# PART WW SUMMARY

# CHAPTER 10-D

# FUND TO ADDRESS PFAS CONTAMINATION

## §320-K. Fund To Address PFAS Contamination

**1. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

<u>A.</u> "Advisory committee" means the Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination in section 320-L.

B. "Agricultural land" has the same meaning as in section 32, subsection 2.

C. "Commercial farm" means a farm that produces any farm product with the intent that the farm product be sold or otherwise disposed of to generate income.

D. "Farm product" has the same meaning as in section 52, subsection 3-A.

E. "Fund" means the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination under subsection 2.

F. "Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances" or "PFAS" has the same meaning as in Title 32, section 1732, subsection 5-A.

**2. Fund established.** The Fund To Address PFAS Contamination is established within the office of the commissioner in the department as a nonlapsing account for the purposes specified in this chapter.

**3.** Sources of the fund. The fund is funded from funds accepted by the commissioner or allocated or appropriated by the Legislature, including funds stipulated for deposit in the fund as part of the terms of settlement of legal actions relating to PFAS contamination against corporations, partnerships or individuals.

**4. Purposes.** Allocations from the fund may be made as determined by the department upon recommendation of the advisory committee and for the following purposes:

A. Monitoring the health of a person, and members of that person's household, whose agricultural land is found to be contaminated by PFAS;

A-1. Providing medical care to a person found to have blood levels of PFAS greater than the general population or health effects associated with exposure to PFAS:

B. Relocating a commercial farm when the agricultural land of the farm is found to be contaminated by PFAS;

C. Buying and selling agricultural land found to be contaminated by PFAS;

D. Investing in equipment, facilities and infrastructure to ensure that a commercial farm with land found to be contaminated by PFAS maintains profitability while the commercial farm transitions to an alternative cropping system, remediation strategies, technological adaptations, solar development or other modifications to its operations in response to PFAS contamination;

E. Assisting a commercial farm with land found to be contaminated by PFAS with developing enterprise budgets for alternative cropping systems, remediation strategies, technological adaptations or transitioning to alternative revenue streams, including but not limited to land use systems combining agricultural use of the land with solar energy production;

F. Providing short-term assistance to a person whose commercial farm is found to be contaminated by PFAS, including but not limited to income replacement and mortgage payments;

G. Evaluating the capacity of PFAS testing and data management in the State;

H. Conducting research that supports short-term farm management decisions and assesses future options for viable uses of agricultural land that has been contaminated with PFAS:

I. Conducting research that quantifies the impact of PFAS commercial farms and agricultural communities in the State;

J. Conducting research on soil and water remediation systems and the viability of those systems for commercial farmers;

K. Conducting research on alternative cropping systems, PFAS uptake of different crops, livestock systems to mitigate exposure to PFAS or remediate it, and research on food safety criteria for food products;

L. Educational programs for landowners, including but not limited to determining best practices for informing residents about the potential of being near or on a site on which sludge or septage application was licensed or permitted by the State prior to 2019, and providing information and guidance on buying or selling agricultural lands that have had sludge or septage applied; and

<u>M.</u> Long-term monitoring of contaminated sites and establishing a corresponding centralized data repository:

N. Establishing food safety criteria and guidance for farm products;

O. Assisting commercial farmers and others in the agricultural sector not directly affected by PFAS contamination with marketing efforts whose branding and marketing may be affected by public perception of PFAS contamination in the State; and

P. Regional planning with other states and the federal government to protect food supply and farmers in the State from out-of-state PFAS contamination.

**5.** Administration. The department shall administer the fund allocations in accordance with a plan that establishes funding priorities, administration and oversight and with the review and advice of the advisory committee. The department may contract for professional services to carry out the purposes of this section.

**6. Rules.** The department may adopt rules to implement this chapter. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

**7. Report**. Beginning March 1, 2023, and annually thereafter, the department shall submit a report on the plan under subsection 5 and on the uses of the fund to the joint standing committees having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry; environment and natural resources; and health and human services. The report must include an update on the status of meeting the purposes of the fund in subsection 4, additional needs identified by the agricultural community, what funds have been disbursed and to what purpose. The report must include the functional status of the advisory committee, including, but not limited to, the number of meetings held, a summary of each meeting and recommendations for legislation from the advisory committee.

# §320-L. Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination

<u>The Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination is established</u> <u>pursuant to Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 2-H to make recommendations to the department</u> <u>regarding administration of the fund. In order to develop recommendations for the department,</u> <u>the advisory committee may form working groups that include and seek input from subject</u> <u>matter experts from the public and private sectors to deliberate issues relating to the purposes of</u> <u>the fund, including but not limited to health monitoring, short-term financial aid for farmers,</u> <u>research priorities, solar siting, long-term environmental monitoring and land acquisition.</u>

1. Membership. The advisory committee consists of:

A. The commissioner or the commissioner's designee;

B. The Commissioner of Environmental Protection or the commissioner's designee;

C. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services or the commissioner's designee;

D. The dean of the Maine Agricultural and Forest Experiment Station at the University of Maine, College of Natural Sciences, Forestry, and Agriculture or the dean of the University of Maine Cooperative Extension, appointed by the President of the University of Maine;

E. One member of the public representing the financial sector and with expertise in agricultural finance and lending, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry;

F. Five members of the public representing the agricultural sector, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry; and

<u>G. One member of the public with expertise in public health, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry.</u>

The 7 members of the public appointed by the commissioner shall serve on the committee for terms of 3 years each, on a staggered-term basis to prevent the terms of more than 2 public members expiring in any one year.

2. Report. The committee shall hold at least 2 public hearings annually to seek input from the public on efforts to meet the purposes of the fund. All proceedings of the advisory committee are public within the meaning of Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter 1. Notwithstanding Title 1, section 403, subsection 6, all records of proceedings of the advisory committee are public and subject to the requirements of Title 1, section 403, subsection 2. The committee shall report to the Legislature annually, beginning March 1, 2023 on the input from subject matter experts under subsection 1 and members of the public on issues relating to the purposes and the use of the fund.

**Sec. 2-A. Initial plan priorities; programs**. The Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall develop and implement an initial plan that prioritizes funding and implementation of the following programs consistent with the purposes in Title 7, section 320-K, subsection 4. The department shall seek public comment on a draft proposal before final adoption of the plan.

1. The department shall establish a program as soon as practicable to provide short-term assistance to a person whose commercial farm is found to be contaminated by PFAS that may include income replacement and mortgage payments.

2. The department may establish a program to fund long-term assistance for commercial farms with agricultural land that is found to be contaminated by PFAS. The program must address a range of alternative strategies including assisting farmers with investing in equipment, facilities and infrastructure to maintain profitability during a transition to alternative cropping systems, remediation strategies, technological adaptations, solar development or other modifications to its operations; purchasing agricultural land found to be contaminated by PFAS; assisting farmers with renegotiating mortgages and lines of credit; direct purchasing of contaminated land and assisting farmers whose land is found to be contaminated by PFAS with purchasing of alternative land.

3. The department may establish, in coordination with the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention, a PFAS medical monitoring and blood PFAS level testing program for persons whose drinking water or agricultural land is found to be contaminated by PFAS. If the department establishes a program under this section, the department may not require a person to show a present injury or disease to qualify for the program.

A. In accordance with rules adopted by the department under Title 7, section 320-K, subsection 6, the program may include payment by the department for annual blood PFAS-level testing and related services and diagnostic evaluations for an affected person who does

not have sufficient health coverage for PFAS testing and related services. The program must allow the drawing of blood for the testing in a health care provider's office or by another laboratory. The program must allow a blood sample taken by a health care provider or laboratory to test for blood PFAS levels to be sent to a facility approved by the Department of Health and Human Services.

B. The department may develop criteria for funding medical monitoring and healthcare for persons found to have blood level exposure to PFAS at a rate greater than the general population, where it is medically relevant to undergo periodic medical examination and healthcare.

**Sec. 2-B. Long-term plan for the administration of the funds**. In implementing, Title 7, section 320-K, the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall, with the advice of the Advisory Committee on the Fund to Address PFAS Contamination:

1. Review examples in other state, federal and international jurisdictions of compensatory, research or public health monitoring program parameters;

2. Consult with experts and participants in similar programs;

3. Consult with stakeholders affected by PFAS contamination by holding public hearing and receiving public comment;

4. Develop methods for determining parameters of the fund components, including, but not limited to, determining financial assistance offerings, evaluating agricultural land valuation, establishing research priorities and assessing research proposals, establishing the need for and scope of long-term health monitoring and land monitoring, and offer recommendations to alter the fund components;

5. Develop processes and criteria to be used to determine funding awards;

6. Create a timeframe for the establishment of the fund and for the consideration of applications for fund programs and issuance of payments, including, but not limited to, land appraisals and income tax statements;

7. Recommend changes to the administration of the fund and corresponding programs to the Legislature, if necessary;

8. Establish rules in accordance with Title 7, section 320-K, subsection 6 to ensure that applicants for fund programs are able to participate in the process;

9. Assess where and how the fund would be best housed and operated within State government in the future; and

10. Take into consideration recommendations, including suggested legislation, of the advisory committee.

**Sec. 3.** Advisory Committee to consider findings and recommendations. By March 1, 2023, the Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination established in the

Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, section 320-L shall consider the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry February 4, 2022 report "Findings and Recommendations for a PFAS Study Plan Supporting L.D. 558" when developing advisory committee recommendations, including but not limited to funding for research, regarding administration of the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination.

Sec. 4. Transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before May 1, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$5,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program, Fund To Address PFAS Contamination, Other Special Funds account for the purposes as provided under Title 7, section 320-K, subsection 4.

Sec. 5. Transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall transfer \$55,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program, Fund To Address PFAS Contamination, Other Special Funds account for the purposes as provided under Title 7, section 320-K, subsection 4.

## PART XX SUMMARY

This Part establishes the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry and the corresponding Advisory Committee on the Fund To Address PFAS Contamination to make recommendations to the department regarding administration of the fund. The bill authorizes the department to allocate funds upon recommendation of the advisory committee and for certain purposes, including but not limited to monitoring the health of a person, and members of that person's household, whose agricultural land is found to be contaminated by perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances, or PFAS; buying and selling agricultural land found to be contaminated by PFAS; Conducting research on alternative cropping systems, PFAS uptake of different crops, livestock systems to mitigate exposure to PFAS or remediate it and research on food safety criteria for food products; funding for educational programs; long-term monitoring of contaminated sites and establishing a corresponding centralized data repository; Providing medical care to a person found to have blood levels of PFAS greater than the general population or health effects associated with exposure to PFAS; establishing food safety criteria and guidance for farm products; assisting farmers and others in the agricultural sector not directly affected by PFAS contamination with marketing efforts whose branding and marketing may be affected by public perception of PFAS contamination in the State; and regional planning with other states and the federal government to protect food supply and farmers in the State from out-of-state PFAS contamination.

This Part also authorizes the advisory committee to form working groups that include and seek input from subject matter experts from the public and private sectors to deliberate issues

relating to the purposes of the fund, including but not limited to health monitoring, short-term financial aid for farmers, research priorities, solar siting, long-term environmental monitoring and land acquisition. This Part also requires the advisory committee to hold at least two public hearing annually to seek input from the public on efforts to meet the purposes of the fund. The advisory committee is required to submit a report to the Legislature annually on input from subject matter experts and members of the public on issues relating to purposes and uses of the fund.

The amendment directs the department to develop and implement an initial plan that prioritizes funding and a long-term plan for the administration of the funds.

This Part requires the department to submit an annual report to the Legislature which includes the status of meeting the purposes of the fund, additional needs identified by the agricultural community, what funds have been disbursed and to what purpose and an update on the functional status of the advisory committee.

This Part provides one-time funding of \$60,000,000 to address PFAS contamination on agricultural land in the State.

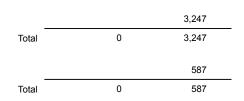

## An Act Making Unified Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2022 and June 30, 2023

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due and payable immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

### PART A

**Sec. A-1. Appropriations and allocations.** In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of State Government and other purposes for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2022 and June 30, 2023, the following sums as designated in the following tabulations are appropriated or allocated out of money not otherwise appropriated or allocated.

### PART B

**Sec. B-1**. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made to provide funding for approved reclassifications and range changes.

### PART C

Sec. C-1. 20-A MRSA §13013-A, as amended by PL 2021, c. 398, Pt. JJ, §1 is further amended to read:

1. **Department of Education salary supplement.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of Education shall provide a public school teacher, or a teacher in a publicly supported secondary school, or a teacher employed by an education service center as authorized

<u>under Title 20-A, Chapter 123</u> who has attained certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, or its successor organization, with an annual national board certification salary supplement for the life of the certificate. The salary supplement must be added to the teacher's base salary and must be considered in the calculation for contributions to the Maine Public Employees Retirement System. If a nationally certified teacher is no longer employed as a teacher, the supplement ceases. The amount of the salary supplement is:

A. For fiscal year 2012-13, \$2,500;

B. For fiscal year 2013-14, \$2,750;

C. For fiscal year 2014-15 and succeeding years, except for a teacher under paragraph D, \$3,000; and

D. For fiscal year 2020-21 and succeeding years, for a teacher who is employed in a school in which at least 50% of students qualify for a free or reduced-price lunch under chapter 223, subchapter 7 during the year that the supplement is provided, \$5,000.

**1-A. Funding revenue**. The National Board Certification Salary Supplement Fund is established as a nonlapsing dedicated fund within the Department of Education beginning in fiscal year 2012-13. The salary supplement under subsection 1 must be funded from fees collected by the department pursuant to section 13007, subsection 1.

**2. Local filing; certification**. On or before October 15th annually, the superintendent of schools of a school administrative unit, or the chief administrative officer of a publicly supported secondary school, an education service center or a career and technical education region shall file with the commissioner a certified list of national board-certified teachers eligible to receive the salary supplement pursuant to subsection 1.

**3. Payment**. If there are available resources, the department shall provide the salary supplement to school administrative units, <u>and</u>-publicly supported secondary schools<u>and</u> <u>education service centers</u> for eligible teachers no later than February 15th of each year. The salary supplement paid may be prorated.

**4. Expend funds**. A school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center may expend funds received through the salary supplement under subsection 1 without calling for a special meeting of the local legislative body.

**5.** Scholarship fund. The National Board Certification Scholarship Fund is established as a nonlapsing dedicated fund, referred to in this subsection as "the scholarship fund," within the Department of Education to encourage teachers to apply to and enroll in the certification program offered by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or its successor organization, referred to in this subsection and subsection 6 as "the certification program." A school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center may request scholarship funds on behalf of its teachers who meet the requirements set forth in subsection 6. The department shall award funds according to this subsection.

A. In fiscal year 2012-13, the department shall allocate \$50,000 from fees collected by the department pursuant to section 13007, subsection 1 to the scholarship fund. The department shall

award an amount equal to the cost of the certification program less any other funds received by the applicant on a first-come first-served basis for the first 20 teachers accepted into the certification program annually.

B. Beginning in fiscal year 2013-14, the department shall allocate \$75,000 from fees collected by the department pursuant to section 13007, subsection 1 each fiscal year to the scholarship fund. The department shall award an amount equal to the cost of enrollment in the certification program less any other funds received by the applicant to not more than 30 teachers accepted into the program annually.

**6. Eligibility requirements**. In order to receive scholarship funds according to subsection 5 on behalf of a teacher, the school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school <u>or an education service center</u> must certify to the department that the teacher:

A. Is currently employed by a school administrative unit, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center;

B. Has completed at least 3 years of teaching in the State;

C. Has agreed to mentor at least one other teacher employed in the State through the national board certification process to apply to and enroll in the certification program;

D. Has provided documentation of acceptance into the certification program; and

E. Has disclosed any other funds received to cover the cost of the certification program.

**7.** Nonlapsing funds. Any unencumbered balance of the National Board Certification Scholarship Fund under subsection 5 remaining at the end of a fiscal year may not lapse but must be carried forward to be used for the same purpose.

## Sec. C-2. 20-A MRSA §15675, sub-§2, ¶A-1 is enacted to read:

A-1. Notwithstanding paragraph A, for fiscal year 2022-23 only, an additional weight of .20. The number of economically disadvantaged students for each school administrative unit is determined by multiplying the number of resident pupils in the most recent calendar year by the greater of the three most recent years elementary free or reduced-price meals percentage. The elementary free or reduced-price meals percentage may be applied to determine the number of economically disadvantaged students in the unit's secondary grades.

**Sec. C-3. 20-A MRSA §15678, sub-§2,** ¶**A-1,** as amended by PL 2021, c.29, Pt. C, §4 is further amended to read:

A-1. Notwithstanding paragraph A, for fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 only, for the elementary school level, the student-to-teacher ratio is 16:1.

## Sec. C-4. 20-A MRSA §15678, sub-§2, ¶B-1 is enacted to read:

A-1. Notwithstanding paragraph A, for fiscal year 2022-23 only, for the middle school level, the student-to-teacher ratio is 16:1.

## Sec. C-5. 20-A MRSA §15688-A, sub-§10 is enacted to read:

<u>10. Career and Technical Education Early Childhood Program Expansion support.</u> Beginning in fiscal year 2022-2023, the Commissioner may expend and disburse funds to career and technical education centers and career and technical education regions for the purpose of expanding or developing early childhood education programs.

## Sec. C-6. 20-A MRSA §15689, sub-§16 is enacted to read:

**16. English Learner budgetary hardship adjustment.** Beginning in fiscal year 2022-2023, the following provisions apply to adjustments for English Learner budgetary hardships.

A. If a school administrative unit determined eligible pursuant to paragraph B petitions the Commissioner and demonstrates that the unexpected education costs of increased English Learner student enrollment will cause a budgetary hardship, the Commissioner may provide an amount equal to that school administrative unit's most recent enacted state share of the increased English Learner weighted allocation, as calculated pursuant to section 15675-1, resulting from the increased enrollment. If the school administrative unit's most recent enacted state share percentage is less than the statewide state share percentage enacted in section 15671-(B), then adjustment amount will be equal to the most recent enacted state share percentage.

B. The commissioner may determine that a school administrative unit is eligible for an adjustment under paragraph A if:

(1) The increased student enrollment is a result of the student(s) becoming the fiscal responsibility of the school administrative unit after the passage of the annual budget for the current fiscal year; and

(2) The school administrative unit's unexpected enrollment increase results in an increase of 5% or more in English Learner weighted allocation, as calculated pursuant to section 15675-1.

C. The funds for adjustments under paragraph A are limited to the amount appropriated by the Legislature for that purpose.

D. A school administrative unit may expend the funds from the adjustment under paragraph A without seeking approval of the school administrative unit's legislative body.

Sec. C-7. 20-A MRSA §15689-A, sub-§12, as amended by PL 2011, c. 702, §3, is further amended to read:

12. **National board certification salary supplement**. The commissioner may pay annual salary supplement payments to school administrative units, or a publicly supported secondary school or an education service center as authorized under Title 20-A, Chapter 123 for payment to school teachers who have attained certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or its successor organization pursuant to section 13013-A.

**Sec. C-8. Mill expectation.** The mill expectation pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15671-A for fiscal year 2022-23 is 7.10.

**Sec. C-9. Total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12.** The total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 for fiscal year 2022-23 is as follows:

**Sec. C-11. Authorization of payments.** If the State's continued obligation for any individual component contained in those sections of this Act that set the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 and the local and state contributions for that purpose exceeds the level of funding provided for that component, any unexpended balances occurring in other programs may be applied to avoid proration of payments for any individual component. Any unexpended balances from this Act may not lapse but must be carried forward for the same purpose.

**Sec. C-12. Limit of State's obligation.** Those sections of this Act that set the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 and the local and state contributions for that purpose may not be construed to require the State to provide payments that exceed the appropriation of funds for general purpose aid for local schools for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023.

Notwithstanding any limitation on the amount of securities that may be issued pursuant to section 1606, subsection 2, the authority may issue additional securities in an amount not to exceed \$39,500,000 outstanding at any one time for an inland fisheries and wildlife headquarters facility.

**Sec. D-2. Maine Governmental Facilities Authority; issuance of securities.** Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1606, subsection 2 and section 1610-O, and notwithstanding the limitation contained in Maine Revised Statues, Title 4, section 1606, subsection 2 regarding the amount of securities that may be issued, the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority is authorized to issue securities in its own name in an amount up to \$39,500,000. Proceeds must be used for the purpose of paying the costs associated with an inland fisheries and wildlife headquarters facility as designated by the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services.

**Sec. D-3. Land Purchase.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of Administrative and Financial Services is authorized to purchase the following parcels of land and any buildings thereon together with railroad crossing and access rights along the Kennebec River in the City of Augusta for an Inland Fisheries and Wildlife headquarters facility:

Parcel 1, the former "Mill Site" parcel situated on the easterly side of the Kennebec River in Augusta, described in deed from American Tissue Mills of Maine, LLC, to Augusta Tissue, LLC, recorded in the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds in Book 8226, Page 167, acquired by the City of Augusta for unpaid taxes, and such rights as may be needed over the Drum Barker Road for access to a public way;

Parcel 2, containing 4.51 acres, more or less, known as 32 Willow Street, situated on the easterly side of the Kennebec River in Augusta, and described as Parcel I in deed from OneSteel Recycling, Inc. to AIM Recycling USA LLC recorded in the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds in Book 11601, Page 178; and

Such rail crossings as may be needed for access to and from Parcels 1 and 2.

# PART D SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue additional securities up to an amount of \$39,500,000 for an inland fisheries and wildlife headquarters facility and provides authority for the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to purchase the land.

An<u>For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2020 but before January 1, 2022, an</u> eligible individual who files a return as a part-year resident in accordance with section 5224-A is allowed a credit against the tax otherwise due under this Part in the amount of 25% of the federal earned income credit for the same taxable year for an eligible part-year individual who does not have a qualifying child and 12% of the federal earned income credit for the same taxable year for an eligible part-year beginning after December 31, 2020 and before January 1, 2022, all eligible part-year individuals are allowed a credit in the amount of 20% of the federal earned income credit for the same taxable year for all other eligible part-year individuals, except that, for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2020 and before January 1, 2022, all eligible part-year individuals are allowed a credit in the amount of 20% of the federal earned income credit for the same taxable year, multiplied by a ratio, the numerator of which is the individual's Maine adjusted gross income as defined in section 5102, subsection 1-C, paragraph A for that portion of the taxable year during which the individual was a nonresident and the denominator of which is the individual's entire federal adjusted gross income, as modified by section 5122.

**3-A.** Part-year resident taxpayer; on or after January 1, 2022. For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022, an eligible individual who files a return as a part-year resident in accordance with section 5224-A is allowed a credit against the tax otherwise due under this Part in the amount of 50% of the federal earned income credit for the same taxable year for an eligible part-year individual who does not have a qualifying child and 25% of the federal earned income credit for the same taxable year for all other eligible part-year individuals, multiplied by a ratio, the numerator of which is the individual's Maine adjusted gross income as defined in section 5102, subsection 1-C, paragraph A for that portion of the taxable year during which the individual was a resident plus the individual's Maine adjusted gross income as defined in section 5102, subsection 1-C, paragraph B for that portion of the taxable year during which the individual was a nonresident and the denominator of which is the individual's entire federal adjusted gross income, as modified by section 5122.

# PART E SUMMARY

This Part increases the earned income tax credit for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022, from 25% to 50% of the federal earned income tax credit for individuals with no qualifying children and from 12% to 25% of the federal earned income tax credit for all other eligible individuals.

An accredited Maine community college, college or university must document for the student information required for purposes of the educational opportunity tax credit, including, once the student has earned the degree, the total principal of loans the student received as part of that student's financial aid package related to course work completed at the accredited Maine community college, college or university. The accredited Maine community college, college or university shall provide an original or certified copy to the student and shall retain a copy of the documentation in its files for at least 10 years after the student graduates.

### §5217-E. Student Loan Repayment Tax Credit

**1. Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

<u>A.</u> "Accredited community college, college or university" means an institution of higher education that is accredited by a regional accrediting association or by one of the specialized accrediting agencies recognized by the United States Secretary of Education.

B. "Earned income" has the same meaning as in the Code, Section 32(c)(2).

B. "Employer" has the same meaning as the term "employing unit," as defined in Title 26, section 1043, subsection 10.

C. "Financial aid package" means financial aid obtained by a student for attendance at an accredited community college, college or university for an associate, bachelor's or graduate degree obtained by the student from an accredited community college, college or university after December 31, 2007. "Financial aid package" may include private loans or less than the full amount of loans under federal programs, depending on the practices of the accredited community college, college or university.

D. "Qualified individual" means an individual, including the spouse filing a joint return with the individual under section 5221, who is eligible for the credit provided in this section. An individual is eligible for the credit if the individual:

(1) Obtained an associate, bachelor's or graduate degree from an accredited community college, college or university after December 31, 2007;

(2) During the taxable year, was a resident individual as defined in section 5102(5); and

(3) During the taxable year had earned income of at least the State minimum wage, as defined in Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 664, subsection 1, as adjusted for cost of living increases, as determined on January 1 of the taxable year, multiplied by 936 hours. The assessor may adopt rules reducing this amount if a portion of the taxable year falls within a disaster period. Rules adopted pursuant to this subparagraph are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

E. "Regional accrediting association" means a regional accrediting association that is either (1) any of the United States accrediting associations/commissions that comprise the Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions, or (2) an equivalent non-United States accrediting association, commission, or government entity that is a reliable authority on the quality of the education or training provided by the institutions of higher education it accredits or charters and that applies standards substantially equivalent to those utilized by the associations/commissions that comprise the Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions.

2. Credit allowed. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2022, a qualified individual is allowed a refundable credit against the tax imposed by this Part in accordance with the provisions of this section. The credit, with respect to a qualified individual, is equal to the amount of loan payments made directly by the taxpayer to the lender during the taxable year plus the amount of any carryover allowed in accordance with paragraph C, up to a maximum of \$2,000. The credit is created to implement the Job Creation Through Educational Opportunity Program established under Title 20-A, chapter 428-C.

A. A taxpayer may claim a credit under this section based on loan payments made directly by the taxpayer to a relevant lender or lenders only with respect to loans that are part of the qualified individual's financial aid package and only with respect to loan payment amounts paid directly by the taxpayer during that part of the taxable year that the qualified individual was a resident individual. Refinanced loans or consolidated loans that are part of the qualified individual's financial aid package are eligible for the credit under this section if the refinanced loans or consolidated loans remain separate from other debt, but only in proportion to the portion of the loan payments that are otherwise eligible under this section.

B. Loans obtained from a person related to the qualified individual or from any person by reason of a loan under any qualified employer plan or under a contract referred to in the Code, Section 72(p)(5) do not qualify for the credit under this section. For purposes of this paragraph, a person is considered related to the qualified individual if that person meets the criteria listed in the Code, Section 267(b) or Section 707(b)(1). As used in this paragraph, "qualified employer plan" has the same meaning as in the Code, Section 72(p)(4).

C. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2022 and before January 1, 2027, a qualified individual with unused carryover credits pursuant to section 5217-D, subsection 2, paragraph A from the credit for educational opportunity generated in the past 10 years, may carry over and apply to the credit amount allowed pursuant to this section the portion, as reduced from year to year, of any unused credits.

D. A qualified individual may only receive a credit otherwise allowed pursuant to this section up to a total lifetime credit cap amount of \$25,000.

Sec. H-15. 36 MRSA §5122, sub-§ 2, ¶ FF, as amended by PL 2013, c. 525, §14, is repealed.

### PART J SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$6,500,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Military Reserve Fund to settle outstanding obligations of the Maine Military Authority.

### PART K

Sec. K-1. Transfer; Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital to a COVID-19 response fund. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller may transfer up to \$8,500,000 from the balance available in the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital to a COVID-19 response fund established by the State Controller to address funding needs related to the novel coronavirus disease, known as COVID-19, through June 30, 2023. Amounts transferred may be expended based on allotment established by financial order approved by the State Budget Officer and the Governor. The amounts transferred are considered adjustments to appropriations. The Governor shall inform the Legislative Council and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs immediately upon such a transfer from the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital. Any remaining balance in the COVID-19 response fund on July 1, 2023 must be transferred by the State Controller to the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital. All amounts received as reimbursement for expenses originally paid by the COVID-19 response fund, up to \$8,500,000, from any funding source whatsoever, must be returned to the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital in accordance with this section.

## PART K SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to transfer up to \$8,500,000 from the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital to a COVID-19 response fund. The funds may be expended based on allotment established by financial order approved by the State Budget Officer and the Governor. Any reimbursements received for expenses paid from these funds must be returned to the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital. Any remaining balance in the COVID-19 response fund on July 1, 2023 must be transferred by the State Controller to the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital.

#### PART L

Sec. L-1. COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account established. The State Controller shall establish a nonlapsing COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account, which is funded through a transfer from the available balance of the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund pursuant to section 2 of this Part.

Sec. L-2. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$411,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Administrative & Financial Services, COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Fund account for the purpose of providing payments to help eligible Maine citizens recover from economic impacts from the epidemic related to coronavirus disease 2019, referred to in this Part as "the COVID-19 pandemic." At the close of fiscal year 2023-24, amounts remaining in the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account must be transferred to the Budget Stabilization Fund.

**Sec. L-3. COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program established.** The COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program is established to help Maine people respond to the economic fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic and enable Maine people to combat rising costs due to pandemic-induced inflation and supply-chain impacts. This relief payment can be utilized by eligible Maine citizens to offset expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, including, without limitation, personal, family, living or funeral expenses.

**1. Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

- A. "Assessor" means the State Tax Assessor.
- **B**. "Eligible Maine citizen" means an individual who:
  - (1) Filed, by October 31, 2022, a Maine income tax return as a full-year resident of the State for the tax year;
  - (2) Has federal adjusted gross income for the tax year of less than:
    (a) For individuals filing married joint returns or surviving spouses permitted to file a joint return, \$150,000;
    - (b) For an individual filing as a head of household, \$112,500;
    - (c) For a single individual, \$75,000; or
    - (d) For married persons filing separate returns, \$75,000; and
  - (3) May not be claimed as a dependent on another taxpayer's return for that tax year.

**C.** "Fund" means the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account established by the State Controller pursuant to section 1.

**D.** "Relief payment" means the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment determined pursuant to subsection 2.

**E.** "Tax year" means a tax year beginning on or after January 1, 2021 but not later than December 31, 2021.

Any other terms used in this section have the same meaning as when used in a comparable context in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, Part 8 relating to Maine income taxes, unless different meanings are clearly required.

**2. COVID Pandemic Relief Payment.** The assessor shall make COVID Pandemic Relief payments in accordance with this subsection.

A. The assessor shall identify each eligible Maine citizen, as defined pursuant to subsection 1.

B. Beginning on or after July 1, 2022 but not later than December 31, 2022, the assessor shall make a \$510 relief payment to each eligible Maine citizen. Funds for the relief payments must come from the Fund and are not subject to setoff to debts owed to agencies of the State.

C. An individual who has not received a payment under paragraph B may provide documentation to the assessor by March 31, 2023 showing that the individual is an eligible Maine citizen. The assessor shall review the documentation, determine if the individual is an eligible Maine citizen and notify the individual of any adverse determination. This determination is final agency action not reviewable pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 151.

D. By June 30, 2023, the assessor shall make a \$510 relief payment to each eligible Maine citizen determined eligible pursuant to paragraph C. Funds for the relief payments must come from the Fund and are not subject to setoff to debts owed to agencies of the State.

**Sec. L-4. State income tax subtraction modification.** For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022 but not later than December 31, 2023, in determining the taxable income of a resident individual, within the meaning of the Maine Revised Statues, Title 36, section 5122, federal adjusted gross income shall be reduced by an amount equal to the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment received by the taxpayer pursuant to this Part, to the extent the payment is included in federal adjusted gross income for the taxable year.

Sec. L-5. Designation as unclaimed property. For purposes of the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program, COVID Pandemic Relief Payment checks that remain undeposited on

January 1, 2024, are to be treated as unclaimed property, not subject to the notice and receipt provisions set forth in 33 M.R.S. § 2101 and the one-year dormancy period set forth in 33 M.R.S. § 2061, as applied to such checks. The State Treasurer shall use unclaimed property systems and networks to find the proper recipients of such checks as quickly as possible to reduce the adverse economic consequences of COVID-19.

## PART L SUMMARY

This Part creates the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program to provide COVID Pandemic Relief Payments to eligible Maine citizens to promote the general welfare of the citizens of the State for reasonable and necessary unreimbursed expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic disaster. To fund the program, this Part creates the COVID Pandemic Relief Payment Program Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account and transfers \$411,000,000 to the Fund from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund. The Fund may be used for a \$510 payment to each eligible Maine citizen and the costs of administration, programming, mailing, public outreach, and taxpayer assistance associated with the program.

#### §1802. Bureau of Parks and Lands established

There is established within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry the Bureau of Parks and Lands, which shall carry out the responsibilities of State Government relating to parks, historic sites, submerged and intertidal lands, public reserved lands and nonreserved public lands.

**1. Director.** The executive head of the bureau is the director.

A. The powers and duties of the position of director may not be combined with any other position within the bureau or department.

B. The position of director may not be filled in an acting capacity; the appointee must be a permanent full-time employee.

**2. Deputy director.** The director is assisted in executive duties by a deputy director. <u>The deputy director position is a classified, confidential position.</u>

**3. Personal attendance to duties.** The director and the deputy director shall attend personally to the duties of their offices as far as practicable.

**4. Appointment.** The director and the deputy director are <u>is appointed</u> by and will serve at the pleasure of the commissioner.

# PART M SUMMARY

This Part changes the Deputy Director position from serving at the pleasure of the Commissioner to a classified, confidential position.

A. Deputy Commissioners;

# PART N SUMMARY

This Part changes the Deputy Commissioner reference in the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry's major policy-influencing positions list from singular to plural.

### PART O

Sec. O-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Community-based Greenhouses. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$1,500,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Community-based Greenhouse-Bureau of Agriculture, Other Special Revenue Funds account for grants for durable (glass, polycarbonate, etc.) greenhouse structures and associated siting and installation costs to schools, community centers, and other eligible public entities as determined by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry.

# PART O SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Community-based Greenhouse-Bureau of Agriculture, Other Special Revenue Funds account. The transfer provides funds for the Department to make grants for community-based greenhouses to schools, community centers, and other eligible public entities for shared and educational uses, and to enhance community-based opportunities for food production.

# PART P

Sec. P-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; PFAS Reserve-Bureau of Agriculture. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$3,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, PFAS Reserve-Bureau of Agriculture, Other Special Revenue Funds account for the purposes of abating, cleaning up and mitigating threats or hazards posed by perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substance, or PFAS, contamination affecting agricultural producers in the State and the food supply, to provide support to affected farms, to support critical PFAS research and to otherwise allow for the department to strategically and effectively respond to PFAS concerns and issues as they arise.

## PART P SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$3,000,000 on or before June 30, 2022 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, PFAS Reserve-Bureau of Agriculture, Other Special Revenue Funds account to assist farmers and agricultural producers in the State that have been affected by PFAS contamination, to support critical PFAS research and to otherwise allow for the department to strategically and effectively respond to PFAS concerns and issues.

# PART Q

Sec. Q-1. 2 MRSA §6, sub-§3 is amended to read:

**3. Range 89.** The salaries of the following state officials and employees are within salary range 89:

Director, Bureau of General Services;

Director, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and Lottery Operations; State Budget Officer; State Controller; Director, Bureau of Forestry; Director, Governor's Office of Policy Innovation and Management the Future; Director, Energy Resources Office; Director, Energy Resources Office; Director, Bureau of Parks and Lands; Director, Bureau of Parks and Lands; Director, Bureau of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources; Director, Bureau of Resource Information and Land Use Planning; and-Director, Office of Marijuana Policy; and-Director, Office of Affordable Healthcare.

# PART Q SUMMARY

This Part adds the Director, Office of Affordable Healthcare to the list of positions with salaries set by the Governor. The Office of Affordable Healthcare was established in Public Law 2021, chapter 459, An Act to Lower Health Care Costs through the Establishment of the Office of Affordable Health Care. Positions and funding for the Office were created in Public Law 2021, chapter 484, An Act to Clarify Funding for the Office of Affordable Health Care. The enacted legislation created the Director position and identified it as appointed but did not include it as a position with salary set by the Governor.

### PART R

Sec. R-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Victim's Compensation Fund. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$750,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Office of the Attorney General, Victim's Compensation Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account to support financial reimbursement for losses suffered by victims of violent crime and their families and reimburses hospitals for sexual assault examinations.

# PART R SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$750,000 on or before June 30, 2022 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Office of the Attorney General, Victim's Compensation Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account to support the operations of the program. Revenues for the program declined during the pandemic. This funding will support financial reimbursement for

losses suffered by victims of violent crime and their families and reimburses hospitals for sexual assault examinations.

## PART S

Sec. S-1. Transfer of Personal Services balances to All Other; Department of Corrections. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, for fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 only, the Department of Corrections is authorized to transfer available balance of Personal Services appropriations and allocations in the Long Creek Youth Development Center program after all salary, benefit and other obligations are met to the All Other line category of the Long Creek Youth Development Center program for the purposes of funding juvenile community programs and services. These amounts may be transferred by financial order upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor. These transfers are not considered adjustments to appropriations.

# PART S SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the Department of Corrections to transfer by financial order available Personal Services balances in the Long Creek Youth Development Center program, for fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 only, in order to fund juvenile community programs and services.

Sec. T-1. Carrying provision; Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management Agency. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller shall carry forward any unexpended balance of the \$400,000 provided under Public Law 2021, chapter 398, in the All Other line category at the end of fiscal year 2021-22 to fiscal year 2022-23 in the Administration-Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management Agency to continue the environmental closure activity costs at the former Maine Military Authority site in Limestone.

This Part carries forward the remaining portion of one-time funding for environmental closure activity costs at the former Maine Military Authority site in Limestone appropriated in Public Law 2021, chapter 398. Two sequential contracts are required to conduct a full background investigation and sampling plan and then use the results of the first contract to

develop remedial action plans. Given the environmental and weather conditions of Northern Maine, these closure activities will extend into fiscal year 2022-23. Therefore, a portion of the \$400,000 provided under Public Law 2021, chapter 398 will be needed in next fiscal year.

1. **Program established; administration.** The Housing Opportunity Program is established within the department to encourage and support the development of additional housing units in Maine, including housing units that are affordable for low and moderate income people and housing units targeted to community workforce housing needs. The department shall administer the program and provide technical and financial assistance to support communities implementing zoning and land uses related policies required to support increased housing development. The program will support regional approaches, municipal model ordinance development, and will encourage policy that supports increased housing density where feasible to protect working and natural lands.

**2. Housing Opportunity Fund.** The Housing Opportunity Fund referred to in this section as "the fund," is established as a fund within the department for the purpose of providing funds for the program. The fund consists of money appropriated to the fund by the Legislature and any funds received by the department for the purposes of the program.

**A. Service Provider grants.** The department shall solicit applications for grants from the fund through a competitive application process that may be awarded to experienced service providers to support municipal ordinance development, technical assistance, and public process and community engagement support. These programs may encourage regional coordination between municipalities.

**B. Community Housing Incentive Program grants**. The department shall solicit applications for the following:

1. Community housing planning grants to be awarded through a competitive process to municipalities to support the creation of housing development plans which include ordinance and policy amendments to support those plans. The grants shall be awarded for a period of up to three years, with required progress reports each year.

2. Community housing implementation grants to be awarded through a competitive process to support the implementation of community housing priorities.

**C. Direct Technical Assistance**. The department shall provide technical assistance, housing policy development, and guidance directly to regional groups, municipalities and other housing stakeholders, to the extent feasible with available resources. This may include, but is not limited

to, assisting municipalities with information about available grant opportunities, sharing best practices from jurisdictions inside and outside of Maine, providing model language for local ordinances and policies, and providing information to the general public which may support local and statewide policy changes meant to increase the supply of housing.

**3. Program evaluation.** Any recipient of grant funds through this program shall cooperate with the department in performing program evaluation and specific reporting requirements.

**4. Report.** By January 15, 2024, the department shall report to the Governor and the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over economic development and housing matters about the program with any recommendations for changes in the statutes to improve the program and its delivery of services to municipalities. The joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over economic development and housing matters may report out a bill relating to this program and continued funding.

# PART U SUMMARY

This Part establishes the Housing Opportunity Program within the Department of Economic and Community Development to encourage and support the development of additional housing units in Maine, including housing units that are affordable to low and moderate income people and housing units targeted to community workforce housing needs.

The Department of Education shall notify the bond bank of any approved project, projects or part of any project under this subsection.

6. Debt service. Debt service costs for bonds issued by the bond bank to career and technical education centers and career and technical education regions for equipment purchases pursuant to this section must be paid by the State. Debt service costs must be paid by the Commissioner of Education to the bond bank according to each career and technical education center's or career and technical education region's debt retirement schedule developed by the bond bank. The first priority in the work of the program and any contract for ombudsman services must be case-specific advocacy services. In performing services under this section, the program, as it determines to be appropriate, may create and maintain records and case-specific reports. Any work on systems improvements or lobbying must be adjunctive to case-specific activities. The program may: A. Provide information to the public about the services of the program through a comprehensive outreach program. The ombudsman shall provide information through a toll-free telephone number or numbers and a publicly accessible website;

B. Answer inquiries, investigate and work toward resolution of complaints regarding the performance and services of the department and participate in conferences, meetings and studies that may improve the performance of the department;

C. Provide services to persons to assist them in protecting their rights;

D. Inform persons of the means of obtaining services from the department;

E. Provide information and referral services;

F. Analyze and provide opinions and recommendations to agencies, the Governor and the Legislature on <u>current or proposed</u> state programs, rules, policies and laws;

G. Determine what types of complaints and inquiries will be accepted for action by the program and adopt policies and procedures regarding communication with persons making inquiries or complaints and the department;

H. Apply for and utilize grants, gifts and funds for the purpose of performing the duties of the program; and

I. Collect and analyze records and data relevant to the duties and activities of the program and make reports as required by law or determined to be appropriate.

The department or designee of the department shall notify the ombudsman of any statewide policy changes affecting the State's child welfare system before the changes take effect.

Sec. BB-4. 22 MRSA §4087-A, sub-§12 is enacted to read:

**12. Notification of child fatality required**. The department shall notify the ombudsman of a fatality of a child if:

A. The child was involved with child welfare services at any time; or

B. The fatality is suspected of being the result of abuse or neglect.

Notification under this subsection must occur within 48 hours of a determination by the department that this subsection applies to the fatality. The notification may be provided by oral or electronic communication.

# PART BB SUMMARY

- 8. It clarifies that the ombudsman program provides services to persons and families involved with the State's child welfare system.
- 9. It requires that the Department of Health and Human Services to notify the ombudsman program of any statewide policy changes affecting the State's child welfare system before the changes take effect.
- 10. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services to notify the ombudsman program of certain child fatalities.

On Until July 1, 2022, on or before the 15th day of each month, the State Controller shall transfer all revenues received by the assessor during the preceding month pursuant to the tax imposed by section 2552, subsection 1, paragraphs G to J and M to the Medical Care Services Other Special Revenue Funds account, the Other Special Revenue Funds Mental Health Services - Community Medicaid program, the Medicaid Services - Adult Developmental Services program and the Office of Substance Abuse - Medicaid Seed program within the Department of Health and Human Services. Beginning July 1, 2022, on or before the 15th day of each month, the State Controller shall transfer all revenues received by the assessor during the preceding month pursuant to the tax imposed by section 2552, subsection 1, paragraphs G to J and M to the Medical Care -Payments to Providers program, Other Special Revenue Funds account.

Sec. EE-2. 36 MRSA §2873, sub-§4, ¶B is amended to read:

B. All Until July 1, 2022, all revenues received by the assessor during the month pursuant to this chapter from residential treatment facilities net of refunds must be credited to the Residential Treatment Facilities Assessment Other Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of Health and Human Services. Beginning July 1, 2022, all revenues received by the assessor during the month pursuant to this chapter from residential treatment facilities net of refunds must be credited to the Nursing Facilities Other Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of Health and Human Services. Beginning October 1, 2011, a percentage equal to the State's annual Federal Medical Assistance percentage of the revenues generated by the increase in the tax rate from 5.5% to 6% received by the assessor during the month must be credited to an Other Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of Health and Human Services, Developmental Services Waiver - Supports program and all revenues credited to that account must be applied to providing services to individuals on the waiting list for the community support benefit provided under a federal 1915(c) waiver under the MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Section 29. The balance must be credited to an Other Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of Health and Human Services, Medicaid Services - Developmental Services program.

Sec. EE-3. PL 2021, c. 398, Pt. SS is repealed.

# PART EE SUMMARY

This Part repeals the language associated with the consolidation of MaineCare related programs and accounts approved in Public Law 2021, chapter 398. Due to technical adjustments that would need to be made and the volume of MaineCare related systems work already in process, this initiative cannot be completed within the required timeframe.

#### PART FF

Sec. FF-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; MaineCare Stabilization Fund. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller shall transfer \$30,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the MaineCare Stabilization Fund established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 3174-KK on or before June 30, 2022.

**Sec. FF-2. Transfer for MaineCare payments.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller may transfer from the balance available in the MaineCare Stabilization Fund established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 3174-KK for MaineCare payments in the Department of Health and Human Services. Amounts transferred may be expended based on allotment established by financial order upon recommendation by the State Budget Officer and approval by the Governor. The amounts transferred are considered adjustments to appropriations. The Governor shall inform the Legislative Council and the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and health and human services matters immediately upon such a transfer from the MaineCare Stabilization Fund.

## PART FF SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$30,000,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the MaineCare Stabilization Fund.

### PART GG

**Sec. GG-1. Transfer of American Rescue Plan savings funds.** Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585 or any other provision of law to the contrary, until June 30, 2023, balances of appropriations in various General Fund accounts in the Department of Health and Human Services, MaineCare program that are available as part of the increased 10% Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) for MaineCare Home and Community Based Services per

the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, section 9817, may be transferred by financial order, upon recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor, to the Medical Care – Payments to Providers program, Home and Community Based Services – ARP Savings, Other Special Revenue Funds account and the Office of MaineCare Services program, Home and Community Based Services Admin – ARP Savings, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Health and Human Services to be used for federally authorized purposes.

### PART GG SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to transfer savings incurred from the increase in FMAP per the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, section 9817, from various General Fund MaineCare program accounts to Other Special Revenue Funds accounts in the Medical Care - Payments to Providers and the Office of MaineCare Services programs to be used for federally authorized purposes.

### PART HH

Sec. HH-1. Carrying balances; Department of Health and Human Services Food Supplement Administration program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, beginning with fiscal year 2021-22, the State Controller shall carry forward, to be used for the same purposes, any unexpended balance of the \$1,335,770 appropriated in Public Law 2021, chapter 1 in the All Other line category in the Office for Family Independence - Food Supplement Administration program, General Fund account for the purpose of reinvestment to resolve obligations to the federal government for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program error penalty incurred in federal fiscal year 2019.

## PART HH SUMMARY

This Part allows the Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Family Independence to carry forward any unexpended balance of the \$1,335,770 appropriated in Public Law 2021, chapter 1 to meet reinvestment obligations for penalties incurred in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program in 2019.

#### PART II

**Sec. II-1. Sec. JJ-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Maine Civil Legal Services. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$1,300,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to Maine Civil Legal Services, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Judicial Branch to support the increased costs for civil legal services for persons unable to afford a lawyer by providing additional funds available for distribution by the Civil Legal Service Fund pursuant to Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 18-A, subsection 1.

# PART JJ SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$1,300,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to Maine Civil Legal Services, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Judicial Branch to support the increased costs for civil legal services for persons unable to afford a lawyer by providing additional funds available for distribution by the Civil Legal Service Fund. This is a one-time transfer to support increased costs resulting from the pandemic.

## PART KK

Sec. KK-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Paid Family and Medical Leave Study. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$300,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Legislature, Study Commissions - Funding Other Special Revenue Funds account to support the costs of contracting with an outside entity to conduct and complete an actuarial study as required for the Commission To Develop a Paid Family and Medical Leave Benefits Program.

# PART KK SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$300,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Legislature, Study Commissions - Funding Other Special Revenue Funds account to support the costs of contracting with an outside entity to conduct and complete an actuarial study as required for the Commission To Develop a Paid Family and Medical Leave Benefits Program.

#### PART LL

#### Sec. LL-1. 27 MRSA §10 is enacted to read:

#### **§10. Imagination Library of Maine Fund**

The Imagination Library of Maine Program is hereby established within the Maine State Library. The State Librarian shall administer the Imagination Library of Maine Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund." The fund may receive appropriations, allocations, grants or gifts from public and private sources, and eligible federal funds. All moneys included in the fund shall be appropriated for the purposes set forth in this section.

- 1. **Fund Purpose**. The purpose of the program shall be to promote and encourage reading by children of the state of Maine and to develop a statewide initiative for encouraging children to develop a love of reading by providing age-appropriate books to children at their homes from birth to age 5 on a monthly basis.
- A. The fund shall provide a 50% dollar match of the necessary funds, if available, to support local partners in the provision of one (1) book per month for registered children through the program described in this section.
- B. The State Librarian, or their designee, shall manage the daily operations and provide oversight of the fund including but not limited to establishing region-based programs throughout Maine and advancing and stretching the programs to ensure enrollment growth, and administration of the 50% dollar match from the fund for each program.

- C. Develop, promote and coordinate a public awareness program to make donors aware of the opportunity to donate to the Imagination Library of Maine Fund.
- D. Develop, promote and coordinate a public awareness program to make the public aware of the opportunity to register children to receive age-appropriate books on a monthly basis. To receive books on a monthly basis, a child shall be under the age of 5 and shall have a Maine residence.
- 2. **Reporting**. The State Librarian shall submit a report that includes updates on the implementation of the Fund and recommendations to the Governor and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters by January 31, 2023.

Sec. LL-2. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Imagination Library of Maine Fund. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller shall transfer \$200,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Imagination Library of Maine Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Maine State Library on or before June 30, 2022 to provide funding for the creation of the Imagination Library of Maine Fund.

## PART LL SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$200,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to Imagination Library of Maine Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Maine State Library. The initiative will provide funding for the creation of the Imagination Library of Maine Fund with a goal to promote and encourage reading by children of the state of Maine and to develop a statewide initiative for encouraging children to develop a love of reading by providing age-appropriate books to children at their homes from birth to age 5 on a monthly basis.

# PART MM

## Sec. MM-1. P&SL 1941, c. 37, §2, 2nd ¶ is amended to read:

The Maine Maritime Academy by action of its board may borrow money, not in excess of \$10,000,000 in the aggregate at any one time outstanding, make and issue negotiable notes, bonds and other evidences of indebtedness or obligations of the academy for the construction of dormitories, dining facilities, student union, and any other buildings and improvements, including land acquisition in connection therewith, and equipment and furnishings therefor, or in anticipation of appropriated state or federal funds, and secure the payment of such obligations or any part thereof by mortgaging its properties or pledging any part of its revenues, and do all other lawful things necessary and incidental to the foregoing powers, except that the portion entire amount of any borrowing for which the related debt service is funded by an appropriation by the State, in whole or in part, or contractually committed to the Maine Maritime Academy from 3rd-party

sources, including foundations, public-private partnership arrangements or donors, is not included in calculating the amount limitation in this paragraph. The Maine Maritime Academy may borrow money or accept grants from federal and state governments and agencies thereof and from any other sources, or both. Such construction shall be under the supervision of the Bureau of General Services.

## PART MM SUMMARY

This Part provides that the entire amount of any borrowing where at least part of the related debt service will be funded by a commitment from the Maine Legislature should be excluded from the total amount limitation.

#### PART NN

Sec. NN-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Reserve for retirement benefits. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer up to \$14,700,000 an amount certified by the Executive Director of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to a retirement benefits reserve account established within the General Fund for the purpose of providing the resources to fund a one-time retirement payment for retired state employees and teachers.

## PART NN SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to transfer up to \$14,700,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to a reserve for retirement benefits established within the General Fund in 5 MRSA \$1552. The purpose of the transfer is to fund a one-time retirement payment for retired state employees and teachers.

## PART OO

Sec. OO-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; MCCS Free Community College - 2 Enrollment Years. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller shall transfer \$20,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the MCCS Free Community College - 2 Enrollment Years, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Maine Community College System on or before June 30, 2022 to provide two years of free community college for all high school graduates in the Classes of 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023 who enroll in a Maine community college full-time in the fall of 2022 or the fall of 2023.

**Sec. OO-2. Reporting.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, by October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023 the Maine Community College System shall submit a report to the Governor and the legislative committee having jurisdiction over education matters on the utilization and success of the pilot project.

# PART OO SUMMARY

This Part requires the transfer of \$20,000,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the MCCS Free Community College - 2 Enrollment Years, Other Special Revenue Funds account. The initiative will be directed at students who graduated from high school in the Classes of 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023, enroll in a Maine community college on a full-time basis, and matriculate towards a degree. Students from the classes of '20, '21 and '22 must enroll or be enrolled in the fall of 2022. Students from the Class of 2023 must enroll in the fall of 2023. This Part also requires the Maine Community College System to report to the Governor and the Legislature on utilization and success of the pilot project.

#### PART PP

Sec. PP-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Highway and Bridge Capital. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$85,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Transportation, Highway and Bridge Capital, Other Special Revenue Funds account for the purpose of supporting highway and bridge projects.

Sec. PP-2. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Multimodal Transportation Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$15,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Transportation, Multimodal Transportation Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account for the purpose of supporting multimodal transportation projects.

### PART PP SUMMARY

This Part requires one-time transfers from the General Fund unappropriated surplus in fiscal year 2021-22 to the Highway & Bridge Capital, Other Special Revenue Funds account and the Multimodal Transportation Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Transportation to support highway, bridge and multimodal transportation projects.

# An Act Making Unified Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, Highway Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2022 and June 30, 2023

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due and payable immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

## PART A

**Sec. A-1. Appropriations and allocations.** In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of State Government and other purposes for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2022 and June 30, 2023, the following sums as designated in the following tabulations are appropriated or allocated out of money not otherwise appropriated or allocated.

# An Act Making Unified Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2023

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due and payable immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

## PART A

**Sec. A-1. Appropriations and allocations.** In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of State Government and other purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, the following sums as designated in the following tabulations are appropriated or allocated out of money not otherwise appropriated or allocated.

#### PART B

**Sec. B-1**. **Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and allocations are made to provide funding for approved reclassifications and range changes.

#### PART C

**Sec. C-1. State Fiscal Recovery Funds encumbered balances.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, encumbered balances within the Federal Expenditures Fund – ARP State Fiscal Recovery may be carried forward through fiscal year 2025-26.

**Sec. C-2. Continuation of limited-period positions.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, limited-period positions funded with Federal Expenditures Fund – State Fiscal Recovery authorized in Public Law 2021, chapter 483, An Act To Provide Allocations for the Distribution of State Fiscal Recovery Funds may be extended beyond two-years by financial order but not later than June 30, 2025.

Sec. C-3. Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Parks General Operations program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the funds allocated in Public Law 2021, chapter 483, Part T for the Parks General Operations program, Federal Expenditures Fund – ARP State Fiscal Recovery account may be used for the Allagash Wilderness Waterway.

**Sec. C-4. Available Balances.** The following initiatives in Public Law 2021, Chapter 483 were not implemented:

- Part KK Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Agriculture, contracted facilitation services, total allocation \$72,400
- Part R Department of Transportation, Multimodal Transportation Fund, construction of a confined aquatic disposal cell within the Port of Portland and maintenance dredging of the marine facilities of Portland and South Portland, total allocation \$10,000,000
- Part DD Department of Health and Human Services, Medical Care Payments to Providers account, a pilot program for the reimbursement of a parent providing inhome personal care services, total allocation of \$465,000
- Part EE Department of Health and Human Services, Medical Care Payments to Providers account, provide equal monthly supplemental payments from January 2022 through December 2022 to all providers of services under the department's rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Section 2, Section 17, Section 26, Section 28 and Section 65 in equal proportion to the services provided by providers in the previous 12-month period, total allocation of \$5,958,014

Sec. C-5. Extension of The Small Business Health Insurance Premium Support Program. The Small Business Health Insurance Premium Support Program, "the program," as established by PL 2021, c. 483, shall remain in operation until December 31, 2023, or until such time as the original and additional funds allocated to the program shall be used, whichever occurs first. In the event that the credit amounts established through rulemaking cannot be provided in full for each qualifying small group plan during a month prior to December 2023, the program shall end on the latest month for which full credits can be provided.

Sec. C-6. Transfer of Federal Expenditures Fund – ARP State Fiscal Recovery balance; Insurance – Bureau of account to Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Fund account. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before January 31, 2024, the State Controller may transfer the available balance within the Department of Financial and Professional Services, Insurance – Bureau of, Federal Expenditures Fund – ARP State Fiscal Recovery account to the Finance Authority of Maine, Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Fund, Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Fund account. Transferred amounts may be allotted by financial order upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor. Sec. C-7. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

## **PROFESSIONAL AND FINANCIAL REGULATION, DEPARTMENT OF Insurance – Bureau of 0092**

Initiative: Provides one-time funding for a temporary premium relief program for small businesses that provide their employees with group health insurance.

## PART C SUMMARY

This Part recognizes initiatives that were not implemented and did not utilize the ARP State Fiscal Recovery Funds authorized in Public Law 2021, chapter 483 and allocates those balances to continue the temporary premium relief program and extends the program through December 2023. This Part also authorizes the transfer of unspent funds within the Bureau of Insurance to the Finance Authority of Maine, Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Fund. This Part also authorizes limited-period positions funded with Federal Expenditures Fund – ARP State Fiscal Recovery to be extended via financial order and authorizes the encumbered balances within the Federal Expenditures Fund – ARP State Fiscal Recovery to be carried forward through fiscal year 2025-26 to align with the period of performance authorized by the Federal Government. Lastly, this Part clarifies that funds approved in Public Law 2021, chapter 483 for state parks may be used for the Allagash Wilderness Waterway.

#### PART D

Sec. D-1. PL 2021, c. 398, Part M is amended to read:

Sec. M-1. Department of Administrative and Financial Services; lease-purchase authorization. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, in cooperation with the Treasurer of State, may enter into financing agreements in fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 for the acquisition of motor vehicles for the Central Fleet Management Division. The financing agreements entered into in each fiscal year may not exceed \$7,500,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$15,000,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 in principal costs, and a financing agreement may not exceed 6 years in duration. The interest rate may not exceed 7%. The annual principal and interest costs must be paid from the appropriate line category allocations in the Central Fleet Management Division account.

### PART D SUMMARY

This Part increases the borrowing authority of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to enter into financing arrangements in fiscal year 2022-23 for the acquisition of motor vehicles for the Central Fleet Management Division and adjusts the interest rate. The Division was unable to fully utilize the borrowing authority in fiscal year 2021-22 due to automobile supply issues.

## PART E

#### Sec. E-1. PL 2023, c. 1, Part B, §8 is enacted to read:

**Sec. B-8. Application to municipal general assistance program.** For purposes of the municipal general assistance program established pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes Title 22, chapter 1161, relief payments are not income as defined in Title 22, section 4301, subsection 7, may not be considered to reduce need, as defined in Title 22, section 4301, subsection 10, and may not be considered a potential resource as defined in Title 22, section 4317.

## PART E SUMMARY

This Part clarifies that the Winter Energy Relief Payment authorized in Public Law 2023, chapter 1 will not be included as income or a resource when determining an application for the municipal general assistance program.

### PART F

**Sec. F-1**. **Continuation of limited-period positions.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, all limited-period positions throughout State Government that are scheduled to expire during June 2023, are already funded through the end of fiscal year 2022-23 and are proposed to continue in the 2024-2025 biennium, are continued until August 1, 2023.

#### PART F SUMMARY

This Part authorizes an extension of the expiration date to August 1, 2023 for limited-period positions that are set to expire in June 2023 but are funded through fiscal year 2022-23 and are proposed to continue into the next biennium.

#### PART G

Sec. G-1. Payments to State from Maine Governmental Facilities Authority operating account. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority shall transfer \$149,955 from the balance in the authority's operating account to the State as undedicated revenue no later than June 30, 2023.

## PART G SUMMARY

This Part directs the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to transfer \$149,955 from the balance in the authority's operating account to the State as undedicated revenue no later than June 30, 2023. This balance is a result of the overpayment of debt service on closed bond issuances.

## PART H

Sec. H-1. Carry provision; Department of Administrative and Financial Services. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, at the end of fiscal year 2022-23, the State Controller shall carry forward to fiscal year 2023-24 any unexpended balance remaining in the Information Services, General Fund account.

## PART H SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to carry forward to fiscal year 2023-24 any unexpended balance appropriated in in the Information Services, General Fund account, All Other line category in fiscal year 2022-23 to be expended for the same purposes.

#### PART I

Sec. I-1. Transfer of Personal Services balances to All Other; Department of Administrative and Financial Services. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, for fiscal year 2022-23 only, the Department of Administrative and Financial Services is authorized to transfer available balances of Personal Services allocations in the Information Services program, General Fund account after all salary, benefit and other obligations are met to the All Other line category of the Information Services program, General Fund account for the purposes of funding statewide cybersecurity costs. These amounts may be transferred by financial order upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor. These transfers are not considered adjustments to appropriations.

### PART I SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to transfer by financial order available Personal Services balances in the Information Services program, General Fund account for fiscal year 2022-23 only, in order to fund statewide cybersecurity costs.

## PART J

**Sec. J-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall transfer \$6,600,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Retirement Allowance Fund within the Maine Public Employees Retirement System for the purpose of providing the resources to fund an additional one-time cost-of-living increase of 1.0% of the established 2022 maximum benefit subject to an increase for retirees from the state-sponsored retirement plans. The additional 1.0% applies to retirement benefit payments, up to a maximum of \$24,186.25, for the one-year period ending August 31, 2022. This additional increase applies to retirees who were eligible for a cost-of-living adjustment in September 2022. The additional increase made pursuant to this section is a one-time payment and is not included in the calculation of future benefit adjustments.

## PART J SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to transfer up to \$6,600,000 from unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Retirement Allowance Fund within the Maine Public Employees Retirement System and directs to Board to issue a one-time 1.0% retirement benefit payment.

### PART K

Sec. K-1. 7 MRSA §3906-B, sub-§2 is amended to read:

**2.** Animal Welfare Fund. The commissioner shall deposit all license fees received pursuant to chapters 721, 723, 725 and 735 in a separate account established by the Treasurer of State and known as the Animal Welfare Fund. The commissioner shall deposit 80% of the feed registration fees collected under section 714, subsection 1 and all revenue in excess of \$100,000 from the surcharge collected under section 714, subsection 4-in the Animal Welfare Fund. This account does not lapse, but continues from year to year. The commissioner shall pay from the Animal Welfare Fund the expense of furnishing license blanks, stickers and tags, travel expenses and salaries for necessary personnel, payments to animal shelters and expenses incurred in the administration of this Part.

### PART K SUMMARY

This Part resolves a conflict with Title 7 section 714, subsection 4, which directs the department to put everything in excess of \$157,000 in the Companion Animal Sterilization Fund.

## PART L

Sec. L-1. Carry provision; Department of Economic and Community Development. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, at the end of fiscal years 2022-23 and 2023-24, the State Controller shall carry forward into the next fiscal year any unexpended balance remaining of the \$2,756,126 appropriated in Public Law 2021, chapter 635 in the All Other line category in the Housing Opportunity Program, General Fund account for the purpose of supporting and encouraging the development of additional housing units in the State.

## PART L SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to carry forward to fiscal year 2023-24 and fiscal year 2024-25 any unexpended balance of the \$2,756,126 appropriated in in the Housing Opportunity Program, General Fund account, All Other line category in fiscal year 2022-23 to be expended for the same purposes.

#### PART M

Sec. M-1. Department of Health and Human Services, Medical Care Services – Payments to Providers account; lapsed balances. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, \$10,777,679 of unencumbered balance forward from the Department of Health and Human Services, Medical Care Services – Payments to Providers program, General Fund carrying account, All Other line category lapses to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund no later than June 30, 2023.

### PART M SUMMARY

This Part lapses \$10,777,679 of the unencumbered balance forward in the Department of Health and Human Services, Medical Care Services – Payments to Providers program, General Fund account to the General Fund in fiscal year 2022-23.

### PART N

Sec. N-1. Department of Health and Human Services, Nursing Facilities account; lapsed balances. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, \$6,161,154 of unencumbered balance forward from the Department of Health and Human Services, Nursing Facilities program,

General Fund carrying account, All Other line category lapses to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund no later than June 30, 2023.

## PART N SUMMARY

This Part lapses \$6,161,154 of the unencumbered balance forward of the Department of Health and Human Services, Nursing Facilities, General Fund account to the General Fund in fiscal year 2022-23.

#### PART O

Sec. O-1. Carry provision; Department of Secretary of State, Bureau of Administrative Services and Corporations program. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, at the end of fiscal year 2022-23 and fiscal year 2023-24, the State Controller shall carry forward any unexpended balance remaining of the \$259,000 appropriated in Public Law 2021, chapter 439, section 14 in the Department of Secretary of State, Bureau of Administrative Services and Corporations program, General Fund account, All Other line category to the next fiscal year to be used for contracted programming costs to implement online voter registration.

## PART O SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to carry forward up to \$259,000 of unexpended balance in the All Other line category in the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Administrative Services and Corporations program, at the end of fiscal years 2022-23 and 2023-24 to the All Other line category for the next fiscal year in the Department of Secretary of State, Bureau of Administrative Services and Corporations program to be used for contracted programming costs to implement online voter registration.

#### PART P

# An Act Making Unified Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, Highway Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Year June 30, 2023

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due and payable immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

## PART A

**Sec. A-1.** Appropriations and allocations. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of State Government and other purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, the following sums as designated in the following tabulations are appropriated or allocated out of money not otherwise appropriated or allocated.

#### PART B

Sec. B-1. Carrying provision; Department of Secretary of State, Administration - Motor Vehicles program. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller shall carry forward any unexpended balances in the All Other line categories in the Department of the Secretary of State, Administration - Motor Vehicles program, after all financial commitments for obligations and budgetary adjustments have been made, at the end of fiscal year 2022-23 to the All Other line category for the 2023-24 fiscal year; and, at the end of fiscal year

2023-24 to the All Other line category for the 2024-25 fiscal year in the Department of Secretary of State, Administration - Motor Vehicles program to be used for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles modernization project.

## PART B SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the State Controller to carry forward any unexpended balances in the All Other line category in the Department of the Secretary of State, Administration - Motor Vehicles program, after all financial commitments for obligations and budgetary adjustments have been made, at the end of fiscal year 2022-23 to the All Other line category for the 2023-24 fiscal year and at the end of fiscal year 2023-24 to the All Other line category for the 2024-25 fiscal year in the Department of Secretary of State, Administration - Motor Vehicles program to be used for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles modernization project.

## PART C

#### Sec. C-1. 23 MRSA §4206, sub §1-Q is enacted to read:

<u>1-Q. Training program. The commissioner may implement a program to enhance the skills</u> of the Department's transportation workers and ferry service workers. Employees in these classifications who participate in training and who demonstrate they have achieved competencies prescribed by the Commissioner may progress immediately to the next level in these classification series.

## PART C SUMMARY

This Part authorizes the Commissioner to implement a program to develop the expertise of Transportation Workers, Ferry Deckhands, Ferry Ordinary Seaman and Ferry Able Seaman. Upon successful completion of the program and demonstration of prescribed competencies, employees in these classifications may immediately progress to the Senior position in the respective classification series.
