**SUBJ:** Revenues – September

\*\*\*\*\*  
September General Fund revenues were over budget by \$5.3 million or 1.5%. For the first quarter of FY15 General Fund revenues are \$9.9 million over budget (+1.5%). Compared to the first quarter of last fiscal year, FY15 General Fund revenues are up 10.1% (+\$63 million).

Individual income taxes were under budget in August by \$8 million. For the second month in a row withholding receipts were below budget (-\$4.9 million). Withholding receipts are now under budget for the fiscal year by \$13.8 million. It's still unclear at this time why withholding revenues have fallen below forecast in recent months. A number of other states have also reported a similar trend in withholding receipts. In addition to the negative variance on withholding, the third estimated payment for tax year 2014 was under budget by \$7.7 million, a 10% decrease from last September's strong performance. Once again, many other states had a similar experience with the third estimated payment. We continue to monitor both of these revenue sources closely in preparation for the November Revenue Forecasting Committee meeting.

Estate tax revenue was over budget in September by \$5.8 million. A number of moderately sized estate tax payments were processed during the month. These payments were for deaths during calendar year 2013. September's receipts put the forecast for estate tax revenue associated with deaths during CY13 back on track after ending FY14 \$3.6 million under budget. It's very difficult to project the monthly distribution of estate tax revenue.

Similar to the individual income tax, calendar year corporate filers remitted their third estimated payment for 2014 on September 15<sup>th</sup>. The September payment was up 8.8% over last year, exceeding budget by \$1.8 million. In addition, final payments were over budget by \$3.5 million.

### Sales & Use Taxes

Revenue was \$47,438 over budget for the month and \$575,162 (-0.2%) under budget fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date revenue was \$32.8 million (+15.6%) over fiscal year 2014.

### Taxable Sales

Total taxable sales for the month of August (September revenue) were 2.9% over August 2013. The annual rate of change excluding utilities was 3.1%. Building supply sales were up 4.4% for the month and 4.8% for the year ending in August. Sales of taxable items in food stores were up 3.0% for the month and 3.2% for the year. General merchandise sales (primarily sales of goods sold in large department and discount stores) were up 2.4% for the month and down 0.3% for the year. Sales in other retail stores such as jewelry, drug, sporting goods, book, antique, pet, photo, toy, and craft stores were up 2.3% for the month and 2.2% for the year. Auto/transportation sector sales were up 5.9% for the month and 6.2% for the year. Sales of meals and other prepared foods were up 4.3% for the month and 3.4% for the year. Lodging sales were up 4.3% for the month and 3.6% for the year. Business operating sales (primarily use tax paid by businesses) were down 5.4% for the month and up 1.0% for the year.

### Service Provider Tax

Revenue was \$265,487 over budget for the month and \$1.2 million (+15.7%) over budget fiscal year-to-date.

### Individual Income Tax

Revenue was \$8 million under budget for the month and \$6.9 million (-2.2%) under budget fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date withholding payments were 2.4% over fiscal year 2014. Estimated payments were down 9.2% and final payments were up 4.7% fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date revenue was \$1.1 million (+0.4%) over fiscal year 2014.

### Corporate Income Tax

Revenue was \$3.6 million over budget for the month and \$3.8 million (9.3%) over budget fiscal year-to-date. Estimated payments were up 3.3% and final payments were up 38.3% fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date revenue was \$4.8 million (11.9%) over fiscal year 2014.

### Cigarette & Tobacco Taxes

Cigarette and tobacco products tax revenue was \$673,721 under budget for the month and \$642,512 (+1.8%) over budget fiscal year-to-date.

### Insurance Companies Taxes

The Insurance Companies Taxes were \$88,917 over budget for the month and \$430,930 under budget fiscal year-to-date.

### Estate Tax

The estate tax was \$5.8 million over budget for the month and \$6.1 million over budget fiscal year-to-date.

### Transfers for Tax Relief Programs

Refunds for the Business Equipment Tax Reimbursement (BETR) and Business Equipment Tax Exemption (BETE) programs were under budget in September by \$3.7 million and for the fiscal year by \$5.2 million.

### Municipal Revenue Sharing

Revenue sharing was under budget in September by \$0.2 million. For the fiscal year revenue sharing is \$0.9 million over budget or 9.5%.

### Lottery

Lottery Revenues were under budget for the month by \$0.2 million. Year-to-date lottery receipts are \$0.4 million below projections.

### Other Revenues

Other Revenues were under budget for the month by \$0.8 million. For the fiscal year other revenues are under budget by \$0.5 million (-28.3%).

### Highway Fund

Motor fuel excise tax receipts were over budget in September by \$0.5 million. The Highway Fund as a whole was over budget for the month by \$0.750 million. Through the first quarter of the fiscal year motor fuel excise taxes are \$1.2 million over budget and the Highway Fund is \$2.4 million over budget. Compared to the first three months of FY14, motor fuel excise tax receipts have increased this fiscal year by 0.4%.

### National Economy

Economists agree that third quarter GDP growth will be in the 3.5% range, after that is where they start to diverge in their forecasts. Some forecasters acknowledge there are certain impediments to growth, but believe the economy has finally entered a period of sustained economic growth of 3% or more. Other economic forecasters are concerned that the slowdown in Europe and China and demographic trends at home will keep US economic growth below the 3% target for the foreseeable future. Federal Reserve decision makers have thus far sided with the slower growth scenario and indicated after their last Open Market Committee meeting that,

“...economic conditions may, for some time, warrant keeping the target federal funds rate below levels the Committee views as normal in the longer run.”

### Maine Economy

Energy prices continue to fall. Depending on the type of crude, oil is now selling between \$82 and \$85 a barrel. This range is well below the \$105 to \$110 a barrel of late summer. Increased production in the US and Libya, and a marked decline in the risk premium associated with conflicts in the Middle East and elsewhere are the primary reasons for the sharp decline over the last couple of months. If oil prices continue to fall or stabilize at current levels, Maine households will avoid overly burdensome heating bills during the upcoming heating season. Lower prices for heating oil and gasoline will provide a significant boost to Mainer’s purchasing power during one of the most difficult times of the year for low and middle income households.
